Petition to His Excellency the Governor in Council.

May it please your Excellency—
The humble petition of the undersigned contributors to The Charity Organization Society of Melbourne respectfully sheweth:—

That your petitioners wish the said society to be incorporated under Division 2 of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1890*.

That the society was formed in 1887 as the result of a public meeting convened by Professor Morris, and held in the Melbourne Town Hall on the 6th day of April, 1887.

That the society is supported entirely by voluntary contributions of not less than 50 persons, each of whom has paid not less than £1 per annum, and that the undersigned are of the number of such contributors.

That the society is established for the following philanthropic objects:—

1. To promote co-operation in charitable work.
2. To make inquiry into all applications for assistance, so that the stream of charity may be directed to the deserving.
3. To afford (where necessary) immediate relief during inquiry or pending arrangements with charitable institutions or aid from other sources.
4. To keep careful records of all cases for facility of reference.
5. To administer a loan fund.
6. To maintain a wood-yard or other labour test, so that the means of earning food and shelter shall be open to applicants able and willing to work.
7. To encourage charitable work where and in so far as no suitable society exists.
8. To discourage indiscriminate alms-giving as well as imposture and professional mendacity.
9. And generally to foster charitable effort and to guide it into wise channels.

Your petitioners therefore pray that Your Excellency may be pleased to declare your petitioners and other the contributors for the time being to the said society to be and continue a body corporate by the style and title of "The Charity Organization Society of Melbourne," and to have perpetual succession and a common seal.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framing; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visu roce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. 



REGULATION No. 3.

THE Commissioners of The First Mildura Irrigation Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 69 of the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895*, do make the following Regulation:—

To facilitate the effective control of the water supply the Commissioners may divide the district into sections, and may from time to time vary such sections as in their discretion may seem fit; may require water orders to be deposited before such dates as they may specify in advertisements of the dates of pumping for irrigation; and may refuse to supply water to such ratepayers as fail to comply with the conditions of such advertisements duly published.

BOORT WATERWORKS TRUST.

REGULATION RELATING TO USE OF WATER BY RATEPAYERS IN THE TRUST DISTRICT.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following addition to the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Naval and Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART VII.—STORES.—REQUISITIONS FOR STORES.

To para. 140, after sub-para. (d), the following sub-para. is added:—

(f) When stores and equipment are being taken over from the Army Service Corps by the corps requisitioning for them they must be checked and signed for by the Quartermaster or Quartermaster-Sergeant of the corps requiring them. When the stores are returned to Army Service Corps they will be handed over by the Quartermaster or Quartermaster-Sergeant of the corps returning them; and he will take a receipt for them from an Officer of the Army Service Corps. The production of the receipts will be considered evidence of the quantities issued and returned. Both in issuing and returning the stores the Officer or Non-commissioned Officer acting on behalf of the requisitioning corps must bear the written authority from his Commanding Officer to act for him, and the latter will be responsible for any articles missing or damaged by other than fair wear and tear.

FIRST MILDURA IRRIGATION TRUST.—REGULATIONS FOR THE ELECTION OF COMMISSIONERS AND AUDITORS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of September, 1896.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Peacock

Mr. Foster.

WHEREAS by section 62 of the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895* (No. 1409), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may, subject to the provisions of the said Act, from time to time make regulations for the purposes following:—

- (a) For determining the period or different periods, not exceeding three years, for which Commissioners of any Trust, including Commissioners for Urban Districts, shall hold office, the time of their election, and the order of their retirement from office.
- (b) For determining the manner in which elections of Commissioners and Auditors shall be held, and in which lists or rolls of voters thereat shall be prepared, and the mode of voting thereat, and the time, mode, place, and all other matters connected with the nomination of Commissioners and Auditors.
- (c) For determining the mode of appointment or election of returning officers and their deputies, and their powers and duties.
- (d) For determining the manner in which any vacancies in the office of any such Commissioners or Auditors shall be filled up.
- (e) For determining questions as to the due election of any such Commissioner or Auditor.
- (f) For prescribing any other matters necessary for giving effect to Part V. of the said Act.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth, so far as regards the First Mildura Irrigation Trust under the said Act, make the regulations following, viz:—

1. Interpretation of terms.—In these regulations "the Act" shall mean the *Mildura Irrigation Trusts Act 1895*; "the Minister" shall mean the Minister of Water Supply; "the Trust" or "the said Trust" shall mean the First Mildura Irrigation Trust; and "the district," "the said district," or "the irrigation district" shall mean the First Mildura Irrigation District, as described in the First Schedule of the said Act.

