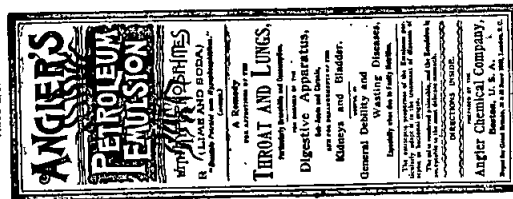

REGULATIONS for the Distribution of the Sum of Three thousand five hundred pounds (£3,500) granted by Parliament to Agricultural Societies, 1896-7.

1. Each society shall furnish to the Secretary for Agriculture, on or before the 1st February, 1897, a statement in the form marked A, which must be verified by statutory declaration in the form marked E.

2. On receipt of the above-mentioned statement so verified, the Minister of Agriculture may cause to be paid to the treasurer of each society a sum equal to one-fourth of the amount shown to have been awarded and paid away in prizes not exceeding Twenty-five pounds each (except for the exhibits mentioned in the statement above referred to, and such other exhibits the Minister may consider unsuitable), on condition that this sum does not exceed the amount raised by members' subscriptions and private donations; and if it do exceed the same, that it be in that case reduced to a sum equal to the amount so raised.

3. If the sums claimable be in excess of the whole grant, Three thousand four hundred and forty-seven pounds seven shillings and sixpence (£3,447 7s. 6d.), they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. No society located within twenty miles of any other society shall be entitled to participate in the vote unless the sum awarded and paid away in prizes by such society, as hereinbefore specified, amounts in the total to One hundred pounds at least; neither shall the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria participate in the said vote.

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

REGULATIONS in connexion with the Vote of Two thousand five hundred pounds (£2,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough councils, trustees, committees of management, &c., 1896-7.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden having a claim on the vote for every One pound expended by such body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1896, and 31st December, 1896, out of funds locally contributed, provided such claim be received by the Secretary for Agriculture on or before the 1st February, 1897. Every statement of particulars of claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1896, and 31st December, 1896; but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the above-mentioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1896.

3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1896 (*vide* form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Two thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced *pro rata*.

4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of expenditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.

5. Moneys expended in street planting, or in fencing, formation, or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in erection or repairs of stands or pavilions for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.

6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Richmond Park, Richmond, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

CARISBROOK WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purpose of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz. :—

REGULATION No. 4.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of the lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1897, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District :—

1. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
 2. For every house or tenement of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.
 3. For every house or tenement of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
 4. For every house or tenement of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal value and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
 5. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
 6. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of above Ten pounds, and not more than Fifteen pounds annual municipal value, a rate Two shillings in the pound, according to such value.
 7. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of above Fifteen pounds and not more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
 8. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile, of Twenty-one pounds annual municipal valuation and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
 9. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling; over Twenty pounds municipal value, One shilling in the pound per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
 10. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement for domestic and other than domestic purposes, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, and the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at the price named, would be equal to the rate payable in respect of the property so supplied, if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 11. For a temporary supply during erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework or brickwork and plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering.
 12. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement, the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of cylinder of the engine.
 13. For water supplied to market gardens for other than domestic purposes solely, the charge shall be One shilling for 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon; and the minimum quantity to be charged for yearly shall be 50,000 gallons; the supply to be by meter only.
- That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly in advance, first payment on the 1st day of January, 1897, and the second payment on the 1st day of July, 1897.
- Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Carisbrook Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

1. For every house or tenement of the annual value of Ten pounds sterling or under, according to the valuation for the time being of such rateable property for the municipal rate of the Borough of Koroit, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds sterling, the sum of Two shillings on each pound of such value.
3. Such rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on 1st January and 1st July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Koroit Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect the said rates.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation :—

REGULATION No. 5.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust for the year 1897 :—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, a rate of One pound per annum.
 2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual municipal value of Twenty-one pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.
 3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.
 4. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds (as the Commissioners may determine) to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.
 5. On every horse-trough, a charge of One pound per annum.
 6. Water supplied to the Government departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.
 7. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st January, 1897, and 1st July, 1897.
 8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

LOWAN SHIRE WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations :—

The following are the rates and charges which all persons shall pay in respect of water supplied to them by this Trust in cases where the cost and expense of haulage or raising the water from any well or dam has been or has to be incurred by the Trust within the district of the Lowan Shire Waterworks Trust.

