BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—  
RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:-

1. For all lands and tenements within the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust District the water rate for 1897 shall be One shilling and ninepence in the One pound on the municipal valuation for the year 1896-7, with a minimum charge of One pound upon all lands and tenements valued at or under Eleven pounds, except such as are entitled to the provisions of section 120 of the *Water Act 1890*.

2. All rates and charges on lands and tenements having no water meters shall be due and payable half-yearly in advance, that is to say, on 1st January and 1st July, 1897. And all rates and charges on lands and tenements where water meters are affixed, payments shall be due and payable at the end of each quarter, that is to say, on the 31st March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, 1897. All payments shall be payable at the Trust's offices, Town Hall, Wilson-street, Horsham.

# WARRACKNABEAL WATERWORKS TRUST.— REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which has been proclaimed an Urban District, do hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1880*, make the following Regulation dealing with the supply of water within the said district. The Regulation made by the Trust on the 31st August, 1894, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 20th November, 1894, is hereby repealed:—

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables or troughs, or a supply for steam boilers or for any manufacturing purposes, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground, or trees, or plants, or washing the house walls, or carriage, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged by meter. Syphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2. The charges for water supplied by measure for other than domestic purposes solely shall, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, be at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons; and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

- (a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
- (b) Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
- (c) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
- (d) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
- (e) Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding 1 acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
- (f) And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately, according to the foregoing scale, for every fractional part of an acre.
- (g) In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall, except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust, be the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure.

4. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly, or as may be agreed upon.

5. Any person receiving water from the Trust, who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated within the Urban District, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within the Trust district to have water from any public service-pipe in such district at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each tank of 400 gallons or for any less quantity.

8. The Trust may cause a meter or meters to be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary: such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons, and until it shall have been tested and approved by an officer of the Trust.

9. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of a duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

10. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements, who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

11. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

12. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

13. All service-pipes must be of the best galvanized iron, and not more than 3-inch diameter, except in cases where special permission, in writing, from the Trust or their engineer is given

to increase the size. All pipes must be provided with proper couplings for jointing same, and all joints to be well screwed up and red lead applied to thread of screw. All screws to be properly cut. Connexions to cast-iron mains must be made with proper stop-cock ferrules, to which 3 feet of lead pipe of full weight must be attached. Connexions with lead and iron pipes must be with brass union couplings, and wiped joints.

14. Each service-pipe from cast-iron mains to be supplied with one brass high-pressure stop-cock at the building line; wooden box with cover to be placed over this to prevent dirt getting in. On service-pipes from wrought-iron sub-mains an additional stop-cock shall be affixed at the sub-main.

15. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

16. In no case will one service pipe be allowed to serve two or more houses.

17. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter, or repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust, until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works. And any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

18. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

19. Any person, whether licensed or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Trust, without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

20. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit, unless the necessary repair shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any—and if none, the owner—shall, in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky, or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

21. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not, immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid, make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.

22. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

23. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of these regulations, or fails to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied, or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains, or is not remedied.

24. The water supplied in the waterworks district of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meter, laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said regulations, and not otherwise.

25. In the construction of these regulations the word "Trust" shall mean "The Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust."

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Warracknabeal Waterworks Trust this 12th day of March, 1897.

The journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey. Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 15s. first class and 10s. second class. Adelaide and Brisbane excursion tickets will be available by the express and ordinary trains.

*Luggage.*—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train. Stamped parcels rates will be charged for it. All luggage should be plainly addressed with the owner's name and the station it is for, and have the address so secured that it will not come off.

## EXTRA TRAINS AVAILABLE FOR EXCURSION AND ORDINARY PASSENGERS.

These trains will only stop at certain stations, notice of which will be given at Melbourne and Bendigo respectively. On 15th and 17th April, an extra train, stopping at North Melbourne and at all stations from Braybrook Junction to Bendigo inclusive, will leave Melbourne at 3.35 p.m. **Woodend and Daylesford Line.**—On 15th, 17th, and 19th April, an extra train will leave Daylesford at 7.40 p.m., and return from Woodend at 10 p.m. It will connect with the last passenger train to Melbourne or Bendigo. **Wycheproof Line.**—On 15th, 17th, and 19th April, a passenger train will leave Bendigo for Wycheproof at 5.10 p.m., and Wycheproof for Bendigo at 5 p.m. **Inglewood and Maryborough Line.**—On 15th, 17th, and 19th April, a passenger train will leave Maryborough for Inglewood at 10.35 a.m., and return from Inglewood at 7.20 p.m. **Arcoa Line.**—On 15th and 19th April, the 10.20 p.m. train from Maryborough to Arcoa, returning at 11.20 p.m., will be run the same as on Saturdays.

