ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath: Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bill passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the title whereof is hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to further amend the *Local Government Act 1890.*”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, and in the sixtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

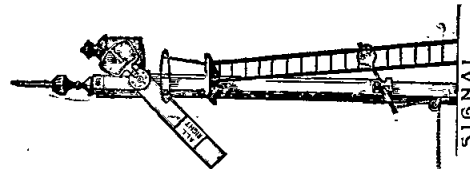

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO MINING LEASES.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Mines Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1120) it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make Regulations generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Part in respect to leases and licences, and such Regulations from time to time to alter, add to, or rescind: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind Regulation 26 of the Regulations relating to Mining Leases, and doth substitute the following therefore, provided always that the Regulation now rescinded shall continue to have full force and effect until the coming into operation of the Regulation hereby made (that is to say):—

26. The applicant (or if there shall be two or more, any one applicant named in the application) and the objector (or if there shall be two or more, any one objector) shall be bound to attend the first court and all adjournments thereof (if any) either by himself or themselves, and may be heard by his or their counsel, solicitor, or agent; but nothing in the rule shall be deemed to prevent all the applicants or all the objectors from attending personally or being heard by their counsel, solicitors, or agents. The warden shall note in the evidence the absence of any party hereby bound to appear, and shall inquire into the truth of any excuse offered for such absence, which shall likewise be entered in the evidence.

KOONDROOK AND MYALL IRRIGATION AND
WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR
ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of
August, 1896.

PRESENT :

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by section 223 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make, alter, and repeal regulations relating to any Irrigation and Water Supply Trust appointed and created under the said Act for the purposes, among others, following—

- (a) For determining the period for which the Commissioners of any Trust shall hold office, the time and manner of election, and the order of their retirement from office.
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of any such Commissioners shall be held, and the manner of voting thereat.
- (c) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such Commissioners shall be filled up; and
- (d) For determining questions as to the due election of any such Commissioner.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Irrigation and Water Supply Trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, make the regulations following, viz.:

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the lands as defined by the Order in Council appointing and creating the said Trust wherein the Trust shall have authority.

2. Period for which commissioners shall hold office.—Subject to the provisions in reference to the first election of commissioners hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said Trust shall hold office shall be three years.

3. Annual retirement of commissioners.—Commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

4. Term of office of persons elected commissioners at first election.—At the first election of commissioners two of the persons elected commissioners shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining three persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year, and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):—

a) How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.—If the first election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall immediately upon such election be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) How term of office ascertained when poll taken.—If at the first election a poll shall be held as in these regulations provided, then of the seven candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining three candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot (as hereinbefore provided in the case of the first election if decided without ballot) the term, or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates shall respectively hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

5. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner whose seat shall have become vacant.

6. Date of first election of commissioners.—Date of ordinary annual election.—The first election of commissioners of the said Trust shall be held on the 22nd day of September, 1896, and the ordinary annual election shall be held on the 22nd day of September in each succeeding year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

7. Voters' list to be prepared.—For the purposes of the first election of commissioners of the said Trust, a voters' list shall be prepared by the persons upon whose petition the said Trust has been appointed and created, and the said voters' list shall be forwarded to the Minister.

8. Form of voters' list.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as these may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the *Water Act 1890* or under the provisions of any Act amending the same, and shall also specify the extent of and indicate with reasonable certainty the land of each such person, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

9. Voting in respect of lands jointly owned or jointly leased.—In the case of joint owners of land, or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners or lessees, as the case may be, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list or lists shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

10. Copy of voters' list to be available for inspection.—Second Schedule.—Objections to list to be in writing and forwarded to Minister.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day-time, in some convenient place within or near to the district of the Trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, setting forth the times and place at which such voters' list may be so inspected, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the Minister within the time mentioned in the said notice.

11. Grounds of objection to be stated.—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the Minister within ten days after the first day of the publication of such notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

12. Minister to revise and certify lists.—The Minister shall revise the said list and consider all objections thereto, and make such alterations and amendments therein as to him may seem just, and shall certify the list under his hand as correct, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

13. Certified list to be voters' roll.—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of the first election of Commissioners of the Trust, but shall also be available for any election in respect of any extraordinary vacancy occurring within twelve months next after the date of the said first election.