2. These regulations shall apply to the election of six commissioners and two auditors for the First Mildura Irrigation Trust to be held on the 22nd January, 1897, and shall also apply to all subsequent elections of commissioners and auditors for the said Trust.

3. Period for which commissioners and auditors shall hold office.—Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, for securing the annual retirement of two commissioners, the period during which the commissioners of the said Trust shall hold office shall be three years, and the period for which the auditors shall hold office shall be one year.

4. Annual retirement of commissioners.—Two commissioners shall retire annually, but the retiring commissioners shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be eligible for re-election.

5. Term of office of persons elected commissioners at the election to be held on 22nd January, 1897.—Two of the persons elected commissioners at such election shall hold office as such commissioners for the term of three years, two others of such persons shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two persons elected as such commissioners shall hold office for the term of one year, and the particular term for which each such person so elected a commissioner shall hold office shall be determined in manner following (that is to say):—

(a) How term of office is ascertained when no poll taken.—

If the election is made without a poll, as in the case in these regulations provided, then the particular term for which each candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office shall, immediately upon such election, be publicly determined by lot by the returning officer in such manner as to him may seem fit, and the returning officer shall thereupon immediately and publicly announce the term for which each individual candidate elected as a commissioner shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

(b) How term of office ascertained when poll taken.—If at the election to be held on 22nd January, 1897, a poll shall be taken as in these regulations provided, then of the six candidates elected as commissioners the two candidates who shall have received the highest number of votes shall hold office as commissioners for the term of three years, and the two candidates who shall have received the next highest number of votes shall hold office for the term of two years, and the remaining two candidates who shall have been elected shall hold office for the term of one year; and if two or more than two candidates elected shall have obtained the same number of votes, then the returning officer shall determine by lot the term or terms of three, two, or one year or years during which such candidates elected shall hold office. But so that no candidate elected shall hold office for a shorter time than the term during which any other candidate who shall have obtained a less number of votes shall hold office. And the returning officer shall publicly declare the respective terms during which the several candidates shall hold office as so determined, and shall report the same to the Minister.

6. Extraordinary vacancies, how filled, and term of office.—Should any vacancy in the office of commissioner or auditor be occasioned by death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or any other cause whatever, an election shall forthwith be held to

fill such vacancy, and the provisions contained in these regulations as to the nomination of candidates, the manner in which elections shall be held, and the mode of voting thereat, shall apply to any election in respect of such vacancy, and the person elected to fill such vacancy shall hold the office of commissioner or auditor during the unexpired portion of the term of office of the commissioner or auditor whose seat shall have become vacant.

7. Date of annual election of commissioners and auditors.—The annual election of commissioners and auditors of the said Trust shall be held on the 22nd day of January in each year. Provided that whenever such date may fall upon a Sunday, or upon any day set apart as a public holiday, such election shall be held upon the day next following.

8. Voters' list to be prepared yearly.—Before the first day of December in each year the Trust shall cause to be prepared a voters' list.

9. Form of voters' list.—First Schedule.—Such voters' list shall be in the form of the First Schedule hereto, and shall contain in regular numerical sequence and alphabetical order of surname the christian name or names, surname, and address, so far as those may be known, of each person entitled to vote under the provisions of the Act, and shall also specify the extent of and indicate with reasonable certainty the land of each such person, in respect of which he appears by the assessment books of the Trust to be rated, and shall state the number of votes to which, under the provisions of the said Act, each such person is entitled.

