Petition to His Excellency the Governor in Council. May it please your Excellency-

THE humble petition of the undersigned contributors to The Charity Organization Society of Melbourne respectfully sheweth:—

That your petitioners wish the said society to be incorporated under Division 2 of the Hospitals and Charities Act 1830.

That the society was formed in 1887 as the result of a public meeting convened by Professor Morris, and held in the Melbourne Town Hall on the 6th day of April, 1887.

That the society is supported entirely by voluntary contribu-tions of not less than 50 persons, each of whom has paid not less than £1 per annum, and that the undersigned are of the number of such contributors.

That the society is established for the following philan-thropic objects:—

1. To promote co-operation in charitable work.

- 2. To make inquiry into all applications for assistance, so that the stream of charity may be directed to the deserving.
- To afford (where necessary) immediate relief during inquiry or pending arrangements with charitable institutions or aid from other sources.
- 4. To keep careful records of all cases for facility of reference.
  5. To administer a loan fund.

- To administer a loan fund.
   To maintain a wood-yard or other labour test, so that the means of earning food and shelter shall be open to applicants able and willing to work.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

VICTORIA.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveys or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

 (a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and bodes, leads, and drifts.

 (b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of viva roce or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. to the Secretary of the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have sorved in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

Note.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.
A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age. 

No procession of persons or vehicles, or of both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any of the steets of the town of Warrnambool, unless with the previous consent in writing of the Mayor, or, in his absence, of the Town Clerk, of the said town, and only by the route specified by such consents and until the recipient of such consent shall have given at least twenty-four (24) hours' notice, with particulars of such consent and route, to the officer in charge of the police force of the said town.

5. Whenever for the prevention of accident or the maintenance of order, and for such time as by notice in writing or advertisement in any of the local newspapers by direction of the Mayor, or in his absence, or in case of sudden emergency, of the Town Clerk of the aforesaid town, any street, footpath, or public place shall be declared closed against traffic of vehicles or persons or both, the drivers and vehicles and all persons contemplated by such notice shall, when so required by any member of the police force or the officer of the council of the aforesaid town, obey and conform to such notice by abstaining from going or travelling on, or by withdrawing and removing from, any street, footpath, or public place, where mentioned herein. And the drivers of all vehicles, whether private or public, which may be in any street or other place mentioned in such notice, whether plying for hire on any duly appointed stand or otherwise, shall when so required by any member of the police force or the council's officer aforesaid, emove their horses and vehicles thence to any other street or public place, which may be indicated by any member of the police force

8. No person shall at one and the same time act as driver or have the charge of more than one cart, dray, or other vehicle drawn by animal power on any street, read, or other public place within the town of Warrnambool.

9. The expression "machine" in this part of this by-law shall mean and include any bicycle, tricycle, or redocipede.

10. No person shall drive, ride, or impel a machine upon or along any footway made or set apart for the use of pedestrians.

Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine, and so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he or she is proceeding, and such lamp shall be kept so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

12. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any vehicle, or any horse or other beast of burden, or foot passenger proceeding or standing on the street or carriage-way, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle, herse, or other beast of burden, or foot passenger, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his or her machine by sounding a bell or whistle.

13. Every person driving, riding, or impelling a machine who overtakes and passes any vehicle, horse, or other beast of burden or foot passenger, shall keep such machine to the right or off-side of such vehicle, animal, or foot passenger, and shall give warning of his or her approach as in the last section preceding.

14 In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any vehicle drawn by a horse or other beast of burden, and where such horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person in charge of same, the person driving, riding, or impelling such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue so dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary.

15. No person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall proceed at a greater speed than eight (8) miles per hour, or part thereof, upon or along any of the streets or public places within the town of Warrnambool.
