LEADING BEACONS, NEW RIVER ENTRANCE, FOVEAUX STRAIT, SOUTH ISLAND, NEW ZEALAND.

THE Borough Council of Invercargill have notified that two triangular-shaped beacons are being erected at New River Harbor for the purpose of guiding vessels crossing the bar. The beacons will be in position on the 30th October, 1897. They are situated on the sandhills on the south side of the channel, and are about 2 miles inside of Point Island. When in line, these beacons bear from each other E. by N. ½ N. and W. by S. ½ S. respectively. The front or western beacon is erected on an elevation 80 feet above sea-level, and is 10 feet high, and painted white with a black top. The back or eastern beacon is erected on an elevation 120 feet above sea-level, and is situated 150 yards away from the western beacon. It is 10 feet high, and painted white.

Sailing Directions: Vessels before entering the harbor should bring the leading beacons in line (E. by N. ½ N.), and continue on that course until they pick up the first red buoy half-a-mile above the Pilot Station.

NOTE.—All bearings are correct magnetic.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1897.

THE births of 50 boys and 58 girls, or in all of 108 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of October. Of these, 42 occurred in Ballarat East, 61 in Ballarat West, and 5 in Sebastopol; included were 5 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 121, viz., 68 of boys and 53 of girls.

The deaths registered in October numbered 46, viz., 28 of males and 18 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 62. In September, the recorded deaths numbered 57; in October, 1896, they numbered 58; in October, 1895, they numbered 56; in October, 1894, they numbered 60; in October, 1893, they numbered 63; in October, 1892, they numbered 64; in October, 1891, they numbered 101; in October, 1890, they numbered 46; in October, 1889, they numbered 61; in October, 1888, they numbered 61; and in October, 1887, they numbered 54.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

4. Tenements exceeding one-quarter, but not exceeding half-a-mile, distant from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the amount of the assessed rate.

5. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for where water is used for other than domestic purposes solely shall be 20,000 gallons, and shall be paid for in advance, or as the Trust may deem necessary.

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling a 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

7. The foregoing rate is made payable in moieties, on the 1st January and 1st July, 1898.

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by rate, at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

6. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties, half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and 1st July, 1898.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns $\frac{3}{4}$ acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns 1 acre and less, 23,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns 1 acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

- (c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.
- (d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load, to be taken at one time, Sixpence.
- (e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

The Trust may grant permission to persons requiring water for domestic purposes, and for other than domestic purposes, to affix two service-pipes, one for domestic supply without meter, for which the ordinary assessed rate shall be paid, and one for other than domestic purposes with meter, the water used therefrom to be paid for at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, but subject to such regulations as may be approved by the Trust against the use or re-use of water from the domestic service for irrigation or any other purpose not domestic.
2. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from the premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
3. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust who shall take or carry away water from any drinking tap, trough, private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
4. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, he shall obtain from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such work. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any way interfering with any such pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (excepting where permission is given to any unlicensed person in writing by the Trust).
5. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable as the Trust shall see fit, and the Trust may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employé, committing any breach of these by-laws.
6. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber.
7. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, or shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Trust, without the permission in writing of the Trust being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, or injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable, for each such offence, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
8. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the Trust, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust of a strength and material not sanctioned by the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
9. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be wiped joints, and in no case will bolt or copper-bit joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement, on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of 3 feet from the building line, to be properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap, or bricks, or stone.
10. No extension of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Trust.
11. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe or water-tap conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe or tap requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the said Trust may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipe from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any)—and if none, the owner—shall, in every instance in which—after notice that service-pipe requires repairing—any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of One pound for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
12. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable, for each offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
13. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Trust. Each meter must be capable of registering at least 1,000,000 gallons.
14. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or any authorized officer of the Trust as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Trust shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter, or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Trust may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.
15. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to, and with the approval of, the Trust.
16. A separate meter shall, in every case, be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.
17. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meter, shall not exceed 6 feet 3 inches in length along the centre line by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1 foot 9 inches, the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes will not be permitted.
18. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first applying a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds, for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
19. No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe (used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Trust for domestic purposes to any house or premises) for watering any garden or land, laying dust, or any other purpose whatever, nor shall any person be allowed to carry water from any tap or pipes as aforesaid in buckets or any other vessels for the purpose of watering gardens, trees, shrubs, or any land, or any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure, and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.
- 19A. The Trust may enter into a special agreement with any person requiring water for any other purposes than domestic, without the use of a water meter, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.
20. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of consumers shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Ten pounds annual value, $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch diameter; for domestic supply of premises exceeding Ten pounds annual value, $\frac{3}{4}$ -inch diameter; for the supply of water for other than domestic purposes and for all supplies by meter, such diameter as the Trust may authorize in each case.
21. The charge for water from stand-pipe shall be Sixpence for any quantity of water up to 200 gallons, over 200 and up to 400 gallons One shilling.
22. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does or causes to be done anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him or her with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.
23. Permission must be granted by the Trust to any person requiring water for any other purpose other than domestic, either by meter or special agreement. The Trust reserve the right to grant water to any person for any purpose whatever other than domestic, and any person using water for any other than domestic, without the written authority of the Trust, will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds in each case.
24. In the construction of these by-laws the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole, and the word "Trust" shall mean the "Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust."

RATING REGULATIONS FOR YEAR 1898.

The Commissioners of the Elmore Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1850*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the Regulations following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1898, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.
2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be charged.
3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be charged.
4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.
5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound, according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.
6. For water supplied to public troughs, a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

8. For water supplied by measure, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1898.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

UPPER MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATIONS.

No water shall be used for irrigation purposes between the hours of Six a.m. and Ten a.m. during a period of three months, such period to commence on the 15th December and end on the 15th March in each year. Any person committing a breach of this Regulation will be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

2nd. Irrigation by means of open taps will not be permitted; and any person committing a breach of this Regulation will be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.— RATING REGULATION No. 55.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation:—

No. 55.—URBAN DISTRICT OF MURTOA.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Murtoa, that is to say:—

In regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District, situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1898, commencing on the 1st January, 1898, and terminating on the 31st December, 1898, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

The foregoing Regulation, No. 55, was made by the Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust, under and by virtue of section 122 of the *Water Act 1890*, this 19th day of October, 1897.