14. Voters' list to be prepared yearly.—Before the 1st day of July in each year the officers of the Trust shall prepare a voters' list in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and such list shall contain, in regular numerical sequence and in alphabetical order of surname, the christian name or names, surname, and address (so far as these may be known), of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, or under the provisions of any Act amending the same, and shall also specify the extent of, and indicate with reasonable certainty the land of each such owner, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such owner is entitled.

15. Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.—In the case of joint owners of land or in the case of joint lessees of land, the name of any one of such owners, lessees, as the case may be, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were owned or leased solely by such one owner or lessee, and the owner or lessee so placed upon the said list shall alone be entitled to vote accordingly. Provided always that if such owners or lessees jointly, by notice in writing, desire that the number of votes to which, under the said provisions, any one of such owners or lessees is so entitled to give as aforesaid may be allotted between such owners or lessees in any manner they may jointly indicate, the alteration or alterations so desired to be made in the said list shall, if the same be consistent with the said provisions, be made when the list or lists shall be revised as hereinafter provided, and such owners or lessees shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

16. Copy of list to be available for inspection.—Third Schedule.—A copy of such voters' lists shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day-time, at some convenient place within or near to the district of the Trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Third Schedule hereto shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

17. Grounds of objections to list to be forwarded in writing to the chairman of Trust.—All objections to the said list shall be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

18. Special meeting of Trust to be held to revise list.—List to be certified.—In the month of July in each year a special meeting of the Trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been forwarded to the chairman under the preceding clause shall be considered by the Commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the Commissioners or a majority of the Commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

19. Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll for the purposes of any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) of Trust commissioners to be held within one year from the twenty-second day of September then next, the said day inclusive.

20. Minister may appoint returning officer for first election.—Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at subsequent elections.—For the purposes of the first such election, the Minister may appoint some fit and proper person to be returning officer; but for every subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, the chairman of the Trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if at the time of any election the office of chairman of the Trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the Trust may by resolution appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election, and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

21. Notice of election.—Nomination of candidates.—Fourth schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of commissioners under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district to be named in such notice, in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Four o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than four nor more than seven days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Four o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid, to the returning officer, a nomination paper in the form of the Fourth Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule; and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named, and such candidate, or some person on his behalf, shall at the time when such nomination paper is delivered to the returning officer pay into the hands of the said returning officer the sum of Ten pounds to be dealt with as by law provided; and no person who shall not have been so nominated, and by whom or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made, shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

22. Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners to be elected.—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

23. Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners to be elected.—Fifth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners to be elected, then the returning officer shall forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian names and surnames of all the candidates in full, in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and shall also forthwith give public notice, by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the district, stating the names of the persons so nominated, and that a poll will be taken for the election of such commissioners upon the day named in such notice, at such place within the said area as the returning officer shall in and by such notice appoint, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at Four o'clock in the afternoon.

24. Retirement of candidates before polling-day.—If at any election after a poll shall have been appointed as aforesaid any candidate for such election and two of the persons having signed the paper nominating him as aforesaid are desirous that he should retire from such candidature, such candidate and the persons aforesaid may sign and deliver to the returning officer, not later than four clear days before the day of polling, a notice in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto, stating that such candidate so retires, and the said candidate or his agent shall thereupon publish in some newspaper generally circulating in the district a copy of such notice, and the returning officer, on sufficient proof of such retirement aforesaid, if the number of candidates is by such publication reduced to the number of persons to be elected at such election, shall on the day appointed for the election declare the remaining candidates duly elected, and, if the said number is not so reduced, shall omit the name of

the person so retiring from the ballot-papers to be used at the said election, and if such papers are already printed shall erase such name therefrom, and such person shall not be capable of being elected at such election.

25. Polling-booth may be hired.—At such election the returning officer shall provide a suitable place for taking a poll, and may, if necessary, cause to be hired and used as a polling-booth any room which he may deem to be suitable at the place appointed for taking the poll, and may divide such room into compartments as to him may seem most convenient.

26. Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

27. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, or his deputy, and the said scrutineers, and any voters, not exceeding four in number actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

28. Pencils to be provided.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of the voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers, and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

29. Mode of voting.—Where voter is illiterate.—The returning officer shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, such ballot-papers being in the form of Schedule Five hereto, and initialled by the returning officer; and every such voter shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. And in case any voter is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out the ballot-paper or ballot-papers, as the case may be, shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. Provided that all the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time, and no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

30. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper to the voter, the returning officer or his deputy shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number set opposite to the voter's name in the roll, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such voter's name as having voted, and mark against such name the number of ballot-papers delivered to such voter.

