FISHING IN LAKE TYERS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from this date, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to issue a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation of the 18th July, 1892, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 22nd July, 1892, page 3046, and the Proclamation of the 11th December, 1891, published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th December, 1891, page 4796, relating to fishing in Lake Tyers, and in lieu thereof fixing the time at which trammels, trawls, or other nets or engines may be employed in fishing in Lake Tyers to be from and including the 1st May to and including the 30th September in each year; and prohibiting the use as above of any description of net of a greater length than 900 feet.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.—SEWERAGE.

REGULATION FIXING THE DISTANCE FROM A SEWER OF THE MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS THE HOUSES WITHIN WHICH MUST BE DRAINED INTO SUCH SEWERS.

WHEREAS by section 107 of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1890, hereinafter called "The Act," it is enacted that if any house or building within the metropolis be found not to be drained by a sufficient drain communicating with some sewer to the satisfaction of the Board, and if a sewer of a sufficient size be found within a reasonable distance, which shall be determined by the regulations of the Board, of any part of such house or building on a lower level than such house or building, the Board may, at its discretion, by notice in writing, require the owner of such house or building forthwith, or within such reasonable time as may be appointed by the Board, to construct and make from such house or building into any such sewer a covered drain, and such branches thereto with such fit and proper works and arrangements as may appear to the Board or its officers requisite to secure the safe and proper working of such drain, and to prevent the same obstructing or otherwise injuring or impeding the action of the sewer to which it leads. Now, therefore, the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works, hereinafter called "The Board," doth hereby in pursuance of such power and authority, and of every other power and authority in the Act make and determine the following Regulation 2, that is to say:—

That the "reasonable distance" which the Board is by the hereinafore recited section, and by sections 108 and 109 of the Act, directed to determine by regulation, shall be a distance of 330 feet.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWN OF MACARTHUR.

WE, Frank Edward Staughton, Henry Baker, and Thomas James Humphreys, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation in the town of Macarthur, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart by the committee of management for sports or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, sheep, cattle, or other animals (except as provided in clause 6) without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management; provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

6. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the committee of management.

7. No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

8. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR A RACE-COURSE, AND OTHER PURPOSES OF PUBLIC RECREATION IN SECTION 44, PARISH OF CARLYLE (RUTHERGLEN).

THE Council of the Borough of Rutherglen, the duly appointed committee of management of the reserve for a Race-course and other purposes of public recreation in section 44, parish of Carlyle (Rutherglen), having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:-

REGULATIONS.

1. The reserve, which is composed of the two (2) divisions mentioned hereunder, shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except as hereinafter provided.

1st division—Course, training track, grand-stand, and all other enclosures.

2nd division—The remainder of the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones therein.

5. No person shall light any fires in the reserve, nor erect any dwellings thereon, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.

6. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed or set apart for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

7. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, or pigs, nor bring any dog therein, unless led by a chain or cord, without the written permission of the committee of management; and any person allowing cattle, goats, pigs, or poultry to trespass on the reserve shall be liable to be prosecuted according to law. Provided always that the moneys received for admission shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

8. No person shall enter the reserve on any day set apart for public sports, nor be permitted to bring any horses, carriages, or other vehicles therein, except on production of a ticket issued by the committee of management duly authorizing the admission of such person, horses, carriages, or other vehicles; but no such ticket of admission shall be of any avail except on the day for which it is issued, nor shall it authorize the holder thereof to enter any buildings, erections, enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots within the reserve.

9. Every person paying for admission to the reserve or bringing therein any horses, carriages, or other vehicles, shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which he shall, upon demand, produce, and, if required, surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the committee of management to demand the production or surrender thereof.

10. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall, together with any horses, carriages, or other vehicles in his possession and care, be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding that such person may have purchased and may be in possession of a ticket of admission:-

1st. Being drunk, or using any profane, indecent, or obscene language;

2nd. Assaulting any person, making use of any abusive, threatening, or insulting expressions, or behaving in an improper or riotous manner;

3rd. Trespassing upon any enclosures, plantations, or cultivated plots, or upon any portion of the grounds set apart for sports, or interfering with or interrupting any person engaged by the authority of the committee of management in carrying out any sports or amusements;

4th. Being found in any portion of the reserve, or in any building, erection, or enclosure for the time being thereon, and not producing on demand, or surrendering, if required, to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand production or surrender, a ticket duly authorizing admission to the place wherein he may be found, unless he shall forthwith satisfy the committee of management, or any person deputed by it, that he has paid the proper charge for admission to such place, and that the ticket of admission supplied to him has been lost.

11. The maximum scale of charges for admission to the reserve and to any buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon, on such days (not exceeding twelve (12) in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for public sports, shall be as follows:-

1st. For admission of each person to the reserve, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

2nd. For admission of each person to any stand, building, erection, or enclosure, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

3rd. For admission of each saddle horse (exclusive of rider) to the reserve, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding One shilling.

4th. For admission to the reserve of every private carriage, cart, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers), drawn by one horse or other animal, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Two shillings.

5th. For admission to the reserve of every private cart, carriage, or other vehicle (exclusive of passengers), drawn by two or more horses or other animals, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Three shillings.

6th. For admission to the reserve of every vehicle plying for hire, such a sum as the committee of management may determine, not exceeding Ten shillings.

12. No person shall be allowed to exercise or train horses in the reserve except on payment of the fees specified hereunder:-

For a single trial of a horse, Two shillings and sixpence.
For every horse for one year, Ten shillings.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, buildings, erections, or enclosure for the occasion of any public sports, may be required to deposit any sum not exceeding Ten pounds, which the committee of management may determine, by way of guarantee that due care will be taken of such stand, buildings, erections, or enclosure, and the committee of management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by such stand, buildings, erections, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by any person by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the committee of management in reference to the reserve, or the buildings, erections, or enclosures for the time being thereon.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

FISHING IN CORIO BAY.*

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honourable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1093) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Proclamations which shall have force and effect only in any waters or places specified therein for all or any of the purposes mentioned in section 38 of the said Act; and that every Proclamation under the said Act shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superseded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made on the 24th day of July, 1882, relating to fishing in the vicinity of the piers in Corio Bay, and do by this Proclamation prohibit the use of trawls, trawls, and other nets or fixed engines in the waters southward and westward of a line from Limeburner's Point on the South Shore, to Hutton's wharf, on the West Shore of Corio Bay, Geelong, from the 1st January to the 31st December, both dates inclusive, in each year.

Tenders must be accompanied by a preliminary deposit, as shown above, in bank notes, or a bank draft payable to the order of the Secretary to the Tender Board (cheques will in no case be received), which will be returned within ten days to unsuccessful tenderers on their application. Such deposit to be forfeited in the event of the successful tenderer failing to complete the security within the prescribed period.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved of. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in Condition 5.

9. The members of boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately

replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be charged as in Condition 5.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in Condition 5.
