Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

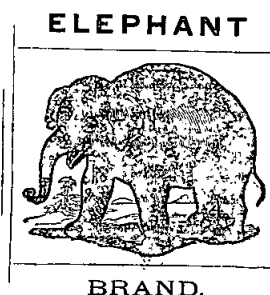

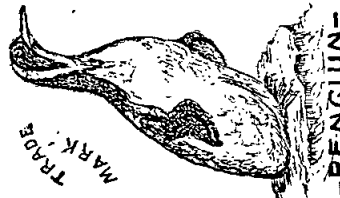

BONUS FOR THE BEST SYSTEM OF VENTILATION
IN MINES.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the subjoined conditions upon which the Bonus of £1,000 is to be granted for the best system of Ventilation in Mines:—

CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH APPLICATIONS FOR A BONUS OF £1,000 FOR AN EFFICIENT SYSTEM OF MINE VENTILATION MAY BE MADE AND CONSIDERED.

(1) Any application for the Bonus must be made to the Honorable the Minister of Mines before the 1st day of January, 1898.

(2) The applicant will be required to demonstrate his system or systems of ventilation and appliances practically in some mine or mines in Victoria to be approved by the Governor in Council.

(3) Any such system or systems must comply with the provisions of section 135 of the *Mines Act 1897*, under any atmospheric conditions.

(4) The air supplied by any such system or systems and appliances to each and every part of the mine where men or horses have to pass, or where work of any description is being carried on by men or horses, shall be equal in purity to the fresh outside air at the surface of the mine.

(5) The system or systems and appliances shall not be of such a character as, by the cost of erection and the cost or expense of working, to be prohibitive of profitable mining.

(6) The full bonus may be awarded to a system and appliances if applicable to the ventilation of deep alluvial, coal, and quartz mines; or the bonus may be awarded in such proportions as their relative merits may justify to a system or systems and appliances only applicable to deep alluvial, or to coal, or to quartz mines, or to any two thereof.

(7) No system and appliances will be considered in which the principle involved in ventilation is not novel, or in which there is not the novel application of known principles or methods.

(8) An applicant to whom any bonus is awarded under these conditions will not be permitted to patent his system and appliances in Victoria; no system and appliances will be considered for which a patent has been applied for or patent rights have been granted in Victoria, unless such application be abandoned, or such patent rights be resigned as regards Victoria.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER, 1897.

THE births of 68 boys and 53 girls, or in all of 121 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of September. Of these, 51 occurred in Ballarat East, 59 in Ballarat West, 8 in Sebastopol, and 3 in the outlying districts; included were 10 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 114, viz., 54 of boys and 60 of girls.

The deaths registered in September numbered 57, viz., 37 of males and 20 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 64. In August the recorded deaths numbered 59; in September, 1896, they numbered 52; in September, 1895, they numbered 57; in September, 1894, they numbered 77; in September, 1893, they numbered 69; in September, 1892, they numbered 48; in September, 1891, they numbered 63; in September, 1890, they numbered 64; in September, 1889, they numbered 63; in September, 1888, they numbered 47; and in September, 1887, they numbered 53.

The births of 1,101 children, viz., 571 boys and 530 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of September. The number was, it will be observed, 95 lower than in September, 1896, only 6 lower than in September, 1895, and much lower than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 252 below the average during the previous ten years, or 256 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in September numbered 548, viz., 297 of males and 251 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 553, or 101 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, more numerous by 72 than in the corresponding month of the preceding year, slightly fewer than in that of 1894 or 1895, and also fewer than in that of any other previous year since 1886; they were also 59 below the average of September during the same period, or 61 below it, allowing for increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 29.69 and of deaths registered 14.78 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month during the last ten years of 30.63 and 16.40 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 34.55 and 18.37.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 80.7° on the 17th, and the lowest was 36.5° on the 4th. The mean temperature of the month (54.2°) was 1° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36.8°) took place on the 16th, and the least range (7.9°) on the 22nd. The mean daily range was 18.4°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.284 inches on the 7th, and the lowest was 29.213 inches on the 28th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.910 inches) was slightly below the average.

Rain fell on ten days, the amount being 2.40 inches, being nearly half-an-inch higher than in September, 1896, and about two-sevenths of an inch above the average of the previous ten years.

Males contributed 54 per cent, and females 46 per cent, to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 21 per cent. to that mortality, as against 20 per cent. in September, 1896; 22 per cent. in September, 1895; 30 per cent. in September, 1894; 29 per cent. in September, 1893; 29 per cent. in September, 1892; and 33 per cent. in September, 1891.