WOODEND WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1898.

No. I.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Woodend Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulations:—

1. The following rates and charges are those respectively which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the boundaries of the Trust district, that is to say:—

(1) For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile, a rate of One shilling in the pound on the shire assessment. Minimum, as fixed by the Governor in Council, Twenty shillings.

(2) For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(4) Any person who may or shall obtain water, or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water shall be supplied by measurement shall be:—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

(3) Such rate is hereby made for the year 1898, commencing from the 1st January, as also the charges for every steam boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on 1st July, 1898.

(4) All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on 1st January, 1898, and 1st July, 1898.

(5) Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

By-LAW No. 7.

By-law regulating the construction and use of Sewers and Drains and Household Fittings and Appliances connected therewith, within the area under the control of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works.

WHEREAS the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (hereinafter called "the Board") in exercise of the powers vested in it by the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890*, did, on the 11th day of December, 1894, make and pass a By-law, numbered 5, and intitled "Regulations for the construction and use of Sewers and Drains within the area under the control of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works." And whereas it is expedient that the said by-law should be amended and altered. Now therefore the Board, in further exercise of the powers vested in it by the Act aforesaid, and the Acts amending the same, and which together are hereinafter called "The Act," doth hereby enact and order as follows:—

1. From and after the date of this by-law coming into operation, the hereinbefore recited By-law No. 5 shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following shall be the Regulations for the construction and use of sewers and drains within the area under the control of the Board, provided that such repeal shall not affect any licence issued or thing authorized and commenced to be done under the provisions of the said by-law.

2. All connexions of plumbing work, drains, or sewers with the sewers of the Board, and all work connected in any way with the drainage of any premises, shall be executed in accordance with these Rules and Regulations.

CONSTRUCTION OF DRAINS.

3. All drains within the boundaries of the properties, and up to and including the boundary trap, whether inside or outside the properties, must be constructed, maintained, repaired, and cleaned by or at the cost of the owners. Washings from paved yards will only be admitted as hereinafter provided. Under no circumstances will washings from unpaved yards be admitted to the sewers.

All the works of sewerage and drainage must be carried out in accordance with the provisions of Part III. of the Act, or any existing modification thereof.

In case of any obstruction taking place in a combined drain draining two or more premises, the Board will determine between the respective owners of the premises so drained, by whom and in what proportion the cost of removing any such obstruction shall be paid.

Every person who, by a notice from the Board, issued in accordance with the Act, shall be required to do or not to do anything, including, therefore, a requirement to make any sewer or drain, or branches, works, or arrangements for the better sewerage or draining of his house, building, or ground, and who fails to comply with such notice, will, under the provisions of section 165 of the Act, become guilty of an offence against the Act, and for every such offence he will be liable, unless other penalty be prescribed, besides any costs or expenses which may be incurred in taking proceedings against him, as well as any costs or expenses which may be incurred in remedying any default of his, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than One pound, for each day during which such offence is continued by him, and such penalty will be recoverable, notwithstanding that the Board may not have chosen to exercise any power given to it by the Act to remedy such default.

With a view to obviate the incurring of liability to such penalties, and to insure uniformity and efficiency of work by reason of its being done by skilled and experienced workmen, supervised by the Board's inspectors, and for economy, because of the cheaper price at which fittings and apparatus can be obtained under contracts for large quantities thereof by the Board, the Board will, in exercise of its powers and duties, contract and agree with the owners of houses, buildings, or ground to perform any work which may be required to be done by any notice issued by the Board to any owner, on terms hereinafter stated. The owner of each and every property which, or any part of which, abuts on any street or part of a street in which a sewer has been laid, if there be any houses or buildings on such property, shall, within such time as shall be specified in the further general notice which the Board shall have caused to be served upon him, or within such further time as the Board may allow, provide such proper water-closet or water-closets, drains, appliances, apparatus, and connexions with such sewer of the Board as are then prescribed by Regulations of the Board.

Within one month after the date specified in the said further general notice, or within such further time as the Board may, either before or after the expiration of one month allow, every such owner shall—

- (a) submit for the approval of the Board a plan for providing such property with such water-closet or water-closets, and such drains, appliances, apparatus, and connexions, fitted and laid in such manner as may be prescribed by the Regulations of the Board or any modification thereof which the Engineer-in-Chief of the Board, on written application made to him, shall, in writing under his hand, approve, and such owner shall, in writing, undertake to carry out such plan within one month or such further time as the Board may in writing allow if the same is approved by the Board; or
- (b) submit for the approval of the Board a plan as aforesaid, and in writing request the Board, if it approves thereof, to give an estimate of the cost and expense thereof, and thereupon the Board will do so; or in writing request the Board to prepare a plan as aforesaid, and give an estimate of the cost and expense thereof, and

thereupon the Board will do so. As soon as the Board gives such estimate such owner shall in writing undertake to carry out such plan within one month, or such further time as the Board may allow, or shall in writing request the Board to carry out the same at the cost and expense of the said owner for the estimated amount, and thereupon the Board will do so.

If within such one month or such further time any such owner has not complied with any of the foregoing requirements, or if, after undertaking so to do, any such owner has not within the limited time provided such water-closet or water-closets and such drains, appliances, apparatus, and connexions as aforesaid, then the Board may order such owner to comply with such of the requirements of the said further general notice as it deems to be necessary, or may carry out such undertaking (as the case may be), and such order shall be deemed to be an order within the meaning of section 110 of the Principal Act, namely, the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890*.

In the event of the Board carrying out the work of providing such water-closet or water-closets and such drains, appliances, apparatus, and connexions, the Board will, at its own cost and expense, keep and maintain the same in good repair for a period of twelve months from the time of completing the said work, unless the necessity for such repair is caused by the wilful act or negligence of the owner or occupier.

The Board, by its Engineer-in-Chief or such other officer as the Board may appoint for the purpose, may at any reasonable time in the day-time, after 24 hours' notice in writing has been given to the occupier or left upon the premises with some person residing therein, or, in case there be no person resident on the said premises, without notice enter any house or building, and ascertain and determine whether any such further general notice has or has not been complied with.