1. For every head of large stock watered, to wit, horses and cattle, not to exceed Sixpence.
2. For every head of small stock watered, to wit, sheep, goats, pigs, not to exceed Twopence.
3. For every 100 gallons or fractional part thereof taken for domestic purposes, not to exceed Sixpence.

All such charges shall be payable in advance, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said charges as in manner by law directed.

4. Any person or persons who shall be guilty of the waste, undue consumption, fouling, or contamination of water contained in or supplied from any part of the works within the Lewan Shire Waterworks Trust District, or who shall be guilty of trespass or injury to any part of the said works or water, shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty in respect of each offence not exceeding the sum of Five pounds sterling.

Every penalty in respect of a breach of any such regulation may be recovered in a summary way before any two justices. Passed this 18th day of December, 1896.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in such Order, among other things, increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 19th December, 1892, a Waterworks Trust, known and incorporated as the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the boundaries of the land comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were, in and by clause 4 of the said Order in Council, defined and limited: And whereas it is expedient to increase the extent of the said Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth order that the land comprised within the following boundaries shall be added to and form part of the aforesaid Waterworks District of the Trust as and from the date hereof:—

WHEREAS by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896* it is enacted that the Governor in Council, upon receiving a petition certified by the municipal clerk of any municipal district as having been signed by a majority of the bakers or butchers or vendors of milk respectively having shops in such district, may make regulations prohibiting the delivery of bread or meat or milk (as the case may be) from a cart or in the street or at any house or premises on any one specified day in each month or on any specified afternoon in each week after One o'clock: And whereas a petition has been received so certified as having been signed by a majority of the bakers having shops in the municipal district of the City of Collingwood praying that a regulation be made prohibiting the delivery within the said municipal district of bread from a cart or in the street or at any house or premises on the Third Wednesday in each and every calendar month in the year: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

No person shall within the Municipal District of the City of Collingwood deliver, or cause or permit to be delivered, any bread from any cart, or in the street or at any house or premises on the Third Wednesday in each and every calendar month in the year. Any person guilty of a contravention of this Regulation shall be liable, for the first offence, to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty of not less than One pound nor more than Five pounds.

Electric Light and Power Act 1896.

REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC.

WHEREAS by the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1413) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as he may think expedient for securing the safety of the persons and property of the public from injury from fire or otherwise, and may by any regulation amend or repeal any condition contained in any Order in relation thereto: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal the Regulations on the subject aforesaid bearing date the 18th day of June, 1896, and doth make the following Regulations in lieu thereof, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS FOR SECURING THE SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC.

DEFINITIONS.

The several words, terms, and expressions to which meanings are assigned in the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* or in any Order granted thereunder have the same respective meanings in these Regulations.

“Consumer’s wires” means any electric lines on a consumer’s premises which are connected with the service lines of the undertakers at the consumer’s terminals.

“Aerial line” means any electric line which is placed above ground and in the open air.

“Pressure” means the difference of electrical potential between any two conductors through which a supply of energy is given, or between any part of either conductor and the earth; and—

(a) Where the conditions of the supply are such that the pressure may at any time exceed 500 volts if continuous, or 250 volts if alternating, but cannot exceed 3,000 volts, whether continuous or alternating, the supply shall be deemed a high-pressure supply;

(b) Where the conditions of the supply are such that the pressure may on either system exceed 3,000 volts, the supply shall be deemed an extra high-pressure supply.

“High-pressure” and “extra-high pressure” respectively are used in relation to electric lines, conductors, circuits, and apparatus, according to the conditions of the supply delivered through the same or particular portions thereof.

Where these Regulations require any metallic body to be “efficiently connected with earth,” it shall be connected with the general mass of earth in such manner as will insure at all times an immediate and safe discharge of electrical energy.

GENERAL.

1. *Pressure of supply to consumers.*—The pressure of a supply delivered to any consumer shall not exceed 250 volts at any pair of terminals, except with the express approval of the Minister. Such approval will only be given for special purposes and on the joint application of the consumer and the undertakers, and the supply will be subject to such further regulations as the Governor in Council may from time to time prescribe.

2. *Pressure of supply to transforming apparatus.*—The pressure of a supply delivered to a transforming station or to transforming apparatus on a consumer’s premises may exceed 250 volts, but shall not exceed the limits of high pressure.

