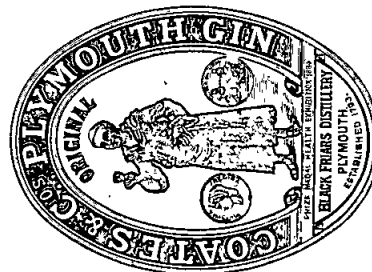

VICTORIAN RAILWAYS.

BY-LAW No. 145.

THE VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONER, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Railways Acts, hereby makes the following By-law for the Issue of Passes and Privileged Tickets to Officers and Employés of the Victorian Railways, and all previous By-laws relating thereto are hereby repealed. This also repeals By-law No. 140 :—

PASSES MAY BE ISSUED TO PERMANENT OFFICERS AND EMPLOYÉS ONLY AS FOLLOWS :—

- 1. Any officer or employé when on annual leave may have a pass to cover the whole period of his leave for himself, wife, and children, not exceeding three in number, and who must be under the age of fourteen years.
2. Officers' passes (with title of each officer engraved thereon) are to be issued only to heads of branches and such other officers as the Commissioner may direct, whose duty requires them to travel on railway business. Such passes to be available, if there is room in the carriage; for sleeping berths within the colony only.
3. Any officer or employé who may be transferred can obtain a pass for himself, wife, family, and furniture to his new place of duty, but this concession is not to cover the free transit of either dogs, horses, cattle, vehicles, or firewood.
4. Officers or employés travelling on free passes will have no claim for luggage or other property lost in transit, and they will be expected to sacrifice their comfort for the convenience of paying passengers.
5. Ordinary employés' passes are not available for "Express" or "Special" trains, unless specially indorsed by an authorized officer.
6. Any officer or employé found travelling without a free pass or ticket is to be at once suspended by the head of his branch, and the occurrence to be reported to be dealt with.
7. All passes issued to officers and employés on duty shall have the words "On Service Only" printed plainly across them.
8. The following officers only are authorized to sign and issue passes and indorse such concessions for special or express trains or guards' vans, viz. :—Heads of branches and such other officers as are specially approved by the Commissioner.
Only the authorized gold, book, and paper passes are to be recognised, except in cases of accident or emergency, when a telegram pass from any authorized officer or the station-master at Spencer-street is to be accepted.
9. At stations where tickets are checked or collected, passes must also be checked or collected. The dates for which passes may be available, and the names of the issuers, are to be clearly written on each pass. Failing the observance of these particulars the holders of passes are to be treated as ordinary passengers, and made to pay unless fraud is attempted.
10. Privileged tickets (not limited as to time for return) may be issued to officers and employés entitled to passes, and their wives, at one-fourth of the ordinary return fares. Minimum First Class, 2s.; Second Class, 1s. The concession to be available to sons under eighteen years of age living at home and not in receipt of any remuneration; unmarried daughters living at home and not in receipt of any remuneration; also to mother or sister acting as employé's housekeeper. Tickets are to be issued for return journey only, and are to bear the word "Employé" printed thereon.
11. Supernumerary employés who have been in the service over two years continuously may, at the discretion of heads of branches, be granted privileged tickets for themselves only.
12. Pass and privileged ticket requisitions, as per form attached hereto, must be sent to the issuing officers, so as to insure the concessions being made in sufficient time. Such officers will be held responsible that the concessions granted under this By-law are not exceeded.

GRAVITATION WATER.

2. The price or rate to be paid for water delivered by gravitation from the River Murray, Gunbower Creek, or the Barr Creek, through the Trust channels or otherwise, shall be for indigenous grasses or pasturage, Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre.

3. For irrigation of lucerne and fodder crops the charge shall be Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre.

4. For the irrigation of cereals, wheat, oats, barley, &c., the charge shall be One shilling (1s.) per inch per acre for the first watering and Sixpence (6d.) per inch per acre for each subsequent watering.

FILLING TANKS.

That for water supplied by gravitation each occupant be allowed to take out a "water right," enabling him to irrigate 30 acres in each 320 acres he so occupies; and for which he shall pay at the rate of Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per acre, and to have the same preferential rights as accorded those holding garden rights.

IRRIGATION BY PUMPING.

And the Honorable Isaac Alfred Isaacs, Her Majesty's Attorney-General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 1106, Part I, sec. 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND ACT 1890.

Chapter XIII.—Timber Licences.

Licences on Crown lands (not being State Forests or Timber Reserves), Section 49.

In the last line of Regulation 5 the words "Five shillings (5s.) per quarter" are cancelled, and the words "Two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per quarter" are substituted therefor.

The following condition is added to Schedules 54, 55, 56, 57, 58, 59, 61, and 62, viz.:—

No timber shall be taken away which, immediately prior to being felled, was of less size than is prescribed in the condition relating to the felling of such timber.

Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART VI.—RESERVES—SECTION I., MILITIA RESERVE OF OFFICERS.

Paragraph 1 is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

1. Age for Retirement of Officers on Reserve.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF APRIL, 1897.

THE births of 53 boys and 48 girls, or in all of 101 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of April. Of these, 40 occurred in Ballarat East, 50 in Ballarat West, 10 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 5 illegitimate births and one case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 122, viz., 66 of boys and 56 of girls.

The deaths registered in April numbered 56, viz., 39 of males and 17 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 45. In March the recorded deaths numbered 72; in April, 1896, they numbered 71; in April, 1895, they numbered 62; in April, 1894, they numbered 70; in April, 1893, they numbered 81; in April, 1892, they numbered 82; in April, 1891, they numbered 74; in April, 1890, they numbered 90; in April, 1889, they numbered 68; in April, 1888, they numbered 43; and in April, 1887, they numbered 66.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Nineteen deaths, or 34 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Ballarat Hospital, 12; Benevolent Asylum, 6; Lunatic Asylum, 1.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, deaths from diseases of the nervous system rose from 5 to 9, and those from diseases of the circulatory system from 4 to 9. On the other hand, deaths from typhoid fever fell from 3 to 1; those from constitutional diseases from 14 to 9; those from premature birth from 3 to 1; those from local diseases other than those of the nervous and circulatory systems from 22 to 16; and those from old age from 7 to nil.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The Postmaster-General will not be bound to issue orders upon the contractors for all the articles enumerated in the schedules, but only for such articles and such quantities of those articles as the Postmaster-General may order from time to time; neither will the Postmaster-General be bound to take from the contractors any larger supply of any of the articles than may be shown upon the orders which have been issued during the year, nor will he be bound to take any of the articles enumerated in the schedules for which orders have not been issued. 1. All the articles are to be of the best quality of the several kinds, in the best condition, and to be delivered in sound packages, free from all charges for cartage, freight, &c. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

2. Supplies for country stations for which no local contract may have been taken, or for which the contract has been terminated, may be ordered under the Melbourne contract.

3. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the price demanded, except brandy casks, porter cases, hogsheads, butter firkins, and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for. 4. Bread.—A sample of the best ordinarily retailed to the public will be considered as a test loaf for first quality. 8. Potatoes to be dry and free from dirt. Contractors to supply 105 lbs. of potatoes for each cental credited to them, and, in addition, to take back all rejected before being cooked.

11. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.

12. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 11.

13. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 11.

14. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they

may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases, the reference to a board of survey will not be deemed to be necessary on the part of the contractor.

15. In the case of supplies for lunatic asylums, it will be competent for a board of survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being; but, pending such appeal, he must take back the rejected articles and at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required or any like supplies suitable for the service may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged to the contractor.
