DETERMINATION OF SPECIAL BOARD APPOINTED TO DETERMINE THE LOWEST PRICE OR RATE OF PAYMENT FOR BREAD MAKING OR BAKING.

REGULATIONS FOR THE AGISTMENT OF STOCK IN VICTORIA IMPORTED ON DEPOSIT OF DUTY.

TOCK may be imported into Victoria across the border for the purpose of being agisted on the following conditions:—

1. Application must be first made, in writing, to the Head of the Department, giving all particulars as to brands, sexes, ownership, and general description of the stock desired to be introduced under these regulations, and stating where they are at the time of making such application and the exact locality and situation of the paddock in which it is intended to pasture them.

2. Such application will only be granted when the animals are intended to be pastured on specified land, either owned or bond fide in the occupancy of the owners of the stock sought to be introduced.

3. Duty on such stock must be deposited with the stock of the

fide in the occupancy of the owners of the stock sought to be introduced.

3. Duty on such stock must be deposited with the customs officer at the time of importation.

4. A bond must be executed by the owner of the stock conditioned that such stock shall not be removed from the paddocks in Victoria in which they are intended to be depastured without the approval of the Minister, and also for the return of the identical stock brought over, and the due and faithful observance of these regulations.

5. The animals are to be under the supervision of the customs officers, who shall have constant access to them. The cost of such supervision to be paid by the owner.

6. The animals must be trucked by railway from the border to the railway station nearest their destination, and must be trucked on their return.

7. If at any time these regulations shall cease to be observed by the owners of stock introduced thereunder, the duty deposited shall be immediately brought to account and forfeited to the consolidated revenue, and no refund will be made.

8. No allowance will be made for the death of any of the stock introduced hereunder.

8. No allowance will be made for the death of any of the stock introduced hereunder.

9. The time allowed for depasturing in Victoria shall in no case exceed six months, and at the expiration of six months from the date of introduction—if the animals have not been exported or otherwise satisfactorily accounted for—the duty deposited upon them shall be paid into the Consolidated Revenue as and for the duty payable on such stock.

10. No relaxation of the preceding Regulations will be permitted, and the same will be strictly enforced.

11. The Minister reserves the right to refuse any application made and revoke this permit at any time without assigning any cause therefor.

12. No person who has been concerned in any evasion of the Customs laws will be considered eligible for a permit to introduce stock under these Regulations.

13. Applications under these Regulations will only be granted in the case of persons who are bond fide holders of property on the other side of the border, and who by reason of want of feed on such property are desirous of removing their animals to Victoria for the purpose of keeping them in good condition, and shall not apply to any person but those fulfalling these requirements.





Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 15s, first class, and 10s, second class, and the journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey.
