Sin,

I have the honour to state, for the information of your Government, that an arrangement has been entered into by the Republics of Honduras, Nicaragna, and Salvador, under which the three Republics will form a single political entity for the exercise of their sovereignty abroad, under the name of "The Greater Republic of Central America," and will be represented by a Diet composed of three Members chosen by each of the Lorislatures.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING NAVAL CADETS.

For the Information of Candidates.

1. Appointments to Naval Cadetships will be made by limited competition, with the undermentioned exceptions:—

Appointments to Naval Cadetships will be made by limited inpetition, with the undermentioned exceptions:—
Six Cadetships given annually to sons of gentlemen in the Colonies, on the recommendation of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.
Service Cadetships, the total number of which is not to exceed seven in any one year. Service Cadets will be selected by the Board of Admiralty from (a) sons of officers of the Army, Navy, or Marines who have been killed in action, or who have been lost at sea on active service, or killed on duty, or who have died of wounds received in action or injuries received on duty within six months from the date of such action or injury, (b) sons of officers of the Navy who have performed long or distinguished service, and who hold or have held rank or relative rank on the Active List not lower than that of Commander. Not more than three Service Cadets will be nominated annually under Clause (b).
Applications for Service Cadetships should be addressed to the Military Secretary, Horse Guards, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Admiralty, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Navy or Marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Office, if the candidate is the son of an officer of the Navy or Marines; and to the Military Secretary, India Army.

Colonial and Service Cadets will be entered on passing the test examination as specified in paragraphs 9 and 10, and will in all other respects be subject to these Regulations.

Candidates must be of pure European descent, and the sons either of natural born British Subjects, or of parents naturalized in the United Kingdom.

If any doubt arises upon this question, the burden of clear proof that he is qualified will rest upon the Candidate himself.

The educational examination of all candidates will be conducted by the Civil Service Commissioners (address, Cannon Row, Westminster), who will deal with all questions connected with such examination, and will announce the results. A fee of £1 will be required from each candidate.

Except in special circumstances, not more than one-third of the number of candidates actually presenting themselves before the Civil Service Commissioners will be entered.

3. All nominations of candidates for Naval Cadetships are made by the First Lord, with the exception of a limited number which are at the disposal of individual members of the Board, and of the Secretaries to the Board of Admiralty.

A Flag Officer or a Commodore 1st Class appointed to the chief command of a station, or to a separate command, and a Captain, on first appointment as such to the command of a ship, will be allowed to nominate one candidate, provided the privilego is exercised within six months of appointment, and that the candidate is not less than 12 years of age when nominated. The examination of candidates will not take place until they are eligible by age under Clause 6.

No Captain will be entitled to nominate more than one candidate during the time he holds the rank of Captain, but a Flag Officer or a Commodore 1st Class may claim the privilege each time he is appointed to a command as above.

In the event of a candidate's nomination being cancelled before he has commenced the examination, the Officer who nominated him will be allowed to select another candidate for the same or following examination.

4. The nominations will be made three times a year, as soon as convenient after the Report of the last examination has been received from the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The examinations will be held in London and at Portsmouth, in March, July, and December, about six weeks before the commencement of each term, and the appointments will date from the 15th January, 15th May, 15th September, following respectively, and the terms will commence as shown in Regulation 15.

The candidate will be required to produce (1) a Registrar's certificate of the date of his birth, or a declaration thereof made before a magistrate (a certificate of Baptism will not be accepted); (2) a certificate of good conduct from the masters of the school or schools at which he may have been educated during the two previous years, or, if educated at home, from his tutor or the clergyman of the parish in which he resides; and (3) proofs of good health.

10. Colonial and Service Cadets will be appointed on passing the test examination; they must, however, obtain not only the proportion of marks in arithmetic and the other test subjects required from the candidates who compute, but also an aggregate of not less than 660 marks in test subjects.

11. A candidate who passes the test examination, but does not succeed in the competition, will be entitled to compete at the next examination, provided he is within the limits of age at that time. A candidate who fails to pass the test will not be entitled to another trial, but he will be allowed to compete at the next examination if he receives a fresh nomination and is still within the limits of age.