The Board may cause the works hereinbefore mentioned to be inspected while in progress, and from time to time during their execution the Engineer-in-Chief of the Board, or such other officer as the Board may appoint for the purpose, may in writing order such reasonable alterations therein or additions thereto as to the said Engineer-in-Chief or other officer may seem necessary.

In all cases in which the Board provides any water-closet or water-closets or drains, appliances, apparatus, and connexions, pursuant to the requirement of any owner as hereinafter provided, or performs any work, matters, or things under section 110 of the Principal Act, namely, the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890*, or under section 5 of the said *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1897*, the cost and expenses thereof, with interest, as prescribed in section 116 of the said Principal Act, shall be recoverable after the expiration of one month from the time that the Engineer-in-Chief of the Board, or such other officer as the Board may appoint for the purpose, certifies in writing to the Board that the same have been provided or performed, and the amount of the costs and expenses thereof.

Until paid such costs, expenses, and interest shall be and remain a charge upon the property in respect to which they were incurred, and may, at the expiration of seven days after demand, in writing, therefor be recovered at any time from the owner thereof for the time being.

At the request of the owner, the Board will accept payment of such costs and expenses by 40 quarterly instalments, bearing interest on such portion as from time to time remains unpaid at the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum.

Such request must be made in writing and signed by the owner, and must be lodged with the Board within one month from the time of such owner being notified, in writing, by the Board, of the amount of such costs and expenses. The first quarterly instalment shall be payable immediately on the expiration of the said month. But the said owner may at any time pay to the Board such portion as then remains unpaid of such costs and expenses, together with interest thereon, at the said rate, to the date of such payment.

In the event of any of the instalments or interest not being paid within fourteen days after the due date thereof, the whole amount then unpaid of the costs and expenses shall, if the Board so desires, become due, payable, and recoverable, with interest at the rate of Five pounds per centum per annum, and as prescribed by section 116 of the said Principal Act.

Payment of any instalment and interest may be recovered in the like manner as is provided by section one hundred and sixty-two of the said Principal Act for the recovery of damages, costs, expenses, or penalties.

The certificate of the Engineer-in-Chief, or such other officer as aforesaid, in writing, shall be *prima facie* evidence in any court that the water-closet, or water-closets or drains, appliances, apparatus, and connexions have been provided, or the works, matters, or things have been performed (as the case may be), and *prima facie* evidence as to the amount of costs, expenses, and interest recoverable in respect thereof.

CONSENTS.

4. Application for the Board's consent to connect with the sewerage system, or to do plumbing work connected therewith, must be made in writing by the owner of the property to be drained, or his authorized agent. Such application shall give the precise location of the property, the name of the owner, and the name of the person employed to do the work, and shall be made in Form "A" hereto attached, or to the like effect. No consent shall be deemed to authorize anything not stated in the application, and for any wilful misrepresentation in such application the owner or authorized agent as aforesaid shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty under these regulations.

Consents to make connexions with the sewerage system will be issued only when the plumbing in the property to be connected is in accordance with the rules for plumbing, hereinafter prescribed, and has been inspected and approved of by an inspector of plumbing appointed by the Board for the purpose, or, in case of new buildings, when a proper plan of the plumbing has been approved of in writing by the Board, which shall define the

position of the Y branch in the sewer to which the work must be connected. All connexions with the drains or sewers, and all plumbing connected therewith, shall be made under the direction of the Engineer-in-Chief or other superintending officer of the Board.

No person shall be engaged or employed as a workman in the actual performance of any plumbing work unless he is the holder of a "Working Plumber's Licence" from the Board.

The conditions upon which "Working Plumbers' Licences" will be issued by the Board are:—

1. That every such licence will be subject to suspension or cancellation at the will of the Board; and that all such licences will be granted to expire on the 30th day of June of each year.
2. A special condition of every consent issued to an owner shall be that if a licensed plumber, in his employment upon any such work, prove according to the judgment of the Board's inspecting officer to be incapable as a workman, or transgress the regulations of the Board, and the "Working Plumber's Licence" of such workman be for any such cause suspended or cancelled by the Board, and notice of such suspension or cancellation, in the Form "B" to this by-law annexed, or to the like effect, be given by the Board in writing, by registered letter addressed to the said owner or agent, the said owner or agent shall cease to employ such workman upon any such work immediately after and during the continuance of such suspension or cancellation. Any such owner or agent who shall neglect or fail to comply with this condition shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and to a continuing penalty of not more than Two pounds nor less than One pound for every day during which such neglect or failure shall continue after service of the hereinbefore mentioned notice upon such owner or agent.
3. First-class "Working Plumbers' Licences" will be issued to candidates who shall have successfully passed an examination by examiners appointed by the Board in the following subjects, that is to say:—

MATERIALS.—The use of lead, tin, copper, and their alloys, wrought and cast iron, stoneware, bricks, tiles, Portland cement, and other materials used by the plumber and drainer.

PLUMBING PRACTICE.—As to solder and soldering, lead burning, lead laying, pipe and joint making, pipe bending, and general plumbers' practice.

WATER SUPPLY WORK.—Knowledge of the Board's Water Supply By-laws, general water supply work, water supply fittings, hot water connexions.

SEWERAGE WORK.—Knowledge of the Board's Sewerage Regulations, construction and use of traps, soil waste and vent pipes, house fittings, water-closets, kitchen sinks, baths, lavatories, housemaids' sinks, urinals, latrines, and other sewerage apparatus and appliances.

GENERAL PRINCIPLES OF SANITARY WORK.—Flushing, ventilation, disconnection.

Candidates for examination in plumbing practice must provide themselves with their own tools, and must submit samples of work done by themselves, and also make any pipe, bend, joint, or other plumbing appliance which may be required to satisfy the examiners.

Candidates for "Working Plumbers' Licences" must give notice, in writing, to the Secretary of the Board of their intention to submit themselves to examination at such time as shall be appointed for the same by the Board's examiners.

