OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1897.

- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS,
VICTORIA.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, of their intention to present themselves not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

- (a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.
- (b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.
- (c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of viva voce or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. A Certificate of Service will be granted to any candidate who can produce evidence of his having successfully practised in his profession as a Mining Surveyor under the Mining Department for a period of not less than five years prior to the 1st January, 1874, and on payment of the above-mentioned fee of £2 2s.

Examinations are held half-yearly (in April and October).

Factories and Shops Act 1890.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1091), and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister of the Crown for the time being administering the said Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the said Act in the

CARPET AND CURTAIN DEPARTMENTS OF MESSRS. ROBERTSON AND MOFFAT'S FACTORY, AT 322 TO 328 BOURKE-STREET, MELBOURNE,

for a period of three weeks from the 9th September, 1896, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory more than twelve females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females shall not be employed for more than fifty-three hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Fifteen shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory for the information of all concerned.

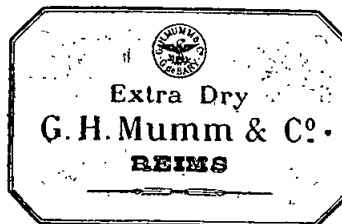

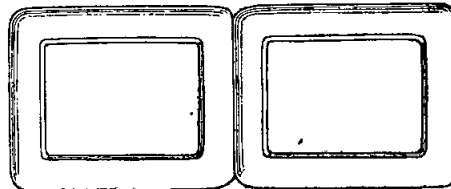

POSITION OF WELLINGTON ROCK, WHANGAPAROA BAY, HAURAKI GULF.

NORTH-WEST CHANNEL, MORETON BAY.

New Lights and Buoys.

NOTICE is hereby given that, on and after 7th September, the following lights, gas buoys, and additional buoys will be exhibited and in position for use in entering or leaving Moreton Bay by the North-west Channel, viz. :—

Light on Caloundra Head.—The light is of the 4th order dioptric condensing; it is placed in a circular tower 33 feet high from ground to lantern top, standing on the summit of the hill, 1½ cables west from Bray Rock. The focal plane of the light is 171 feet above high-water level, and the light is visible a distance of about 16 miles.

It shows a fixed white light to seaward between the bearings of S. 1° E. and N. 61° W., a fixed red light over the North Banks between the bearings of N. 61° W. and N. 30° W., and an intensified white sector down the North-west Channel between the bearings of N. 30° W. and N. 23° W.

Note.—The light may be partially obscured by trees between the bearings of S. S. W. and S. by W.

Leading Lights on Bribie Island.—These lights bear in line S. 55° W. The front light is of the 4th order dioptric condensing; it is placed in a skeleton wooden tower 62 feet high from ground to lantern top, and the tower stands 80 yards back from high-water line, bearing S. 10° W., distant 4.73 miles from Bray Rock. The focal plane of the light is 56 feet above high-water level, and the light will be visible about 12 miles.

It shows a fixed white light to seaward between the bearings of S. 17° W. and S. 77° W., intensified over an arc of 15°, the centre of which is on the line of lights; it is obscured between the bearings of S. 77° W. and N. 46° W., and shows an intensified white sector down the North-west Channel between the bearings of N. 46° W. and N. 40° W.

The back leading light is heliophotal, showing a fixed white light over an arc of about 15° to seaward, the centre of which passes over the front light. It is placed on a skeleton wooden tower 97 feet from ground to top of lantern, and is 1,060 yards distant from the front light; the focal plane of the light is 95 feet above high-water level, and the light will be visible about 15 miles.

Two gas buoys, painted black, with can-shaped superstructures, replace the two black buoys hitherto marking the western extremity of the Spitfire Banks and the western side of Yule Bank respectively; and one gas buoy, painted red, with conical superstructure, replaces the red buoy hitherto marking the northern extremity of the Western Banks.

From the black buoys a fixed white light is shown; and from the red buoy an occulting white light, visible four seconds, eclipsed two seconds, is shown; the focal plane of the lights is 10 feet above water level, and the lights will be visible about 3 to 4 miles.

