

# MANUFACTORIES, WORKS, ETC.; STONE QUARRIES; AND COLLIERIES IN VICTORIA, COMPILED IN 1896.

THE following Statement of the Manufactories, Works, &c., the Quarries, and the Collieries, for the year 1895, is published for general information. As a general rule establishments employing less than four hands are not considered as manufactories, and are not returned unless machinery worked by steam, gas, electric, water, wind, or horse power is used, or the industry is of a hands have, owing to the depression, temporarily fallen below the prescribed number. When manufacturing is carried on in hands employed only those actually engaged in the manufacturing portion of the business. On this occasion, for the first time, distinction is made in the case of horse-power between the full capacity of engines and the power actually used. Stone exceptions, to the year ended 31st December.