Every candidate who shall have successfully passed the before-mentioned examination, and given proof to the satisfaction of the examiners of practical ability as a plumber, will be furnished with a first-class licence from the Board to do practical work as a working plumber upon and in connexion with the sewers, drains, and all necessary fittings, appliances, and apparatus appurtenant thereto within the metropolis, subject to and in accordance with the Board's regulations. And he will likewise be furnished with a certificate from the Board that he is duly qualified to do work in connexion with the water supply and sewerage systems under the control of the Board, and in accordance with the Board's regulations.

Every candidate who shall have successfully passed the examination in plumbing practice only, will be furnished with a second-class licence.

"Working Plumbers' Licences" will, at the discretion of the Board, be issued without previous examination to any practical plumber who shall be the holder of and shall produce a licence from any other sewerage or water supply authority equal in value to the standard established by the Board's examination according to the judgment of the Board's examiners, which shall be final, subject only to review by the Board.

Prior to the issue of any "Working Plumber's Licence," the person to whom the same is to be issued must sign a register containing a declaration that he accepts such licence subject to and in conformity with the conditions thereof and with the regulations of the Board, and that he will conform to and comply therewith.

PLANS OF DRAINAGE.

5. Plans will be furnished by the Board upon application and payment for the same, as follows:—

Plan of drainage, including survey, &c., for every house	5s. 0d.
Plan of any alterations or addition	2s. 6d.
Copy of drainage plan	2s. 6d.

INSPECTION.

6. The owner or his authorized agent must give notice to the Board when any work is ready for inspection, and all work must be left uncovered and convenient for examination until inspected and approved of by an inspector appointed by the Board. Such inspection shall be made within 48 hours of such notification being received at the office of the Board, except on Saturday, when 72 hours must be allowed. The inspecting officer may apply the ether, peppermint, water, or smoke test, and the plumber shall furnish all the necessary tools, labour, and assistance for such tests. The owner or his authorized agent shall remove or repair any defective material or labour when so ordered by the inspecting officer.

Any drain-pipe, soil-pipe, trap, water-closet, urinal, sink, or other fitting laid, used, or constructed otherwise than in accordance with these regulations, or which shall, in the opinion of the Board, be or become of bad or defective quality, shall, upon notice in writing from the Board, be removed or repaired in the manner determined and within the time fixed by the Board; and the Board will, if it think fit, remove or repair the said defective fitting, and charge the owner or occupier of the premises with the cost incurred.

STATEMENT OF WORK DONE.

7. The owner or his authorized agent shall, on the completion of the work, file in the office of the Board, on forms furnished for the purpose, a correct statement of the work done under the consent furnished for the same.

INJURY TO SEWERS.

8. No municipal council, corporation, firm, or person shall interfere with, break up, or remove any gully, ventilating shaft, man-hole, lamp-hole, flush-tank, catch-basin, or any part of the sewerage system, except by a special permit in writing of the Board, or throw or deposit, or cause to be thrown or deposited, in any drain or sewer, opening or receptacle connected with the sewerage system, any garbage, offal, dead animals, vegetable parings, ashes, cinders, rags, or any other matter or thing which in the opinion of the Board may injuriously affect the sewers or sewerage machinery.

SUB-SOIL DRAINAGE.

9. Every person who shall erect a new building shall cause the sub-soil of the site of such building to be effectually drained by means of suitable earthenware pipes properly laid to a suitable outfall, whenever the dampness of the site renders such a precaution necessary in the opinion of the Board.

No such pipes shall be laid in such a manner or in such a position as to connect directly with any drain or sewer, but shall discharge into an open shaft made of earthenware pipes, and fitted with a dirt box which shall communicate with the sewer by a proper trap with a ventilating pipe on the sewer side.

CELLAR DRAINAGE.

10. Where any house heretofore built shall have its lowest floor at a lower level than the sewer of the Board into which such house would otherwise drain, pending pulling down or alteration of such house, the owner shall cause the drainage from such lowest floor to be raised by means of a siphon, or some automatic method approved by the Board, so that it shall discharge into a drain communicating with the sewer of the Board. The water-seal of the trap in the drain-pipe leading from the cellar shall be constantly maintained by means of an automatic flushing cistern.

PLUMBING RULES.—GENERAL.

11. All materials used must be of good quality and free from all defects. The work must be executed in a thorough and workman-like manner, and to the satisfaction of the Board.

The drain outside of the house or building, or from isolated water-closets, to the street sewer, shall be of first quality salt-glazed vitrified, stoneware pipes, unless laid less than 2 feet deep from the surface to the centre line of the pipe in yards or places liable to heavy traffic, when it shall be of heavy cast or wrought iron. Heavy cast-iron pipes must be used if the ground has been made up or filled in, or adjoins a cellar.

PIPES.

12. All drain pipes are to be at least 4 inches in diameter, except where otherwise ordered by the Board, and they must be taken to one of the Board's store-yards, unless obtained from there, to be tested by the officer appointed by the Board in the machines provided for the purpose.

All cast-iron pipes must be sound, free from holes or cracks, and coated with tar or asphaltum.

The following weights will be accepted as standards:—

2 inch diameter	... 5½ lbs. per lineal foot
3 " "	... 9½ " "
4 " "	... 13 " "
5 " "	... 17 " "
6 " "	... 20 " "

All wrought-iron pipes must be of approved standard weight and quality, and galvanized or coated to the satisfaction of the Board.

All fittings used in connexion with such pipes shall correspond with them in weight and quality. All junctions must be curved; right-angled junctions must not be made. Where lead pipe is

used for waste or vent pipes, such pipes must not be lighter than of 6-lb. lead, but, where, in the opinion of the Board, a heavier weight may be required, its instructions shall be complied with.

The arrangements of soil and waste pipes must be as direct as possible.

The drain pipes shall be laid on an even grade of not less than 1 in 40 if a four-inch (4-in.) pipe be used, or of 1 in 60 if a six-inch (6-in.) pipe be used, unless by special permission of the Board, in which case special provision must be made for regular and efficient flushing. As far as possible, all drains shall be laid in straight lines; where changes of direction occur, they shall be made either by suitably curved pipes or in man-holes.