Additional Black Buoys.—Three additional black buoys, marking the eastern side of the North-west Channel, are placed on a line joining the buoys marking the northern extremity of the North Banks and the western extremity of the Spitfire Banks on the following bearings, viz. :—

Buoy in 8 fathoms—

Caloundra Light-house, bearing N.W. by N. ¼ N.

Mount Beerwah, bearing W. ¼ S.

Buoy with top-mark in 10 fathoms—

Caloundra Light-house, bearing N.W. by N.

Mount Beerwah, bearing W. ¼ N.

Buoy in 9 fathoms—

Caloundra Light-house, bearing N.W. ¼ N.

Mount Beerwah, bearing W. ¼ N.

Buoy Numbers.—The black buoy marking the northern extremity of the North Banks will be numbered NW1, as before; the additional buoys will be numbered NW8, NW5, and NW7 respectively. The Spitfire Bank gas buoy will be numbered NW9, and the Yule Bank gas buoy will be numbered NW11. The Western Banks gas buoy will be numbered NW4.

Buoys Nos. 1 and 5 will carry top-marks.

Directions by Night.—Vessels from the southward, after rounding Cape Moreton, should steer a course for Caloundra Light, keeping both the Yellow Patch and the Caloundra Light white until the Bribie leading lights come in line bearing S. 55° W. Keep the latter in line, passing through the red sector from Caloundra Light until in the white sector from that light, then haul up and bring the light astern bearing N. 25° W. until through the obscured sector of the front leading light, and when the white sector from the latter is entered keep within its limits until the Spitfire Bank gas buoy is visible, when steer to pass it on the port hand at a distance of about 3 cables; then steer to pass the Western Banks gas buoy on the starboard hand at a distance of about 3 cables off; then steer to pass the Yule Bank gas buoy on the port hand at a distance of about 4 cables, and then steer for Cowan Cowan Light, bearing S.E. ¼ N. until the bright white sector from Combonyo Light is entered, when bring that light astern bearing north, and continue, passing through the obscured sector from Cowan Cowan Light, until the Cowan Cowan Light opens out bright again, when bring it astern, and keeping within the limits of that sector steer a course across the Bay for the anchorage near the Pile Light.

Vessels from the northward must approach the entrance keeping Caloundra Light white until the leading lights are in line, when proceed as directed above.

Directions by Day.—Vessels from the southward, after rounding Cape Moreton, should steer for Caloundra Head, keeping Cape Moreton Light-house open east of the Outer White Patch until the light towers on Bribie Island come in line bearing S. 55° W., or until the S.E. Glasshouse Mountain (marked 920 feet on chart) comes in line with the front leading light-house. Steer in on that line until Coolum Hill (600 feet high) is shut in its own width with Caloundra Head—its top showing over the near land—or until Caloundra Light-house bears N.W. by N. ¼ N.; then steer S. 36° E., rounding the black buoy with top-mark on the north extreme of the North Banks, passing three more black buoys on the port hand, the middle one of which carries a top-mark, and the Spitfire Bank gas buoy. Pass the latter at a distance of about 2 or 3 cables, and steer to pass the red gas buoy on the western banks on the starboard hand at a similar distance; then steer to pass the Yule Bank gas buoy on the port hand at a distance of 3 to 4 cables; and then steer for Cowan Cowan Light-house, keeping Come Hill just open south of the tower until the red buoy on the East Knoll Bank is visible, when steer to pass it on the starboard hand at a distance of about 4 cables, and continue until Mount Campbell, bearing N.E. ¼ N., is just open south of Cowan Cowan Light. Keep these marks in that position, and continue on across the Bay to the roadstead.

Vessels from the northward should not bring Coolum Hill west of the summit of Cartwright Point before running down the line of leading marks; then proceed as directed above.

REGULATIONS FOR EXPENDITURE OF THE SUM OF £233,000 GRANTED BY PARLIAMENT TO PROMOTE THE AGRICULTURAL, DAIRY, FRUIT, AND WINE INDUSTRIES.

