ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to amend the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* and for other purposes."

"An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of One million one hundred and sixty-eight thousand seven hundred and ninety-six pounds to the service of the year One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six and ninety-seven."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the sixtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

STEAM-SHIP "AUSTRALIEN" DETAINED IN QUARANTINE.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship *Australien* has arrived in Victorian waters, and had on board during the voyage a case reported to be one of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore I, the Minister of Health for the Colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person whatever, except the passengers for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken, and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, lastly, that all persons landed from the said steam-ship at the Quarantine Station shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

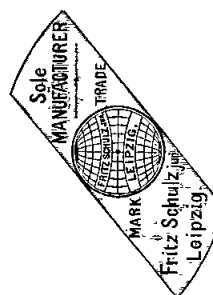

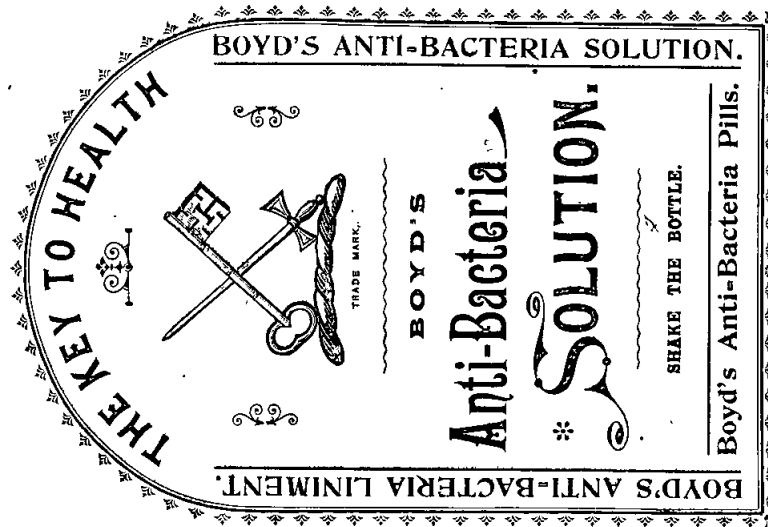

SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Land Surveyors Act 1895* (59 Vict. No. 1400) the Surveyors' Board has made the subjoined Regulations for the Examination of Land Surveyors, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. to the Secretary of the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40–20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age. After 1st March, 1899, no candidate will be admitted to examination under the age of nineteen years.

Spherical trigonometry, as applied to land surveying;
Determination of latitude in field and office;
Determination of true meridian in field and office;
Determination of azimuth in field and office;
Barometric measurements of heights in field and office.

5. Levelling, &c.:
Levelling and mensuration of earthwork.

6. Drawing and Charting:
Construction of maps and charts, including projection;
Compilation of plan from detached plans and notes;

The births of 1,133 children, viz., 581 boys and 552 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of June. This number was, it will be observed, 139 lower than in the corresponding month of the previous year, also the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, and one-third less than the maximum recorded, viz., in 1890. It was, moreover, 244 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 265 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in June numbered 629, viz., 349 of males and 280 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 504, or 80 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, much higher than in the corresponding month of the two preceding years, were about the same as in 1893, but were fewer than in any of the other preceding years except 1886, 1887, and 1892. They were 20 above the average of June during the previous ten years, and if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded that average by only 11.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 30.56, and of deaths registered 16.97 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62.5° on the 10th, and the lowest was 33.2° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (49.7°) was one degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24.5°) took place on the 3rd, and the least range (4.5°) on the 18th. The mean daily range was 13.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.41 inches on the 7th, and the lowest was 29.581 inches on the 28th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.976 inches) differed from the average by a small fraction.

Rain fell on 13 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.58 inches, or .84 of an inch more than in June, 1895, or .53 of an inch above the average of the month during the previous ten years. During the first six months of the current year the rainfall amounted to 15.56 inches, or 0.95 inches higher than in the corresponding period of 1895.

Fog occurred on four days during the month.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 25 per cent. to that mortality, as against 21 per cent. in June, 1895; 23 per cent. in June, 1894; 35 per cent. in June, 1893; 27 per cent. in June, 1892; 34 per cent. in June, 1891; 33 per cent. in June, 1890.

Sixty-two deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a gentleman, aged 75, died of diarrhoea; a labourer, aged 75, of rheumatism; a female servant, aged 75, of syncope; a carpenter, a fruiterer, and a female, each aged 75, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 75, of enteritis; a solicitor, aged 75, of ulceration of intestine; a female, aged 75, of obstruction of the intestine; a female, aged 75, of hepatitis; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 75, of Bright's disease; a master mariner, aged 75, of uraemia; two females, each aged 76, of apoplexy; a slater, aged 76, of paralysis; a commission agent, aged 76, of epilepsy; two females, each aged 76, of pneumonia; a female, aged 76,

of pleuro-pneumonia; a master mariner, aged 76, of peritonitis; a clerk, aged 77, of apoplexy; a civil servant, and a male of no occupation, each aged 78, of heart disease; a saddler, aged 78, of pneumonia; a bootmaker, aged 78, of gastritis; a miner, aged 78, of Bright's disease; a farmer, aged 79, of congestion of the lungs; a cabinetmaker, aged 80, of apoplexy; a laundress, aged 80, of heart disease; a surveyor, aged 80, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 80, of fracture of ribs, the result of a fall whilst getting out of bed; a gentleman, aged 81, of rheumatism; a plumber, aged 81, of valvular disease of the heart; a cook (male), aged 81, of thrombosis; a draper, aged 81, of bronchitis; a female, aged 83, of cancer; an ex-bank inspector, aged 83, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 84, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 84, of diabetes; a female, aged 85, of valvular disease of the heart; a female servant, aged 86, of pneumonia; two gentlemen, each aged 86, of gallstones and cystitis respectively; two females, each aged 97, of bronchitis and bed sores respectively; a miner and a mariner, each aged 75, a bootmaker, aged 77, a boot manufacturer, aged 78, a farmer and a carter, each aged 82, three females, aged 83, 84, and 85 respectively, a druggist, aged 85, a silversmith, aged 86, a sailor, aged 87, a female, aged 88, a cabinetmaker and an engine-fitter, each aged 90, and two females, aged 92 and 95 respectively, of old age.

