## ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

"An Act relating to certain Officers and Teachers who hold office in the Education Department at the passing of *The Public Service Act 1883*."

"An Act to further amend the *Mining Development Act 1896*."

"An Act relating to the Studley Park Bridge."

"An Act to amend the *Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1897*."

CARETAKER, SANATORIUM.

APPLICATIONS will be received by the Public Service Board up to Monday, the 13th December proximo, from officers of the Non-Clerical Division of the Public Service, for the position of Caretaker, Sanatorium, Wyndham, Department of Public Health. Yearly rate of pay:—Minimum, £90; maximum, £102 (with quarters when required to reside on the premises); regular increments are not provided for.

The duties of the office are:—To take care of the Sanatorium, and have it always ready for use; to wait upon a medical man, when one is there; to look after a pony; and generally to make himself thoroughly useful.

The requirements of the office are:—That the applicant must be married but without children, that he be absolutely sober and trustworthy in every way, that he and his wife be fearless as to infection, that the wife should be able to nurse (for which, when so employed, she would be paid specially).

It would be no bar to an applicant were he past middle age. An officer may be transferred at his present salary, although it be over the minimum pay provided for the office of Caretaker.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MR. GEORGE CROCKER, STURT-STREET, BALLARAT (DRESSMAKING DEPARTMENT),

for a period of three weeks from the 6th December, 1897, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twelve females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twelve females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.

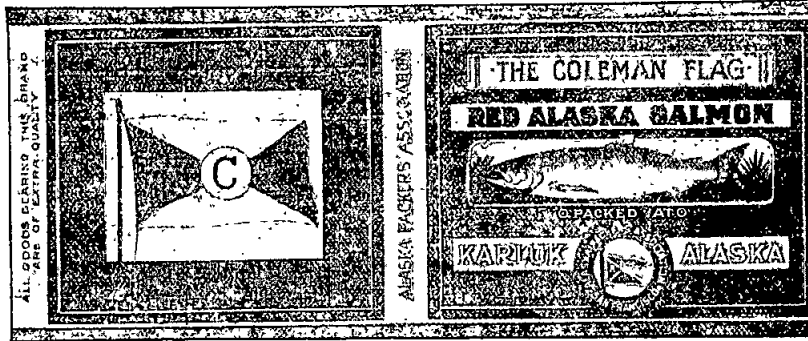

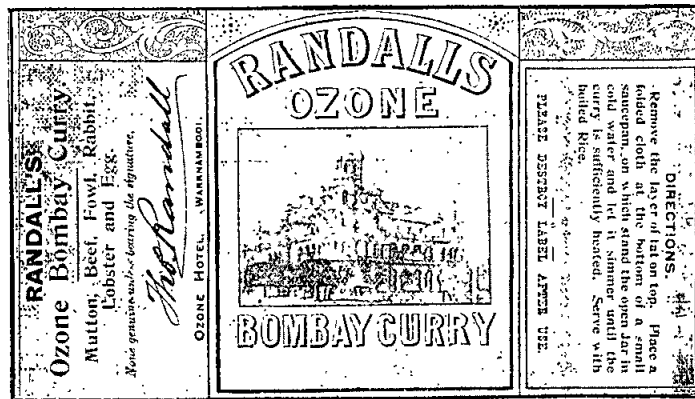

**TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1898, No. 1.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1898 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant and unoccupied allotments of land, and vacant and unoccupied pieces of land, or any other property liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling.

3. For each and every vacant allotment and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

4. For each and every unoccupied allotment and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.

5. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling.

7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling and ninepence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.

8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by measure, shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate at One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1898.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

TATURA WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATION  
No. 2, 1898.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Tatura Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1892*, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, repeal the following Regulation heretofore made by them, viz.—Regulation No. 2, 1897, passed on the 16th day of November, 1896, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 14th day of December, 1896, and do hereby, in further pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation:—

1. No person receiving water from the Trust at or upon any premises shall allow any person to carry or take away any water from such premises, and no such person shall sell any water to any other person.