10. Voting in respect of lands jointly owned.—In the case of partners, joint occupiers, joint owners, or tenants in common, the person whose name shall appear first on the assessment book shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of these regulations, be placed in respect of such land upon the voters' list in like manner as if such land were occupied or owned solely by him, and he alone shall be entitled to vote accordingly.

11. Copy of list to be available for inspection.—Second Schedule.—A copy of such voters' list shall be available for inspection, without payment of any fee or charge, at all reasonable hours in the day-time, at some convenient place within or near to the irrigation district of the Trust for a period of seven clear days; and a notice in the form, or to the like effect, of the Second Schedule hereto, shall be published in some newspaper ordinarily circulating within the said district, and such notice shall state that all objections to the said list must be forwarded in writing to the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice.

12. Grounds of objections to list to be lodged in writing with the chairman of Trust.—All objections to the said list shall be lodged in writing with the chairman of the Trust within the time mentioned in the said notice, and the ground or grounds of objection must be clearly set forth.

13. Special meeting of Trust to be held to revise list.—List to be certified.—Within five days after the date fixed for lodging objections against the said list as provided by the last preceding clause, a special meeting of the Trust shall be held for the purpose of revising the said list; and all objections which may have been so lodged with the chairman shall be considered by the commissioners then present; and the chairman may make such alterations and amendments in the said list as the commissioners or a majority of the commissioners present may determine to be just and necessary, or such as by these regulations are required to be made; and the list, when so revised, altered, and amended, shall be certified as correct under the hand of the chairman, and no objection to the list when so certified shall be allowed.

14. Revised and certified list to be voters' roll.—The list so revised and certified shall be the voters' roll to be used at the election of commissioners and auditors to be held on the 22nd January then next ensuing, and shall be the voters' roll to be used at any election for the purpose of filling any vacancy in the office of any commissioner or auditor that may arise within twelve months from the said 22nd day of January.

15. Disqualification of voter.—No person whose name shall appear upon the voters' list, who shall be more than three months in arrears with the payment of the whole or any part of the rates due by him to the Trust in respect of the land described in such list, shall be entitled to vote.

16. Chairman of Trust to be returning officer at elections.—For the purpose of every election (whether ordinary or extraordinary) the chairman of the Trust for the time being shall be the returning officer; but if, at the time of any election, the office of chairman of the Trust should be vacant, the commissioners of the Trust may, by resolution, appoint one of their number to be returning officer until the office of chairman shall again be filled; and the returning officer may appoint a deputy to assist him or to act in his room at any election; and such deputy may do all or any of the acts or things which the returning officer is hereby authorized or required to do.

17. Notice of election.—Nomination of candidates for commissioners and auditors.—Third Schedule.—Fourteen clear days before any election of commissioners and auditors under these regulations, the returning officer shall give public notice of such election by advertisement inserted in some newspaper generally circulating in the said district, and by such notice shall require all candidates at such election to be nominated at some place within the said district to be named in such notice in manner hereinafter mentioned, between the hours of Ten o'clock in the forenoon and Three o'clock in the afternoon, on some day before a day (hereinafter called the day of nomination) not less than seven nor more than ten days after the time of giving such notice, and named therein; and any person desirous of nominating a candidate shall, before Three o'clock in the afternoon of the day next preceding the nomination day, cause to be delivered at the place aforesaid to the returning officer a nomination-paper in the form of the Third Schedule, or to the like effect, stating therein the christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required in and by the said schedule, and such nomination-paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such elections, and also signed by the person named therein as a candidate in token of his assent to being so named. Every candidate for

election as a commissioner, or some person on his behalf shall, at the time when such nomination-paper is delivered to the returning officer, pay into the hands of such returning officer the sum of Ten pounds (£10) to be dealt with as by law provided. And no person who shall not have been so nominated, and, in case the nomination be for election as a commissioner who or on whose behalf such payment shall not have been so made, shall, within the subsequent provisions of these regulations, be deemed to be a candidate at any election of commissioners.

18. Where number of candidates does not exceed number of commissioners or auditors to be elected.—If at the expiration of the time limited as hereinbefore provided for the nominations of candidates the number of persons who have become candidates as aforesaid does not exceed the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, the returning officer shall then declare such candidates to be duly elected, and they shall be deemed to be then duly elected accordingly.