3. *Limitations of extra high-pressure supply.*—An extra high-pressure supply shall not be given except to distributing stations or other premises in the sole occupation of the undertakers, and with the written consent of the Minister, and subject to such conditions as he may prescribe.

4. *Maximum current in conductors.*—The maximum working current in any conductor shall not be sufficient to raise the temperature of the conductor or any part thereof to such an extent as to materially alter the physical condition or specific resistance of the insulating covering (if any), or in any case to raise such temperature to a greater extent than 30° F.; the cross-sectional area and conductivity at joints must be sufficient to avoid local heating, and the joints must be protected against corrosion.

5. *Minimum size of conductors.*—The sectional area of the conductor in any electric line laid or erected in any street after the date of these Regulations shall not be less than the area of a circle of one-tenth of an inch diameter, and where the conductor is formed of a strand of wires each separate wire shall be at least as large as No. 20 standard wire gauge. Any conductor of less area than No. 14 standard wire gauge which may have been erected prior to the date of these Regulations shall be replaced by a conductor of the area prescribed by this Regulation.

6. *Specification of insulating material.*—All material used for insulating electric lines or apparatus shall be of the best quality, and thoroughly durable and efficient, having regard to the conditions of its use. Suitable provision shall be made for the protection of the insulating material against injury or removal.

If the protection so provided be wholly or partly metallic it shall be efficiently connected with earth.

7. *Insulation test of electric lines.*—Every main shall be tested for insulation after having been placed in position and before it is used for the purposes of supply, the testing pressure being at least 200 volts, and the undertakers shall duly record the results of the tests of each main, or section of a main.

8. *Maintenance of insulation.*—The insulation of every complete circuit used for the supply of energy, including all machinery, apparatus, and devices forming part of, or in connexion with, such circuit, shall be so maintained that the leakage current shall not under any conditions exceed one-thousandth part of the maximum supply current; and suitable means shall be provided for the immediate indication and localisation of leakage. Every leakage shall be remedied without delay.

Every such circuit shall be tested for insulation at least once in every week, and the undertakers shall duly record the results of the testings.

Provided that where the Minister has approved of any part of any electric circuit being connected with earth, the provisions of this regulation shall not apply to that circuit so long as the connexion with earth exists.

9. *High-pressure conductors to be covered.*—Every high-pressure conductor shall be continuously covered with insulating material to a thickness of not less than one-tenth part of an inch, and in cases where the extreme difference of potential in the circuit exceeds 2,000 volts, the thickness of insulating material shall not be less in inches or parts of an inch than the number obtained by dividing the number expressing the volts by 20,000.

10. *Testing of insulation of all parts of any high-pressure circuit.*—A high-pressure circuit shall not be brought into use unless the insulation of every part thereof has withstood the continuous application, during one hour, of pressure exceeding the maximum pressure to which it is intended to be subjected in use—that is to say, in the case of every electric line a pressure twice the said maximum pressure, and in the case of every machine, device, or apparatus, a pressure 50 per cent. greater than the said maximum pressure.

The undertakers shall duly record the results of each test.

11. *Quick-acting cut-off for high-pressure lines, &c.*—Every high-pressure electric line, conductor, or other apparatus shall be protected by a suitable automatic quick-acting cut-off.

Provided that it shall not be incumbent upon the undertakers to provide such a cut-off for the outer conductor of a concentric main which is, with the approval of the Minister, efficiently connected with earth.

12. *Transformers.*—In every case where a high-pressure supply is transformed for the purpose of supply to one or more consumers, some suitable automatic and quick-acting means shall be provided to protect the consumers' wires from any accidental contact with or leakage from the high-pressure system, either within or without the transforming apparatus.

13. *Limit of power in high-pressure electric line.*—A high-pressure electric line shall not be used for the transmission of more than 300,000 watts, except with the consent in writing of the Minister, and efficient means shall be provided to prevent this limit being at any time exceeded.

14. *Protection from lightning.*—Where any portion of any electric line or any support for an electric line is exposed in such a position as to be liable to injury from lightning, it shall be efficiently protected against such injury.

15. *Accidents to be reported.*—Where any accident by explosion or fire, or any other accident of such kind as to have caused or to be likely to have caused loss of life or personal injury has occurred at any part of any electric line or work, the undertakers shall give immediate notice thereof to the Minister.

