1. As the exact quantity of firewood which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large forest timber, and must be perfectly sound, dry, and of the kind or kinds specified in the tender; neither burnt wood, heartwood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received. The billets must be not less than 4 inches nor more than 6 inches in diameter. The long wood to be not less than 9 inches nor more than 18 inches in diameter. The water must be pure and fresh. Delivery to be made on the written order of the chief officer of the Department requiring the supply. The ton of firewood consists of 40 cubic feet; the load of water of 165 gallons.

3. The orders for wood will be issued half-yearly (except in cases where the storage is small, when they will be issued quarterly); those for water as required; but the contractor must have 24 hours' notice before purchases are made at his risk.

4. The contractor for wood will be bound to place it in stacks for measurement on such ground as may be pointed out. The stacks are to be 2 feet wide (or 4 feet 6 inches for long wood) by 5 feet high, with space between each stack for measuring; and the billets (or lengths) are all to lie the same way, viz., crossways of the stacks in the form of a cord, and are to be laid as closely and solidly as possible in the stack and to the satisfaction of the officer receiving the supply. In the event of any inconvenience being felt, either through delay in delivery or of stacking the wood, the Department concerned will purchase the same or re-stack that delivered, at the contractor's risk, from whose account any expense incurred thereby will be deducted.

5. The officer receiving the supply shall have full power to reject any wood which he may consider not in accordance with the contract, notice of which will be given to the contractor in writing, stating the reason. The contractor may, however, claim a survey; but in that case he must, within 48 hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the wood.

6. The board of survey will be composed of persons appointed by the Honorable the Treasurer, and the decision of the board of survey is to be considered as final.

7. If the board of survey shall decide that the supply is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 3.

8. Accounts for firewood to be rendered to the Department receiving the supply immediately upon completion of the order, which must be attached to the accounts. Accounts for water to be rendered monthly if amounting to £1; under that sum to be rendered quarterly. Payment will be made at the receipt and pay office of the district, or at the Treasury, Melbourne, as the contractor may require.

9. In the event of any irregularity on the part of the contractor being repeated, it will be competent for the Government, in case such irregularity should be established to the satisfaction of the Tender Board, to cancel the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

BY-LAW No 28.

A By-Law of the Council of the Municipality of the Shire of Heidelberg, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 28, for regulating Traffic in, through, and over the streets of the said Shire of Heidelberg.

IN pursuance of the power conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Heidelberg do hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. Throughout this by-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.

2. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway, pavement, or causeway made or set apart for the use or accommodation of foot passengers, provided that a machine may be impelled or taken across any footway, pavement, or causeway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.

3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to such machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a white light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person when driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall carry a proper bell which shall be capable at the will of such person of giving audible and sufficient warning to foot passengers and others of the approach of such machine.

5. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine overtaking or passing any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden in charge of any person, or any foot passenger proceeding along or across any street shall, within a reasonable distance from and before overtaking or passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, horse or other beast of burden, or such foot passenger, by sounding the bell affixed to such machine, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine.

6. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any machine furiously or negligently through or upon any public place or thoroughfare.

7. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, except there be justifiable cause for deviation therefrom.

8. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine, who overtakes and passes any vehicle, or any horse or any other beast of burden, shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such vehicle or animal, except there be justifiable cause for deviation therefrom.

9. Any person using a machine causing any injury, accident, or collision with any other person, machine, or vehicle, or being concerned therein, who shall proceed on his or her way without stopping a reasonable time to see the extent of any injuries caused, and giving, on demand, his or her name and address to the person injured, or to some one on his or her behalf, or to any member of the police force on demand at any time, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

10. Any person who shall not observe this by-law or any clauses, saving the preceding clause hereof, shall, on conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding £2 for each such offence.

THE WARRNAMBOOL HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.—BY-LAWS.

1. That, the building be used both for the purpose of an hospital and benevolent asylum.

2. That the objects of the hospital be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, for casualties; and for a limited number of paying patients. That the object of the benevolent asylum be the reception and relief of the aged, infirm, disabled, and destitute of all creeds and nations, and to give outdoor relief in cases of need.

3. Every donor of £20 and upwards shall be a life governor; and every person who shall subscribe £10 or upwards and raise by collection in the same year a further sum of £10 or upwards from persons not entitled to vote at any meeting of contributors, and the executor or one of the executors proving any will and paying to the institution a bequest of £30 or upwards under such will, or any other person, for special services rendered to the institution, may be elected a life governor by the committee.

4. Contributors shall be entitled to recommend one in and two out patients for each £1 contributed up to £20, subject to the approval of the visiting committee. Admission tickets will be available for twelve months from date of issue.

Powers and Duties of Contributors.

5. There shall be, on the last Thursday in the month of July in every year, a general meeting of the life governors and contributors of the institution, of which ten shall form a quorum, to be held at such a place as the general committee shall appoint, of which meeting seven days' previous notice shall be given in terms of the Act, to receive the report and balance sheet of the committee of management, to elect by ballot a president, vice-president, treasurer, two or more honorary medical officers, two auditors, and one-third of the members of the committee for the ensuing year. No member shall be eligible unless his name and consent be received by the secretary three clear days previously.