31. Informal ballot-papers.—If any voter suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect.

32. What question may be asked.—At any election of commissioners the returning officer may, if he see fit, or if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, put to any person tendering his vote the question following:—

"Are you the person whose name appears as (A. B.) in the roll now in force for this Trust, being enrolled therein in respect of land in the parish of _____ being (here specify land as described in the roll)?"

And no other question shall be put to any person tendering his vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such question, or who shall not answer the same absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

33. False answer, polling twice, and personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to the question aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as it appears by the roll he is entitled so to do.

34. Result of polling, how ascertained.—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and, as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners of the Trust; and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officers shall in each case have the casting vote.

35. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall, in the case of the said first election of commissioners, forthwith after the declaration of the poll indorse with a description of the contents thereof and sign the sealed parcel of

ballot-papers, and forward the same to the Minister, who shall, as soon as may be after the first meeting of Trust commissioners shall have been held, forward such sealed packet to the secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the Trust; but in all subsequent elections the parcel of ballot-papers so sealed, indorsed, and signed shall be delivered by the returning officer to the said secretary, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months after such delivery, and then by him caused to be destroyed in the presence of three of the commissioners of the Trust.

36. Minister to determine questions arising upon first election.—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at the first election, the returning officer shall, at the request of any voter or candidate, submit such question in writing to the Minister, who shall decide the same, and such decision shall be final and binding.

37. Questions arising upon subsequent elections to be determined by Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner at any subsequent election, whether ordinary or extraordinary, such question shall be determined by the commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been so determined, and the majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

38. Appeal to Minister from determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

39. Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.—If at any election of commissioners no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies, and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

40. Expenses of election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election, shall be defrayed by the Trust.

41. Penalty for breach of regulations.—Any person guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, to be recovered in a summary manner before justices of the peace.

42. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

THE KOONDROOK AND MYALL IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of August, 1896.

WHEREAS by the Water Act 1890, No 1156, it is enacted that any Irrigation Trust or any two or more of such Trusts within any proposed district may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein. And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or trust can be constituted or appointed, a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that such petition for the constitution of an Irrigation District and the appointment and creation of an Irrigation Trust may be adopted in part or in whole.

And it is further enacted that, after compliance with the provisions of the said Act, the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of same he shall make an Order in Council accordingly. And it is further enacted that, if the Governor in Council approve of such proposed scheme, he may by Order in Council constitute the proposed district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and appoint and create an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, to construct, maintain, and continue the works described in the Order.

And whereas the Chairman and Commissioners of the Koondrook Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and the Chairman and Commissioners of the Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust have, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, and for the purpose of amalgamating the two districts of the said Trusts, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute certain land,

forming the respective districts of the said Trusts, situate within the parishes of Murrabit and Murrabit-West, in the county of Gumbower, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of a proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition), an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration, in writing, of the Minister of Water Supply upon the said petition having been complied with, the Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette* on the 25th day of March, 1892, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district proposed to be constituted, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme of such first-named petition, as set out in the said declaration, in writing, of the Minister might be adopted. And whereas after compliance with all the provisions under the said Act necessary to be observed before approval of the scheme proposed, the Governor in Council has, by an Order in Council dated this 10th day of August, 1896, approved of the said proposed scheme.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, doth declare, order, and direct as follow:—

