## DENUNCIATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES OF THE TREATY OF FRIENDSHIP, COMMERCE, AND NAVIGATION BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND THE REPUBLIC OF COSTA RICA.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its enclosures, are published for general information.

Sir,

I have the honour to transmit to you, for information and publication in the colony under your Government, copies of notes exchanged between the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Costa Rica and the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs respecting the denunciation of Articles V., VI., and VII. of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Great Britain and the Republic of Costa Rica of the 27th November, 1849, together with a copy of an announcement made in the "London Gazette."

Foreign Office, San José, 4th November, 1896.

My Lord,

The Government of Costa Rica wish to conclude with those nations, with whom they entertain close and cordial relations, new treaties which may be more in harmony with the present interests and necessities of the country and of its commerce.

For this reason, and by instruction of the President of the Republic, I have the honour to inform your Lordship that I denounce, in the name of my Government, Articles V., VI., and VII. of the Treaty concluded between this Republic and Great Britain on the 27th day of November, 1849, and signed by the plenipotentiaries Don Joaquín Bernardo Calvo and Mr. Frederic Chatfield. This denunciation is made in accordance with the provisions of Article XV. of the same Treaty.

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt, on the 26th ultimo, of your note of the 4th of November denouncing Articles V., VI., and VII. of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation concluded between Great Britain and the Republic of Costa Rica on the 27th of November, 1849.

Her Majesty's Government note that this denunciation is made in conformity with the provisions of Article XV. of that Treaty. They therefore accept it, and have announced in the "London Gazette" that Articles V., VI., and VII. of the Treaty will cease and determine on the 26th of November, 1897.

Her Majesty's Government are happy to think that all the other Articles referring to Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation will, under the terms of the above-mentioned Article, remain in force, and in order to strengthen the relations of amity, to which they attach much value, they will be prepared to negotiate alternative Articles in place of those now denounced.

They will therefore be glad to be informed of the nature of the alternative Articles which the Government of Costa Rica may desire to suggest.

The Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs received, on the 26th ultimo, from the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Costa Rican Republic, a note, dated the 4th ultimo, denouncing Articles V., VI., and VII. of the Treaty of Friendship, Commerce, and Navigation between Great Britain and the Republic of Costa Rica concluded on the 27th November, 1849.

This notice of denunciation, which is in conformity with the provisions of Article XV. of that Treaty, has been accepted by Her Majesty's Government, and Articles V., VI., and VII. of the Treaty will cease and determine accordingly on the 26th November, 1897.

All the other Articles of the Treaty will remain in force.

WEDNESDAY, THE 17TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT, at Mirboo North, Morwell, Nhill, Seymour, and Yackandandah;

WEDNESDAY, THE 17TH, AND WEDNESDAY, THE 31ST, DAYS OF MARCH NEXT, at Tatura.

Every person who is the owner or occupier of any dairy farm or milk store shall, on or before the 1st January in every year, register himself by signing and forwarding to the municipal clerk of the Shire of Hampden an application, in the form specified in the Regulations of the Board of Public Health, as approved by the Governor in Council on the 11th March, 1890; and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Five shillings.

5. Every person committing a breach of this by-law shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or, if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.

## SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

By-Law No. 16.

**I**N pursuance of the power conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Shire of Hampden, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Hampden, do hereby order and direct as follows:—

1. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the townships of Camperdown and Terang.

2. The ordinary system of pans for night-soil is abolished and sections 19 and 23 of By-law No. 2 are hereby repealed so far as they relate to the said townships.

3. Instead thereof every closet shall be forthwith furnished with a double-pan service.

4. The pans for such service shall be supplied by the council, and every occupier shall permit such pans to be placed in every such closet where directed by the Inspector of Nuisances for the Shire of Hampden.

5. At least once a week, or as much more frequently as the council may from time to time direct, the pan in use in every closet shall be closed with a tight-fitting lid and removed in the daytime in a suitable cart, and a pan cleansed by superheated steam, or some equally efficient means approved by the council, left in its place.

6. The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil and rubbish, to make a charge on each occupier for such double-pan service as specified in the by-law, and for pans supplied the amount in default of payment to be recovered in any court of petty sessions.

7. The occupier of every tenement within the townships of Camperdown and Terang shall daily place, or caused to be placed, in each pan in use at such tenement, a quantity of suitable disinfectant and deodorant sufficient to efficiently deodorize and disinfect such pan and the contents thereof.

8. No person, unless authorized in writing in that behalf by the Council of the Shire of Hampden, shall remove any night-soil pan or the contents thereof, and no person shall remove any such pan or the contents thereof except between the hours of Six o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the evening of such working day.

9. Every person committing a breach of any one of the provisions contained in this By-law No. 16 shall forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds and not less than Five shillings, or if such breach be a continuing act or default, shall pay a penalty or sum not exceeding Five pounds and not less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