2. The service-pipes for conveying water from the pipes of the Trust unto the premises of consumers shall be of the best galvanized quality; and all cocks shall be of high-pressure pattern, and all such service-pipes and cocks shall not be laid or connected with the pipes of the Trust until approved of, in writing, by the Trust's officer, or some other person authorized by the Trust in that behalf, and shall in no case exceed the following diameters:—

For the domestic supply of premises not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value,  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch diameter; for the domestic supply of premises exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value,  $\frac{7}{8}$  inch diameter; for the supply of water for all other than domestic purposes by meter, such diameter as the Trust shall authorize, in writing, in each case.

3. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any land or tenement who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, and is desirous of being so supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of any such land or tenement abutting on the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

4. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing an efficient self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.

5. No overflow-pipes to private baths shall be connected or affixed.

6. No water-closets shall be supplied direct from any main of the Trust, but from a cistern only, so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and that not more than 2 gallons can escape at each flush.

7. No extension or alteration of any service whatever will be permitted without the written permission of the Trust, and such extension or alteration shall be under the supervision of the Trust's officer, or some other person authorized by the Trust in that behalf; and no meter shall be affixed unless the same shall have been submitted to and approved of by the Trust or the Trust's officer, or by such other person as may be authorized by the Trust in that behalf; and no meter shall be removed by any person without he shall give six clear days' previous notice, in writing, to the Trust of his intention so to do.

8. Any person supplied with water by the Trust who does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, as may be deemed expedient, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause or complaint remains, or is not remedied.

9. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise through the pipes and meters laid, placed, and being under and in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

10. No person other than a plumber licensed by the Trust will be permitted to tap or in any way interfere with any main the property of the Trust. The fee for a plumber's licence shall be One pound for each period of three years, the first period dating from 1st January, 1898.

11. Any person infringing these Regulations, or any of them, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

12. In the construction of these Regulations the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation whether aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Tatura Waterworks Trust.

MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATION FOR 1898.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, for the purposes of the *Water*

*Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

REGULATION No. 18.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1898, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said urban district:—

1. For every house or tenement used as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement used as a domicile of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Five pounds per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

3. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.

4. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Four pounds per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Ten pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of Ten shillings.

6. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Eleven pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Five pounds per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.

7. For every water-trough Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed on), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

1. Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale, for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

9. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter, where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens), equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

10. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year.

11. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

12. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

13. For water supplied to breweries the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

15. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

16. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

17. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1898, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

LONGWOOD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING  
REGULATIONS FOR 1898.

THE Commissioners of the Longwood Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, and in exercise of the powers and authorities of the said Act, make the following Regulations:—

1. The rates and charges herein specified are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements situated within the aforesaid waterworks district, and liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1898 in respect of water supplied otherwise than by measure for domestic purposes, such rate to be payable half-yearly, in advance, in equal moieties, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July.

(1) On every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds sterling or under, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Twenty shillings.

(2) On every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, according to the municipal valuation for the time being of such house or tenement, the sum of Two shillings in the £1 of such valuation.

(3) For each vacant allotment, Two shillings in the £1 on the annual municipal valuation thereof.

2. The following shall be the charges in respect of water supplied by measure:—

(1) Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings for every 1,000 gallons (or such price as may be specially agreed upon). The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when so supplied shall be 20,000 gallons per half-year, or a quantity which, at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or in the event of there being no such contract, Thirty shillings per cent. on the amount charged or paid for stonework, brickwork, or plastering of such building, the same to be paid before the pipes are connected.

3. Tenements situated within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe to be charged one-half of the assessed rate.

4. Tenements situated more than a quarter of a mile, but not exceeding one-half of a mile from a stand-pipe, shall be charged one-quarter of the assessed rate.

5. All accounts for water supplied by special agreement or by measure shall be paid quarterly, or as may be agreed upon.

6. Such person or persons as the commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, a rate of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual municipal value of Twenty-one pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds (as the Commissioners may determine) to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.

5. On every horse trough, a charge of One pound per annum.

6. Water supplied to the Government Departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.

7. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st January, 1898, and 1st July, 1898.

8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds (£10), the sum of One shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property, provided that no rate be less than One pound.

3. For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1898, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1898, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1898, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st day of January and the other moiety on the 1st day of July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.