16. *Earth return.*—No earth return shall be allowed on any electric light or power circuit.

AERIAL LINES.

17. *Maximum intervals between supports.*—Every aerial line shall be attached to supports at intervals not exceeding 200 feet where the direction of the line is straight, or 150 feet where the direction is curved, or where the line makes a horizontal angle at the point of support.

18. *Supports, construction and erection of.*—Every support of an aerial line shall be of a durable material and properly stayed against forces due to wind pressure, change of direction of the line, or unequal lengths of span. The factor of safety shall be for aerial lines and suspending wires at least six, and for all other parts of the structure at least twelve, taking the maximum possible wind pressure at 25 lbs. per square foot. Every support if of metal shall be efficiently connected with earth.

19. *Low-pressure conductors to be insulated.*—Every low-pressure aerial conductor shall be continuously insulated with a durable and efficient material, to be approved by the Minister, and shall be further efficiently protected on the outside against injury by removal or abrasion. If this protection be wholly or partly metallic, it shall be efficiently connected with earth.

20. *Attachment of aerial lines.*—All aerial lines shall be attached to insulators, and shall be so guarded that they cannot fall away from the support. Conductors shall not be attached to the insulators by uninsulated metal binders.

21. *Height from ground and distance from buildings, &c.*—An aerial line shall not in any part thereof be at a less height from the ground than 18 feet, or within 3 feet measured horizontally, or 7 feet measured vertically, from any building or erection other than a support for the line, except where brought into a building for the purpose of supply.

22. *Service lines from aerial lines.*—Service lines from aerial lines shall be led as directly as possible to insulators firmly attached to some portion of the consumer's premises which is not accessible to any person without the use of a ladder or other special appliance, and from this point of attachment they shall be enclosed and protected in accordance with the subsequent Regulations as to electric lines on the consumer's

premises. Every portion of any service line which is outside a building and within reach of any person without the aid of a ladder or other appliance shall be completely enclosed in stout india-rubber tubing.

23. *Protection of telegraph and telephone wires from interference.*—Except where otherwise permitted by the Minister, the two conductors constituting the lead and return for any circuit shall be run parallel with each other, and at a distance apart not exceeding 24 inches; and the position of such lead and return shall be interchanged by crossing every half-mile, or at least once in any shorter length of parallel telegraph or telephone wire, which would be liable to induction.

24. *Conductors not to be placed on telegraph or telephone poles.*—In no case, without special permission from the Postmaster-General, the Board of Land and Works, or the Victorian Railways Commissioners, shall any aerial conductor be attached to any pole or support carrying a telegraph or telephone wire belonging to the Postmaster-General, the said Board, or Commissioners.

25. *Protection of telegraph and telephone lines from induction.*—Every aerial conductor shall be placed and used with due regard to electric lines and works from time to time used, or intended to be used, for the purpose of telegraphic or telephonic communication, or the currents in such electric lines and works, and every reasonable means shall be employed in the placing and use of aerial conductors, to prevent telegraph and telephone wires being injuriously affected, whether by induction or otherwise, to the entire satisfaction of the Postmaster-General, the Board of Land and Works, or the Victorian Railways Commissioners; as the case may be.

26. *Angle of crossing thoroughfares.*—Where an aerial line crosses a street, the angle between the line and the direction of the street at the place of crossing shall not be less than 60 degrees, and the spans shall be as short as possible.

27. *Crossing wires, &c.*—Where any aerial line is erected so as to cross one or more telegraph, telephone, or other wires, it may pass over, under, or, where specially permitted by the Minister, between such wires, provided precautions are taken to keep such line at least 1 foot clear of the other wires in all directions; and both the aerial line and the telegraph and telephone wires shall be respectively affixed to separate supports, placed within 6 feet of the point of intersection where practicable, but in no case to exceed the width of the footpath at the intersection of streets, and further protected from coming in contact, under any circumstances, by guard irons or wires; all such guard irons or wires to be efficiently connected with earth.

28. *Suspending wires.*—Every aerial line having a sectional area greater than 19, No. 15, S.W.G., or greater than 7, No. 16, S.W.G., where the span exceeds 160 feet, shall be suspended, by means of non-metallic ligaments, to a suspending wire, securely affixed to the support, and efficiently connected with earth at a point of support as near the centre as possible in each length. Every such suspending wire shall be in lengths not exceeding 300 feet, and shackled with insulating shackles. All suspending wires, if of iron or steel, shall be galvanized.