WHEREAS by the Act 53 Victoria No. 1043, the sum of Thirty-seven thousand pounds was authorized to be spent in giving bonuses in respect of factories for fruit canning, fruit drying, dairying, raisin and currant making, vegetable oil making, preparing for the manufacturer flax, hemp, silk, and other products to be named in regulations: And whereas by the said Act it is provided that such sums of money hereinbefore specified shall be expended under regulations to be made by the Governor in Council: And whereas by Act 53 Victoria No. 1046, the said sums were specially appropriated for the purpose for which the same were respectively granted: Now therefore His Excellency, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth amend the Regulations made for the purpose aforesaid by Orders in Council dated 29th April, 1890, and 20th July, 1895, respectively, in the manner following, that is to say:—

SUBDIVISION No. 1. ITEM 1.

General Vegetable Products.

Clause 13.—Bonus for sowing or planting certain vegetables. After the words "Governor in Council" and "Payment of bonus may, however, at the discretion of the Minister of Agriculture, be allowed on all crops harvested, irrespective of yield or the crop being converted into oil or fibre: should any crop eventuate in failure, re-sowing may be allowed for the year 1896 as regards such crop."

The births of 1,061 children, viz., 503 boys and 558 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of August. The number was, it will be observed, 70 lower than in the corresponding month of the previous year, also the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years, and nearly two-fifths less than the maximum recorded, viz., in 1891. It was, moreover, 342 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, and 375 below that average, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 632, viz., 333 of males and 299 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 429, or 68 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, more by 14 than in the corresponding month of the previous year, but fewer than in any other previous years since 1888, except 1892 and 1894. They were, moreover, 17 below the average of August during the previous ten years, and, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 32.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.70, and of deaths registered 16.50 per annum.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 67.2° on the 22nd, and the lowest was 35.8° on the 2nd. The mean temperature of the month (50.0°) was three-fifths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (23.5°) took place on the 24th, and the least range (4.4°) on the 28th. The mean daily range was 14.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.450 inches on the 6th, and the lowest was 29.449 inches on the 28th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.006 inches) was somewhat above the average.

Rain fell on 14 days, the amount of rainfall being 2.75 inches, or nearly an inch more than in August, 1895, and over an inch above the average of the month during the previous ten years. During the first eight months of the current year the rainfall amounted to 20.61 inches, or 8.41 inches higher than in the corresponding period of 1895, and 5.69 inches above the average of the period during the last ten years.

Fog occurred on three days during the month.

Males contributed 53 per cent, and females 47 per cent, to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 22 per cent. to that mortality, as against 23 per cent. in August, 1895; 30 per cent. in August, 1894; 42 per cent. in August, 1893; 29 per cent. in August, 1892; 41 per cent. in August, 1891; and 41 per cent. in August, 1890. The low proportion of juvenile mortality which is still prevalent was referred to in the last report.

Seventy-nine deaths of persons, who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these persons, two gentlemen, each aged 75, died of softening of the brain and mitral disease of the heart respectively; a female, aged 75, of heart disease; a superintendent, aged 75, of bronchitis; two labourers and a female, each aged 75, of pneumonia; a female, aged 75, of enteritis; a miner, aged 76, of syncope; a gentleman and a miner, each aged 76, of heart disease; a miner and a female,

each aged 76, of bronchitis; a baker and a female, each aged 76, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 76, of cirrhosis of the liver and uremia respectively; a solicitor and a cordial manufacturer, each aged 76, of cystitis; a dealer, aged 77, of heart disease; a cook, aged 77, of pneumonia; a soldier and a dairyman, each aged 77, of nephritis; a labourer, aged 78, of apoplexy; a female, aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; a gardener, a labourer, and a female, each aged 78, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 78, of concussion of the brain, consequent on a tram passing over him; an agent, aged 79, of asthma; a cab proprietor, a carpenter, and a female, each aged 79, of bronchitis; a female, aged 80, of phthisis; a casemaker, aged 80, of bronchitis; a female, aged 80, of pneumonia; a farmer, aged 80, of stricture of the esophagus; a female, aged 81, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 81, of enlarged prostate; a carrier, aged 82, of paralysis; a plasterer, aged 83, of apoplexy; a female, aged 83, of heart disease; a cabinetmaker, aged 84, of paralysis; two females, each aged 84, of pericarditis and enteritis respectively; a dealer, aged 84, of enlarged prostate; a medical practitioner and a female, each aged 85, of apoplexy; a female, aged 85, of endocarditis; a bricklayer, aged 86, of influenza; a female, aged 86, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 86, of asthma; three females, each aged 87, of apoplexy, bronchitis, and ulceration of the stomach respectively; a quarryman, aged 87, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 88, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 90, of pericarditis and pneumonia respectively; a farmer, aged 99, of syncope; a female, aged 77, a carpenter, aged 78, a female, aged 79, a gentleman and a female, each aged 80, a musician, a carrier, and two females, each aged 81, a dealer and a bricklayer, each aged 82, a painter and a female, each aged 84, a gentleman, aged 85, a female, aged 89, a gardener, aged 90, a farmer, aged 91, and a seaman and a female, each aged 92, of old age.