12. A candidate who, owing to illness, fails to appear at the examination for which he has obtained his nomination, may receive a second nomination, provided he is still within the limits of age.

13. For all Cadets entered moder these regulations, the payment will be at the rate of £75 per annum for the period in the Britannia, to be paid every term in advance to the Cashier of the Bank, of England, on receipt of claim from the Accountant-General of the Navy. But the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty reserve the power of selecting, from among the Cadets entered at each examination, a number, not to exceed six, being sons of officers of the Navy, Army, or Marines, or of Civil Officers under the Board of Admiralty, with respect to whom the annual payment will be £40 only. In this selection their Lordships will have regard solely to the pecuniary circumstances of the Cadet.

Applications for the Reduced Scale must be received at the Admiralty not later than 1st January, 15th April, and 1st September.

14. In addition to the annual payments mentioned in the fore-going paragraph, the parent or guardian will be charged with the personal expenses incurred by the Cadet for washing, repairing boots and clothes, hair cutting, pocket-money, &c.

(d) Cadets who at any time are reported to the Admiralty for unsatisfactory conduct will be "warned," and, should they be again reported, they will be liable to be discharged. Any Cadet, however, who is reported for unsatisfactory conduct during his final term will be liable to be discharged without being allowed to present himself at the examination for passing out of the Britannia.

(c) Any Cadet who shall at any time appear to their Lordships to be unfit for the Naval Service, for any reason whatever, will be removed from the Britannia, and it must be understood that this rule will apply to those who are considered unfit from insufficient physical development or weakness of constitution, although no actual organic disease may have been developed.

17. It is to be distinctly understood that the period of training on board the *Britannia* is a time of probation, and the parent or guardian of every Cadet will be required to sign a declaration (on the admission of the Cadet to the *Britannia*) to the effect that he shall be immediately withdrawn on the receipt of an official intimation of his being considered unfit for the Navy.

18. Cadets will, on passing out of the *Britannia*, rank according to the amount of sea time they obtain at their final examination, and those who obtain equal amounts of sea time will rank in the order of merit in which they pass out of the *Britannia*.

19. The parent or guardian of every Cadet will be required to provide outfit under the regulations in force.

20. No pay will be allowed by Government to Cadets in the Britannia. The pocket-money allowed to Cadets will be charged to the present. to the parents.

21. As only Cadets who are able to swim are permitted to use the boats belonging to H.M.S. Britannia, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty desire to impress upon parents and guardians the importance of Cadets being taught to swim before they join the Training Ship, so as to enable them to obtain the full benefits of usu of the boats.

Health Act 1890. SHIRE OF VIOLET TOWN. BY-LAW No. 2.

SHIRE OF VIOLET TOWN.

By-law No. 2.

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1899, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President. Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Violet Town, in the Colony of Victoria, being the Municipal Council thereof, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, hereby make the By-law following and numbered two, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws in force within the said shire on the matter and things herein provided for are hereby repealed.

2. Interpretation of terms.—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meaning hereby assigned to them.

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, tootway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

3. Every occupier or person having the control or management of any house or premises shall cause the same to be kept in such a state as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

4. Every occupier of land on which is etceted any stable, shed, sty, yard, or other place for the keeping of animals shall from time to time remove or cause to be removed from such premises all dung, soil, or other manure produced or accumulated thereon as often as the same shall amount to two cubic yards or at least once every week, and in case of the default of such occupier the council of said shire may remove the same at the expense of such occupier, licensee, or person having the management.

5. Every occupier, licensee, or person having the management or control of an abattoir, slaughter-house, or place where any cattle or other animals are killed, shall cause all the blood from the animals killed therein, as soon as conveniently may be, to be collected in a fit receptacle to be provided for that purpose, and to be effectually deodorized by miving therewith commercial sulphate of iron or chloride of lime, in the proportion of one pound to the gallon, or some other efficient deodorizer sufficient to effectually deodorize the same, and to be removed from the promises within 24 hours after such blood is shed.

6. Every occupier of any premises in which there may be any offal shall forthwith effectually deodorize the same and remove the same from the premises, or cause the same to be deodorized and removed within 24 hours.

7. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than three inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and overy such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof do not exceed three cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry carth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises once a week at least shall empty or cleanse or cause to be emptied or cleansed every earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Six o'clock p.m. and Six o'clock a.m., or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized, and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

11. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health.

12. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse mater into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way into any drain or sewer.

13. No person shall place, or assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any waters used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

14. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or

for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any darry, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

14. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any cesspool or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents thereof may find its way into such water.

15. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deedorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated within one week of notice given by the local board or one of its officers.

16. No person shall keep any animal of any kind so as to be a muisance or injurious to health.

17. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy so as to endanger the health of any person using such water or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

18. Every occupier or licensee or person having the management of a slaughter-house or abattor; shall cause the same to be supplied with a sufficient quantity of water for all purposes.

19. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any muisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the immates of such building, and every tenant of a building under loase of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within th

fractic.

21. If any person commit a breach of any of the sections of this by-law numbered two, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued. Provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the said council may be empowered by the by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.







VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part I, of the Defences and Discipline Act 1890 it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the sail Part of the sail Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part, of the said Act, and from time to time annul, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Excentive Council thereof, deth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART IV .- MOUNTED RIFLES.

Section III, -Medical and Veterinary Staff.

Paragraph 5 is cancelled, and the following is substituted

therefor:—

"5. At any military station where the services of a medical officer of the Victorian Mounted Rifles are not available, the medical officer attached to any other corps at the station will be required to give professional attendance to the warrant and non-commissioned officers permanently employed in accordance with Part III., section III., paragraph 8 of these Regulations; where the services of such medical officers are not available, arrangements may be made, in cases of great argency, for the services of a civil practitioner, and in such cases a medical certificate stating the mature of the sickness must be obtained and forwarded, together with a report, to the Commanding Officer, Victorian Mounted Rifles, within three days of the commencement of such attendance, otherwise no claim for expenses incurred will be on any account entertained."

PART V.—VICTORIAN RANGERS.

Section III .- Victorian Rangers .- Medical Staff.

Paragraph 5 is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

"5. At any military station where the services of a medical officer of the Victorian Rangers are not available, the medical officer attached to any other corps at the station will be required to give professional attendance to the warrant and non-commissioned officers permanently employed in accordance with Part III. section III., paragraph S of these Regulations; where the services of such medical officer are not available, arrangements may be unde, in cases of great urgency, for the services of a civil practitioner, and in such cases a medical certificate stating the nature of the sickness must be obtained and forwarded, together with a report, to the Commanding Officer, Victorian Rangers, within three days of the commencement of such attendance, otherwise no claim for expenses incurred will on any account be entertained."

PART VII.

Section II.-" Command, Rank, and Precedence."

To the sub-section headed "Precedence of Warrant and Non-Conmissioned Officers" the following new paragraph is hereby added, viz.:-

- 6. "Armament artificers and blacksmiths on enlistment will receive the rank of sergeant; after three years as sergeant, company sergeant-major; after four years as company sergeant-major, quartermaster-sergeant.
- "Second-class warrant officer, one per establishment on special recommendation of the Inspector of Ordnance Machinery to Commandant through the Commanding Officer of the Victorian Permanent Artillery.
- "Assistant armament artificors are selected from gunners, and will receive pay under paragraph 19, Part I., section II. of Financial and Stores Regulations, and on appointment will receive the rank of gunner: after three years as gunner, bombardier; after three years as bombardier, corporal.
- "The above ranks and their retention will be subject to the recommendation of the Inspector of Ordnance Machinery and passing an examination in ordnance machinery.
- "Armament artificers holding warrant rank will require to pass an examination every three years.
- "These ranks will be in excess of the present establishment of ranks of the Victorian Permanent Artillery, and no increase of pay can be claimed."

6. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths has been delivered to the secretary (gatckeeper or sexton).

7. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

8. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall be not less than 3 feet below that level, and a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

9. The hours for burials shall be:—On week days, September to April inclusive, Ten a.m. to Six p.m.; May to August inclusive, Ten a.m. to frour p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from Eight to Ten a.m., or from