1. That the Order in Council bearing date the 18th day of May, 1886, constituting the Koondrook Irrigation Trust, together with all subsequent Orders in Council that have been approved relating to such Trust, excepting those dated the 7th day of December, 1891, 9th day of January, 1893, 15th day of January, 1894, 11th day of January, 1895, and 17th April, 1896, approving certain rating regulations made by the said Trust, shall be and the same are hereby severally repealed.
2. That the Order in Council bearing date the 9th day of June, 1890, appointing and creating the Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, together with all subsequent Orders in Council that have been approved relating to such Trust, excepting those dated the 20th day of February, 1893, 30th day of January, 1894, 13th day of February, 1895, and the 24th day of February, 1896, approving certain rating regulations made by the said Trust, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
3. That the said proposed district shall be and the same is hereby constituted, as from the date of this Order, an "Irrigation and Water Supply District" under the said *Water Act 1890*, and an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is hereby appointed and created to construct, maintain, and continue the works in this Order described, in accordance with the provisions of this Order and of the said Act.
4. That the limits and boundaries of the district within which such Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall have authority, and which district shall henceforth be an Irrigation and Water Supply District, shall be those contained within the limits and boundaries of the area of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District hereby constituted, as such limits and boundaries are set out and described in the First Schedule hereto.
5. That the name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply District shall be the "Koondrook and Myall amalgamated Irrigation and Water Supply District," and the corporate name of the said Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be the "Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust."
6. That the scheme of works of the Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust hereby constituted shall be a steam pumping plant on the left bank of the River Murray, a main channel therefrom, and a system of minor reticulation channels throughout the Trust District, as carried out by the Koondrook Irrigation and Water Supply Trust and by the Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.
7. That the source from which the said Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust is to obtain its supply of water shall be the River Murray, and the quantity to be taken therefrom shall not exceed one thousand six hundred (1,600) cubic feet per minute at any season, subject, however, to the condition that the whole of the water so taken shall be used for domestic, stock, and irrigation purposes within the Trust District.
8. That the amount of loan hereby granted to the said Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be Thirteen thousand five hundred and eighty pounds seventeen shillings and tenpence sterling (£13,580 17s. 10d.).
9. That the Treasurer of Victoria shall cause to be transferred in the books of account in the Treasury the amount of Seven thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine pounds (£7,829), granted and advanced by way of loan to Koondrook Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and that such sum of Seven thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine pounds (£7,829) shall be deemed to be part of the said Thirteen thousand five hundred and eighty pounds seventeen shillings and tenpence (£13,580 17s. 10d.) hereby granted to the Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust. The Treasurer for Victoria shall also cause to be transferred in the before-mentioned books all interest and other charges that may be due by the Koondrook Irrigation and Water Supply Trust upon the said Seven thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine pounds (£7,829), and such interest and other charges shall be a debt due by the said Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.
10. That the Treasurer of Victoria shall cause to be transferred in the books of account in the Treasury the amount of Five thousand seven hundred and fifty-one pounds seventeen shillings and tenpence (£5,751 17s. 10d.), granted and advanced by way of loan to the Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and that such sum of Five thousand seven hundred and fifty-one pounds seventeen shillings and tenpence (£5,751 17s. 10d.) shall be deemed to be part of the said Thirteen thousand five hundred and eighty pounds seventeen shillings and tenpence (£13,580 17s. 10d.) hereby granted to the said Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust. The Treasurer for Victoria shall also cause to be transferred in the before-mentioned books all interest and other charges that may be due by the Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust upon the said Five thousand seven hundred and fifty-one pounds seventeen shillings and tenpence (£5,751 17s. 10d.), and such interest and other charges shall be a debt due by the said Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.
11. That the rate of interest to be paid by the Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust upon such loan shall be four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, being one-half per cent. higher than the rate paid by the Government upon the public loan out of which such moneys have been advanced, the rate of interest to be subject to reduction in accordance with section 306 of the *Water Act 1890*, in event of the interest paid by the Government upon such loans being reduced.
12. That the number of persons to be elected as Commissioners of the said Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall be seven, and the period for which such Commissioners shall hold office shall be three years.
13. That no rate made by the Koondrook and Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust shall exceed the sum of Eight shillings in the pound of the annual valuation of the rateable property within the Trust District hereby constituted.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is provided that any Irrigation Trust or any two or more of such trusts within any proposed district may petition the Governor in Council to constitute such district an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein.

And it is further provided by the said Act that, before any district or trust can be so constituted or appointed under the said Act, a petition from owners of land, being an absolute majority of the owners of land within the proposed district, such majority being the owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, shall be presented to the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme or plan of works of such petition for the constitution of an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and the appointment of an Irrigation and Water Supply Trust may be adopted in part or in whole.

And it is further enacted that after compliance with the provisions of the said Act the Governor in Council may approve of the scheme proposed, or he may disapprove of the same; and if he approve of the same he shall make an Order in Council accordingly.

And whereas the Chairman and Commissioners of the Koondrook Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, and the Chairman and Commissioners of the Myall Irrigation and Water Supply Trust have, in accordance with the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and for the purpose of amalgamating the two districts of

the said trusts, petitioned the Governor in Council to constitute certain land, forming the respective districts of the said trusts, situate in the parishes of Murrabit and Murrabit West, in the county of Gunbower, in the colony of Victoria, and within the boundaries of the proposed district (shown upon the plan accompanying their petition), an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and to appoint and create a Trust therein for carrying out the scheme or plan of works proposed in the said petition.

