The Federal Council of Australasia Act 1885.
A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict., cap. 60, intitled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Federal Council of Australasia shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazettes* of each of the Colonies in the said Act No. 12.—FEBRUARY 12, 1897.—1.

referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation: And whereas the present Session of the said Federal Council has been held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient that the said Federal Council shall be prorogued: Now therefore I, The Right Honorable Jenico William Joseph, Viscount Gormanston, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred upon me, do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Federal Council.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF WM. CAMERON BROS. & COY. LTD., TOBACCO, ETC., MANUFACTURERS, OF 14 TO 20 A'BECKETT-STREET, WEST MELBOURNE,

for a period of three weeks from the 4th February, 1897, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than four females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said four females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. to the Secretary of the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the

School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age. After 1st March, 1897, no candidate will be admitted to examination under the age of nineteen years.

CERTIFICATES WITH PARTIAL OR WITHOUT EXAMINATION.

Certificates may be granted by the Board with partial or without examination to applicants who produce satisfactory evidence of having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed by the Board, and of having been professionally employed for not less than twelve months in any Australasian colony.

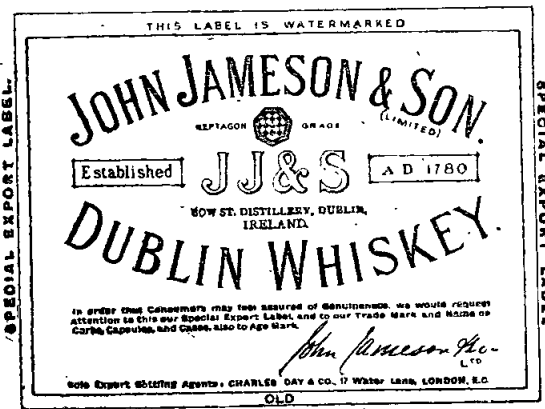

STEAM-SHIP "NINEVEH" DETAINED IN QUARANTINE.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship *Nineveh* has arrived in Victorian waters, and has on board cases of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and doth further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said vessel, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken, and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said vessel except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said vessel under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said vessel, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said vessel shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and further, that all persons who have landed in Victoria from the said vessel, or have been on board of her, shall render themselves to the health authorities and proceed into quarantine at such place as the Minister of Health or the said Board may direct; and further, that such persons, and the vessel and all persons and things on board of her, shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the said Minister or by the said Board.

This Order shall be deemed to have been in force on and since the 8th inst.

SHIRE OF FLINDERS AND KANGERONG.

A By-law of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong, made under Section 190 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered seven (7), for extending the provisions of Part I. of the *Police Offences Act 1890* to the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Flinders and Kangerong order as follows:—

This by-law shall come into operation within one month after publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

5. Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglect shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

- (i.) Throwing any glass, dirt, filth, rubbish, or any other matter of a similar nature upon any road, footway, or public place.
- (ii.) Hiding, driving, or wheeling any barrow or carriage upon or along any footpath.
- (iii.) Placing any timber, brick, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.
- (iv.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway, carriage road, or open or public place.
- (v.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the local authority.
- (vi.) Drawing or trailing any sledge, timber, or any other heavy material upon any footway or carriage road to the injury of such footway or carriage road.
- (vii.) Emptying any privy or cesspool or carting away any night-soil or other offensive matter without a licence from and without having given such security as is required by the local authority.
- (viii.) Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place.
- (ix.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves of any houses to fall upon any public footway.
- (x.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamppost, or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
- (xi.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.
- (xii.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.
- (xiii.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place, or obstructing any footway or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon, or otherwise.
- (xiv.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile to the damage or danger of any person.
- (xv.) Having any awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being 7 feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway.
- (xvi.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority.
- (xvii.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place.
- (xviii.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (excepting in any fare or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any horse or other animal for show, hire, or sale.
- (xix.) Permitting any horse to serve a mare for breeding purposes, or permitting a mare to be brought to a horse or a horse to be brought to a mare in order to ascertain if she is in season for taking the horse for breeding purposes, in or within sight of any road, street, or thoroughfare.
- (xx.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the local authority.
- (xxi.) Any carter plying for hire without a licence.
- (xxii.) Any carter waiting for hire allowing his cart or dray to stand in any other place than those appointed by the local authority, or demanding higher rates than authorized by such local authority.
- (xxiii.) Plying for hire with any boat not being a steam-boat at any ferry or on any river without a licence from the local authority, or demanding higher rates than sanctioned by such local authority.
- (xxiv.) Discharging any firearms, or setting off any fireworks, or carrying any firearms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or public place without permission from the local authority.