The following are the minimum sizes of soil, waste, and vent pipes, and weights of lead, soil, waste, and vent pipes to be used throughout, unless otherwise specially ordered by the superintending officer:—

Twenty-two gauge galvanized iron must be the minimum for all outside vents, and for wastes outside of buildings except soil pipes, urinals, and slop sinks.

Vent pipes must not be less than two-thirds (⅔) the diameter of the waste they ventilate, and no vent pipe is to be less than sizes given above.

External vent pipes of galvanized iron are to be of not less gauge than the following:—

1½ in., 2 in., and 2½ in. diameter	... 22 gauge galvanized iron.
3 in. and 4 in. diameter	... 20 " " "
6 in. diameter	... 18 " " "

PIPE TRENCHES.

13. The trenches for the drains from all properties shall be dug so as to meet the public sewers at the position of the Y branches indicated by the Board. The material thrown from the trench shall be placed so as not to obstruct, and so as to cause the least inconvenience to the public. Proper barriers and lights must be maintained on the banks of the trench to guard the public against accident during the progress of the work. In refilling the trench the earth shall be carefully rammed or flooded, so as to keep the pipe in position and avoid settling. No stone shall be used in refilling until there has been a depth of at least two feet (2 feet) of earth or gravel placed over the pipe.

PIPE LAYING.

14. The cover of the Y branch on the sewer shall be carefully removed so as not to injure the socket.

The first length of the pipe attached to the Y branch shall be curved and set so as to give a good fall into the sewer.

The joints of the stoneware pipes shall be made with Stamford joints, or cement joints with gaskets.

Joints of iron pipes shall be made with gasket and lead if cast-iron pipes are used, or screwed joints, with white lead, if wrought iron be used.

The ends of all private drains not immediately connected with the plumbing fixtures shall be securely closed with water-tight imperishable materials. If lead pipe, the end must be soldered; if wrought-iron pipe, a plug must be screwed on the end; if cast-iron pipe, a cast-iron plug must be caulked in the solid ground.

All pipes shall be carefully bedded in the solid ground. Where, in the opinion of the Board, the ground is not sufficiently solid, cast-iron pipes must be used or stoneware pipes bedded in concrete composed of one of Portland cement, two of clean sand, and five of stone of one and a half inch (1½-in.) gauge or gravel approved by the inspector.

Where there is a sewer in the street or right-of-right adjoining, every property must be separately and independently connected with it, unless a combined drain be ordered by the Board.

Whenever possible, such connexion must be made directly at the rear of, or in the front of, the house.

Where there is no sewer in the street, or it is necessary to construct a private drain to connect either one or several properties with a sewer in an adjoining street, the drain must be laid under the roadway or right-of-way, and not through the yards or under the houses if possible to avoid it.

Subsoil drains shall be of earthenware field pipes.

CESPOOLS, OVERFLOWS.

15. No cesspool overflow, or privy-vault shall be connected with any drain or sewer.

DRAINS, SOIL AND WASTE PIPES.

16. At the head of every connecting drain, at or near the boundary of the premises or building, a boundary trap must be fixed, with or without a manhole. All the drains must, wherever considered necessary by the Board, join in a manhole at least three feet (3 feet) long and two feet (2 feet) wide, fitted with a closed cover if for inspection purposes only, and with an open grating if for ventilation purposes. The portions of the drains crossing the floor of the manhole must be connected with the boundary trap, either in a straight line or by curved junctions in the floor of the manhole. The boundary trap must be provided with a seal two and a half inches (2½ inches) deep, and an inspection cap on the sewer side of the trap.

All soil pipes shall be at least four inches (4 inches) diameter. The soil and waste pipes and traps must, where practicable, be exposed to view at all times where necessary for ready inspection and for convenience of repairing. When unavoidably placed within partitions or recesses of walls, soil and waste pipes must be covered with woodwork so fastened with screws as to be readily removed.

No soil or waste pipe shall be fixed within any building or tenement unless the special authority of the Board has been previously obtained.

No material shall be used within the building for soil or waste pipes other than wrought or cast iron pipes with securely screwed or leaded joints, or lead pipes with wiped joints. Cement or putty joints, or tin or sheet-iron pipes, whether galvanized or not, shall not be used.

In all cases the upward extension from the soil pipe for ventilation must pass in as direct a manner as possible above, and if necessary through, the roof.

Wastes from disconnected fittings (except urinals and slop sinks) need not be ventilated unless they exceed 12 feet inclined, or 18 feet vertical, in length (or their equivalent), and branch wastes to such fittings, if connected with a ventilated main waste, may be 12 feet in length without being ventilated, unless syphonage occurs in a trap, in which case air must be supplied to the waste of that trap. Trap ventilation shall not be required to such fittings unless syphonage occurs after the waste is vented. Waste and soil pipes must have an approved fall.

Where an open grating is inadvisable, the manhole must be provided with a closed cover if for inspection purposes only, and with an open grating if for ventilation purposes, with a fresh-air inlet, fitted with a mica flap valve, and the manhole must be fitted with an iron air-tight cover. A ventilation pipe of such size and materials and so placed as the Board may desire shall be provided and fixed wherever considered necessary.

Separate internal wastes shall be provided for each of the following classes of polluted waters, viz:—

1. Dirty water from baths, pantry and china closet sinks, lavatories, and wash troughs, and other waters with a small proportion of soap and dirt.
2. Greasy water from kitchen and scullery sinks, where grease traps are required.
3. Sludge water from manufactures, stables, cow-houses, cab-stands, and other specially polluted surfaces for which consents have been granted by the Board.
4. Soil water from closets, and other water containing faecal matter, and urinal water from housemaids' slop sinks, public and private urinals.

Each one of these separate waste pipes, except for soil water, must be connected with the drains through a gully or disconnector trap.

A main waste pipe, into which lavatories, baths, or kitchen sinks discharge, must be at least two inches (2 inches) in diameter, with at least one and a half inch (1½-in.) branches, except for single lavatories and urinals, which may be one and a quarter inch (1¼-in.)

Wastes in outhouses entirely disconnected from living rooms and kitchens, may be of 22 gauge galvanized iron for baths and wash-troughs.

