SOUTH AFRICAN REPUBLIC.—ALIENS LAW.

THE following translation of the Aliens Law of the South African Republic is published for general information.

SOUTH AFRICAN REPUBLIC.—ALIENS LAW.

WHEREAS it has been found necessary to make Regulations with regard to the admission of aliens into this Republic, it is hereby made known that, in accordance with Article 6 of the Grondwet, the following Regulations have been made:—

Article 1.

All foreigners, other than natives, will be admitted into this Republic, provided they are furnished with a proper foreign passport, given by or on behalf of the Government of the country to which they belong, and viséd by a Consul or Consular Official of the Republic.

Article 2.

Such passports must show that the said foreigner has sufficient means of subsistence, or can obtain such by his work.

Article 3.

Failing the possession of a passport, as aforementioned, foreigners may be admitted on letters of indication, or even on mere mention of their names, provided, however, they can prove their identity, and can show that they can fulfil the conditions laid down in Article 2 to the satisfaction of the authorities named hereafter.

Article 4.

Admission is granted by the Fieldcornet at the place of first arrival, or, on crossing the frontier, by the official appointed by the Government, through the issue of a travelling and residing passport.

Article 5.

Such travelling and residing passport shall be valid for a period of three months, but can each time be renewed for a further three months by the Fieldcornet of the place where the foreigner is residing.

Such renewal can only be refused through non-fulfilment of the requirements laid down in Article 2.

The decision of the Fieldcornet shall be subject to an appeal to the Government.

Article 6.

Foreigners who, when applying for a renewal of their travelling and residing passports, declare that they intend to settle in the republic, need only renew their travelling and residing passports once a year, provided always that they give the required guarantee that they will be obedient to the laws of the country, by making a sworn or other declaration to the satisfaction of the Fieldcornet.

Article 7.

The above Regulations shall not be applicable to foreigners who may be already residing in the Republic on the coming into force of this law, or who have been duly registered according to law, at the Fieldcornet's office, or who may so register themselves within one month.

Article 8.

Travelling and residing passports, as mentioned in this law, must be shown on demand to any Landdrost, Mining Commissioner, Resident Justice of the Peace, or Fieldcornet.

Article 9.

Foreigners who are residing within the Republic contrary to the conditions of this law, and who are not in possession of the necessary travelling and residing passports, can be expelled from the country according to law No. 25 of 1896.

Article 10.

This law shall come into force on the 1st of January, 1897.

UNDER the Regulations made pursuant to the Factories and Shops Acts, the Under-Secretary is the returning officer at elections of Special Boards; and "every candidate as a representative of employers on any Special Board shall be nominated, in writing, by ten electors, and every candidate as a representative of employes on any Special Board shall be nominated, in writing, by twenty-five electors; and every nomination shall contain the written consent of the candidate to his nomination, and the particular branch of the trade (if any) such candidate has a special knowledge of, and shall be delivered or posted to the returning officer so as to reach him before Four o'clock on the day of nomination."

The number of electors on the roll working outside a factory or work-room being greater than one-fifth of the whole number of electors who are employes, electors working outside a factory or work-room will be entitled to nominate candidates and to vote for and elect one member of such Special Board, but will not be entitled to nominate or vote for any person as a representative of persons working inside a factory or work-room; and electors working inside a registered factory or work-room will not be entitled to vote for any person nominated for election as a special representative of persons working outside a registered factory or work-room.

The electors working inside a factory or work-room will be entitled to nominate candidates and to vote for and elect four members of such Special Board.

In the event of the number of persons nominated either as representatives of employers or as representatives of employes exceeding five (the number to be elected), the day for taking the poll (by voting-papers) will be Friday, the 19th day of February, 1897.

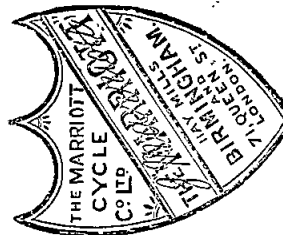

INTENDING candidates must give notice of their intention, in writing, and must forward to the Board documentary evidence that they have complied with the following preliminary conditions; and, upon their applications being approved by the Board, shall pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. to the Secretary of the Board.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

A candidate whose application shall have been approved as showing that he has complied with any of the above conditions will be eligible for examination, but certificates will not be issued to candidates under 21 years of age. After 1st March, 1897, no candidate will be admitted to examination under the age of nineteen years.