And whereas all the provisions of the Act necessary to precede the declaration, in writing, of the Minister of Water Supply upon the said petition having been complied with, the said Minister duly published his declaration in the *Government Gazette*, on the 25th day of March, 1892, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act.

And whereas after due observance of the steps necessary under the said Act to precede a petition of an absolute majority of the owners of land in the district so proposed to be constituted, such majority being owners of at least half the land in such proposed district, hath been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, praying that the scheme of such first-named petition; as set out in the said declaration, in writing, of the Minister, might be adopted.

And whereas the Governor in Council, having taken all the circumstances into consideration, and having ascertained and being satisfied that there has been a compliance with all the provisions of the said Act necessary to be observed before the approval of the scheme of the petition for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, has determined to approve of the scheme proposed by such petition for the amalgamation of the districts of the aforesaid trusts.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in accordance with the provisions of and in exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid, doth hereby approve of the scheme of the said-recited petition for the amalgamation of the aforesaid districts, and for the constitution of the proposed district as an Irrigation and Water Supply District, and for the appointment and creation of a Trust therein, as such scheme is set out in the schedule hereto, in which also are set out the boundaries of the proposed district.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Vermin Destruction Acts it is among other things provided that, on the application of the council of any shire, the Governor in Council, out of any trust funds or moneys under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, may from time to time grant a loan to any such shire for the purpose of enabling such shire to obtain materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing to be supplied to owners of land in special areas constituted under the said Acts: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Lexton has received petitions signed by a majority in number of the owners of land in the special area (the petitioners owning more than one-half of the land in such area) describing the special area for which the petitioners desire a loan to be obtained by the shire, which petitions contain statements of the acreage of the whole of such special area and of the acreage owned by each and every owner of every part thereof, with a short description of the land owned by each petitioner, and of the acreage thereof, and gives an estimate of the probable cost of the whole of the materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing required for the land in such area, and asks that the said shire council will apply to the Governor in Council for a loan an amount sufficient to purchase materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing not exceeding four lineal miles of fencing to every owner, and gives an estimate of the materials required for each petitioner's land, and the probable cost of such material, and an estimate of the extent of fencing to be erected by each owner [and states that in such special area adjoining properties could advantageously be enclosed by one continuous wire-netting fence, and states in each case the estimated cost of such continuous fence and the proportions thereof to be borne by every owner of property to be enclosed by such

fence] and states that each petitioner signing the petitions undertakes to pay to the council in each and every year one-tenth part of his proportion of the value of all materials for wire-netting fencing which the council may obtain by means of the loan proposed to be obtained from the Governor in Council, with interest in the meantime at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum on the amount of the value of such materials or on the value of so much thereof as is unpaid for, and that such undertaking as between each petitioner, or the owner for the time being of the land of such petitioner, or any part thereof, and the said shire council is to be deemed to be and may be enforced as a speciality contract, and states that each petitioner undertakes to erect on his land, with the materials with which he may be furnished, wire-netting fencing to the satisfaction of the said council, or that he will join with other owners in erecting all necessary fencing: And whereas every signature to such petitions is verified by the solemn declaration of a person signing such petitions, which declaration is in the form or to the effect in the Eighth Schedule to the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890*:

And whereas the said shire council has considered the prayer of such petitions and has determined to apply for a loan from the Governor in Council in accordance therewith, and has transmitted to the Minister the said petitions, accompanied by an application, under seal on behalf of the said shire, for a loan of £50 in the terms therein stated, which said application contains an undertaking by the said shire to repay such loan in accordance with the provisions of the said-recited Acts and of any Order in Council granting such loan: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the sum of £50, being the whole of the amount applied for by the said shire council in the application hereinbefore referred to, be granted out of any trust funds or money under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, available by virtue of the provisions of the *Vermin-proof Fences Advances Act 1890*, as a loan to the said shire of Lexton for the purposes of the said Vermin Destruction Acts.

That the said sum of £50 be paid to the council in one instalment of £50.

That the said sum of £50 be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

That the said sum of £50 be a loan for the benefit of the land specified in the Schedule hereunder.

That the proportion of the said sum of £50 to be paid by each and every owner of land within the special area to the said shire council is that set out in the Schedule hereunder.