**North-Western and South-Western Lines.**—From 15th till 21st April inclusive, special booking windows at the south end of Spencer-street station will be open for the issue of tickets. On 16th April, if required, an extra train will leave Melbourne for Geelong, Ballarat, and stations beyond at 6.19 a.m., and on 15th and 19th April (*via* North Geelong) for Ballarat and stations beyond at 10.45 a.m. On 14th, 15th, and 17th April an extra train will leave Melbourne for Ballarat (*via* Bacchus Marsh) at 4.15 p.m., taking passengers for Ballarat and stations beyond. On 15th and 19th April an extra train, stopping at all stations, if required, will leave Ballarat for Melbourne (*via* Bacchus Marsh) at 7.25 p.m. **Ballarat East.**—From 14th till 21st April (both dates inclusive) passengers will not be booked at Ballarat for Ballarat East by any of the trains for Melbourne. **Port Fairy Line.**—On 14th, 15th, and 17th April passengers for the Port Fairy line will require to travel by the special train leaving Melbourne at 4.35 p.m. instead of by the 4.20 p.m. Adelaide express train.

On 15th April, if required, the 1.20 p.m. train to Benalla will be run in two divisions as far as Seymour, the first leaving Melbourne at 1.5 p.m., but not stopping at any station on the Melbourne side of Kilmore East. # ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE SALE COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd day of July, 1893, the Managers of the Sale Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in addition to the Regulations now in force in respect of such Common:—

## REGULATIONS.

(a) Stock for depasturing on the Common shall be registered only for the periods from 1st day of March to 31st day of August, both days inclusive, and from 1st day of September to the last day of February, both days inclusive, in every year; and the fees for such stock shall be payable half-yearly, as provided by the existing Regulations. Any person registering stock at any time between the above-mentioned dates shall be liable for the full fee for the half-yearly period then current.

(b) In the construction, and for the purposes of the Regulations, for management of the Common, the words "Large Cattle" shall mean cows, heifers, oxen, steers, horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, asses, and mules; the words "Small Cattle" shall mean sheep and goats; and the word "Stock" shall mean large or small cattle.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF CERTAIN RESERVES IN OR NEAR THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF WARRNAMBOOL.

THE Council of the Town of Warrnambool, the duly appointed committee of management of Albert Park, Victoria Park, and Flagstaff Hill Recreation Reserve, in the municipal district of Warrnambool, and the other undermentioned reserves, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

## REGULATIONS.

- The parks and reserves shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- No person shall enter or remain in the parks or reserves who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, seats, gates, or erections in any of the parks or reserves, or put offensive matter in the water troughs or reservoirs therein.
- No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in any of the parks or reserves, nor shall fires be lighted therein, except with the consent of the Council in writing.
- No person shall put in any of the parks or reserves any cattle, goats, or pigs, or bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority of the Council in writing.
- No person shall engage in any game or sports, in any of the parks or reserves on Sunday.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in any of the parks or reserves, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the council.

8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the parks or reserves, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of trees and shrubs.

9. No person shall sail, row, or otherwise propel or use any boat, punt, or raft, or other vessel, or shoot, trap, or otherwise destroy any wild fowl upon the waters of Lake Pertobe.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5) for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. Should the Postmaster-General require a larger supply of any article than the quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will be bound to supply the same at the contract rate.

2. The supplies are to be according to sample, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the quality of their several kinds of manufacture. A preference will, however, be given to goods of Victorian manufacture, provided the quality be equal to the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

3. All orders must accompany the goods on delivery, otherwise the goods will not be received. Delivery, as a rule, is to be of the full quantity ordered.

4. Supplies ordered for delivery in Melbourne to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.) within a radius of six miles from the General Post Office.

5. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Controller of Stores, General Post Office.

6. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in condition 5, or the head of the department, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account.

7. The contractor will be required to furnish his account in the prescribed form simultaneously with delivery of the full quantities of goods ordered, the account being rendered with order to which it relates. The prices quoted in the orders cannot be increased.

8. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer named in condition 5. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to; but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof in writing to the officer rejecting the goods.

9. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. All articles rejected must be immediately replaced by the contractor, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in condition 6.

10. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Government, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 6.

11. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of a delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report, to such mulct, not exceeding fifty pounds, as the Postmaster-General may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in condition 5 or from the contractor's security. It will also be in the power of the Postmaster-General, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

12. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognised.

13. *Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

14. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Postmaster-General will neither claim any decrease upon the contract price nor entertain any application from a contractor for any increase to it.

15. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or violated by the importation of stores, &c., by any contracts made by the Imperial Commissariat or the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for any works or supplies by the Department of Public Works or the Tender Board, or on account of other Governments; or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment; or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

9. This licence is to be used under and in accordance with the regulations made or to be made under the provisions of the said Act and for the time being in force.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.