19. Where number of candidates exceeds number of commissioners or auditors to be elected.—Fourth Schedule.—Notice of poll.—Hours of polling.—If at the expiration of the time limited for the nomination of candidates the number of candidates exceeds the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, then the returning officer shall, in respect of the offices for which there is such excess of candidates, forthwith cause ballot-papers to be printed, with the christian and surname of the candidates in full, in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto, and shall cause notices to be published in a newspaper generally circulating in the Trust district, or to be posted up in conspicuous places throughout the district, giving the names of the candidates nominated, and setting forth the date and place at which the poll shall be taken, and the time at which the poll shall commence and be closed, and such poll shall take place accordingly, and shall commence at Ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at Seven o'clock in the afternoon.

20. Returning officer to preside at polling-booth.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall preside at the polling-booth for taking the poll.

21. Scrutineers may be appointed.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present in the polling-booth, and the said returning officer, and his deputy, and the scrutineers, and any persons, not exceeding six in number actually engaged in voting, shall alone be permitted at any one time to enter or remain in the polling-booth.

22. Pencils and ballot-box to be provided.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall provide pencils in the polling-booth for the use of voters, and also a locked box, to be called the ballot-box, with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers; and such box shall be opened and exhibited to the scrutineers before the polling begins, and the box shall then be locked, and shall stand on a table opposite the returning officer or deputy returning officer, who shall keep the key of such box.

23. Mode of voting.—The returning officer, or his deputy, shall deliver to every voter who requires the same a ballot-paper, or if such voter appears by the roll to be entitled to give more votes than one, then so many ballot-papers as may be equal to the number of votes which such voter so appears to be entitled to give, and, so long as the Mildura Riding of the Shire of Mildura forms part of the First Mildura Irrigation Trust District, he shall also deliver twenty-nine ballot-papers to such one of the councillors representing the Mildura Riding in the Shire of Mildura as all or a majority of the said councillors shall, in writing, nominate for that purpose, which written nomination shall be produced to and lodged with the returning officer or his deputy. Every ballot-paper delivered as aforesaid shall be initialled by the returning officer or his deputy; and every person voting shall, without leaving the booth, strike out from all or any of such papers the name of every candidate for whom he does not intend to vote. In case any person voting is unable to read or write, the returning officer, or his deputy, if so required, shall, in view of such one of the scrutineers as the voter may desire, strike out the name or names of such candidate or candidates as such voter may designate, and after such name or names have been so struck out the ballot-paper or ballot-papers (as the case may be) shall forthwith be deposited in the said box. All the ballot-papers to which any person may be entitled at the polling-booth shall be demanded and received by him at one and the same time; and, except as hereinafter expressly provided as to voting by proxy, no person having once demanded and received any such ballot-paper or papers, and voted by the same, shall at the same election receive any further ballot-papers, or exercise any further right of voting.

24. Ballot-papers to be numbered.—Before delivering any ballot-paper, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall write upon the back of each such ballot-paper, as near as practicable to the lower edge thereof, the number in the roll set opposite to the name of the person entitled to vote, and shall thereupon, upon a copy of such roll, check off such person's name as having voted. In the case of the twenty-nine ballot-papers to be delivered to one of the councillors as hereinbefore provided, the returning officer, or his deputy, shall, instead of a number, write the initials of his name only.

25. Informal ballot-papers.—If any person voting suffer to remain upon his ballot-paper a greater number of names not struck out than the number of commissioners or auditors to be elected, the vote given on and by such paper shall be void and of no effect as to the offices for which such greater number is suffered to remain.

26. What questions may be asked.—The returning officer or his deputy may, if he sees fit, or, if required to do so by any candidate or scrutineer, shall put to any person claiming to vote in his own right tendering his vote the questions following:—

- (1) Are you the person whose name appears as (A.B.) in the roll in use at this election?
- (2) Are you more than three months in arrear with the payment of the whole or any part of the rates levied by the First Mildura Irrigation Trust upon the land described opposite to your name in the said roll?