That the said sum of £50 be repaid by the council of the said shire to the Treasurer of Victoria for the time being within ten years, by annual instalments of not less than £5 each. The first of such payments to be made on or before the 31st May, 1897, and a further instalment of not less than £5 on or before the 31st May in each and every succeeding year until the whole sum of £50 is repaid.

That in the month of May in each and every year until the whole amount of the loan be repaid the council pay to the Treasurer of Victoria on such loan, or on so much thereof as is unpaid, interest at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum.

Land Act 1890, Part I.

ADDITION TO REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of August, 1896.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106, Part I., section 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following additions to the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

CHAPTER VIII.—AURIFEROUS LANDS (SECTION 65).

When the area licensed is three (3) acres or under, the fee to be paid for the licence shall be Five shillings (5s.) per annum.

CHAPTER XI.—LICENCES.—STATE FORESTS AND TIMBER RESERVES.

Felling and removal of Redgum Timber in and from State Forests, and the payment for the same by measurement.

All the Regulations made in respect to felling and removing Redgum Timber in and from State Forests shall apply equally to Ironbark Timber in the Killawarra State Forest.—(Corr. T. 2923c.)

SCHEDULE 70.—SECTION 99.—MISCELLANEOUS LICENCES.

Licences which confer the exclusive right to enter on Crown lands.

The fee payable for a licence under section 99 of the *Land Act 1890* for obtaining limestone and erecting lime-kilns on Crown lands within the parish of Merrimu shall, for the year 1896 only, be Twelve pounds ten shillings (£12 10s.) sterling per annum, payable quarterly in advance.—(Corr. 1459/99.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Land Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of Part I. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby declare as follow, viz.:—

The births of 1,013 children, viz., 545 boys and 468 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July, The number was, it will be observed, 19 lower than in the corresponding month of the previous year, also the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, and about two-fifths less than the maximum recorded, viz., in 1890. It was, moreover, 283 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 313 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 555, viz., 286 of males and 269 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 458, or 83 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, fewer by 65 than in the corresponding month of the previous year, and also fewer than in any other of the ten preceding years. They were, moreover, 98 below the average of July during the previous ten years, and, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 113.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 26.44, and of deaths registered 14.49 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 61.0° on the 3rd, and the lowest was 32.9° on the 31st. The mean temperature of the month (48.0°) was a tenth of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (22.3°) took place on the 31st, and the least range (4.4°) on the 7th. The mean daily range was 11.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.275 inches on the 15th, and the lowest was 29.245 inches on the 6th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.881 inches) was about one-ninth of an inch below the average.

Rain fell on 18 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.30 inches, or .52 of an inch more than in July, 1895, but .12 of an inch below the average of the month during the previous ten years. During the first six months of the current year the rainfall amounted to 17.86 inches, or 7.47 inches higher than in the corresponding period of 1895.

Fog occurred on three days during the month. Males contributed 52 per cent. and females 48 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed only 22 per cent. to that mortality, as against 27 per cent. in July, 1895; 27 per cent. in July, 1894; 50 per cent. in July, 1893; 29 per cent. in July, 1892; 33 per cent. in July, 1891; 38 per cent. in July, 1890. The relatively low proportion of juvenile mortality is most striking. It is most probably due, not so much to greater vitality, as to the diminution of the birth rate, consequent on an emigration of marriageable adults, and the somewhat restricted incomes of those who still remain in the colony, and possibly also to some extent to an increased mortality amongst adults. To decide which of these causes is most potent would require a special investigation.

Eighty-four deaths of persons who had attained, or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these persons a male of occupation unknown, aged 75; died of gout; a labourer, aged 75, of phthisis; a labourer, a mariner, and a