Thirty-five deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 25 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A railway porter, aged 31, and a station-master, aged 54, were passed over by railway trains; a law student, aged 19, died of injuries, consequent on a fall from his horse whilst hunting; a male, of occupation unknown, aged 35, was killed by a burning tree falling on him; a boy, aged 7, died of injuries to the head, the result of a fall from a bridge; a sawyer, aged 32, and a boatswain, aged 40, of fracture of the skull, caused by falls, the former whilst drunk; a seaman, aged 54, of injuries, consequent on falling from the main yard of a ship; a gentleman, aged 80, of fracture of the ribs, caused by a fall whilst getting out of bed; a labourer, aged 16, of fracture of the skull, the result of being struck by a block; a female, aged 65, of fracture of leg; two female children, each aged 1 year, of burns; a State school teacher, aged 30, of an overdose of morphia and cocaine, self administered; a female, aged 48, of chloroform poisoning, taken whilst under the influence of drink; a compositor, aged 53, of lead poisoning; a male child, aged 1 year, was drowned by falling into a tank; a female servant, aged 16, and a labourer, aged 50, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a female child, aged 1 year, in the Children's Hospital, and a female, aged 24, in the Melbourne Hospital, died under the administration of chloroform for an operation; a female, aged 20, a labourer, aged 45, and a clergyman, aged 72, were suffocated by food; and a male infant, aged 1 week, died of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of 3 new-born male infants, who were suffocated, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a baker, aged 48, who shot himself; a coach-builder, aged 26, a labourer, aged 34, and a slaughterman, aged 57, who cut their throats; a night watchman, aged 42, and a female, aged 67, who hanged themselves; and a painter, aged 53, who threw himself in front of a railway train.

One hundred and forty-three deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—69 in the Melbourne Hospital, 14 in the Alfred Hospital, 2 in the St. Vincent's Hospital, 7 in the Women's Hospital, 6 in the Children's Hospital, 7 in the Homoeopathic Hospital, 5 in the Austin Hospital; 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 7 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 4 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 157, of which 88, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 69, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 99 were under one year of age, 30 were between one and two, 11 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 8 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 472. Of these, 261, or 55 per cent., were males, and 211, or 45 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 18 were between fifteen and twenty, 29 were between twenty and twenty-five, 26 were between twenty-five and thirty, 36 were between thirty and thirty-five, 35 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 34 were between fifty and fifty-five, 45 were between fifty-five and sixty, 37 were between sixty and sixty-five, 50 were between sixty-five and seventy, 34 were between seventy and seventy-five, 31 were between seventy-five and eighty, 16 were between eighty and eighty-five, 9 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 3 were between ninety-five and one hundred.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding one in the previous year, an increase of 14 occurred in the deaths from zymotic diseases, of 7 from developmental, of 26 from local diseases, and 6 from violence; as against which a decrease of 9 took place under other heads. In the zymotic class, deaths from influenza rose from 6 to 13, diphtheria from 2 to 6, and typhoid fever from 3 to 6; but those from erysipelas fell from 5 to 1. In the constitutional class, phthisis caused 6 fewer deaths. In the developmental class, deaths from premature birth rose from 16 to 23, but those from old age fell from 22 to 13. In the local class there was an increase under diseases of the respiratory system from 94 to 112, of the circulatory system from 72 to 80, of the urinary system from 28 to 34, and of the locomotive system from 3 to 8; but a decrease under diseases of the nervous system from 68 to 62. A marked increase also took place in the number of suicides, viz., from 2 to 7; although during the first six months of the year the suicides numbered 25, or 3 less than in the corresponding period of last year.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1895 and the first six months of 1896, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Orders as may be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steam-ship *Australien* arrived in Victorian waters on the 23rd instant, having had on board during the voyage a case reported to be one of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order direct that the said steam-ship, while she remains in Victorian waters, shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine

Station at Point Nepean or at the outer anchorage off Williams-town, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and doth further direct that no person whatever, except the passengers for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her; nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or persons authorized by such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, lastly, that all persons landed from the said steam-ship at the Quarantine Station shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

Sword belt.—Brown leather; as described for Garrison Sergeant-Major.

Forage Cap, Gloves, Sword, Leggings, Sword-knot, and Great Coat, as for Permanent Staff of Infantry.

No. 1431), it is enacted that at the request of the council of any municipal district, including the city of Melbourne and the town of Geelong, the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, declare that the provisions of the said Act shall apply to and be of full force and effect in such district from and after a date to be specified in such Proclamation; and that, except in pursuance of a Proclamation under the said section, the said Act shall not have any force or effect in any municipal district: And whereas the councils of the several municipal districts hereunder mentioned have requested that the provisions of the said Act may be declared to apply to and be of full force and effect in such districts respectively: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that the provisions of the *Width of Tires Act 1896* aforesaid shall apply to and be of full force and effect in each of such districts from and after the 1st day of February, 1897, that is to say:—

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable in the opinion of the Governor in Council that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church, or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
