FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he might think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he should deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," stand prorogued until Thursday, the 4th day of February, 1897, and it is expedient to further prorogue the same: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Thursday, the 4th day of February, 1897, until Tuesday, the 9th day of March, 1897.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-seventh day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and in the sixtieth year of Her Majesty's reign.

All candidates presenting themselves for examination must be provided with a book of logarithms, a 40-20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and all necessary appliances (except paper) for plan drawing.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

I. A candidate must have passed the matriculation examination at the University of Melbourne, including English, Geography, Arithmetic, Geometry, Algebra, and Physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and must have served with some recognised surveyor for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

II. Or he must have served under articles for not less than four years some recognised surveyor, two years at least of such service to have been in the field; and must give satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

III. Or he must have completed the third year's course in the Engineering School of the Melbourne University, or have obtained the Land Surveyor's Certificate as prescribed in the School of Mines, Ballarat, and must have served in the field for two years with some recognised surveyor.

NOTE.—By service in the field is to be understood the survey and subdivision of land.

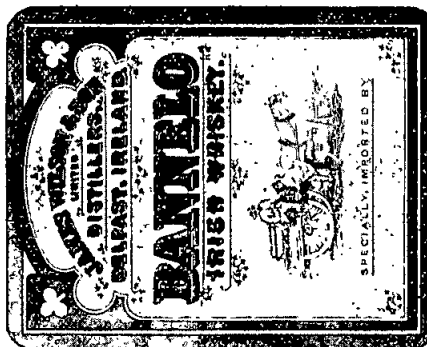

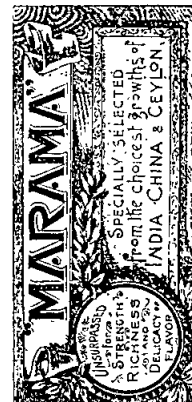

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 147.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONER, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, doth hereby make the following By-law for fixing the Rates and Charges for the Carriage of Goods, and repeals all portions of By-law No. 143 of 19th October, 1896, conflicting therewith:—

The Charges on and conditions respecting the Carriage of Goods, &c., shall be as follows, viz.:—

1. Aerated Waters and Empty Aerated Water Bottles to be charged "B" Class rate and conditions—viz., 2-ton lots, "B" Class; smaller lots, "C" Class, with "Smalls" minimum.
2. Ale, Beer, and Porter, in bulk.—The minimum at "C" Class rate to be 1 ton, and at "B" Class rate 4 tons.
3. Bacon and Hams.—On the Up journey "C" Class rate to be charged for lots of 2 tons and upwards.
4. Calcium Chloride, to be charged First Class rate; 6-ton lots, "C" Class.
5. Colonial Wine, in bulk.—The minimum at "A" Class rate to be 4 tons; smaller lots to be charged "B" Class rate, with "Smalls" minimum.
6. Earthenware and Stoneware in crates, semi-hogsheads, casks, and cases to be charged Class 2 rate, owner's risk.

7. Empty Cases.—All Empty Cases are to be charged "C" Class rate, minimum 6d., irrespective of measurement. (This cancels the Special Measurement rate in force between Melbourne and Geelong for empties.)

8. Firewood.—Firewood from Musk Creek, Lyonville, and Bullarto to Ballarat and Ballarat East to be charged 2d. per ton less than Miscellaneous rate.

9. Granite, Dressed, to be charged "C" Class rate and conditions.

10. Honey to be charged "B" Class rate and conditions, viz., 2-ton lots, "B" Class; smaller lots "C" Class, with "Smalls" minimum.

11. Hops in bales and pockets to be charged "C" Class rate, minimum 10 cwt.

12. Leather.—On the Up journey to be charged "B" Class rate and conditions, viz., 2-ton lots "B" Class; smaller lots "C" Class, with "Smalls" minimum.

13. Lime.—The minimum at "A" Class rate to be 3 tons. Truck loads of 6 tons and upwards to be charged Miscellaneous rate.