29. *Discharge of pressure in case of fire.*—In the case of any high-pressure aerial line exceeding one-half mile in total length, means shall be provided whereby the pressure may be discharged from any portion of the line erected over or alongside of any building or buildings without loss of time in case of fire or other emergency.

30. *Maintenance.*—Every aerial line, including its supports and all the structural parts and electrical appliances and devices belonging to or connected with the line, shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained as regards both electrical and mechanical conditions. Every support shall bear a distinctive mark approved by the Minister to indicate the ownership.

31. *Disused aerial lines to be removed.*—No aerial line or support or attachment thereto shall remain erected for more than one month after it has ceased to be in use, unless the undertakers intend, within a period not exceeding three months, to take it again into use, and shall give notice of such intention to the Minister.

32. *Bare conductors for long distances.*—For the purpose of transmission of electrical energy over long distances the Governor in Council may, on the recommendation of the Minister, after due inquiry by the Minister, and on his being satisfied that the public safety will not be endangered thereby, grant permission; under special conditions, for the erection of bare conductors overhead in sparsely populated districts, and beyond the area of cities and towns.

ELECTRIC LINES OTHER THAN AERIAL LINES.

33. *Construction of receptacles for electrical lines.*—All conduits, pipes, casings, and street boxes used as receptacles for electric lines shall be constructed of durable material, and where laid under carriage ways shall be of ample strength to prevent damage from heavy traffic; and reasonable means shall be taken by the undertakers to prevent accumulation of gas in such receptacles.

34. *Crossing pipes, &c.*—Where any electric line crosses, or is in proximity to, any metallic substance, special precautions shall be taken by the undertakers against the possibility of any electrical discharge to the metallic substance from the line or from any metal conduit pipe or casing enclosing the line.

35. *Electric continuity of metal conduits, pipes, and casings.*—All metal conduits, pipes, or casings containing any electric line shall be efficiently connected with earth, and shall be so jointed and connected across all street boxes and other openings as to make good electrical connexion throughout their whole length.

36. *Precautions against charging of short lengths of pipe, &c.*—Where isolated lengths of metal conduit, pipe, or casing are used for the protection of any electric line at road crossings or similar positions, special precautions shall be taken to prevent the possibility of any electrical charging thereof.

37. *Precautions to be taken when bare conductors are used.*—Where the conductors of electric lines placed in any conduit are not continuously covered with insulating material, they shall be secured in position, and no unfixed uninsulated material of a conducting nature shall be contained in the conduit. No such conductor shall be at a higher potential than 300 volts.

Adequate precautions shall also be taken to insure that no accumulation of water shall take place in any part of the conduit, and to prevent any dangerous access of moisture to the conductors or the insulators.

In the case of any such electric lines laid in conduits, the insulators shall be so disposed that they can be readily inspected.

38. *High-pressure lines laid above ground.*—Every portion of any high-pressure electric line placed above the surface of the ground, or in any subway not in the sole occupation of the undertakers, shall be completely enclosed either in a tube of highly insulating material embedded in brickwork, masonry, or cement concrete, or in strong metal casing efficiently connected with earth.

39. *High-pressure lines laid in proximity to other electric lines or to the surface of the ground.*—Where any high-pressure electric line is laid beneath the surface of the ground, efficient means shall be taken to render it impossible that the surface of the ground or any neighbouring electric line or conductor shall become charged by leakage from the high-pressure electric line.

STREET BOXES.

40. *Street boxes.*—In addition to the provisions contained in Regulation 33 as to the construction of receptacles for electric lines, the following regulations shall be observed with respect to the construction of street boxes:—

- (a) The covers of all street boxes shall be so secured that they cannot be opened, except by means of a special appliance.
- (b) The covers of all street boxes containing high-pressure apparatus other than cables shall be connected to strips of metal laid immediately underneath the adjacent roadway, and efficient means shall be taken to render it impossible that the covers or other exposed parts of these boxes, or any adjacent material forming the surface of the street, shall become electrically charged, whether by reason of leakage, defect, or otherwise.
- (c) Where street boxes are used as transformer chambers, reasonable means shall be taken to prevent as far as possible any influx of water, either from the adjacent soil, or by means of pipes; and in the case of any such street box exceeding 1 cubic yard in capacity, ample provision shall be made, by ventilation or otherwise, for the immediate escape of any gas which may by accident have obtained access to the box, and for the prevention of danger from sparking.
- (d) All street boxes shall be regularly inspected for the presence of gas, and if any influx or accumulation is discovered the undertakers shall give immediate notice to the council or company whose gas mains are laid in the neighbourhood of the street box.