And to any person claiming to vote as proxy for another the questions following in respect of each proxy:—

- (3) Is the signature (A.B.) at the foot of the proxy form presented by you, to the best of your belief, in the actual handwriting of (A.B.) personally?
- (4) Is the said (A.B.) the person whose name appears in the roll in use at this election?
- (5) Is the said (A.B.) more three months in arrear with the payment of the whole or any part of the rates levied by the First Mildura Irrigation Trust upon the land described opposite to the said (A.B.) name in the said roll?
- (6) Are you (C.D.) the person named in the said proxy form?
- (7) Have you already received ballot-papers in respect of three proxies at this election?

and no other question shall be put to any person tendering a vote; and no person who shall refuse to answer such questions, or who shall not answer the second, fifth, and seventh questions absolutely in the negative, and all the other questions absolutely in the affirmative, shall receive a ballot-paper or be permitted to vote.

27. Voting by proxy.—Fifth Schedule.—All proxy forms shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth Schedule to these regulations or to the like effect, and shall in all cases be signed by the person entitled to vote by proxy in his own actual handwriting, or, if unable to write, by his own mark, and such signature or mark shall be attested by a magistrate, a justice of the peace, a commissioner for taking affidavits or declarations, a legal practitioner, a bank manager, a public or State school teacher, or a postmaster or postmistress, either in Victoria or elsewhere, and all such proxy forms shall be lodged with the returning officer at least forty-eight hours prior to the hour fixed for the opening of the poll.

28. False answer, polling twice, and personation.—Every person who shall wilfully make a false answer to any of the questions aforesaid, or who shall poll more than once, or offer to poll more than once at the same election, in his own right or in right of the same person, or who shall use or attempt to use more than three proxies, or who shall depart or attempt to depart from any polling-booth after having received a ballot-paper without having deposited the same in the ballot-box as hereinbefore provided, or who shall personate any other person for the purpose of polling at such election, shall be guilty of a breach of these regulations; but nothing contained in this clause shall apply to any person only by reason of his exercising the right of voting as often as he is entitled so to do.

29. Result of polling, how ascertained.—Returning officer to have casting vote.—Immediately upon the close of the poll, the returning officer shall, in the presence of and subject to the inspection of so many of the scrutineers of the candidates as please to be present, proceed to ascertain the number of votes for each candidate; and such returning officer shall abstain from inspecting the number, or, in the case of the hereinbefore mentioned twenty-nine ballot-papers, the initials written as aforesaid on any ballot-paper, and take care that the same is not seen by any person before being sealed up as herein provided; and the returning officer shall seal up the ballot-papers deposited in the booth, and, as soon as conveniently may be on or after the day of the poll, publicly declare the candidates not exceeding the number of vacancies to be filled up who have received the greatest number of votes to have been duly elected commissioners or auditors of the Trust (as the case may be); and if two or more candidates have received an equal number of votes, the returning officer shall in each case have the casting vote in addition to any other vote or votes he may have.

30. Ballot-papers, how disposed of.—The returning officer shall, forthwith after the declaration of the poll, indorse with a description of the contents thereof, and sign the sealed parcel of ballot-papers, and shall deliver such sealed packet to the secretary of the Trust, to be by him safely and secretly kept for six months then next ensuing, and then by him cause to be destroyed in the presence of three commissioners of the Trust.

31. Questions arising upon elections to be determined by Trust.—If any question arise as to the due election of any commissioner or auditor at any election (whether ordinary or extraordinary), such questions shall be determined by the commissioners of the Trust at the first ordinary meeting held after the election; but no commissioner in respect of whose election such question shall have arisen shall act as a commissioner at such meeting, or be entitled to take any part in the proceedings thereof, or in any manner or at any time to act as a commissioner until such question shall have been determined, and a majority of the commissioners whose election is not in dispute shall form a quorum.

