SIR,

I have the honour to state, for the information of your Government, that an arrangement has been entered into by the Republics of Honduras, Nicaragua, and Salvador, under which the three Republics will form a single political entity for the exercise of their sovereignty abroad, under the name of "The Greater Republic of Central America," and will be represented by a Diet composed of three Members chosen by each of the Legislatures.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

For the Information of Candidates.

1. Appointments to Naval Cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the undermentioned exceptions:—

Six Cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the Colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Service Cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed seven in any one year. Service Cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from (a) sons of officers of the Army, Navy, or Marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury, (b) sons of officers of the Navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the Active List not lower than that of Commander. Not more than three Service Cadets will be nominated annually under Clause (b).

Applications for Service Cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Army; to the Secretary of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Navy or Marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Indian Army.

Colonial and Service Cadets will be entered on passing the test examination as specified in paragraphs 9 and 10, and will in all other respects be subject to these Regulations.

Candidates must be of pure European descent, and the sons either of natural born British Subjects, or of parents naturalized in the United Kingdom.

If any doubt arises upon this question, the burden of clear proof that he is qualified will rest upon the Candidate himself.

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address, Cannon Row, Westminster), who will deal with all questions connected with such examination, and will announce the results. A fee of £1 will be required from each candidate.

2. Except in special circumstances, not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.

3. All nominations of candidates for Naval Cadetships are made by the First Lord, with the exception of a limited number which are at the disposal of individual members of the Board, and of the Secretaries to the Board of Admiralty.

A Flag Officer or a Commodore 1st Class appointed to the chief command of a station, or to a separate command, and a Captain, on first appointment as such to the command of a ship, will be allowed to nominate one candidate, provided the privilege is exercised within six months of appointment, and that the candidate is not less than 12 years of age when nominated. The examination of candidates will not take place until they are eligible by age under Clause 6.

No Captain will be entitled to nominate more than one candidate during the time he holds the rank of Captain, but a Flag Officer or a Commodore 1st Class may claim the privilege each time he is appointed to a command as above.

In the event of a candidate's nomination being cancelled before he has commenced the examination, the Officer who nominated him will be allowed to select another candidate for the same or following examination.

4. The nominations will be made three times a year, as soon as convenient after the Report of the last examination has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The examinations will be held in London and at Portsmouth, in March, July, and December, about six weeks before the commencement of each term, and the appointments will date from the 15th January, 15th May, 15th September, following respectively, and the terms will commence as shown in Regulation 15.

6. The limits of age will be gradually increased as follows:—

Candidates must be within these limits of age at the time of entry.

7. Every candidate must be in good health, and free from any physical defect of body, impediment of speech, defect of sight or hearing, and also from any predisposition to constitutional or hereditary disease or weakness of any kind, and in all respects

well developed and active in proportion to his age. Before being examined by the Civil Service Commissioners he will be required to pass the medical examination according to the prescribed regulations, and must have been found physically fit for the Navy; rejection at such examination will finally exclude him from the Navy.

8. The candidate will be required to produce (1) a Registrar's certificate of the date of his birth, or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate (*a certificate of Baptism will not be accepted*); (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.

10. Colonial and Service Cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain not only the proportion of marks in arithmetic and the other test subjects required from the candidates who compete, but also an aggregate of not less than 600 marks in test subjects.

11. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the limits of age at that time. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age.

12. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination, may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.

13. For all Cadets entered under these regulations, the payment will be at the rate of £75 per annum for the period in the *Britannia*, to be paid every term in advance to the Cashier of the Bank of England, on receipt of claim from the Accountant-General of the Navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the Cadets entered at each examination, a number, not to exceed six, being sons of officers of the Navy, Army, or Marines, or of Civil Officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their Lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the Cadet.

Applications for the Reduced Scale must be received at the Admiralty not later than 1st January, 15th April, and 1st September.

14. In addition to the annual payments mentioned in the foregoing paragraph, the parent or guardian will be charged with the personal expenses incurred by the Cadet for washing, repairing boots and clothes, hair cutting, pocket-money, &c.

15. The period of training on board the *Britannia* will be four terms; there will be three terms in each year. The first term of each year will be approximately from 14th January to 14th April, the second from 5th May to 5th August, and from 16th September to 16th December.

"Gardiner's Outlines of English History" (Longman's) has been selected as the present text book for Examination in English History. The subject will be divided into periods as follows:—

1st Period, from the earliest times to A.D. 1603.

2nd Period, from A.D. 1603 to 1820.

Either of these periods may be selected by Candidates at the Examinations in March and July, 1897.

The vacations will be four weeks at Christmas, three weeks at Easter, and six weeks at Midsummer.

