ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to prevent the Adulteration of Seeds and to regulate the Sale of Seeds Trees Shrubs and Vines."

"An Act to provide for the Reduction of Floods in the River Yarra Yarra within the Cities of Melbourne Richmond and Prahran and for other purposes."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the sixtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

QUEEN'S REGULATION

(Made in the name and on behalf of Her Majesty by Her Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

FOR THE PROTECTION OF NATIVES ENTERING INTO CONTRACTS.

(SEAL) JOHN B. THURSTON.

1. *Interpretation.*—In this Regulation the word "native" shall mean aboriginal native of any island in the Pacific not being a trader.

2. *No action to be brought against natives.*—No action shall be brought in the High Commissioner's Court against any native in respect of any contract entered into after the coming into force of this Regulation.

3. *Native may bring action for recovery of money paid.*—If a native enter into a contract with a non-native person (subject to the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner's Court), such native, whether he has fully performed his part of the contract or not, may, with the leave of the Court, bring an action for the recovery of any money paid and for the value of any work done or goods or produce supplied, and the Court shall give judgment for the same subject to the deduction hereinafter provided. The Court may deduct a *quantum meruit* for the performance by the non-native party of so much of his part of the contract as he has actually performed. If the Court is of opinion that the contract is a fair and reasonable one, and that it has not been carried out owing to the default of the native party, the Court may deduct a sum by way of damages for breach of contract. No contract shall be deemed reasonable if it is one which the native party would in the ordinary course of events have difficulty in performing.

4. *Contracts for repairs to vessels.*—It shall be lawful for any person to enter into a contract with a native for the repair of a boat or vessel, with the proviso that such boat or vessel may be detained until the repairs are paid for. Provided that such native is either the owner of such boat or vessel or has proper authority to enter into such contract. And in the event of an action being brought in the High Commissioner's Court for the delivery of any such boat or vessel, the Court may order the payment by the native party of the value of the repairs done as a condition precedent to the return of such boat or vessel. If any such native is a person subject to the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner's Court, the other party may apply to the Court for an order for the sale of the boat or vessel, and the Court may order that if by a certain date the value of the repairs be not paid the boat or vessel shall be sold, and the amount due for repairs and costs shall be deducted from the proceeds and paid to the party executing such repairs. If the proceeds are not sufficient to meet the amount due no proceedings for the recovery of the balance shall be taken against the native party.

5. *Court may inquire into adequacy of consideration.*—Notwithstanding any agreement to the contrary the Court may in any proceedings under this Regulation inquire into the adequacy of the consideration moving from the non-native party.

Short title.—This Regulation may be cited as the "Native Contracts Regulation, 1896."

Factories and Shops Act 1890.

No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

CIGARETTE FACTORY OF MESSRS. SNIDERS AND ABRAHAMS, AT DRURY-LANE, OFF LONSDALE-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of four weeks from the 6th August, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than thirteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said thirteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Fifteen shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. to the Secretary of the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40–20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age. After 1st March, 1899, no candidate will be admitted to examination under the age of nineteen years.

CONTRACT FROM 1ST AUGUST, 1896, TO 30TH JUNE, 1901.

(All items to Sample.)

Orders will be issued from time to time for such articles as may be required, and contractor will be bound to complete the orders at the rate of not less than 100 garments every week under each of the contracts.

All the clothing must correspond in every particular with the standard patterns as regards shape, make, and workmanship. Machine sewing to be not less than nine or more than eleven stitches to the inch, and fellings to be seven stitches to the inch.

All garments are to be cut full to the sizes, and linings must fit easily. All pipings must show a regular width all round.

All garments for non-commissioned officers and rank and file must be supplied of such sizes as may be demanded on size rolls, and, in the case of tunics, jumpers, and trousers, must conform to the following scales of dimensions.

The Defence Department reserves to itself the right of altering the scales of dimensions from time to time.

All trousers to have the size, number, and the height, waist, and leg measurement of the man prominently marked on a ticket on the outside of the left hip. Stripes of trousers must run regularly down the leg, falling into the hollow of the foot. The cloth for the scarlet stripes must be obtained by the contractor of a quality equal to the stripes in the pattern garment.

All tunics, jumpers, and jackets to have the size, number, the height, breast, and waist measurements of the man prominently marked on a ticket inside.

All caps and other garments not specified above must be made to such dimensions as may be ordered, and have size and number on tickets, which are to be affixed on suitable and prominent places.

Contractor must, if called upon to do so, and without extra charge, measure all warrant officers, also the N.-C. officers and men of the V.E. for their uniforms, but such persons will attend on the contractor for that purpose. All such garments must fit properly.

The contractor must provide everything necessary for the due fulfilment of the contract.

The contractor will be required to purchase from the Defence Department, at the prices laid down on Schedule I. attached to this contract, all blue and scarlet cloth (except scarlet cloth for stripes of trousers) and Khaki drill required for the clothing of the permanent force, and all uniform buttons, gold lace, and gold ornaments for all the articles included under this contract. He will also be required to purchase from the Defence Department, in such quantities as may be required, all yellow worsted universal cord and yellow worsted lace required for the clothing until the present stock shall have been exhausted; thereafter the contractor shall obtain them elsewhere, either by importation or otherwise. The quantity now in stock is—cord 7,000 yards, lace 8,000 yards.

Contractors must forward requisition, accompanied by remittance, for materials to the Secretary of Defence, Public Offices, Melbourne.

In all respects the clothing is to be in strict accordance with samples and specifications, well made, and hand or machine sewn.

The clothing will be subject to the approval of the Controller of Stores.

Should the identical garments now exhibited as patterns for warrant officers' uniforms not be available when required, other similar garments may be used as patterns.

Any article bad in workmanship or materials will be rejected, and if, upon examination of one-fourth of any delivery, the garments should be found to be inferior to pattern or contrary to the specification, the whole delivery will be rejected.

All rejected garments must be removed by contractor immediately after rejection, or they will be stored at contractor's risk and expense.

Accounts will be passed for payment monthly for such garments as have been completed, delivered, and accepted.

No subletting will be allowed. All work must be carried out in the factory of the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged in the manufacture of the articles tendered for in this Schedule are not to exceed 45 per week of 8 hours per day, and at a minimum wage of 10d. per hour for men and 4d. per hour for women. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large forest timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. The water must be pure and fresh. 6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12.