Committee of Management.

6. The committee of management shall consist of 24 contributors, twelve of whom shall reside in the outlying district. The president, vice-president, and treasurer of the institution, the mayors of the town of Warrnambool and borough of Kororoit, and the presidents of the shires of Warrnambool, Heytesbury, Mortlake, Hampden, and Minhamite shall be members of committee by virtue of their respective offices, and the president of the institution shall be, *ex officio*, a member of all committees.

7. The committee shall have power to appoint, suspend, and discharge all paid officers, and to fix salaries.

8. The committee shall meet monthly, and the presence of four members shall form a quorum. If, at the expiration of fifteen minutes from the time appointed for meeting there is not a quorum such meeting shall stand adjourned until that day week.

9. In the event of any vacancy in the office of president, vice-president, treasurer, auditors, or the committee of management, the committee shall have power to fill up such vacancy for the remainder of the year.

Special Meeting of Subscribers.

10. It shall be competent at any time for four members of committee, or at least nine contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the president to summon forthwith a special meeting of life governors and contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in such requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.

11. That such meeting of contributors shall be called by advertisement in one of the newspapers published in Warrnambool, at least one week before the day of meeting; ten contributors to form a quorum.

Plurality of Votes.

12. All contributors of the sum of £1 shall be entitled to one vote; of £3 two votes; of £5 and upwards to three votes, at all general meetings of subscribers.

Duties of Visiting Committee.

13. The general committee shall appoint two visitors from their number every month, whose duties shall be:—To visit the institution at least once a week; to investigate any case of distress and to afford temporary relief; to admit into the institution fitting subjects; to see that the various duties of the officers and servants are duly performed; to ascertain if any of the inmates are in a fit state for employment or to leave the asylum, and if so, in conjunction with the paid medical officer, to discharge them. Also, to offer any suggestions as to necessary repairs, and authorize the purchase of any article immediately required.

Honorary and Paid Medical Staff.

14. There shall be one paid medical officer, and not less than two honorary medical officers, each of whom must be an annual contributor to the institution.

15. In all cases of a critical or protracted nature it shall be the duty of the paid medical officer to call by circular a consultation with one or more of the honorary medical officers, and, when any of such last-named officers deem it necessary, they may call a consultation of the whole medical staff.

16. No case having been admitted for medical treatment shall be discharged as incurable without a consultation by the paid medical officer, with one or more of the honorary medical officers.

17. In cases of a difference of opinion between the paid medical officer and one or more of the honorary medical officers as to treatment or otherwise of any patient, such difference shall be decided by a majority of the whole staff present at a meeting called for dealing with such case.

18. The paid medical officer shall perform all the surgical operations necessary, but no capital operation (save in case of great emergency) shall be performed on any patient without a previous consultation with one or more of the honorary medical officers, and, save, as aforesaid, no capital operation shall be performed without due notice having been given to all the honorary medical officers.

19. The paid medical officer shall visit the institution daily; make an entry of his visits in the visitors' book, and keep a register of all cases treated in the institution, which he shall present before the general committee, at their monthly meetings, giving the number of patients, describing their diseases, mode of treatment thereof, number of deaths, if any. Should he be unavoidably absent, he shall secure the services of one of the honorary medical officers to supply his place. On admission of each patient he shall cause the name, age, date of admission, date of arrival in the colony, and religion, to be written on a card, to be suspended over the bed of such patient. He shall also lay before the committee, at their monthly meetings, a detailed health report of the institution, and certify to the master the names of those patients who are able to work on the grounds or fit to be discharged.

Admission of Patients.

20. Accident and emergency cases may be received at any time, but ordinary cases must be recommended by a contributor's ticket countersigned by visitors, and considered fit subjects for admission by paid medical officer, or, in his absence, by an honorary medical officer. Benevolent patients will not, however, require the consent of the last-named officers.

21. Paying patients may be admitted on the order of the visiting committee, countersigned by the paid medical officer, or, in his absence, an honorary medical officer.

22. That the amount chargeable to each patient shall be at the discretion of the visiting committee.

23. That the general rules and regulations of the institution shall be applicable to and observed by all paying patients received into the institution.

24. That persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either), but not requiring admission to the institution, may be treated as out patients of the hospital on producing the recommendation of a contributor, countersigned by a member of the visiting committee.

Persons not Admissible.

25. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no one subject to epilepsy; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one suffering from venereal disease or delirium tremens; nor any one who, in the opinion of the visiting committee, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except from an accident or for surgical operation; or any one who, in the opinion of the paid medical officer or visiting committee, is unsuitable for admission.

26. Ministers of religion, or persons duly accredited by them, shall have free access to persons of their respective denominations at such time as shall be appointed by the committee of management; and when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for such wish shall be immediately complied with.