14. Oil, in casks, not otherwise specified, to be charged Class 2 rate, owner's risk.

15. Pearl Barley.—The Up journey rate for Pearl Barley is hereby cancelled. All Pearl Barley to be charged Class 2 rate.

16. Potatoes, in lots of 2 tons and upwards, to be charged the rates shown in Clause 26 hereof; smaller lots to be charged "A" Class rate, with "Smalls" minimum. The rates for 6-ton lots for long distances not to exceed the rates shown in Clause 26.

17. Potteryware, in truck loads.—The minimum at "A" Class rate to be 5 tons.

18. Printing Paper to be charged First Class rate; 6-ton lots, "C" Class.

19. Runners, Undressed, from Freezing and Boiling-down Works to be charged "B" Class rate and conditions. Dressed Runners from similar establishments to be charged at First Class rate, owner's risk.

20. Loading and Unloading charges are not to be made on consignments of Kerosene, Sugar, Rice, Beer in bulk, and Galvanized Iron, and Unloading charges are not to be debited on Butter sent *viâ* the City Market for export.

21. The minimum at "C" Class for Sugar and Rice to be 5 tons; the minimum for Household and Soft Soap at "B" Class on the Up journey to be 5 tons.

22. The maximum rate for goods in Class 3 between Melbourne and Stations on the Eastern or South-Eastern Lines is to be 40s. per ton.

23. Safety Trucks.—The extra charge for Safety Trucks as per General Condition No. 24 is not to be made on those which act as "tailers" to timber and other articles not exceeding 24 feet in length, which project over the end of the truck on which they are loaded. This instruction applies also to Hardwood Timber, &c., as per Clause 8 of Loading Scale.

24. Mixed Consignments (General Condition No. 22).—When a truck is loaded with not less than 6 tons of goods of different kinds for one consignee each kind is to be charged at its lowest class rate, and on goods in classes 1, 2, and 3, forming the whole or part of any such truck load, a reduction of 10 per cent. on the ordinary rates for these classes is to be made in the freight for such goods. Less than 6 tons to be charged as 6 tons if cheaper than the ordinary rate for the actual weight of the goods; the charge for the tonnage short of the 6 tons in such a case to be calculated at "A" Class rate. (This cancels the final sentence of General Conditions No. 22.)

25. Small Consignments.—The instructions contained in A.B. 10/7 are hereby cancelled, and the first and third footnotes to the scale shown on Page 39 of Merchandise Rates Book are amended, to read as follows:—

First footnote.—When packages of different classes weighing in the aggregate not more than 336 lbs. are sent from one consignor to one consignee, the goods in each class will be charged separately at their class rates according to the above scale, except when it is cheaper to charge the whole consignment at the rate of the highest class item as per above scale.

Third footnote.—Articles forming portion of a mixed consignment of goods weighing over 336 lbs. are to be charged on their actual weight at their proper tonnage rates, the whole consignment being, however, subject to the "Smalls" charge for 336 lbs. at the rate of the highest class item as a minimum.

WHEAT CLASS.

26. The conditions of the Wheat Class are amended as follows:—Minimum, 6 tons per four-wheeled truck, or when cheaper if in lots of 3 tons and upwards charges as per subjoined mileage scale to be enforced; smaller lots "A" Class rate with "Smalls" minimum. These amended conditions to apply also to the following articles of the Miscellaneous Class:—Artificial Manures, Bonedust, Guano.

Consignments in excess of 6 tons are to be charged at the 6-ton rate irrespective of the number of trucks used, provided senders arrange the loading so that the least possible number of trucks is used for the conveyance of the whole consignment. Way-bills for any lots of less than 6 tons under this arrangement to be marked "Part Consignment."

When the construction of any particular class of truck prevents a full 6-ton consignment being safely loaded on it, the actual weight of the bags loaded is only to be charged for. Officers in charge to see that all such trucks are as well loaded as possible. Way-bills for any such lots of less than 6 tons to be marked "Limited Load."

*Land Surveyors Act 1895 (Section 9).*REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF SURVEYORS ENGAGED ON SURVEYS
UNDER THE LAND ACTS.

(1) Every surveyor, when making surveys, shall conform to the following requirements, that is to say:—All bearings shall be observed with a serviceable theodolite in good adjustment, and all measurements made with a Chesterman's steel tape maintained at the true standard length by comparison when in use with a standard tape kept exclusively for such purpose; the standard itself to be compared at intervals with that recognised by the Department of Lands and Survey.