- Under revision.
16. (a) Examinations in Seamanship and Study will be held at the end of each term. Cadets who fail to obtain half marks in Seamanship will be "warned," and, should they again fail to pass, they will be liable to be discharged.
- (b) Cadets who pass an unsatisfactory examination at the end of either of the first three terms will be "warned," and they will be liable to be discharged at the end of the following or any subsequent term should they again be reported as failing to obtain the proper number of marks. The requisite standard of marks to be 40 per cent. in the Mathematical subjects, and also in the total.
- (c) Cadets who fail at the final examination to obtain 45 per cent. in the Mathematical subjects, including the Theory of Navigation and Nautical Astronomy, and 40 per cent. in the Technical subjects, combined with Physics and French, will be ordered to be withdrawn.
- (d) Cadets who at any time are reported to the Admiralty for unsatisfactory conduct will be "warned," and, should they be again reported, they will be liable to be discharged. Any Cadet, however, who is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term will be liable to be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the *Britannia*.
- (e) Any Cadet who shall at any time appear to their Lordships to be unfit for the Naval Service, for any reason whatever, will be removed from the *Britannia*, and it must be understood that this rule will apply to those who are considered unfit from insufficient physical development or weakness of constitution, although no actual organic disease may have been developed.

17. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the *Britannia* is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every Cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the Cadet to the *Britannia*) to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the Navy.

18. Cadets will, on passing out of the *Britannia*, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the *Britannia*.

19. The parent or guardian of every Cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.

20. No pay will be allowed by Government to Cadets in the *Britannia*. The pocket-money allowed to Cadets will be charged to the parents.

21. As only Cadets who are able to swim are permitted to use the boats belonging to H.M.S. *Britannia*, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty desire to impress upon parents and guardians the importance of Cadets being taught to swim before they join the Training Ship, so as to enable them to obtain the full benefits of use of the boats.

Health Act 1890.
SHIRE OF VIOLET TOWN.
By-LAW No. 2.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Violet Town, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, hereby make the By-law following and numbered two, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws in force within the said shire on the matter and things herein provided for are hereby repealed.

2. *Interpretation of terms.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them.

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

3. Every occupier or person having the control or management of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

4. Every occupier of land on which is erected any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove or cause to be removed from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards or at least once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the council of said shire may remove the same at the expense of such occupier.

5. Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by mixing therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime, in the proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the premises within 24 hours after such blood is shed.

6. Every occupier of any premises in which there may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same and remove the same from the premises, or cause the same to be deodorized and removed within 24 hours.

7. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof do not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford every means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

8. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once a week at least shall empty or cleanse or cause to be emptied or cleansed every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

10. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Six o'clock p.m. and Six o'clock a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized, and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

11. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

12. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way into any drain or sewer.

13. No person shall place, or assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any waters used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

14. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents thereof may find its way into such water.

15. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the local board or one of its officers.

16. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

17. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

18. Every occupier or licensee or person having the management of a slaughter-house or abattoir, shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

19. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building, and every tenant of a building under lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

20. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Violet Town, and shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

21. If any person commit a breach of any of the sections of this by-law numbered two, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by the by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

REGULATION No. 4.

REGULATION for the making of a graduated rate, under Part III. of the *Water Act 1890*, on all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District:—

1. A rate is hereby made for the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the Bacchus Marsh Irrigation and Water Supply Trust:—

In the Werribee Division, Three shillings in the pound sterling.

In the Parwan Division, One shilling in the pound sterling. In the Urban Division, One shilling and sixpence in the pound sterling (except on tenements not used as a domicile, on which the rate will be Three and a half per cent. on the annual value, with a minimum of One pound) respectively, on the annual value of all rateable property within the said divisions of the said district of the said Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situated.

2. Such rate is made for the year 1897, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1897.

3. Such rate is made payable on the 2nd day of January, 1897, and the 1st day of July, 1897.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. For all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District the water rate for 1897 shall be One shilling and ninepence in the One pound on the municipal valuation for the year 1896-7, with a minimum charge of One pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Eleven pounds, except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 120 of the *Water Act 1890*.

2. All rates and charges on lands and tenements having no water meters shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, that is to say, on 1st January and 1st July, 1897. And all rates and charges on lands and tenements where water meters are affixed, payments shall be due and payable at the end of each quarter, that is to say, on the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, 1897. All payments shall be payable at the Trust's offices, Town Hall, Wilson-street, Horsham.

Defences and Discipline Act 1890.

VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the second day of April, 1897.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART IV.—MOUNTED RIFLES.

Section III.—Medical and Veterinary Staff.