Provided that the provision last aforesaid shall not apply to any justice or any person in Her Majesty's military or naval service, or any member of the police or other peace officer, or any member of a recognised volunteer corps or any special constable, or any person actually in pursuit of any felon or offender.

6. Any local authority may from time to time make regulations for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and

public places of any city, town, or borough, and for preventing any obstruction thereof, whether by the assemblage of persons or otherwise; and every wilful breach of any such regulation shall be deemed to be a separate offence against this Part of this Act; and every person committing any such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any local authority may make such rules and regulations with reference to the licensing of carters and boatmen, the places where they shall stand, the rates they shall receive, the distance they shall be compellable to go, and such other matters as may tend to the public convenience in regard to them, as such local authority may see fit.

8. No person without a licence first had, and obtained from the local authority, shall erect, place, or set up, or build in any public place any hoarding or scaffolding, or place or erect any posts, bars, rails, boards, or other thing by way of enclosure for the purpose of making mortar or of depositing sifting screenings, or slacking, and brick, stone, lime, sand, or any other material for building or repairing any house or other tenement or erection, or for any other purpose; and such licence as aforesaid shall specify therein the length of time for which such hoarding, scaffolding, posts, bars, rails, boards, or other thing when so erected or set up may be continued, and shall contain such other directions respecting the same as are necessary; and if any person place, set up, erect, or build, or cause or permit to be erected, placed, set up, or built any such hoarding or scaffolding, or any enclosed posts, bars, or rails, or any other matter or thing for the purposes aforesaid, or for any other purpose, without such licence, or contrary to the provisions and conditions of such licence, or to be continued for any longer time than is allowed or expressed in such licence; then, and in any of the said cases, such person shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and also the sum of One pound for every day that the same has been and is set up and continued contrary to the provisions hereof, and the said local authority may, four days after notice, cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and the same, and all the materials thereof, to be kept and detained until such person pays to such local authority all the penalties incurred by such persons, together with the charges of pulling down, removing, and keeping the same; and if the same be not claimed, and the said penalties and charges as aforesaid paid within the space of five days next after the pulling down and removing thereof, such local authority may order or cause the same to be sold by public auction, and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.

9. If any person expose for sale any article whatsoever on any footway or outside of any shop window or doorway abutting on any public thoroughfare or street so as to obstruct the public thoroughfare, he shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and if any article so exposed be not removed within six hours after notice, any local authority or any officer of police or any constable without warrant may seize any such article; and every such article shall be forfeited and sold, and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.

11. If any person, after the coming into operation of this Act, erect or cause to be erected in any city, town, district, or place to which this provision may be extended any chimney or fireplace of timber, or other matter liable to ignition, or do not place for a sufficient distance some matter or material not liable to ignition between such chimney or fireplace and any material of an inflammable nature or liable to ignition, the occupier of such house shall, on notice from the local authority being served upon him or left at such premises requiring such fireplace or chimney to be so altered as not to come within the meaning of this provision, and neglecting after the expiration of seven days to comply with the conditions of such notice, forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

12. Upon the extension of any of the provisions of this Part of this Act to any city, town, or borough in Victoria, the council of such city, town, or borough, or, if there be no such council, the Surveyor-General, shall cause to be set out the breadth of the carriage and footways in the streets and public places of every such city, town, or borough, and shall cause the said footways to be marked by posts at the corners and intersections of the streets; and the carriage and footways, when so set out, shall be deemed to be the carriage and footways respectively of such city, town, or borough.

13. Before the Surveyor-General shall cause to be set out the carriage and footways of any such city, town, or borough as aforesaid, he shall submit to the Governor in Council a plan of the same, showing the proposed breadth of the carriage and footways; and thereupon the Governor may, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, fix and declare the breadth of such carriage and footways and the distance from the outer edge of such footways within which it shall not be lawful to erect any building or fence.