JOINTS.

17. All joints in iron drain pipes, soil pipes, and waste pipes, except where screw joints are used, must be so filled with gasket and lead and caulked as to make them gas tight.

All connexions of lead pipes with iron pipes must be made with a brass sleeve or ferrule of the same size as the lead pipe put in the socket of the branch of the iron pipe and caulked with lead.

The lead pipe must be attached to the ferrule by a wiped joint.

All connexions of lead waste and vent pipes shall be made by means of wiped joints.

INSPECTION OF FIXTURES.

18. Before the fixtures are placed in connexion with the plumbing of any house or building, and before the soil pipe is connected with the sewer, the outlet of the soil pipe and all openings into it below the top shall be hermetically sealed; the pipe shall then be filled with water to such height as the Superintending Officer of the Board shall require, and every joint carefully examined for leaks. Work already in place will be examined by the peppermint or other test. Defective pipes must be removed and replaced by sound ones, and all defective joints made tight, and every part of the work made to conform to these Rules and Regulations, and subject to the approval of an inspector of plumbing appointed by the Board.

TRAPS.

19. Every water-closet, urinal, lavatory, slop sink, kitchen sink, bath, and every tub or set of tubs must be separately and effectively trapped, unless otherwise specially allowed by the Engineer-in-Chief.

Traps must be placed as near the fixtures as possible, and in no case shall a trap be more than two feet (2 feet) from a fixture, unless specially allowed by the Engineer-in-Chief. All lead traps must be drawn.

Traps of three (3) classes will be used—

- (a) "Traps," for intercepting gases only, to be of round section and self-cleaning form, but not so easy as to empty by momentum or suction.
- (b) "Silt traps," for intercepting both gases and solids, to have slightly tapered sides, flat bottoms, and rounded (not sharp) angles, and provided with trays fitted with handles for catching and removing solids.
- (c) "Grease traps," for solidifying and collecting grease or other semi-fluid matter liable to foul the pipes, must be of such form as may from time to time be approved.

The term "gully" will be applied to traps (a) and (b) in cases where they are to be used externally, and fitted with dished tops and gratings. In such cases the dish must be in one piece with the trap, or jointed thereto spigot and faucet, and the depth of the dish from the top to the grating must not be less than half the diameter of the pipe, and the grating must be removable.

The term "disconnector" will be applied to traps in cases where provision has to be made for inlet ventilation to the pipe or pipes discharging therein.

All traps must have a water-seal of at least half the diameter of the outlet pipe, but in no case less than two and a half inches (2½ inches).

The P form of traps, with wastes above the floor, and joints visible and accessible all round, must be used in all internal fittings where possible.

The S form of trap or waste under floors must not be used, except with special permission and facilities for periodical inspection.

In detached closets and urinals, approved S forms in earthenware, with joints visible and accessible all round, may be used.

Sinks in all food-packing houses, butchers' shops, lard-rendering establishments, hotels, restaurants, boarding houses, and laundries, or wherever ordered by the Board, shall be provided with suitable approved grease traps. Wash-rooms for carriages must have silt traps provided with proper means of intercepting mud.

Stables, dairies, cab-stands, markets, &c., and paved backyards for which drainage consents have been granted, must be provided with suitable approved silt traps.

VENT PIPES.

20. Every vent pipe extending upwards from a soil pipe must extend to such a height as may be deemed necessary by the Board, at least two feet (2 feet) above the highest part of the roof or coping. Disconnected bath, sink, and lavatory vents need not extend more than 2 feet above the eaves unless otherwise ordered by the Engineer-in-Chief. Every vent pipe must be of undiminished size without return bend, with basket end or educt or induc cowls as ordered, and it must not open near a window, a chimney, nor an air shaft which ventilates living rooms.

All vent pipes, in an extension of a main building, must be extended to such a height as may be deemed necessary by the Board, above the roof of the main building, when otherwise they would open within thirty feet (30 feet) of the windows of the main house or of the adjoining house.

The main drain leading to the boundary trap is to be vented at its upper end by a pipe or shaft erected vertically to such a height that the mouth of the pipe or shaft shall be at least six feet (6 feet) higher than any window or door situated within a distance of thirty feet (30 feet) therefrom. Branch drains need not be vented if the gully traps are within less than fifteen feet (15 feet) from the main drain, or unless otherwise ordered by the Board, and then must be vented according to such order. If the drains cannot be vented at the upper end, the system must be reversed.

Traps must be prevented from syphonage, or the waste pipe leading from them be ventilated by a special pipe taken from such a position that the vent pipe entrance will not be fouled by the discharge of the trap.

The vents must not be less than two inches (2 inches) for water-closets, and in other cases not less than two-thirds of the diameter of the pipe they ventilate. The combined vertical vent pipes for traps of water-closets in buildings must be at least three inches (3 inches) in diameter, with branches two inches (2 inches) in diameter to each trap, and for traps of other fixtures not less than two inches (2 inches) in diameter unless the trap is smaller, in which case the diameter of the branch vent pipe must be at least equal to two-thirds of the diameter of the trap.

In all cases vent pipes must be of cast or wrought iron or lead inside a building; dipped and folded galvanized iron vent pipes may be used where they are entirely outside a building, and shall be connected with the traps with brass or lead ferrules, or other joints approved by the Engineer-in-Chief.

The various vent pipes may be branched into a soil or waste pipe of the same class above the inlet from the highest fixture. They may be combined by branching together those which serve several traps of the same class.

These vent pipes must always have a continuous slope, to avoid collecting water by condensation.

No vent pipe shall be used as a waste or soil pipe.

No brick, earthenware, or house chimney flue shall be used as a sewer ventilator, nor to ventilate any drain, soil, or waste pipe.

All inlets to drains or openings for ventilating shall be efficiently protected by proper gratings of ample area. The aggregate area of the apertures in any grating covering a ventilation opening shall not be less than the sectional area of the pipe or drain to which such grating is fixed. All openings for ventilation made in accordance with these regulations, or by order of the Board, shall at all times be kept open and perfectly free from obstruction.

SAFES, OVERFLOWS, ETC.