TRANSFORMING STATIONS.

41. *Transforming stations.*—Transforming stations, or points in a system of distribution in which a high-pressure supply is transformed for the purpose of supply to consumers, and which are not on the consumer's premises, shall be established in suitable places which are in the sole occupation and charge of the undertakers.

Where transformers are attached to street poles they shall be securely fixed thereto at a height of at least 18 feet above ground, and shall be provided with switches and fusible cut-outs placed in the lead and return of the high-pressure or extra high-pressure conductors, in such a manner that the transformer can be completely disconnected from the supply mains, and the whole apparatus shall be enclosed in a watertight covering, which, if of metal, and within the reach of any person without the aid of a ladder or other appliance, shall be efficiently connected to earth, and necessary precautions shall be taken to render it impossible for the low-pressure or secondary conductors to receive current from the high-pressure or primary conductors.

CONSUMER'S PREMISES.

42. *Responsibility of undertakers for their lines, &c., on consumer's premises.*—The undertakers shall be responsible for all electric lines, fittings, and apparatus belonging to them or under their control, which may be upon a consumer's premises, being maintained in a safe condition and in all respects fit for supplying energy.

43. *Fire risks.*—In delivering the energy to a consumer's terminals the undertakers shall exercise all due precautions so as to avoid risk of causing fire on the premises.

44. *Main fuses or disconnectors.*—A suitable safety fuse or other automatic disconnector shall be inserted in each service line within a consumer's premises as close as possible to the point of entry, and contained within a suitable locked or sealed receptacle of fireproof construction, except in cases where the service line is protected by fuses in a street box.

45. *Treatment of electric lines and apparatus on consumer's premises.*—All electric lines and apparatus placed on a consumer's premises shall be highly insulated and thoroughly protected against injury to the insulation or access of moisture, and any metal forming part of the electric circuit shall not, unless efficiently connected with earth, be exposed so that it can be touched. All electric lines shall be so fixed and protected as to prevent the possibility of electrical discharge to any adjacent metallic substance.

46. *Transformers and high-pressure apparatus to be enclosed in metal, &c.*—Where the general supply of energy is a high-pressure supply, and transforming apparatus is installed on a consumer's premises, the whole of the high-pressure service lines, conductors, and apparatus, including the transforming apparatus itself so far as they are on the consumer's premises, shall be completely enclosed in solid walls, or in strong metal casing efficiently connected with earth, and securely fastened throughout.

47. *Connexion to consumer's premises not to be made where leakage would result.*—The undertakers shall not connect the wires and fittings on a consumer's premises with their mains unless they are reasonably satisfied that the connexion would not cause a leakage from those wires and fittings exceeding one ten thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises; and where the undertakers decline to make such connexion they shall serve upon the consumer a notice stating their reasons for so declining.

48. *Discontinuance of supply on discovery of leakage on consumer's premises.*—If the undertakers are reasonably satisfied, after making all proper examination by testing or otherwise, that a leakage exists at some part of a circuit of such extent as to be a source of danger, and that such leakage does not exist at any part of the circuit belonging to the undertakers, then and in such case any officer of the undertakers, duly authorized by them in writing, or, if the undertakers so require, an electric inspector may, for the purpose of discovering whether the leakage exists at any part of a circuit within or upon any consumer's premises, by notice require the consumer at some reasonable time after the service of the notice to permit him to inspect and test the wires and fittings belonging to the consumer and forming part of the circuit.

In any case where the undertakers require the services of an electric inspector under this regulation they shall pay him the prescribed fee.

If, on such testing, the officer or the electric inspector discovers a leakage from the consumer's wires exceeding one ten thousandth part of the maximum supply current to the premises, or if the consumer does not give all due facilities for inspection and testing, the undertakers shall forthwith discontinue the supply of energy to the premises in question, giving immediate notice of the discontinuance to the consumer, and shall not recommence the supply until they are reasonably satisfied that the leakage has been removed. This Regulation shall not affect any power contained in the Order or otherwise enabling the undertakers to discontinue the supply.