Paragraph 5 is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

"5. At any military station where the services of a medical officer of the Victorian Mounted Rifles are not available, the medical officer attached to any other corps at the station will be required to give professional attendance to the warrant and non-commissioned officers permanently employed in accordance with Part III., section III., paragraph 8 of these Regulations; where the services of such medical officers are not available, arrangements may be made, in cases of great urgency, for the services of a civil practitioner, and in such cases a medical certificate stating the nature of the sickness must be obtained and forwarded, together with a report, to the Commanding Officer, Victorian Mounted Rifles, within three days of the commencement of such attendance, otherwise no claim for expenses incurred will be on any account entertained."

PART V.—VICTORIAN RANGERS.

Section III.—Victorian Rangers.—Medical Staff.

Paragraph 5 is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

"5. At any military station where the services of a medical officer of the Victorian Rangers are not available, the medical officer attached to any other corps at the station will be required to give professional attendance to the warrant and non-commissioned officers permanently employed in accordance with Part III., section III., paragraph 8 of these Regulations; where the services of such medical officer are not available, arrangements may be made, in cases of great urgency, for the services of a civil practitioner, and in such cases a medical certificate stating the nature of the sickness must be obtained and forwarded, together with a report, to the Commanding Officer, Victorian Rangers, within three days of the commencement of such attendance, otherwise no claim for expenses incurred will on any account be entertained."

PART VII.

Section II.—"Command, Rank, and Precedence."

To the sub-section headed "Precedence of Warrant and Non-Commissioned Officers" the following new paragraph is hereby added, viz.:—

6. "Armament artificers and blacksmiths on enlistment will receive the rank of sergeant; after three years as sergeant, company sergeant-major; after four years as company sergeant-major, quartermaster-sergeant."

"Second-class warrant officer, one per establishment on special recommendation of the Inspector of Ordnance Machinery to Commandant through the Commanding Officer of the Victorian Permanent Artillery."

"Assistant armament artificers are selected from gunners, and will receive pay under paragraph 19, Part I., section II. of Financial and Stores Regulations, and on appointment will receive the rank of gunner; after three years as gunner, bombardier; after three years as bombardier, corporal."

"The above ranks and their retention will be subject to the recommendation of the Inspector of Ordnance Machinery and passing an examination in ordnance machinery."

"Armament artificers holding warrant rank will require to pass an examination every three years."

"These ranks will be in excess of the present establishment of ranks of the Victorian Permanent Artillery, and no increase of pay can be claimed."

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Acts it is enacted that, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others, to sever any portion of Victoria forming part of a municipal district from such municipal district, and annex the same to any other municipal district with which the portion so severed forms one continuous area, and from time to time make any apportionment of property rights and liabilities, and give any directions as to any matters and things that may be necessary to do justice as between the municipalities concerned; and that every such Order shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and shall take effect as from the day of such publication: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the said Acts are now exercised upon a petition signed by a majority of the rate-payers of a portion of the West Riding of the Shire of Borung, with regard to a certain area therein described, notices of such petition having been published in the manner prescribed in the said Acts: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever from the Shire of Borung the portion described in such petition, being portion of the West Riding of the said shire, and doth annex the portion so severed from such shire to the North Riding of the Shire of Wimmera; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth re-define the boundaries of the said Shire of Borung and of the several ridings thereof, including the West Riding as hereby reduced, and the boundaries of the said Shire of Wimmera and of the several ridings thereof, including the North Riding as hereby enlarged, in the manner set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

SHIRE OF BORUNG REDUCED AND RE-DEFINED.

Commencing at a point on the Yarriambiack Creek at the south-west angle of allotment 36, parish of Kewell East; thence northerly by that creek to the south-east angle of allotment 59, parish of Werriagar; thence north-westerly by a road being the north boundary of allotments 60, 63, 63A, 67A, 67C, 67B, and 67A to the south-east angle of the parish of Cannum; thence westerly by the south boundary of that parish to its south-west angle; thence north by the western boundary of the parishes of Cannum, Yellangip, and Willenabrana to the north-west angle of the parish last named; thence east by the northern boundary of the parishes of Willenabrana, Batchica, and Beyer to the north-west angle of mallee allotment 117A of parish last named; thence south to the south-west angle of mallee allotment 123B; thence east by the south boundary of that allotment to its south-east angle; thence south by the western boundary of mallee allotment 123F to its south-west angle; thence north-easterly by the southern boundary of mallee allotments 123F and 123C to the south-east angle of allotment last named; thence south by the western boundary of mallee allotment 122 to its south-west angle; thence east by south boundary of allotment last named and a 3-chain road to the north-west angle of the parish of Watchem; thence south by the western boundary of that parish and the parishes of Carion, and part of Laen, to a road forming the north boundary of allotment 78A, parish of Dunmunkle; thence west by that road to the south-west angle of allotment 56B; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 105B; thence south-westerly by the Minyip to Donald road to a road forming the south boundary of allotment 120, parish of Nullan; thence west by that road to the south-west angle of allotment 127; thence north-westerly by a road to a road forming the north boundary of allotment 134; thence west, north-westerly, and west by that road to the commencing point.