21. Unless where otherwise allowed by the Engineer-in-Chief, every lead safe under a water-closet, urinal, lavatory, bath, refrigerator, sink, or other fixture, must be drained by a special pipe not directly connected with any waste pipe, soil pipe, drain, or sewer unless it be trapped and ventilated. They must be provided at the outlet into the open air with flap valves of brass or other approved metal.

No steam exhaust, blow-off, or drip pipe shall be connected with a drain or sewer, or with any soil or waste pipe. Such pipes must discharge into the rain-water channels.

RAIN-WATER AND PAVING YARDS.

22. Rain-water conductors must not be connected with the sewers. All stables, dairies, paved yards, market places, cab-stands, or other places for which the Board may from time to time grant consent to be connected with the sewers or drains, must be properly graded, cemented, asphalted, flagged, or well paved, and properly drained, and must be trapped with an approved gully silt trap, connected with the drain inside the boundary trap.

WATER-CLOSETS.

23. Every water-closet in a building shall, where practicable, be constructed in such a position that one of its sides at least shall be an external wall. Every water-closet, that is, every closet consisting of a single soil pan or not more than two soil pans, constructed within a building, shall have in a wall of such water-closet a window or other opening of not less dimensions than are equal to an area of 18 inches x 12 inches, exclusive of frame, and, where practicable, opening directly into the external air.

Such water-closet must be provided with adequate means of constant ventilation by at least one air-brick built in an external wall of such water-closet, or by an air-shaft, or by some other effectual method or appliance for ventilation.

Every soil pan shall be furnished with a separate flushing cistern of at least 3 gallons capacity, which shall be so constructed, fitted, and placed as to admit of the supply of water for use in such soil pan, without any direct communication with any service-pipe upon the premises. A suitable apparatus must be provided for the effectual application of water to the basin of the water-closet, and for the effectual flushing and cleansing of such basin, and for the prompt and effective removal therefrom of any solid or liquid filth which may from time to time be deposited therein. Such water-closet shall be furnished with a basin of non-absorbent material of such shape, capacity, and mode of construction as to receive and contain a sufficient quantity of water, and to allow all filth which may from time to time be deposited in such basin to fall free of the sides thereof and directly into the water received and contained in the basin.

Latrines, where they are allowed by the Engineer-in-Chief, or a group of soil pans, may, by special permission, be supplied from one flushing tank of approved size; but soil pans on different floors must not be flushed from one tank. In houses occupied by different tenants in separate rooms, or suites of rooms, there must be a separate cistern to each soil pan. In no case will water-closet accommodation be allowed in the cellar or basement, except by permission of the Engineer-in-Chief. Water-closets of the description known as "pan-closets" are absolutely prohibited. At any time after the date fixed by notice from the Board to the owner of any house, building, or ground, requiring him to connect the same with any sewer of the Board, or after such further time as shall be allowed by the Board for the purpose of such connection, no privy-closet, other than a water-closet approved by the Board, shall be used in such house or building, or upon such ground.

The soil pan and fittings thereto must be entirely open to inspection, and with no enclosures.

STRAINERS.

24. The entrance to exit pipes to all fixtures except water-closets shall be furnished with suitable permanently attached strainers.

URINALS.

25. Internal cradle urinals must be small, free from projecting ornament, and of non-absorbent material. The waste-pipe shall be of pottery-ware, lead, or glass-enamelled cast iron, and, after being trapped, if necessary, must deliver out into the open air over a gully trap, or into a disconnector trap, keeping the waste-pipe as short and free from bends as possible. The urinal must be provided with approved flushing apparatus. The floor under urinals must be covered with non-absorbent material.

In hotels, clubs, restaurants, theatres, and other public places, enamelled slate or other approved water troughs shall be provided, either raised above the floor or sunk in an impervious floor under the range of urinals, and kept full of flowing water by approved flushing apparatus. The floors of the urinals must be tiled or paved, with a fall towards a drain against the wall or under the trough. The walls behind and screens between urinals must be of non-absorbent material, and of approved height; the screens must also be free from the floor for a portion of the width of the divisions. They must project at least one foot and a half, and be not less than 2 feet apart. Other forms of urinals will only be allowed if specially approved of by the Engineer-in-Chief.

HOUSEMAIDS' SLOP SINKS.

26. The waste pipe from a slop sink must be carried independently out to the open air, with a quick fall, and into a full-bore ventilated two and a half inch (2½-in.) down pipe to the ground, where a gully trap or disconnector trap must take the waste to the drain, or into a soil pipe and the sink must be trapped with two and a half inch (2½-in.) trap, having a two and a half inch (2½-in.) seal and a brass cleaning screw under the

water line, well opened out into a deep cone to receive the sink-basin. The trap must be fitted with a one and a half inch (1½ in.) vent pipe. The sink must be of approved material. Draw-off taps must not be used directly over slop sinks, unless at least two feet (2 feet) above the sink. Slop sinks must be provided with approved flushing arrangements.

KITCHEN AND SCULLERY SINKS OR TROUGHS.

27. Unless where otherwise specially approved, kitchen and scullery sinks and troughs must discharge into the open air over a gully trap, or into a disconnector trap. The trap and waste pipes must be not less than one and a half inches (1½ inches) in diameter.

The brass strainer must be sunk in a hollow cone to the level of the trough.

BATHS AND LAVATORIES.

28. The waste pipe from a bath or set of lavatories must be at least one and a half inches (1½ in.) diameter, trapped with a deep syphon trap, with a cleansing screw provided with a one and a quarter inch (1¼ in.) vent pipe. The waste pipe must be carried separately to the open air, and delivered over a gully trap, or into a disconnector trap.

The waste pipe and trap from single lavatories newly placed must be at least one inch and a quarter (1¼ in.) in diameter, but the area of the grating must be sufficient for the water to effectually scour the waste pipe. The waste pipe must be as short as possible, and discharge over a gully trap or into a disconnector trap.

EXISTING FITTINGS.

29. Existing fittings and appliances which, in the opinion, of the Engineer-in-Chief shall be inoffensive and which the owner may desire to retain unaltered may by the consent of the Board remain unaltered until the Board shall otherwise order.