49. *Appeal to electric inspector.*—If any consumer is dissatisfied with the action of the undertakers in refusing to give or in discontinuing or in not recommencing the supply of energy to his premises, the wires and fittings may, on his application and on payment of the prescribed fee, be tested for the existence of leakage by an electric inspector.

This Regulation shall be indorsed on every notice given under the provisions of either of the two last preceding Regulations.

ARC LIGHTING.

50. *Arc lamps to be guarded.*—All arc lamps shall be so guarded as to prevent pieces of ignited carbon or broken glass falling from them, and shall not be used in situations where there is any danger of the presence of explosive dust or gas.

51. *Height from ground.*—Arc lamps used in any street for public lighting, except where suspended over the roadway, shall be so fixed as not to be in any part at a less height than 10 feet from the ground. If suspended over the roadway of any street, arc lamps shall be so fixed as not to be in any part at a less height than 20 feet from the ground.

52. *Cut-off switch.*—Arc lamps used in any street for private lighting shall be fixed so as not to be in any part at a less height than 8 feet from the ground, and shall be so screened as to prevent risk of contact with persons. A cut-off switch shall be provided for every such high-pressure arc lamp, and such switch shall be of such pattern and construction as will provide—

- (a) That the lamp can by its means be entirely disconnected from the supply circuit;
- (b) That the switch itself can be safely operated in the dark without special precautions; and
- (c) That there shall be no danger of any injurious electrical arcing, sparking, or heating being caused by the operation of the switch.

53. *Penalties for default.*—If the undertakers make default in complying with any of the preceding Regulations, they shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £10 for every such default, and to a daily penalty not exceeding £10.

The recovery of a penalty under these Regulations shall not affect the liability of the undertakers to make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of the default.

These Regulations are made subject to the power of the Governor in Council to make such further or other Regulations as he may think expedient, and nothing in these Regulations shall be construed to authorize the undertakers to lay any electric line or work their undertaking otherwise than in accordance with the *Electric Light and Power Act 1896* and the Order granted to them.

And the Honorable John Gavan Duffy, Her Majesty's Postmaster-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alteration in the Dress Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

1. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

3. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. 5. Orders must receive prompt execution; and, in the event of the goods not being delivered within the time allowed under the contract, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officers named in Condition 4, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

6. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form as soon as possible after delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being accompanied by the receipted delivery orders on which it is based. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such stores may be returned to the contractor.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 5.

9. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD.

By-Law No. 36.

A By-law of the Borough of Daylesford, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890* and section 46 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, and numbered 36, for regulating the hours during which and conditions on which traction and locomotive engines and rollers impelled by steam or electricity may proceed over the roads within the Borough of Daylesford.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890* and section 46 of the *Local Government Act 1891*, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Daylesford do order as follows:—

1. No person shall drive along any road within the Borough of Daylesford any traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity if its weight exceeds 10 tons, or so that the same engine or roller shall push or haul over any road in the said borough any tender or other vehicle if the weight of such tender or other vehicle including its loading exceeds 10 tons, or if the minimum width of tire of such tender or other vehicle be less than 4 inches, or so that any part of the said engine or roller shall be or remain upon the same bay, span, or arch of any bridge or culvert within the said borough at the same time as the tender or other vehicle, or any part thereof, pushed or hauled by the said engine or roller unless the joint weight of the whole train including the engine do not exceed 10 tons. And no traction or locomotive engine or roller impelled by steam or electricity shall proceed along or over any road within the said borough before the hour of Eight p.m. or after the hour of Six a.m.

2. Every such locomotive engine or traction engine shall be preceded when at work by a man at least 100 yards in advance of such engine, who shall carry with him a red flag during daylight or a red lamp during darkness to be used as a signal, and the engine shall be stopped at the request of any one riding or driving until they have safely passed, and when passing any horse or vehicle the said engine shall move to the near side of the road. The name and address of the owner shall be painted or written in legible character, and affixed or attached in some visible and conspicuous place on the off side of the engine.

3. The engine whistle must not be used within the borough.
4. Any person offending against this by-law shall for every such offence forfeit a sum of not less than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds.