Australasian Federation Enabling Act 1896.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE CONDUCT OF THE ELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVES OF VICTORIA AT THE AUSTRALASIAN FEDERATION CONVENTION.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-first day of January, 1897.

WHEREAS by the *Australasian Federation Enabling Act 1896* (59 Vict. No. 1443) it is among other things enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may make Regulations prescribing the mode of nominating candidates, of holding elections of representatives of Victoria, of receiving and recording the vote of any person who attends at the place of polling on the day appointed for the election and who through no default on his part has been unable to record his vote during the hours fixed for such purpose, and of submitting the acceptance or rejection of the Constitution to the electors, and generally for the purpose of carrying into effect such provisions of the said Act as relate to Victoria : Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the powers contained in the said Act, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say :—

REGULATIONS.

- Interpretation. -1. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context—
 “ Act ” means the *Australasian Federation Enabling Act 1896*.
 “ Electoral District ” means an electoral district as defined in the Seventeenth Schedule to *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1890*.
 “ Returning Officer ” means the person for the time being appointed as returning officer under the provisions of section 40 of the Act.
- Returning officer to make declaration. First Schedule. 2. The returning officer, before he enters upon any of his duties as returning officer at the election of members of the Convention as representatives of Victoria, shall make and sign before some justice a declaration in the form in the First Schedule to these Regulations, and such declaration, when duly made and attested, shall be forwarded to the Chief Secretary.
- Writ. 3. The writ issued to the returning officer under the provisions of section 40 of the Act shall be made returnable within twenty-one days after the day fixed by proclamation for the election, and shall specify the day of nomination (being the day before which nominations of candidates at and for the election must be made) and the day for taking the poll in the event of such election being contested (being the day fixed for the election as aforesaid).
- Receipt of nomination papers and deposits. 4. Forthwith on the receipt by the returning officer or his substitute as hereinafter provided of such writ the returning officer or his substitute shall indorse thereon the date of such receipt, and shall also give public notice, by advertisement in some newspaper circulating in each electoral district, of the purport of the said writ and of the day of nomination and the day of polling respectively mentioned therein, and also of a place to be appointed by such returning officer at which he will receive the nomination papers and the payments mentioned in section 8 of the Act.
- Substitute. 5. The returning officer may by writing under his hand appoint some one of the deputy returning officers appointed pursuant to the provisions of section 40 of the Act to be the substitute of the returning officer.
- Powers of the substitute. 6. Such substitute shall have the like powers of doing, acting, or suffering any act or thing relating to the election aforesaid as and for the returning officer that a substitute for a returning officer for an electoral district has at an election of a member of the Legislative Assembly.
- Attendance of returning officer. 7. The returning officer shall in person or by such substitute attend at reasonable hours in the daytime in the interval between the receipt of such writ as aforesaid and the day of nomination at the place appointed as aforesaid to receive nomination papers and payments.
- Returning officer to post names of candidates. 8. The returning officer shall, upon each day between the receipt by him of such writ as aforesaid and the day of nomination mentioned in such writ, cause to be posted and kept posted in some public and conspicuous position outside the place so named as aforesaid for receiving the nomination papers the names and descriptions of all persons who shall previously to such posting have duly become candidates for such election.