Fifty-five deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a gentleman, aged 75, a pensioner, and a female, each aged 76, died of apoplexy; a plasterer and a female, each aged 76, of paralysis; a female, aged 76, of heart disease; another, aged 77, of dilatation of the heart; a male, of un stated occupation, aged 77, of heart disease; a stonemason, aged 77, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 77, of pneumonia; a plasterer, aged 77, of cystitis; a female, aged 78, of influenza; a labourer, aged 78, of paralysis; a blacksmith, aged 78, of valvular disease of the heart; three females, each aged 78, of pericarditis, syncope, and bronchitis respectively; a miner, aged 78, and a tailor, aged 79, both of emphysema; a female, aged

79, of pericarditis; a housekeeper, aged 79, of bronchitis; a female, aged 79, of congestion of the liver; a gentleman, aged 80, of apoplexy; a baker, aged 81, of pneumonia; a dealer, aged 81, of nephritis; two females, each aged 82, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 82, of pneumonia; a gentleman and a female, each aged 83, of syncope; a banker, aged 84, of paralysis; a female, aged 84, of bronchitis; a female, aged 85, of oedema of brain; a gardener, aged 85, of dilatation of the heart; a female, aged 85, of heart disease; another, aged 86, of bronchitis; another, aged 87, of bedsores; a saddler, aged 88, of valvular disease of the heart; a gentleman, aged 89, and a farmer, aged 91, of syncope; a female, aged 92, of bronchitis; a servant (female), aged 75, a labourer, aged 76, a clerk and a female, each aged 78, five females, aged 79, 80, 80, 81, and 82 respectively, a butcher and a female, each aged 83, a carpenter, aged 88, and two females, aged 90 and 99 respectively, of old age.

Thirty-four deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 24 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 7 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A fireman, aged 37, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall off a locomotive; a female, aged 40, of injuries resulting from a fall off a tram-car; a labourer, aged 61, was passed over by a tram-car; a boy, aged 5, by a dray; a butcher, aged 42, and a builder, aged 66, were thrown from vehicles; a labourer, aged 39, died of abscess of the brain, consequent on injuries caused by a stone having fallen on him; three female cartridge-fillers, two aged 19, and one 20, were killed by an explosion in an ammunition factory; two females, aged 33 and 60 respectively, died of burns; a boy, aged 11, was drowned by falling into a quarry hole; a chemist, aged 21, in the River Yarra, by the upsetting of a canoe; six persons were "found drowned," viz.:—A ganger, aged 37, a female, aged 39, and a miner, aged 59, in the River Yarra, a fireman, and a male of unknown occupation, each aged 35, in Hobson's Bay, and a labourer, aged 40, in the West Melbourne Swamp; a labourer, aged 17, was killed by an electric shock, received through catching hold of an electric-light wire, in the act of climbing; a hawker, aged 34, was suffocated by coal gas; a hawker, aged 38, by falling down a sewer shaft; and a new-born male infant died of accidental injuries received at birth. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born female infant, who died of fracture of the skull, and two new-born female infants, who were suffocated, verdicts of wilful murder being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a dairymaid, aged 33, who stabbed herself; a female, aged 66, who cut her throat; a female, aged 19, who poisoned herself; an upholsterer, aged 36, a bootmaker, aged 46, and a carpenter, aged 60, who hanged themselves; and a sailor, an inmate of the lunatic asylum, aged 43, who died of blood poisoning, the result of self-injection of kerosene into the rectum.

One hundred and sixty-five deaths, or 30 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—69 in the Melbourne, 12 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 5 in the Women's, 11 in the Children's, 6 in the Homoeopathic, and 16 in the Austin Hospitals; 9 in the Metropolitan and 8 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 14 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 4 in the Protestant Refuge.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 116, of which 69, or 59 per cent., were of males, and 47, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 82 were under one year of age, 14 were between one and two, 8 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 432. Of these, 228, or 53 per cent., were males, and 204, or 47 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 15 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 39 were between twenty-five and thirty, 28 were between thirty and thirty-five, 39 were between thirty-five and forty, 25 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 26 were between fifty-five and sixty, 33 were between sixty and sixty-five, 52 were between sixty-five and seventy, 32 were between seventy and seventy-five, 27 were between seventy-five and eighty, 16 were between eighty and eighty-five, 8 were between eighty-five and ninety, 3 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-nine.

In the month under notice, as compared with the corresponding period of 1896, deaths from zymotic diseases increased by 15, those from dietic diseases by 7, constitutional diseases by 10, developmental diseases by 6 (chiefly of old people), local diseases by 22, violence by 8, and those from undefined causes by 4. In the zymotic class the increase was contributed to by diphtheria, from which the mortality rose from 10 to 14; scarlet fever from 1 to 3; venereal disease from 1 to 4; and septicaemia from 1 to 4. In the constitutional class there was, on the one hand, a falling off under cancer from 40 to 32; but an increase under phthisis from 58 to 69, rheumatism from 2 to 5, gout from 1 to 3, scrofula, &c., from 1 to 4. In the local class there was an increase of 19 under diseases of the nervous system, 8 under those of the respiratory, 9 under those of the urinary system, 5 under those of parturition, and 4 under those of the integumentary system; as against a falling off of 4 under diseases of the circulatory, and of 18 under those of the digestive system.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1896, and the first nine months of 1897, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that diphtheria, prevalent in an epidemic form during the second quarter of the year, still causes a more than average mortality.