Secretary.

27. The secretary shall convene all meetings, and take proper minutes of the business transacted thereat; he shall also keep such books and compile such returns as may be required by the committee.

Treasurer.

28. The treasurer shall receive all moneys, and acknowledge all subscriptions in a local paper on behalf of the institution, and shall deposit the same in such bank as the committee shall direct to the credit of the Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum. He shall pay all accounts passed by the committee by cheques on the bank, which shall be signed by him and countersigned by the secretary. He shall keep an account of all money received and paid and report the same to each monthly meeting of the committee, if required, and shall cause a balance-sheet, duly audited, to be presented at the annual meeting.

Auditors.

29. The auditors shall, at the end of each year, examine the treasurer's annual statement, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting.

Collector.

30. The collector, on appointment, shall give such security as the committee deem sufficient for the performance of his duty. He shall pay to the treasurer fortnightly all sums that he may have collected.

31. He shall give printed receipts for all moneys paid to him, and shall keep a counterpart or butt for the inspection of the treasurer and financial committee.

INTERNAL MANAGEMENT.

1. The master shall reside on the premises, and have the charge, control, and management of the institution and the inmates thereof, subject to the regulations and orders of the general and visiting committee and the paid medical officer. Neither master nor matron shall be absent between the hours of Ten p.m. and Eight a.m., nor more than two hours at a time, without permission from the visiting committee or the paid medical officer (except on Sundays for three hours). The master and matron are never to be absent from the institution at the same time without the special permission of the president or visitors.

2. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the matron and servants, and shall see they do their duty; and he shall enforce order, sobriety, personal cleanliness, neatness, and obedience to orders. In case of any misbehaviour, disobedience, or neglect of duty by any of them, he shall have power to suspend the offender and report to the visiting committee, who shall discharge the offender, or deal with the case as they deem fit.

3. He shall regularly visit every part of the institution, and see that the wards and other parts of the house and grounds are kept in a proper state of cleanliness and order, and that all inmates, whom the doctor shall certify as able, be employed in the grounds or otherwise.

4. He shall have the charge of and be accountable for the surgical instruments, furniture, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, medicine and stores, and all other property of the institution; and he shall make an exact inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which he shall regularly enter the receipt, disposal, loss, or breakage of any article; and he shall, on the last days of June and December in each year, and at such other times as a general committee may require, prepare and submit such inventory to the committee.

5. He shall receive the stores and supplies furnished by the contractors or others, and he shall see that they correspond in description, quality, and quantity with the tenders and orders; and in case they do not, he shall have power to return same and obtain others in lieu thereof, and shall report accordingly to the committee at the next meeting.

6. He shall keep an exact account of the admission and discharge of inmates, with their ages and religious denominations; and also of all outdoor patients, the nature of the relief given, and its period of continuance, in the register book.

Matron.

7. She shall be subject to the same regulations respecting living in the house and absence therefrom as the master; she shall see that the female servants do their duty; and shall report any neglect or disobedience of orders on their part to the master.

8. She shall visit each ward daily, and shall see that the beds, linen, and clothes of the patients are clean and in good order; and shall cause such of the bedding, &c., as require it to be replaced by others, and thoroughly cleansed and repaired where necessary; and furnish an inventory of goods belonging to her department to the master.

9. She shall superintend the cooking of all food for the inmates, and shall generally discharge the duties of matron as shall be directed by the committee.

Patients.

10. Patients shall conduct themselves orderly, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the medical officer, master, and matron.

11. No one shall leave his or her ward and go into another ward or apartment, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquor, or any other article without express leave of the paid medical officer, master, or visiting committee.

12. They shall not play at cards or dice, nor gamble or smoke in the house, nor spit on the floor, nor efface or injure any part of the ward, nor any furniture, bedding, or clothing therein, nor blaspheme or use rude or indecent language, nor sing, without permission from the master.

13. Patients deemed able by the medical officer to assist in the work of the institution shall, at the request of the master, so employ themselves.

14. Outdoor patients shall attend at the institution on such days and at such hours as may be required by the committee.

Visitors.

15. Visitors are admitted into the institution on Tuesdays and Saturdays, between the time of Two and Four p.m.; at any other time by a special order from the medical officer or visitors for the month.

16. Visitors will not be allowed to go into any ward without the leave of the master, and every visitor must retire when requested. They must not disturb the patients by unnecessary noise.

17. They will not be permitted to give or to leave with any patient any money, medicines, food, or liquor of any kind, nor any other article without the express leave of the master.

18. No visitor shall give to any servant of the institution any money or gratuity of any kind.

19. Any visitor violating any of the regulations of the institution or behaving with impropriety will be compelled to retire, and will not be readmitted without special leave from the visiting committee.

Form of Bequest.

"I give and bequeath to the Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum the sum of _____, to be applied as the committee for the time being may direct, for which sum the receipt of the treasurer for the time being of the institution shall be a sufficient discharge."
