The Federal Council of Australasia Act 1885. A PROCLAMATION.

Whereas by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict., cap. 50, intituled "An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia," it is enacted that the Federal Council of Australasia shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so aummoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette of each of the Colonies in the said Act

referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation: And whereas the present Session of the said Federal Council has been held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania: And whereas it is expedient that the said Federal Council shall be prorogued: Now therefore I, The Right Honorable Jenico William Joseph, Viscount Gormanton, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred upon me. do by this my Proclamation prorogue the said Federal Council.

Factories and Shops Acts.

In compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Exctories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Act, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the Factories and Shops Act 1890, as re-enacted by the Factories and Shops Act 1890, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF WM. CAMERON BROS: & COY. LID., TOBACCO, ETC., MANUFACTURERS, OF 14 TO 20 A'BECKETT-STREET, WEST MELBOURNE,

for a period of three weeks from the 4th February, 1897, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work rooms more than four females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said four females shall not be employed for more than fitty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than fitty-seven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.

VICTORIA.

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. to the Secretary of the Board.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the

School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

Norz.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for aximination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age. After 1st March, 1899, no candidate will be admitted to examination under the age of nine-teen years.



WHEREAS by the Health Act 1800 it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contaginu util the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship Ninerch has arrived in Victorian waters, and has on board cases of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby order and direct that, nutil the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and doth further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on bahalf of the said Board, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said vessel, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken, and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said vessel except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that a cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said vessel under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said vessel, nor shall

 (iii) Placing any timber, brick, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.
 (iv.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway, carriage road, or open or public place.
 (v.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the local authority.
 (vi.) Drawing or trailing any sledge, timber, or any other heavy material upon any footway or carriage road to the injury of such footway or carriage road.
 (vii.) Emptying any privy or cesspool or carting away any night-soil or other offensive matter twithout a licence from and without having given such security as is required by the local authority.
 (viii.) Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public places.
 (ix.) Allowing the drippings of the caves of any houses to fall upon any public footway.
 (x.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on or otherwise deacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamppost, or gate without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof.
 (xi.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained.
 (xii.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused.
 (xiii.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing at any game

(xix.) Permitting any horse to serve a mare for breeding purposes, or permitting a mare to be brought to a horse or a horse to be brought to a mare in order to ascertain if she is in season for taking the horse for breeding purposes, in or within sight of any road, street, or thoroughars.

(xx.) Making cellar door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the local authority.

(xxi.) Any carter lying for hire without a licence.

(xxii.) Any carter waiting for hire allowing his cart or dray to stand in any other place than those appointed by the local authority, or demanding higher rates than authorized by such local authority.

(xxiii.) Plying for hire with any boat not being a steamboat at any ferry or on any river without a licence from the local authority, or demanding higher rates than sanctioned by such local authority.

(xxiv.) Discharging any firearms, or setting off any fireworks, or carrying any firearms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon within any town or public place without permission from the local authority:

ovided that the provision last aforesaid shall not apply to any

Provided that the provision last aforesaid shall not apply to any justice or any person in Her Majesty's military or naval service, or any member of the police or other peace efficer, or any member of a recognised volunteer corps or any special constable, or any person actually in pursuit of any felon or offender.

6. Any local authority may from time to time make regulations for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and footways and

public places of any city, town, or borough, and for preventing any obstruction thereof, whether by the assemblage of persons or otherwise; and every wilful breach of any such regulation shall be deemed to be a separate offence against this Part of this