West Riding Reduced and Re-defined.

East Riding Unaltered.

Commencing at a point on the south boundary of the shire where it is intersected by the eastern boundary of the parish of Dunmunkle; thence following said shire boundary westerly to the east boundary of the parish of Nullan; thence north and west by the east and north boundaries of said parish to the south-west angle of the parish of Bangerang; thence north by the west boundary of that parish and the parish of Beyer to the northern boundary of the shire; thence following the shire boundary easterly and southerly to the point of commencement.

SHIRE OF WIMMERA ENLARGED AND RE-DEFINED.

All shops in the municipal district of the Shire of North Ovens (other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*) shall be closed on Wednesday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

(2) That such work will be of a pioneer character, and of national importance.

(3) That the monetary assistance granted by the Government shall not exceed one-half of the actual expenditure.

(4) That such company, syndicate, or individual shall defray all liabilities in the first instance, the Government to refund such portion of expenditure as agreed, upon receipt from the said company, syndicate, or individual of approved vouchers.

(5) That a sum not exceeding £270 may be expended on the construction of a dam at Woolshed Flat, for the purpose of providing a supply of water for mining requirements.

VICTORIA by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen Defender of the Faith to all to whom these presents shall come greeting: Whereas in conformity with the laws relating to the sale and occupation of Crown lands in that portion of our colony of Victoria known as the mallee country border the person hereinafter named ha in consideration of the sum of which sum has been duly paid to us become entitled to a grant in fee simple of the surface and down to the depth of feet below the surface of the land hereinafter described in the mallee country border: Now know ye that in consideration of the sum so paid and in pursuance of the Land Act 1890 as amended by the Land Act 1891 and of the Mallee Lands Act 1896 we do hereby grant unto h heirs and assigns so much and such parts as lie above the depth of feet below the surface of all

that piece of land in the mallee country border in the said colony containing delineated with the measurements and abutments thereof in the map drawn in the margin of these presents and therein coloured yellow: Provided however that the grantee shall be entitled to sink wells for water and to the use and enjoyment of any spring or springs of water upon or within the boundaries of the said land for any and for all purposes as though he held the land without limitation as to depth.

Excepting however unto us our heirs and successors all gold and silver and auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone and all mines containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores whatsoever and all mines seams lodes and deposits containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores in upon and under and within the boundaries of the land hereby granted And also reserving to us our heirs and successors free liberty and authority for us our heirs and successors and our and their agents and servants at any time or times hereafter to enter upon the said land and to search and mine therein for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and all other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to extract and remove therefrom any gold silver and any auriferous and argentiferous earth or stone copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to search for and work dispose of and carry away the gold silver copper tin antimony coal metals minerals and their ores and the mines metals and minerals in the land lying in upon and under the land hereby granted and for the purposes aforesaid to sink shafts make drives erect machinery and to carry on any works and do any other things which may be necessary or usual in mining and with all other incidents that are necessary to be used for the getting of the said gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and the working of all mines seams lodes and deposits containing gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores in upon or under the land hereby granted to hold unto the said h heirs and assigns for ever

Provided always that the said land is and shall be subject to be resumed for mining purposes under section 68 of the Land Act 1890 And provided also that the said land is and shall be subject to the right of any person being the holder of a miner's right or of a licence to search for metals or minerals or of a mining or mineral lease to enter therein and to mine for gold silver copper tin antimony coal and other metals and minerals and mineral ores and to erect and to occupy mining plant or machinery thereon in the same manner and under the same conditions and provisions as those to which the holder of a miner's right or of a mining or mineral lease had at the time of the passing of the Land Act 1890 the right to mine for gold and silver in and upon Crown lands Provided that compensation shall be paid to the said h heirs executors administrators assigns and transferees by such person for surface damage to be done to such lands by reason of mining thereon such compensation to be determined as provided by the 121st section of the said Act and the payment thereof to be a condition precedent to such right of entry.

The journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey. Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 15s. first class and 10s. second class. 1. These Rules and Regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. The office of the Trust shall be open daily (Sunday, Christmas Day, and Good Friday excepted), from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

3. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

4. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees are paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B), which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the trustees, as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

5. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the trustees.

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to Four p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from Two to Five p.m.

10. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

11. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

12. No private grave shall be re-opened, or any interment permitted therein, without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

13. No person employed by the trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the trustees.

14. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from Seven a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

15. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery, unless with the previous authority of the trustees.

16. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

17. No dogs shall be allowed within the cemetery.