(2) He shall conspicuously mark on the ground by pegs (split from sound timber and squared on top) and trenches all the boundary lines of each allotment surveyed by him, and shall distinctly blaze all trees within 3 feet (or further if necessary) of such lines, and at all angles of such allotment; if a tree is available within 2 chains radius, remove a square foot of bark from it and grave with a chisel or scribe in the solid wood the number of the allotment or a broad arrow, the bearing and distance of number or arrow from the angle peg being carefully entered in the field book. All pegs shall be not less than 2 inches square and where practicable 12 inches long. Intermediate pegs and trenches shall be placed at regular intervals of 10 chains along the lines on plains or flat country, but where hilly and undulating, in such position that from each peg one other peg, at least, on either side, will be visible, the distance apart not to exceed 10 chains; the position of each peg to be correctly given in field notes. When the slope of ground exceeds 5 degrees a clinometer shall be used for correction of chainage, and all measurements reduced to the horizontal plane. All pegs shall be driven level with the ground. Corner trenches shall be 15 links long from the corner stake, cut exactly in the direction of the several boundary lines, and the trenches at the intermediate stakes shall be 5 links in length, cut in the direction of the line on each side of the peg, leaving a spit 12 inches long between the trenches, thus = □ = All such trenches shall be not less than 8 inches wide and 5 inches deep. In places where, on account of rock, such trenches cannot be cut, the corner and intermediate pegs shall be protected by piles of stones placed around them.

(3) The surveyor shall in all cases chain the actual boundaries of allotments, unless there be insuperable difficulties in the way, such as a wide river, lake, &c. In such cases the method observed in measuring the distance and prolonging the line should be clearly shown in the field book. Running new boundary lines by traverse will not be permitted, but the principle of parallel offsets wherever practicable should be observed, and only where trees over 18 inches in diameter obstruct the true line will any departure be allowed.

(4) In establishing a connexion with a previous survey, the most reliable line of that survey shall be adopted as a datum for bearings, and the surveyor will be careful, before adopting any line for such purpose, to verify its position by angular measurement, and also by chainage, if necessary. If no Government survey has been made in the immediate neighbourhood of the site, the surveyor shall establish a datum for his bearings, and shall connect his survey by traverse with some permanent survey mark or large tree suitably marked on or near the most remarkable feature in the vicinity.

(5) In making the permanent survey of a road, grades over 5 degrees must be given on field notes, and, as far as possible, the approximate centre-line gradient shall be deduced and indicated on the plan; both sides are to be marked by pegs and trenches, trees along the run side and nearest to the laid-off pegs on the other side blazed as specified for boundary lines.

(6) Any previously surveyed roads, lines, blocks, or allotments that may adjoin or be adjacent to the area or allotment under survey shall be connected by tie lines with such survey, and be shown on plan and field notes.

FIELD NOTES, ETC.

(7) Proper field notes of all surveys are to be recorded in books of a convenient size, and any correction in the entries made for practical errors is to be shown in red, with an explanatory note on the page in which it occurs. The dates on which survey was commenced and completed must also be entered in the field book. Field notes must show clearly and distinctively all new marks of the survey, and all old ones (if any) along previously surveyed lines; also all methods of running the lines, clinometer readings, reductions of chainage, closing angle, and full detail description of country, character of soil, vegetation, &c. He must also certify on the field book that his notes as recorded are the actual results of his or his assistant's observations and measurements on the ground. With the plan must be sent in a copy of the field notes certified as follows:— I certify that this is a correct copy of the recorded observations and measurements made by me personally (or by my assistant), together with a copy of the computations of the figure and its area in the usual form adopted for computation by reduction of traverse and double areas.

(8) Plans are to be drawn in accordance with the specimen plans prepared by the Department of Lands and Survey for the guidance of surveyors.

(9) Any authorized surveyor employing an assistant will be held responsible for any work performed by him, and both shall certify all plans and field notes of surveys made by such assistant.