9. Any eligible person may be nominated in manner following (that is to say) :—After the issue of the writ and before six o'clock in the evening of the day preceding the day of nomination there shall at the place so appointed for the purpose as aforesaid be delivered to the returning officer or to his substitute (who shall if required give a receipt for the same) a nomination paper in the form in the Second Schedule to these Regulations naming such person as a candidate by his full name with particulars of his address and occupation and signed by the persons nominating such candidate as required by the Act and having at the foot thereof a statement under the hand of the person so nominated that he consents to such nomination; and such person or some person for him or on his behalf shall as required by the Act at the time of the delivery of such paper pay to the returning officer or his substitute the sum of Fifty pounds. How candidate to be nominated. Second Schedule.
10. If on the nomination day or on any day between that day and the expiration of the time appointed within which candidates may retire the number of persons who shall have been duly nominated in accordance with the provisions of the Act and of these Regulations shall not then exceed ten, the returning officer shall forthwith report in writing under his hand to the Chief Secretary and indorse on the writ the names of such persons as duly elected and return such writ, and the Chief Secretary shall certify in the form in the Third Schedule to these Regulations the result of the election and shall publish a copy of such certificate in the *Government Gazette*. Report when ten candidates only are nominated. Third Schedule
11. If the number of persons duly nominated shall exceed ten, the returning officer shall cause to be advertised a list of such persons with the residence and occupation of each in the alphabetical order of their surnames in such newspapers as the Governor in Council may determine and shall also state in such advertisement the day named in the writ for taking the poll. Polling.
12. The number of clear days before the day of polling before which any candidate may sign and deliver to the returning officer pursuant to the provisions of the Act a notice that such candidate retires shall be eight. When candidates may retire.
13. If the number of persons who have been duly nominated and who have not duly retired shall exceed ten, a poll shall be taken on the day named in the writ.
14. If a poll is to be taken the following Regulations shall apply.
15. Such poll shall be taken at every polling place appointed under *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1890* for the purpose of elections of members of the Legislative Assembly. Where poll to be taken.
16. Deputy returning officers shall be appointed to act for the returning officer and take the poll at each booth of the several polling places, and likewise to act for and take the poll at any polling booth during the temporary absence of the deputy presiding at such booth or in the absence through illness or other unavoidable cause of such deputy. As many of such deputy returning officers as there are electoral districts shall be designated chief deputies and be appointed each for some one electoral district. Each such chief deputy shall, in addition to the powers and duties of a deputy returning officer, have the powers and carry out the duties hereinafter mentioned in these Regulations. Such poll clerks shall be appointed as may be necessary to assist the returning officer and his deputies to take the poll. Deputy returning officers. Chief deputies. Poll clerks.
17. Every deputy returning officer and poll clerk shall be under the direction of the returning officer, and shall act at the polling booth which the returning officer shall assign to him. Every deputy returning officer shall, in addition to the powers conferred and the duties imposed by these Regulations, have the powers and carry out the duties *mutatis mutandis* of a deputy returning officer at elections of members of the Legislative Assembly. Powers and duties of deputies, &c.
18. Every deputy returning officer and poll clerk shall, before he enters upon any of the duties assigned to him, make and sign before some justice a declaration in the form in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations; and the said justice shall attest the declaration, and every such declaration when duly made and attested shall be forwarded to the returning officer. Declaration. Fourth Schedule
19. Forthwith after the nomination day the returning officer shall cause ballot-papers in the form in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations to be printed with the christian names and surnames in full of all the candidates at such election and of no other persons; and shall, by himself or his chief deputies, sign or initial a sufficient number of such ballot-papers to be used as hereinafter mentioned; and if the christian names and surnames of any two or more candidates be the same they shall be distinguished upon such ballot-papers by the addition of their residence and occupation; and the directions and instructions in the said Schedule shall be of the same force as if they had been provisions contained in these Regulations. The returning officer or his chief deputies shall before the day of polling forward to each deputy and themselves retain a sufficient number of such ballot-papers for the use of the electors entitled to vote at each polling booth. Ballot-papers. Fifth Schedule.
20. The returning officer shall obtain as polling booths the use of suitable rooms or buildings by hiring or otherwise, or, if he deem it necessary, may cause to be erected booths for the purpose of taking the said poll. In determining whether one, two, or more booths shall be provided at one polling place he shall be guided by the practice adopted in the particular polling place to secure sufficient accommodation for voters at elections of members of the Legislative Assembly, and if under this Regulation there shall be more than one booth at any polling place, there shall be affixed over the entrance of each booth in succession so many letters of the alphabet, in their alphabetical order, as shall denote the booth at which each voter, according to the initial letter of his surname, is to vote; and in such case no voter shall vote in any booth Booths to be provided.

save that which is so denoted by the initial letter of his surname. Provided always that no polling booth shall be in any house licensed for the sale of fermented or spirituous liquors, or upon the premises appertaining to such house.