female, each aged 75, of apoplexy; a butcher and a female, each aged 75, of insanity; two females, each aged 75, of syncope and bronchitis respectively; a gentleman, and a female, each aged 75, of pneumonia; two gentlemen, each aged 75, of dyspepsia, and Bright's disease respectively; three females, each aged 76, of apoplexy, dilatation of heart, and gastritis respectively; a master mariner, aged 76, of peritonitis; a female, aged 76, of hepatitis; a female, aged 77, of insanity; a gentleman and a female, each aged 77, of heart disease; a gardener, aged 77, of bronchitis; a miner, a gardener, and a female, each aged 77, of pneumonia; a seaman, aged 77, of congestion of the lungs; a carpenter, aged 77, of Bright's disease; a female, aged 77, of anaemia; a boot manufacturer, aged 78, of phthisis; a butcher, aged 78, of apoplexy; two females, each aged 78, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 78, of pneumonia; a laundress, aged 79, of cancer; a female, aged 79, of embolism; a gentleman, aged 79, of bronchitis; a gentleman, and three females, each aged 79, of pneumonia; a male of no occupation, aged 79, of injuries, the result of being knocked down by a horse; a female, aged 80, of phthisis; a bootmaker, aged 80, of valvular disease of the heart; a male of no occupation, aged 80, of senile gangrene; two females, each aged 80, of bronchitis; a missionary, aged 80, of jaundice; a boat builder, aged 80, of cystitis; two females, each aged 81, of cancer and heart disease respectively; a gentleman, aged 81, of asthma; a farmer, aged 81, of bronchitis; a gardener, aged 82, of influenza; two carpenters, each aged 82, of paralysis and heart disease respectively; a female, aged 82, of pneumonia; one aged 83, of embolism; another aged 83, of heart disease; a man servant, aged 85, of apoplexy; a labourer, aged 86, of syncope; a lackey, aged 87, of cancer; a dyer, aged 87, of cystitis; a female, aged 89, of heart disease; and one aged 91, of bronchitis; a farmer, a pensioner, and a female, each aged 75, a miner and a female, each aged 76, a clerk, a charwoman, and a female, each aged 77, a cabinetmaker, aged 78, a gentleman, aged 79, a female, aged 80, a doctor of laws, aged 81, a labourer, aged 84, five females, aged 87, 90, 90, 93, and 93, respectively, and a gentleman, aged 90, of old age.

Twenty-five deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 19 were set down to accident, 4 to homicide, and 2 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—Three females, aged 3, 10, and 66 respectively, and a truck-washer, aged 59, were passed over by railway trains; and a female child, aged 5, by a train; five persons succumbed to injuries resulting from accident with horses, viz., a merchant, aged 40, by a fall, a male, of no occupation, aged 79, by being knocked down, two boys, aged 2 and 6 respectively, by kicks, and a male, of occupation unknown, aged 55, was passed over by a horse-moving machine; a boy, aged 11, died of injuries, consequent on being struck by a swinging-boat; a teamster, aged 39, of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall; a boy, aged 6, of burns; a male child, aged 2, of scalds; a farmer, aged 60, was found drowned in the River Yarra; a female infant, aged 1 month, was suffocated by the bed clothes; a labourer, aged 40, by food; and a female, aged 33, during a fit; and a new-born male infant, died of injuries received at birth. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male, and 3 new-born female infants, who were suffocated, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a rato-collector, aged 34, who poisoned himself, and a labourer, aged 35, who hanged himself.

One hundred and sixty-eight deaths, or 30 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne Hospital, 13 in the Alfred, 2 in St. Vincent's, 4 in the Women's, 15 in the Children's, 4 in the Homeopathic, and 7 in the Ausfin Asylum; 13 in the Metropolitan and 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 22 in the Benevolent Stockade, and 1 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 120, of which 58, or 48 per cent., were of males, and 62, or 52 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 83 were under one year of age, 13 were between one and two, 17 were between two and three, 5 were between three and four, and 2 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 435. Of these, 223, or 52 per cent., were males, and 207, or 48 per cent., were females; 15 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 30 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 27 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 32 were between sixty and sixty-five, 51 were between sixty-five and seventy, 35 were between seventy and seventy-five, 52 were between seventy-five and eighty, 19 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 5 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-six.

Under all classes of diseases, except the Constitutional (which showed an increase of 2 deaths), there was a lower mortality in the month under review as compared with the corresponding month of 1895, thus deaths from Zymotic diseases fell off by 8, Parasitic by 2, Dietic by 5, Developmental by 18, Local by 27, Violence by 1, and undefined causes by 6. In the Zymotic Class, although deaths from scarlet fever rose from nil in July, 1895, to 2 in July, 1896, diphtheria from 4 to 8, and typhus fever from 3 to 5; those from Diarrhoeal diseases fell from 5 to 2, and Septic diseases from 11 (including 4 from puerperal fever) to 2. In the Developmental Class, the reduction occurred, mainly under the head of premature birth, which showed a falling off from 26 to 11. In the Local Class, the chief decreases were under diseases of the Circulatory and the Respiratory System, the deaths from the former having fallen from 67 to 52, and the latter from 125 to 109. Moreover in the Ill-defined Class deaths from debility fell from 18 to 12. It may be further remarked that under the head of Violence, 4 murders (all of infants) are recorded in the month under review as against nil in July, 1895.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1895 and the first seven months of 1896, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.