Thirty-one deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 24 were set down to accident, 4 to homicide, and 3 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—Two engine-drivers, aged 39 and 55 respectively, and a farmer, aged 48, were passed over by railway trains; a gentleman, aged 78, by a tram; a female, aged 60, by a cart; a boy, aged 11, died of concussion of the brain, the result of falling from a train in motion; a female, aged 50, of fracture of the thigh, caused by falling out of bed; a labourer, aged 58, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall from the roof of his house; a female, aged 32, was accidentally shot by a relative with a gun which was erroneously thought to be unloaded; a male child, aged 2, died of burns; three female children, aged 1, 2, and 2 respectively, of scalds; a labourer, aged 35, and a groom, aged 43, were accidentally drowned by falling into the River Yarra; a boy, aged 9, and a male of occupation unknown, aged 70, were "found drowned," the former in the Saltwater River, and the latter in the River Yarra; three female infants, each aged 1 week, and a male and a female child, each aged 3 months, were overlain; a new-born male infant died of injuries received at birth; and a male infant, aged 18 days, of umbilical hæmorrhage. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male infant, who was suffocated; a male child, aged 3 months, who died of pleuro-pneumonia, caused by exposure; a labourer, aged 49, who was drowned in a water-hole on a vacant piece of ground; and a female, aged 52, who died of hæmorrhage on the brain, the result of an assault; a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the first case, and of manslaughter in the last three cases. The suicidal deaths were those of a clerk, aged 27, and a gardener, aged 54, who shot themselves; and a female, aged 16, who poisoned herself.

One hundred and seventy-four deaths, or 28 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—62 in the Melbourne, 12 in the Alfred, 4 in St. Vincent's, 9 in the Women's, 6 in the Children's, 6 in the Homoeopathic, and 6 in the Austin Hospitals; 12 in the Metropolitan and 15 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 30 in the Benevolent Asylum, 4 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 4 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 141, of which 72, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 69, or 49 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 93 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two, 15 were between two and three, 13 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 491. Of these, 261, or 53 per cent., were males, and 230, or 47 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 43 were between thirty and thirty-five, 33 were between thirty-five and forty, 31 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 47 were between sixty and sixty-five, 61 were between sixty-five and seventy, 41 were between seventy and seventy-five, 36 were between seventy-five and eighty, 23 were between eighty and eighty-five, 13 were between eighty-five and ninety, 6 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-nine.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding one in the previous year, deaths from local diseases increased by 29, from developmental diseases by 15, from violence by 4, and from parasitic diseases by 3; but, on the other hand, deaths from constitutional diseases fell off by 18, from zymotic diseases by 11, and from dietic diseases and ill-defined causes by 4 each. The increase under local diseases resulted from a higher mortality by 25 under diseases of the respiratory system, by 7 under those of the digestive organs and by 5 each under those of the urinary system and the organs of generation respectively, less a lower mortality by 9 under diseases of parturition, and by 4 (net) under other heads; whilst the increase of 15 under developmental diseases was made up of 4 under premature birth, 5 under atelectasis, 4 under cyanosis, and 2 each under other heads. The falling off under the head of constitutional diseases resulted chiefly from a decrease of 13 deaths under phthisis, 6 under tubercular meningitis, and 6 under rheumatism and gout, less an increase of 5 under tuberculosis (undefined), and 4 under diabetes. Under zymotic diseases the falling off was distributed over most causes, except diphtheria, which shows an increase of 5; thus deaths from whooping cough fell off by 6, those from influenza, typhoid fever, and diarrhoeal diseases by 3 each, and those from septic diseases by 2.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1895 and the first eight months of 1896, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November.