32. Appeal to Minister from determination of Trust.—In event of any voter or candidate feeling aggrieved by the determination of the Trust with reference to any such question as last aforesaid, he may appeal therefrom to the Minister within fourteen days from the date upon which the commissioners shall have determined the question, and the Minister may make such inquiry as to the merits of the question as may appear to him to be necessary, and determine such question in such manner as to him may appear just, and such determination of the Minister shall be final and binding.

33. Failure to elect deemed to create extraordinary vacancies.—If at any election of commissioners or auditors no vacancies or a number of vacancies less than the whole number which should have been filled up at such election are filled up, then the vacancies which are not so filled shall severally be deemed extraordinary vacancies, and to have occurred on the day appointed for such election. Provided always that the commissioners eventually elected to fill such vacancies shall go out of office as if elected at such election.

34. Expenses of election to be paid by Trust.—The expenses incurred by the returning officer, or under his direction, in connexion with any election, shall be defrayed by the Trust.

35. Interpretation.—In these regulations words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, unless there is something in the context repugnant to or inconsistent with this interpretation.

Customs Act 1890.

ADMISSION INTO VICTORIA OF GOODS PRODUCED OR MANUFACTURED IN THE COLONY AND TEMPORARILY REMOVED THEREFROM.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of September, 1896.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by section 287 of the Customs Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1081) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make regulations to admit into Victoria free of duty any goods produced or manufactured in Victoria which may be temporarily removed from Victoria, provided that such previous notice of such temporary removal be given to the Commissioner as such regulations shall prescribe: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind, from the 1st day of October, 1896, the regulations made under the provisions aforesaid and bearing date the 15th day of December, 1890, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, to date from the said 1st day of October, 1896 (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS.

Part 1.—Goods.

1. Any person desirous of temporarily removing from Victoria any goods produced or manufactured in Victoria shall give notice in the form contained in the First Schedule hereto, and obtain the sanction of the Secretary for Trade and Customs to such removal.

2. The goods intended to be removed shall, prior to removal, together with the Secretary's permit, be produced to the collector or other proper officer of Customs at any seaport, or to the Customs officer stationed on the border most convenient to the owner of such goods, and proof must be given, to the satisfaction of such collector or other proper officer, that the said goods have been produced or manufactured in Victoria.

3. The collector or other proper officer shall examine the packages, and satisfy himself that the contents are correctly stated in the aforesaid form, and file a record of his examination. Upon the re-admission of the said goods into Victoria, the proper officer of Customs shall examine the same in detail, and, if found to correspond with the particulars taken at the time of the temporary removal, they may be admitted into Victoria free of duty, upon the usual entry and declaration in the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto, or to the like effect.

Part 2.—Live Animals.

EXPORT.

1. Any person desiring to take live animals out of Victoria for the purpose of bringing them back free of duty shall make application to the Secretary for Trade and Customs, or, in case of emergency, to the principal officer of Customs at the place of export, in the form of the Third Schedule hereto, for a permit therefor, and shall, in such application, state accurately the number, ages and brands, and sexes of such animals, and the place where they are at the date of the application, and the exact locality in which they are to be depastured. Only one class of animals can be included in any one permit.

2. The said Secretary may demand such evidence of fitness of the applicant to hold a permit as he in his discretion may think necessary.

3. The said Secretary may refuse to issue a permit without assigning any cause or reason for such refusal.

4. If the application be approved a permit authorizing the return of the animals will be issued in the form of the Fourth Schedule hereto to the applicant, who will be required to pay therefor to the local Customs officer fees as under:—

5. Animals intended for export under these regulations must be branded at the expense of the exporter with a fire brand, being, in the case of sheep, a small crown on the near cheek, and in the case of cattle, a crown of moderate size on the near neck or cheek. Such brand will be supplied by the Customs officer, and will be the property of the Department. After being branded the animals must be brought to the authorized crossing place, and there counted by the local officer, who will also verify the description given of such animals in the application.

6. Prior to export the exporter or his agent, being duly authorized as such in accordance with the provisions of the Customs Act, shall pass an export entry in the manner required by law and in the form of the Fifth Schedule hereto, and make the declaration on the back thereof in the presence of the Customs officer.