5. This licence entitles the holder thereof, during the period for which it is granted, to use the land therein comprised for depasturing purposes only, but does not confer any right to build thereon, or to cultivate or to fence any portion thereof.

6. If the licensee desire a renewal of this licence, notice to that effect must be given to the responsible Minister aforesaid one month prior to the expiration thereof, but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to confer the right to any renewal.

7. The interest in this licence may not be transferred without the consent of the Minister aforesaid and the payment of a fee of £1.

8. No claim whatever shall be made or entertained by reason of the licence not being renewed or transferred.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made, under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

13. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half-width of adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the Thistle Act in like manner, as holders of freehold lands.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and also for persons desiring to take water for domestic supply.

THE TALBOT AND CLUNES BOROUGH AND TALBOT SHIRE WEIGHTS AND MEASURES DISTRICT.

BY-LAW No. 2.

A By-law made under section 32 of the *Weights and Measures Act 1890*, and numbered "Two," for regulating the meetings for the transaction of the business of the union, appointment of chairman, &c., and fixing the amount of fees to be paid to the inspector for examining and comparing weights and measures within the said union.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Weights and Measures Act 1890*, the Councils of the Borough and Shire of Talbot and Borough of Clunes, proclaimed under the said statute to be a union for the purposes of the said Act, order as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 1 be repealed, and the same is hereby repealed.
2. *Ordinary meetings.*—That the union shall hold half-yearly meetings in the months of June and December for the transaction of general business, at the Borough Hall, Talbot, and Town Hall, Clunes, alternately at each place, and the chairman and secretary shall have power to fix the days and hours at which such meetings shall be held.
3. *Special meetings.*—Two members of the union or the secretary shall have power to call special meetings for the transaction of special business. No meeting of the union shall be held unless six clear days' notice thereof, at least, be given to each of the members of said union.
4. *Election of chairman.*—On the day of the December meeting in each year the members present shall proceed to the election of a chairman.
5. *Quorum.*—All powers vested in the union may be exercised at any legally constituted meeting by any three members present, and no business shall be transacted at any meeting of the union unless the said number of members be respectively present.
6. *Adjournment of meetings.*—The members present at any meeting may from time to time adjourn such meeting, and if at any meeting of the union there be not present within half-an-hour after the time appointed for holding such meetings, the number of members hereby authorized to exercise the powers vested in the union, the members present, or the major part of them, or any one member, if only one be present, or the secretary, if no member be present, may adjourn such meeting to any time not further distant than fourteen days from the date of such adjournment.

Each member attending any meeting of the union shall be paid the sum of Five shillings out of the funds of the union for personal expenses consequent upon attending such meetings.

7. *Fees for Comparison.*—The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector of Weights and Measures for the time being for the said Union, for comparing any weights, measures, scales, balances, steelyards, beams, or other weighing machines with the authorized copies of the Standard Weights and Measures in his possession, according to the said Act, that is to say:—

For examining and comparing weights or measures, including stamping when necessary—any weights, measures, balances, beams, steelyards, or other weighing machines at the appointed office, and on the days appointed for the Inspector to attend there, the said examination, comparison, and stamping shall be done free of charge.

On receipt of a requisition in writing, addressed to the secretary, and given within three days of the date fixed for the Inspector's attendance at any of the appointed offices, any bank may have its balances, beams, or other weighing machines with set of troy weights tested by the Inspector at its business premises; and any person having platform scales in their possession may have same tested at their business places, and the fees to be paid for comparing same with the standard weights and measures, and stamping when necessary, shall be as follows:—

- Each balance or beam, with set of troy weights ... 1s.
- Each platform scale, with weights ... 1s.
- For testing public weighbridges the fee shall be £2 2s. annually.
- 8. The Inspector shall attend at the Town Hall, Talbot, Town Hall, Clunes, and Shire Hall, Dunach, at least one day in every year respectively at each for the purpose of comparing weights and measures with the authorized copies of the Standard Weights and Measures on such days and at such hours as the Union may appoint, and he shall also make one circuit annually throughout the district with the said Standard Weights and Measures for the purpose of making the said comparison, commencing at such times and places as may from time to time be fixed by the Union.
