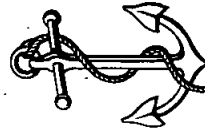

GULF OF ST. VINCENT.—PORT ADELAIDE RIVER.

NOTICE is hereby given that on or about 1st February, 1897, the Port Adelaide River will be lighted by electricity, in consequence of which the whole system of buoys and light beacons will be re-arranged.

Light beacons Nos. 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the present system will be discontinued.

All buoys marking the channel will be removed, except the two outside of the light-house, two black buoys near the Old Boat Channel, and the two mooring buoys (for vessels with explosives) in Lipson Reach.

The new system will consist of (5) five pairs of leading lights, and (8) eight single light beacons.

The pairs of leading lights and single light beacons will in future be numbered from seaward, instead of in the opposite way, as at present, that is to say, No. 12 and the light behind it, of the old system, will be No. 1 of the new, and so on.

The near light of each lead will be red, and the far one white, except in the case of No. 1 lead, where the far light will be red, as at present, and the near one white; these two have not been altered—because the red light of No. 1 on with No. 2 is an established lead over the ocean steamers' mooring buoy; and the white light of No. 1 on with No. 2 leads over the bell buoy on Wonga Shoal.

The two lights of No. 1 lead through the outer cutting near the light-house, as at present.

The single lights, Nos. 2 to 9 inclusive, will mark the edge of the channel from opposite the Old Boat Channel to Mutton Cove.

Nos. 10, 11, 12, and 13 are leads, *i.e.*, pairs. No. 10 is placed on the shore, abreast of the two mooring buoys for vessels with explosives, and leads from Mutton Cove half-way up Lipson Reach.

No. 11 is placed near the torpedo station, and leads up the other half of Lipson Reach to the north arm.

No. 12 is placed on the swamp south of the false arm, and leads from the north arm to the false arm.

No. 13 is placed on Snowden Beach, and leads from the false arm to Luff Point.

Sailing directions and further notice as to the exact date of the alterations will be issued in due course.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

REGULATION No. 4.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District :—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.
3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.
7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
11. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework or brickwork and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
12. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of cylinder of the engine.
13. For water supplied to market gardens for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon; and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons; the supply to be by meter only.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the 1st day of January, 1897, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

4. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds (as the Commissioners may determine) to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.
5. On every horse-trough, a charge of One pound per annum.
6. Water supplied to the Government departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.
7. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st January, 1897, and 1st July, 1897.
8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate. WHEREAS it is provided by the *Medical Act 1890* that any person shall be entitled to be registered under Part II. of the said Act who has attained the age of twenty-one years, and has been engaged continuously during a period of not less than four years in the acquirement of professional knowledge, and has passed an examination before the Dental Board of Victoria in the subjects prescribed by them, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council: And whereas it is further provided that, subject to the provisions of Part II. of the said Act, the Governor in Council may from time to time make, alter, and revoke regulations with respect to examinations held by the said Board, and the fees to be paid for such examinations; and generally for carrying the said Part of the said Act into effect:

Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following addition to clause 3 (*Provis*) of the Regulations respecting Examinations held by the Dental Board of Victoria, made under the provisions aforesaid, and dated the 28th day of January, 1896 (that is to say) :—

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, permitting shops of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1890, on obtaining a licence to keep open after the hours mentioned in the said Factories and Shops Acts, and during such hours as shall be specified in such licence, and also for closing all shops or all shops of any particular class, other than those mentioned in such Schedule, for one afternoon in each week, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers or of all the shopkeepers of the particular class (as the case may be) substantially interested and affected thereby: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the City of Prahran all shops of boot dealers (such shops being shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1890 aforesaid) may be permitted, on obtaining a licence, to keep open until a quarter-past Seven o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday, and until half-past Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday in each week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said City as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of the particular class substantially interested and affected thereby: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

It shall be lawful for any boot dealer's shop within the municipal district of the City of Prahran to keep open on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week from Seven o'clock until a quarter-past Seven o'clock, and on the evening of Saturday in each week from Ten o'clock until half-past Ten o'clock, on obtaining a licence to keep open during such hours from the Chief Inspector of Factories.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Act 1890 it is enacted that the Governor in Council, upon receiving a petition certified by the municipal clerk of any municipal district as having been signed by a majority of the bakers or butchers or vendors of milk respectively having shops in such district, may make regulations prohibiting the delivery of bread or meat or milk (as the case may be) from a cart or in the street or at any house or premises on any one specified day in each month or on any specified afternoon in each week after One o'clock: And whereas a petition has been received so certified as having been signed by a majority of the bakers having shops in the municipal district of the City of Prahran praying that a regulation be made prohibiting the delivery within the said municipal district of bread from a cart or in the street or at any house or premises on the Third Wednesday in each and every calendar month in the year: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation (that is to say):—

No person shall within the Municipal District of the City of Prahran deliver, or cause or permit to be delivered, any bread from any cart or in the street or at any house or premises on the Third Wednesday in each calendar month in the year. Any person guilty of a contravention of this Regulation shall be liable for the first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than One pound or more than Five pounds.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS under the third section of the Victorian Government Stock Act 1896 (60 Vict. No. 1468), the nominal amount £2,290,481 18s. of the Victorian Government Three per cent. Stock is erected: And whereas by section four of the said Act the Treasurer of Victoria is empowered to offer the said stock for sale under regulations and conditions to be imposed by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby authorize the Receiver of Revenue and Paymaster, Melbourne, to dispose of stock to the amount aforesaid on application subject to the other conditions prescribed by the said Act, and at a price not being below par, to be from time to time fixed by the Treasurer, and, further, doth require purchasers of stock to make payment (in addition to the price of the stock so fixed) of a sum equal to the interest which may be considered to have accrued on the said stock from the date when interest on stock was last payable.

2. Stock may be inscribed in the name of one or more persons not exceeding four.

3. Stock may be inscribed in the name of a corporation, but the Treasurer must first be furnished with a copy of the certificate of incorporation or special Act of Parliament under which such incorporation is established, together with a certified specimen of the seal of the corporation and a duly authenticated copy of any regulations governing the mode of affixing the seal.

4. Stock cannot be inscribed in the name of a minor unless jointly with one or more persons of mature age, and when so inscribed it cannot be transferred until the maturity or decease of the minor.

5. All powers of attorney, probates, and letters of administration must be exhibited at the Treasury at least two clear days before they can be acted upon.

6. Any change of address of a stockholder should be at once notified to the Treasurer.

MANUFACTORIES, WORKS, ETC.; STONE QUARRIES; AND COLLIERIES IN VICTORIA,
COMPILED IN 1896.

THE following Statement of the Manufactories, Works, &c., the Quarries, and the Collieries, for the year 1895, is published for general information. As a general rule establishments employing less than four hands are not considered as manufactories, and are not returned unless machinery worked by steam, gas, electric, water, wind, or horse power is used, or the industry is of a novel or interesting description. An exception has been made in the case of some of the factories, formerly included, whose hands have, owing to the depression, temporarily fallen below the prescribed number. When manufacturing is carried on in connexion with a trading or commercial business, as in a large drapery establishment, care is taken to include in the number of hands employed only those actually engaged in the manufacturing portion of the business. On this occasion, for the first time, specific particulars were obtained of the various classes of hands employed which are shown in the second statement, and a distinction is made in the case of horse-power between the full capacity of engines and the power actually used. Stone Quarries, which were formerly included, are now omitted, but are shown in a subsidiary table. The returns relate, with few exceptions, to the year ended 31st December.
