PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act to prevent the Adulteration of Seeds and to regulate the Sale of Seeds Trees Shrubs and Vines."

"An Act to provide for the Reduction of Floods in the River Yarra Yarra within the Cities of Melbourne Richmond and Prahran and for other purposes."

JOHN B. TRURSTON.

1. Interpretation,—In this Regulation the word "native" shall mean aboriginal native of any island in the Pacific not being a trader.

2. No action to be brought against natives.—No action shall be brought in the High Commissioner's Court against any native in respect of any contract entered into after the coming into force of this Regulation.

3. Native ray bring action for recovery of nanny paid.—If a native enter into a contract with a non-native person (subject to the jurisdiction of the High Commissioner's Court), such native, whether he has fully performed his part of the contract or not, may, with the leave of the Court, bring an action for the. recovery of any money paid and for the value of any work done or goods or produce supplied, and the Court shall give judgment for the same subject to the deduction hereinafter provided. The Court may deduct a quantum meruit for the performance by the non-native party of so much of his part of the contract as he has actually performed. If the Court is of opinion that the contract is a fair and reasonable one, and that it has not been carried out owing to the default of the native party, the Court may deduct a sum by way of damages for breach of contract. No contract shall be deemed reasonable if it is one which the native party would in the ordinary course of events have difficulty in performing.

4. Contracts for repairs to vessel.—It shall be lawful for any person to enter into a contract with a native for the repair of a beat or vessel, with the provise that such boat or vessel may be detained until the repairs are paid for. Provided that such native is either the owner of such boat or vessel may be detained until the repairs are paid for. PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.





(All items to Sample.) Orders will be issued from time to time for such articles as may be required, and contractor will be bound to complete the orders at the rate of not less than 100 garments every week under each of the contracts.

All the clothing must correspond in every particular with the standard patterns as regards shape, make, and workmanship. Machine sewing to be not less than nine or more than eleven stitches to the inch, and fellings to be seven stitches to the inch, and fellings to be seven stitches to the inch.

All rejected garments must be removed by contractor immediately after rejection, or they will be stored at contractor's risk and expense.

Accounts will be passed for payment monthly forsuch garments as have been completed, delivered, and accepted.

No subletting will be allowed.