- How booths to be arranged and fitted. 21. Each booth shall be so divided or arranged that there shall be in the same one or more inner compartments opening only into that part of the booth in which the ballot-box is kept; and the deputy returning officer or assistant deputy shall provide in every such compartment pencils, or pens and ink, for the use of the voters; and shall also provide for each booth a ballot-box having a lock and key and with a cleft or opening therein capable of receiving the ballot-papers herein mentioned.
- Notification of polling booths. 22. The returning officer shall cause to be advertised in some newspaper circulating in each electoral district, and where he considers it necessary in some newspaper circulating in a division of a district, the polling booths in such district or division at which the poll will be taken.
- Deputies to be furnished with rolls. 23. Before the day of polling the returning officer shall cause to be delivered to each of the deputies for use at each polling booth copies of all rolls in force for the division of the electoral district within which such booth is situated, certified under his hand or that of his substitute, or of a chief deputy, to be true copies.
- Hours of polling. 24. The polling at the election shall commence on the day appointed for the same at eight o'clock in the forenoon and shall, unless lawfully adjourned, finally close at seven o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.
- Where vote is to be recorded. 25. The polling place at which any person qualified and entitled to vote at the election shall record his vote shall be a polling place at which such person would be entitled to vote at a general election of members of the Legislative Assembly.
- Procedure at polling, &c. 26. The practice in respect to the manner of tendering a vote, the duty of the returning officer or deputy when a vote is tendered, the questions (in addition to the question specified in section 39 of the Act) to be put to an elector by a returning officer or deputy, the marking of the ballot-paper the roll and the elector's right, and the recording of an elector's vote and the casting vote of the returning officer shall be that followed in the election of members of the Legislative Assembly.
- Duty of deputy after close of poll. 27. Every deputy returning officer presiding at any polling booth shall immediately upon the close of the poll ascertain the number of votes for each candidate at such booth, and transmit a list thereof, with separate sealed parcels of the ballot-papers, rolls, and papers used by him, to the chief deputy returning officer of the electoral district in which such polling booth is situated in like manner as a deputy is required to make out and transmit to the returning officer of an electoral district a list and parcels at an election of a member of the Legislative Assembly.
- Duty of chief deputy after close of poll. 28. Every chief deputy returning officer shall likewise ascertain the number of votes for each candidate at the booth at which he presides, and from the list made out by him and the lists received from the deputy returning officers make out a general list showing the total number of votes received by each candidate at all the polling booths in the electoral district for which he is appointed, and shall transmit such general list to the returning officer with the several lists relating to each polling booth within the electoral district, and shall likewise forward to the returning officer the several sealed parcels of ballot-papers, rolls, and papers relating to the polling booth at which such deputy took the poll, and likewise those which have been transmitted to him by the deputy returning officers within the district.
- Duties of returning officer. 29. The returning officer or his substitute shall preside and take the poll at some one booth as he shall think fit, and immediately after the close of the poll shall make out a list of the votes received by each candidate at such booth, and shall seal up separate parcels of the ballot-papers, rolls, and papers relating to such booth.
- Report and publication of result of election. Sixth Schedule. 30. The returning officer shall make up from the list made out as provided in the preceding Regulation, and from the general lists transmitted to him by the chief deputy returning officers, the general state of the poll, and shall as soon as conveniently may be after the taking of the poll report to the Chief Secretary in the form in the Sixth Schedule to these Regulations the result of the election, and shall publish in some Melbourne daily newspaper a copy of such report; and the names of the persons elected shall likewise be indorsed on the writ by the returning officer; and such writ shall thereupon be returned by the returning officer.
- Certificate of result. Third Schedule. 31. As soon as conveniently may be after the return of the writ and the receipt by the Chief Secretary of such report the Chief Secretary shall, in the form in the Third Schedule to these Regulations, certify the result of such election, and shall publish a copy of such certificate in the *Government Gazette*.
- Provision as to persons unable to vote during fixed hours. 32. When at the hour for closing the poll there are persons within or outside any polling booth waiting to record their votes, who through no default on their part have been unable to record their votes during the hours fixed for taking the poll, the returning officer or deputy shall take down in writing the names of such persons, if so requested by them at the time, and shall either forthwith or during specified hours on the day following allow such persons if duly qualified to record their votes. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations the result of the poll shall not be ascertained until opportunity has been given to such persons to record their votes as herein provided.

33. The packets of parcels which, in the case of an election of a member of the Legislative Assembly are required to be forwarded to the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly, shall in the case of the election under the Act be forwarded by the returning officer to the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly, to be by him safely kept until the petitions (if any) against the validity of the election have been finally dealt with.

Disposal of papers.

34. If any person having been appointed to act as a deputy returning officer or as a poll clerk at the election, and undertaken so to act is guilty of any wilful misfeasance or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any of these Regulations, or by word or act or any other means whatsoever directly or indirectly divulges or discovers or aids in divulging or discovering for what candidate or candidates any person has voted at the election, save in answer to some question which he is legally bound to answer or in compliance with the express provisions of the law relating to such election, he shall upon conviction be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds, or at the option of the court to be imprisoned for any term not exceeding six months; and the court may and shall hear and determine such charge in a summary way.