The births of 1,051 children, viz., 546 boys and 505 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of December. The number was, it will be observed, slightly more than in the corresponding months of the three previous years, but fewer than in any other year since 1886. It was, moreover, 438 below the maximum (viz., in 1891), and 153 below the average of the month during the previous ten years, or 181 below that average if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in December numbered 737, viz., 392 of males and 345 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 314, or 43 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, 18 fewer than in the corresponding month of the previous year. They were, however, 93 below the average of December during the previous ten years, and, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been lower than that average by 112.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 27.44 and of deaths registered 19.24 per annum, as compared with averages for the same month during the last ten years of 32.73 and 22.89 respectively, and averages for the whole year of 35.22 and 18.88.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 98.9° on the 23rd, and the lowest was 47.0° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (65.5°) was 1.6° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (42.1°) took place on the 11th, and the least range (7.8°) on the 6th. The mean daily range was 22.0°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.213 inches on the 30th, and the lowest was 29.487 inches on the 5th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.895 inches) was somewhat above the average.

Rain fell on six days, the amount of rainfall being 1.16 inches, or 1.01 inches lower than in December, 1895, and 1.37 inches below the average of the month during the previous ten years. During the current year the rainfall amounted to 25.16 inches, or 8.12 inches higher than in the year 1895, and .63 of an inch above the average of the period during the last ten years.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 43 per cent. to that mortality, as against 42 per cent. in December, 1895; 39 per cent. in December, 1894; 45 per cent. in December, 1893; 49 per cent. in December, 1892; 54 per cent. in December, 1891; and 44 per cent. in December, 1890.

Forty-eight deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a female aged 75, died of cancer; two females, each aged 75, of valvular disease of the heart; two females, each aged 75, of bronchitis and hepatitis respectively; a dancing-master, aged 76, of dysentery; six females, each aged 76, of apoplexy, inflammation of bowels, cirrhosis of liver, hepatitis, nephritis, and a fractured thigh respectively; a labourer, aged 77, of cancer; a female, aged 77, of insanity; a labourer, aged 77, of bronchitis; a clerk, aged 78, of diarrhoea; a female, aged 78, of dysentery; a labourer and a female, each aged 78, of heart disease; a labourer, aged 78, of pneumonia; a carpenter, aged 78, of nephritis; a labourer, aged 79, of apoplexy; a male of unstated occupation, aged 79, of heart disease; a carpenter, aged 79, of hepatitis; a female, aged 80, of diarrhoea; a female cook, aged 80, of dysentery; two females, each aged 80, of cancer; a female, aged 80, of Bright's disease; a

gentleman, aged 80, of burns; a female, aged 81, of mitral regurgitation; a labourer, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of diarrhoea; a gentleman, aged 84, of enteritis; two females, each aged 86, of diarrhoea and pericarditis respectively; a gentleman, aged 86, of heart disease; a miner, aged 88, of bronchitis; a female, aged 90, of endocarditis; a lady, aged 90, of heart disease; a female, aged 92, of apoplexy; a plasterer, aged 76, a pensioner and a labourer, each aged 78, a sailor, aged 79, a gentleman, aged 80, a shoemaker, aged 81, and a cabinetmaker, aged 87, of old age.

Thirty-nine deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 32 were set down to accident, 3 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 16, and a railway porter, aged 33, were passed over by railway trains; a labourer, aged 39, and a driver, aged 43, by vehicles; a labourer, aged 13, died of injuries received whilst diving into the River Yarra; a painter, aged 50, of injuries caused by a fall from a building; a bootmaker, aged 73, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall in the street; a steward, aged 36, of injuries received by falling into a lift well; a labourer, aged 28, of injury to pelvis, caused by a fall from a trolley; two females, aged 72 and 76 respectively, of fracture of the thigh; a male of no occupation, aged 28, of gunshot wounds; a male child, aged 2, a servant, aged 18, a housekeeper, aged 58, and a gentleman, aged 80, of burns; a female, aged 57, of sunstroke; a plumber, aged 53, of plumbism; three boys, aged 8, 10, and 13 respectively, were drowned whilst bathing in the River Yarra; a seaman, aged 29, when trying to swim ashore from a steamer; a labourer, aged 29, whilst going aboard a craft; and a tide surveyor, aged 52, through being washed off a steam launch in Hobson's Bay; an upholsterer, aged 36, an ex-civil servant, aged 37, a grave dresser, aged 56, a female, aged 59, and a male of occupation unknown, aged 60, were found drowned in the River Yarra; a female child, aged 4 months, was accidentally suffocated by the bed clothes; a male infant, aged 15 days, by food; and a female, aged 34, by the smoke in a burning house. The homicidal deaths were those of a new-born male infant, who was suffocated; a new-born female infant, who was strangled; and a boy, aged 5, who died of rupture of liver and spleen, the result of being run over by a cart—a verdict of wilful murder being returned in the first two cases and of manslaughter in the last. The suicidal deaths were those of an engine driver, aged 37, who shot himself; a dog inspector, aged 70, who poisoned himself; a publican, aged 69, who hanged himself; and a female, aged 41, who threw herself from the bridge over the Yarra at Studley Park.