CONSENT, SANCTION, ETC., OF THE BOARD.

30. Where the sanction, permission, authority consent, approval, satisfaction, order, direction, opinion, indication, or notice of or from the Board is necessary, whether special, in writing, or otherwise, with regard to any act, matter, or thing mentioned in this by-law, the same may be given by and under the hand of the Chairman of the Board, or of the Engineer-in-Chief, personally or through an Inspecting Officer appointed under him, who severally shall be competent to give the same and on behalf of the Board to prescribe any conditions attaching thereto, and subject to and in accordance with which only the same shall be deemed to have been given. The giver of the same shall notify his having done so at the next following meeting of the Sewerage Committee of the Board, with a view to report thereof to the Board where necessary.

PENALTY.

31. Any person offending against any provision of this by-law, for violation of which no special penalty is hereinbefore prescribed, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

Such boundaries as hereby varied are shown by red lines on plan marked "A" attached to Corr. M.1863, and deposited in the Office of the Department of Crown Lands and Survey, Melbourne.

WARRACKNABEAL VERMIN DISTRICT.

The boundaries of the Warracknabeal Vermin District are varied by adding to such district mallee allotments 1 to 68, county of Weeah; 51A to 84, 85D, 86A, 87 to 212, 1000 to 1035, county of Karkaroo; and agricultural allotments 1 and 2, parish of Pullat, county of Karkaroo; and any subdivisions of such allotments.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PUBLIC PARK, KNOWN AS QUEEN'S PARK, IN THE TOWN OF COLERAINE.

THE Council of the Shire of Wannon, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the public park, known as Queen's Park, in the town of Coleraine, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:-

REGULATIONS.

1. The park shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset.
2. No person shall enter or remain in the park who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
3. No person shall cut, damage, or otherwise injure in any way any fences, gates, trees, shrubs, or flowers, in the park, nor shall any fires be lighted therein without the written consent of the Council.
4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates of the park, or stick bills or notices on the posts, rails, or seats, or cut names on the fences, gates, trees, or seats, or throw stones in the park.
5. No person shall put or graze in the park or any part thereof any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Council.
6. No person shall bring any dog into the park. All dogs, pigs, goats, fowls, geese, or turkeys found in the park shall be liable to be destroyed, and all cattle, sheep, horses, or other animals trespassing or found without proper authority within the park shall be liable to be impounded.
7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the park, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any

article, without the consent, in writing, of the Council first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the park, shall enter any part thereof which may be specially enclosed for the growth of seedling trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

SHIRE OF BALLARAT.

By-Law No. XIV.

A By-law of the Shire of Ballarat made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, as amended by section 46 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, and numbered 14, for Regulating the Traffic and the Hours during which and the conditions on which Traction and Locomotive Engines and Rollers impelled by steam or electricity may proceed over the roads within the shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890* and 1891, the president, councillors, and ratepayers of the shire of Ballarat order as follows:—

1. No traction engine shall travel within the shire boundaries without having the true name and full address of the owner painted on such engine in a conspicuous place, and so that the word "owner" shall appear between the name and address.
 2. No traction engine shall travel over any road within the shire after dark, or before daylight, unless such engine shall be preceded by some person by at least 100 yards, which person shall carry a lamp, and shall give notice that such engine is travelling on such road to the president, councillor, or secretary.
 3. No traction engine shall travel on any road within the shire with badly-packed stuffing-boxes or leaky valves, or otherwise in bad order, and the driver shall not permit steam to be blown off unless through accident to the engine or unavoidable circumstances which necessitate the stoppage of such engine.
 4. No traction engine shall travel on a road within the shire with less than two men engaged thereon, one of whom shall be the driver and in charge of such engine, and the other of whom shall steer such engine, and render assistance to horses and vehicles passing when necessary.
 5. The person in charge of any traction engine shall stop such engine, or, where practicable, take or move such engine to one side of the road, upon which such engine shall be travelling, when called upon to do so by persons travelling thereon on horseback, or with vehicles or otherwise, where horses are frightened, except in the following places, namely:—
 - (a) Where the engine at such time or times is in such a position as to have the front wheels much lower than the hind wheels.
 - (b) Where the man in charge would be endangering the engine boiler by so doing.
 - (c) When such engine shall be crossing a bridge.
 - (d) When such engine is proceeding up a steep hill.
 - (e) Where the person in charge would not be able, if he then stopped, to start such engine again; and in all such places the person in charge shall send his assistant to and such assistant shall render all such help as may then be required to persons, horses, and vehicles then passing and travelling.
 6. The person in charge of any traction engine shall forthwith fill up or cause to be filled up any hole caused by such engine or waggons or vehicles drawn by it on any road along which the same shall have travelled, or otherwise, where such road shall be damaged, shall prepare such road in a proper manner, so as to render the same fit for any vehicle traffic.
 7. The owner of any traction engine shall be liable to pay for any damage caused to any bridge or culvert by his engine.
 8. No person shall permit a traction engine, whilst travelling, to stop upon a bridge or culvert.
 9. In the event of any traction engine breaking the decking or otherwise damaging a bridge or culvert the person in charge thereof shall forthwith, before leaving the bridge or culvert, place an obstruction or notice in a conspicuous position on or near the damaged portion, and shall send notice, within 24 hours, to the president and secretary, or president, councillor, or engineer of the shire. Notice shall particularize the bridge or culvert so damaged and the nature of such damage.
 10. The owner of or person travelling with or in charge of any traction engine within the shire shall do so at his or their own risk, and the owner shall be responsible for any damage done or caused through or by any traction engine whilst travelling aforesaid.
 11. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten (10) pounds.
 12. The person in charge of any traction engine, whether stationary or travelling on any road within the shire, shall between sundown and sunrise cause a lamp to be fixed thereon in a prominent position, and keep such lamp brightly burning between the periods aforesaid.
 13. No traction engine shall draw more than three trucks or waggons, the aggregate weight of which must not exceed twenty (20) tons.
 14. That a licence-fee of Five (5) pounds per annum or Thirty (30) shillings per quarter shall be paid for each engine used on the roads of the shire.