7. The permit shall be in force for six months only, and no stock mentioned in such permit can be returned duty free when such time has been exceeded. Provided that under special circumstances the Secretary for Trade and Customs may extend such permit for a further period of three months (but no longer), on receipt of a statutory declaration from the exporter setting out the whereabouts of the animals and the reasons for asking for such extension.

8. If during the time the animals are absent from Victoria under permit the exporter shall desire to remove the animals to

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some place of pasture other than that mentioned in the application, he shall inform the Customs officer of the place where they were exported, and obtain the permission, in writing, of such officer before removing the animals.

9. Stock can be exported under these regulations only at such places as may be approved by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs.

Return.

10. Animals must be returned at the place at which they were exported.

11. They will not be admitted duty free if they bear any other brands than those which were on them when exported; but this shall not apply to any brand, not being a fire brand, placed on sheep after shearing in New South Wales, of which notice shall have been given at the time to the Customs officer at the place where the sheep were exported.

12. Before delivery can be given in Victoria they must be yarded or otherwise handled by the owner or his agent, so as to enable them to be carefully and easily counted by the Customs officer, and their description compared with that given when the animals were exported.

13. An import entry in the form of the Sixth Schedule hereto must be passed before the animals can be passed for importation, and the declaration on the back of the entry duly made and signed before a Customs officer. The permit must be delivered up to the Customs officer at the place where the animals are introduced. Such permit will be retained by such officer and cancelled.

14. In the event of sheep exported under these regulations being shorn before their return due notice of such shearing must be given at the time to the local officer of Customs.

General.

15. Any person who may have been at any time or shall be hereafter prosecuted to conviction or fine by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for any breach of these regulations or of any other regulations issued by or in connexion with the Customs Department, or of any law relating to the duties of customs or any customs matter, is disqualified from holding a permit under these regulations, and any permit held by any such person shall be immediately cancelled, and have no further force or effect whatever.

SHIRE OF MINHAMITE.—LOAN.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of September, 1896.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Vermin Destruction Acts it is among other things provided that, on the application of the council of any shire, the Governor in Council, out of any trust funds or moneys under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, may from time to time grant a loan to any such shire for the purpose of enabling such shire to obtain materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing to be supplied to owners of land in special areas constituted under the said Acts: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Minhamite has received petitions signed by a majority in number of the owners of land in the special area (the petitioners owning more than one-half of the land in such area) describing the special area for which the petitioners desire a loan to be obtained by the shire, which petitions contain statements of the acreage of the whole of such special area and of the acreage owned by each and every owner of every part thereof, with a short description of the land owned by each petitioner, and of the acreage thereof, and gives an estimate of the probable cost of the whole of the materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing required for the land in such area, and asks that the said shire council will apply to the Governor in Council for a loan an amount sufficient to purchase materials for wire-netting or other rabbit-proof or vermin-proof fencing not exceeding four lineal miles of fencing to every owner, and gives an estimate of the materials required for each petitioner's land, and the probable cost of such material, and an estimate of the extent of fencing to be erected by each owner [and states that in such special area adjoining properties could advantageously be enclosed by one continuous wire-netting fence, and states in each case the estimated cost of such continuous fence and the proportions thereof to be borne by every owner of property to be enclosed by such fence] and states that each petitioner signing the petitions undertakes to pay to the council in each and every year one-tenth part of his proportion of the value of all materials for wire-netting fencing which the council may obtain by means of the loan proposed to be obtained from the Governor in Council, with interest in the meantime at the rate of £3 per cent. per annum on the amount of the value of such materials or on the value of so much thereof as is unpaid for, and that such undertaking as between each petitioner, or the owner for the time being of the land of such petitioner, or any part thereof, and the said shire council is to be deemed to be and may be enforced as a specialty contract, and states that each petitioner undertakes to erect on his land, with the materials with which he may be furnished, wire-netting fencing to the satisfaction of the said council, or that he will join with other owners in erecting all necessary fencing: And whereas every signature to such petitions is verified by the solemn declaration of a person signing such petitions, which declaration is in the form or to the effect in the Eighth Schedule to the Vermin Destruction Act 1890:

an application, under seal on behalf of the said shire, for a loan of £687 15s. 3d. in the terms therein stated, which said application contains an undertaking by the said shire to repay such loan in accordance with the provisions of the said-recited Acts and of any Order in Council granting such loan: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the sum of £687 15s. 3d., being the whole of the amount applied for by the said shire council in the application hereinbefore referred to, be granted out of any trust funds or money under the control of the Treasurer of Victoria, available by virtue of the provisions of the Vermin-proof Fences Advances Act 1890, as a loan to the said shire of Minhamite for the purposes of the said Vermin Destruction Acts.

That the said sum of £687 15s. 3d. be paid to the council in one instalment of £687 15s. 3d.

That the said sum of £687 15s. 3d. be a loan for the benefit of the whole land described in the petitions.

No. 1106, Part I., sec. 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

CHAPTER XIII.—TIMBER LICENCES.

Licences on Crown lands (not being State Forests or Timber Reserves).

There may be issued licences to cut and take away from Crown lands, not being State Forests or Timber Reserves, eucalyptus timber, not including redgum, for the purpose of obtaining piles therefrom. Every such licence shall be subject to the conditions specified in Schedule 58, and to payment of the following fees:—Ironbark logs not exceeding 20 feet in length, Four shillings each; every additional foot, lineal measurement, Twopence; other kinds of eucalyptus, one-half the above-mentioned rates.—(Corr. F. 150.)

This licence does not empower the licensee to fell timber for the purpose of obtaining piles.—(Corr. F. 150.)

INTRODUCTION OF SHEEP, CATTLE, ETC., INTO VICTORIA FROM AFRICA PROHIBITED.

WHEREAS by section 267 of the *Health Act 1890* it is among other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and repeal such Orders as may seem to be necessary for the purpose of prohibiting or regulating the introduction into Victoria from any country or colony, or part of a country or colony (in which respectively any disease in sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever is known to exist), and for the detention in quarantine in such place and for such period as the Governor in Council by such Order appoints or directs of all sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, swine, or other animals of the same or any other kind or kinds whatsoever, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or other parts of any animals, or of hay, straw, fodder, or other articles likely to propagate amongst men or other animals any infectious or contagious disease whatsoever. And whereas it is also enacted that all Orders for any of the purposes in the said section mentioned shall have the like force and effect as if the same had been inserted in the now in part recited Act, and that all persons offending against any Order made under the authority of the said section shall for each and every offence forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding Fifty pounds, or such smaller sum as the Governor in Council may in any case by such Order direct, and that such sum shall go to and form part of the consolidated revenue: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the powers conferred by the above-recited Act and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, prohibit the introduction of sheep, cattle, horses, dogs, or of meat, skins, hides, horns, hoofs, or of hay, straw, or fodder into Victoria from Africa.

And the Honorable Henry Roberts Williams, Her Majesty's Minister of Public Health for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

13. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the Thistle Act in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and also for persons desiring to take water for domestic supply.

Special Conditions:

1. The period of occupation will be from 1st October, 1896, to 30th June, 1897.

3. That each auctioneer doing business in the market shall draw lots on each market morning for priority of sale. Dairy cows shall have precedence of sale of all other cattle.

4. That the drawing for priority of sale of cattle shall take place in the office of the market inspector at 11.50 a.m. on the morning of each market day. The inspector shall draw for any auctioneer not being present at the time.

5. That each auctioneer shall be allowed at the rate of three minutes and a half for the sale of each milch cow. Any salesman who shall not have finished the sale of the whole of his milch cows within the allotted time shall stop his sale and finish at the close of the last sale in that class.

6. That any cattle entered after the commencement of the sales shall not be offered until each agent has offered his lot in each class.

7. That horses shall not be offered for sale until the close of the cattle sale.

8. That the market inspector shall be timekeeper, to whom all disputes with reference to this by-law shall be referred, and his decision shall be final.

9. That every person offending against this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for every offence a penalty not exceeding Ten (10) pounds.