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan to such Waterworks Trust, and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the public loan out of which such loan may be granted;
- (b) Proclaim the limits of the lands within the municipal district or districts of the council or councils making the application, and within which such Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;
- (c) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council shall think fit:

No. 4. The Shire of Stawell Division, comprising all that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust District within the Shire of Stawell.

No. 5. The Shire of Borung Division, comprising all that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust District within the Shire of Borung.

No. 6. The Shire of Birchip Division, comprising all that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust District within the Shire of Birchip.

No. 7. The Shire of Karkaroc Division, comprising all that portion of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust District within the Shire of Karkaroc.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE BIRREGURRA TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd July, 1893, the Council of the Shire of Winchelsea, having drafted the following Regulations for management of the Birregurra Town Common, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:—

REGULATIONS.

1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five (5) miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four (4) head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one (1) head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three (3) head of small cattle.
2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the *bona fide* owner, and the right to depasture shall not be transferable.
3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of April and the 1st day of October in every year:—
For every horse, Twelve shillings per annum.
For every head of other large cattle, Eight shillings per annum.
For every head of small cattle, Eight shillings per annum.
4. All stock running on the common shall be branded with the brands of the owners thereof.
5. The herdsman shall be in attendance at the time and place to be appointed, prior to the commencement of each half-year, for the purpose of registering stock intended to be depastured on the common, and to receive the fees thereon (for which the managers will give receipts in the prescribed form), together with a schedule of particulars of the animals to be depastured, signed by the owners thereof.
6. The herdsman, on delivery to him of any stock, and after payment of the prescribed fees, shall, with the assistance of the owner or person in charge, mark, brand, or affix a badge (as directed by the managers) to such stock.
7. No stock duly registered shall be removed from the common without and unless notice, in writing, be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.
8. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common, or being removed therefrom without the owner's consent, notify the same, in writing, to the owner thereof within ten days; and in default of notice within that time, the herdsman shall, if the stock be lost, be held responsible, and the loss shall be computed at a rate not to exceed Ten pounds sterling for each animal.
9. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common.
10. The herdsman shall report immediately to the managers the indication of any contagious disease in any stock on the common, and shall give notice thereof, in writing, to the owner of such stock.

11. Whenever in these Regulations any act or thing is required to be done by the managers, it shall be considered to be well and truly done if done by any two or more of them duly appointed from time to time to act on their behalf.

Every person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.

13. The licensee shall destroy all thistles on the land, and on the half width of adjoining roads, and shall be responsible for the destruction of thistles under the Thistle Act in like manner as holders of freehold lands.

14. Free access to water shall be kept open at all times for travelling and other stock and also for persons desiring to take water for domestic supply.

Special Conditions :

1. The period of occupation will be for eight months—from 1st November, 1897, to 30th June, 1898.

2. The fee for the period from 1st November, 1897, to 30th June, 1898—for which the licence will be issued, and fee for licence—must accompany the tender, otherwise the offer of the next highest tenderer who complies with this condition may be accepted.

SHIRE OF MOUNT ROUSE.

By-Law No. 10.

A By-law of the Shire of Mount Rouse, made under section 191 of the Local Government Act 1890, and numbered 10, for regulating bicycle traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1890, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Mount Rouse order as follows:—

1. Throughout this By-law the expression "Machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.
2. A person shall not ride, drive, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers within the boundary of any proclaimed township in the Shire, provided, however, that a machine may be taken across any foot-way direct to or from any premises abutting thereon.
3. Every person riding, driving, or impelling a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp which shall be attached to the machine, and shall be so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which such person is proceeding, and such lamp shall be so lighted and kept lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.
4. Every person riding, driving, or impelling a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the road or carriage-way, and whenever any such person shall overtake with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or vehicle, or horse, or foot-passenger, such person shall keep such machine to the right or off side of such waggon, cart, carriage, or vehicle, or horse, or foot-passenger; and any person overtaking with such machine any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or any horse or foot-passenger proceeding along such road or carriage-way, such person shall, within a reasonable distance from, and before passing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or horse, or foot-passenger, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of such machine by sounding a bell or whistle.
5. In every case where a person riding, driving, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or horse, and where the animal or animals drawing such waggon, cart, carriage, or other vehicle, or horse become restive or alarmed, the person riding, driving, or impelling such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted so long as may be reasonably necessary.
6. A person shall not ride, drive, or impel a machine along or across any road or carriage-way, or any other public thoroughfare within the limits of any proclaimed township in the shire at a rate of speed exceeding eight miles an hour, or in any manner likely to endanger the safety of or injure any person, vehicle, or property whatsoever.
7. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, upon conviction, to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).