One hundred and forty-eight deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne, 21 in the Alfred, 7 in St. Vincent's, 4 in the Women's, 7 in the Children's, 4 in the Homeopathic, and 6 in the Austin Hospitals; 7 in the Metropolitan and 5 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 14 in the Benevolent Asylum, 2 in the Protestant Refuge, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 2 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 314, of which 171, or 54 per cent., were of males, and 143, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 268 were under one year of age, 32 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 423. Of these, 221, or 52 per cent., were males, and 202, or 48 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 9 were between ten and fifteen, 21 were between fifteen and twenty, 22 were between twenty and twenty-five, 32 were between twenty-five and thirty, 40 were between thirty and thirty-five, 29 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 9 were between forty-five and fifty, 23 were between fifty and fifty-five, 33 were between fifty-five and sixty, 37 were between sixty and sixty-five, 47 were between sixty-five and seventy, 29 were between seventy and seventy-five, 28 were between seventy-five and eighty, 12 were between eighty and eighty-five, 5 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 3 were between ninety and ninety-five.

The following table shows the causes of death of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age, and the proportions per cent. of deaths from each cause, in Greater Melbourne during the month under review:—

N.B.—The figures in brackets represent the numbers in the corresponding month of the preceding year.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding month of 1895, there was a decrease of 26 under the head of zymotic, 22 under local, and 5 under imperfectly defined diseases (chiefly atrophy and debility); but an increase of 25 under constitutional, 5 under dietetic, and 5 under developmental diseases—there being a net decrease in all causes of 18. In the zymotic class, deaths

from influenza fell from 12 to 1; from typhoid fever, from 20 to 10; and from syphilis (chiefly congenital), from 7 to 1; and in the local class, whilst deaths from diseases of the nervous system fell from 87 to 53, and those from respiratory diseases from 69 to 37; on the other hand, those from heart diseases, &c., rose from 44 to 67, those from diseases of the digestive organs from 175 to 185 (those under enteritis alone having risen from 118 to 143); and those from kidney diseases, &c., from 24 to 32. The increased mortality in the constitutional class occurred chiefly under phthisis, which caused 67 deaths in the month under notice, as compared with 52 in December, 1895, and anæmia, &c., and diabetes, which caused 4 and 3 deaths respectively, as against nil. The increases in the dietetic and constitutional classes are to be found under the infantile causes of want of breast milk and premature birth, deaths from the former having risen from 8 to 15, and the latter from 15 to 22.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1896; from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year; it will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from diphtheria has steadily increased since 1893, when, however, it was exceptionally low; whilst that from typhoid fever has varied but little during the last three years:—

The following rate is made on the annual value of all the rateable property in the said several divisions of the Lowan Shire Waterworks District, according to the valuation on all such lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shires of Lowan, Dimboola, and Kowree respectively, that is to say:—On rateable property within the Shire of Lowan Division, a rate of Tenpence in the pound sterling of such valuation; in the Shire of Dimboola Division, a rate of Ninepence in the pound sterling of such valuation; and in the Shire of Kowree Division, a rate of Fivepence in the pound sterling of such valuation.

Such rate is hereby made for the year 1897, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and terminating on 31st December, 1897, and shall be payable on the 1st day of February, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

SHIRE OF NUMURKAH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1897 FOR THE PURPOSE OF LEVYING RATES WITHIN THE RURAL PORTION OF THE DISTRICT OF THE TRUST.