Penalty for neglect, &c., by deputy returning officer, &c.

35. All petitions respecting the validity of an election or return shall within fourteen days of the return of the writ be addressed and forwarded to the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly if Parliament be then sitting, or to the Governor in Council if Parliament be not sitting, and shall be forthwith referred by the Speaker or the Governor in Council (as the case may be) to the Committee authorized under section 15 of the Act to determine as to such validity.

Petitions.

36. The election shall not be liable to be questioned by reason only of any defect in the title or any want of title of the person by or before whom such election or any polling for the same has been held, if such person has been actually appointed to preside or has been acting in the office giving the right so to preside at such election. The election shall not be void in consequence only of there having been no returning officer at the time of the issue of the writ or of any delay in the return of the writ; and where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened, the Governor in Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission; or may declare any or all of the proceedings at or for the election valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*.

SHIRES OF BALLAN AND BACCHUS MARSH.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the Local Government Act 1890 (No. 1112, section 43), the substance and prayer of a Petition, in accordance with the 10th section of Act 1243 and the 41st section of Act 1112, which has been presented to His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published, viz.:

The petitioners purport to constitute a majority of the ratepayers in the portion of the shire of Ballan described in their petition, and they desire that the area so described may be severed from the said shire of Ballan and annexed to the shire of Bacchus Marsh.

Area described in petition is as follows:—Commencing at the junction of the Myrning Creek and the Werribee River; thence northerly by the said creek to the south boundary of allotment 32 of section 7, parish of Blackwood; thence easterly by a road to the south-east angle of the said allotment; thence northerly by a portion of the western boundary of the shire of Bacchus Marsh to a point in the centre of the Bacchus Marsh and Blackwood road north of the north angle of allotment 54 of the said section; thence westerly by the northern boundary line of allotment 14 of section 8, in the said parish, to the north-west angle of said allotment 14; thence further westerly by a direct line to a point in the Dale's Creek, which point is at the extreme northern angle of allotment 2, section 1X.A, of said parish; thence southerly by the said creek to a road forming the western boundary of village allotment 14 of section 7, township of Greendale; thence southerly by the said last-mentioned road to another road forming the northern boundary of section 2 of said township; thence westerly by the said last-mentioned road to the north-west angle of said section 2; thence north-westerly by a street called Prince-street, forming the north-east boundary of sections 3 and 4 of said township, to a road known as High-street, which forms the north-western boundary of said section 4; thence southerly by High-street aforesaid to the main Government road from Ballan; thence westerly by the said main Government road from Ballan to its intersection with the said main Government road from Ballan to its intersection with the Korjammunip Creek; thence southerly by the said Korjammunip Creek to its intersection with the Werribee River; thence easterly by the said Werribee River to the commencing point.

The petitioners state that Bacchus Marsh is the principal market town for them, that the roads to and from Bacchus Marsh are more extensively used by them than those to and from Ballan, and they consider that, by the annexation, the roads within the area above described would be better maintained by the shire of Bacchus Marsh than they are at present.

The petitioners therefore humbly pray that His Excellency in Council may be pleased to sever that portion of the shire of Ballan above described, and annex same to the Pentland Hills Riding of the Shire of Bacchus Marsh.

ROCHESTER WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Rochester Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION No. 5.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the said Trust for the year 1897:—

1. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds municipal value and under, a rate of One pound per annum.
 2. For every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of the annual municipal value of Twenty-one pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.
 3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust District before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Two shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.
 4. A minimum rate of Ten shillings and a maximum rate of Four pounds (as the Commissioners may determine) to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year, in addition to the rate upon the annual municipal value.
 5. On every horse-trough, a charge of One pound per annum.
 6. Water supplied to the Government departments and religious denominations shall be by measurement or special agreement.
 7. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st January, 1897, and 1st July, 1897.
 8. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

ELMHURST CRICKET AND RECREATION RESERVE.—ADDITIONAL REGULATION.

WH. James Wise, Alexander Sanderson, and William Webster, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Elmhurst Cricket and Recreation Reserve, having framed the following additional Regulation for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulation to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:

REGULATION.

The maximum scale of fees which may be charged and taken for admission to the reserve on such days, not exceeding (12) twelve in any one year, as the reserve may be set apart for sports or holiday amusements, shall be as follows:—

For admission of every adult, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding One shilling. For admission of every horse or vehicle, such a sum as the Committee of Management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

Every person offending against this Regulation shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against such Regulation, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

5.