REGULATION No. 25.

WHEREAS the Governor in Council has, by an Order made the 14th day of December, 1896, under the provisions of section 100 of the *Water Act 1890*, divided the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks District, exclusive of that portion thereof proclaimed an Urban District on the 23rd day of June, 1896, and the 30th day of September, 1896, into divisions, and directed that the necessary rates for paying interest on all moneys borrowed by the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust for the construction and maintenance of their waterworks, or to meet any other expenses in connexion therewith, shall be levied in such divisions,

viz.:-Number 1 Division and No. 2 Division, and has further directed that such rates be levied differentially as between such divisions.

The Commissioners of the Shire of Numurkah Waterworks Trust, under the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, hereby make the following rates to be levied within the aforesaid divisions of the district of the Trust, the boundaries of which divisions are fully set forth in the Order in Council of the 14th December, 1896, hereinbefore mentioned:—

1. In Number 1 Division, Sixpence in the pound sterling.

In Number 2 Division, Fourpence in the pound sterling.

The respective rates to be levied on the annual value of all rateable property situated as above described according to the valuation for the time being for the municipal rates of the Shire of Numurkah.

The rates hereby made shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1897.

2. Such rates are hereby made payable in one instalment, and shall be due on the 18th day of January, 1897.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

AVENEL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.

THE Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby make the following Regulations:—

The following are the rates which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied (for domestic purposes only) by the said Trust within the Trust District:—

1. For each vacant allotment or allotments owned by one person, in one section, rated by the Shire of Seymour, of the municipal value of Ten pounds or under, a rate of Ten shillings shall be paid for the year; and of all vacant allotment or allotments so rated of more than Ten pounds municipal value, a rate of One pound shall be charged.

2. For all lands and tenements within the Trust area of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

3. For all lands and tenements within the Trust area of more than Sixteen pounds municipal value, an amount equal to One shilling and threepence in the pound on the amount of the municipal valuation for the Shire of Seymour.

4. For every steam boiler supplied during 1897 with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of Five pounds will be made.

5. Water by measurement, a charge of Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 galls. shall be made.

6. Water troughs shall be supplied at a charge of £2 per year each.

That the above-mentioned rates and charges are made for one year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1897, and shall be payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and on the 1st day of July, 1897.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Avenel Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive and collect and recover the said rates and charges.

No. 1072) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations in relation to all or any cemeteries, burial grounds, or places of burial as to him may seem proper for the protection of the public health and the maintenance of public decency, and may impose such fine, not exceeding Five pounds, to be recovered before any court of petty sessions, for the breach of any such regulation as to the Governor in Council may seem fit: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The Regulation relative to interments in cemeteries and burial grounds made on the 4th day of November, 1895, under the *Cemeteries Act 1890*, is hereby revoked.

2. No coffin shall be buried within four feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contain the body of a child under twelve years of age, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below that level; and except in the case of a vault, or in the case of a grave allotment used for burial prior to or within four weeks following upon the date of the gazettal of this Regulation, a layer of earth at least 1 foot thick, and in the case of a grave allotment used for burial prior to or within four weeks following upon the date of the gazettal of this Regulation, a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around the uppermost coffin previously buried in the grave.

3. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Five pounds.

If and whenever a casual vacancy in the committee shall occur within nine months of the previous annual meeting the secretary shall, as soon as practicable, give notice thereof in one of the Melbourne newspapers, at the same time publishing the date fixed by the committee for a special meeting of the members of the club, to be held within one month from the occurrence of the vacancy, and called for the purpose of electing a committee man to the vacant office.

The names of all candidates proposed or submitting themselves for election shall be forwarded to the secretary at least fourteen days before the date fixed for the meeting. In all other respects such election shall be governed and conducted as hereinbefore provided with respect to annual elections of committee men; but the member elected to such vacancy shall hold office so long only as the vacating member would have retained the same if no vacancy had occurred.

Should there be two or more vacancies to be filled up at any such special meeting the candidate who shall poll the largest number of votes shall be deemed to have been elected in the place of the vacating member who would have been entitled to hold office for the longest period if the vacancy had not occurred, and so on as to the other candidates elected.
