



The accompanying information relative to hurricanes on the Queensland coast, received from H.M.S. Dart, is promulgated for general information and guidance.

HURRICANES, QUEENSLAND COAST.

HURRICANES, QUEENSLAND COAST.

Tropical hurricanes on the coast of Queensland may be expected during the summer months, viz., December, January, February, March, and early part of April, and have occurred between the dates 14th December to 14th April inclusive.

These storms appear to originate between latitudes 8' to 12° S., and between the meridians of 155' B. and 170° W. On reaching the Queensland coast, they may strike the land at any point between latitudes 14° and 26" (that is, between Cape Melville and Wide Bay); for the last eight years the full force, or centre of the storm, has passed about 30 miles to the southward of Cairns.

The names of the places at which they are most frequently experienced are Cardwell, Townsville, Bowen, the Northumberland Islands, and the neighbourhood of Sandy Cape.

To the southward of lat. 26° S. these storms break up into heavy gales.

heavy gales.

2. If, during the summer months and the early part of April, a heavy swell sets in from N.E., and there is little or no wind at the time, bad weather is certain, for the sea is always in advance

a heavy swell sats in from N.E., and there is little or no wind at the time, bad weather is certain, for the sea is always in advance of a cyclone.

With the glass steadily falling, heavy rains and murky sky, winds between S.S.E. and E., a cyclone may be expected.

These storms may extend some distance inland, but their centres do not often pass the coast ranges, which appear to repel them, and they usually emerge from the coast between Broad Sound and Cape Moreton.

3. If the barometer is high over a considerable portion of the coast, the storm will recurve some distance off the land, and the wind will be from S.E. to S.

4. If, on the contrary, the barometer is low in front of the storm, it will blow home on the land as far as the coast range, and cause floods; when this happens, the first of the gale will be southerly, the latter part northerly.

5. The bearing of the storm centre will be at right angles to the waves line; thus, on a fine day, if there is a heavier sea than usual breaking on the beach, and it is coning from the N.E., if the direction remains the same or nearly so, and the barometer is not above 30 inches, the gale will blow home on the land, and the first signs of bad weather will not precede the gale by more than twelve hours; but if the direction of the swell changes to the castward, the storm is recurving, and the body of it will not reach the land.

When the swell is from the cast, the storm centre is east; when there is any southing in the line of swell, the storm has passed.

Ś,

6. No matter how threatening the weather signs may be, if the line of swell comes first from the southward there will only be an ordinary south polar storm with a low temperature.

7. To avoid the storms.—By applying Buy's Ballot's law for the Southern Hemisphere, namely, "Standing with your back to the wind the lowest barometer is on your right hand," and hence the storm centre, valuable information is actained.

Should the wind be from S.S.E. to E., the barometer steadily falling, and a heavy murky sky, the navigator may be certain the storm is approaching him, and should endeavour to make northwards, so as to locate himself in the northern or fine weather half of the disturbance, where the winds will be from N.W. to W. Steamers bound north and outside the Barrier Reef, on observing the barometer falling and signs of bad weather, should steam S.S.E., and let the storm pass inside them. Steamers coming south should, in a similar case, stop for a few hours, and let the storm pass a head of them.

Sailing vessels should not hesitate a moment, but run for the nearest shelter; but should they be coming south and find themselves on the east side of the storm with northerly wind they should heave to, and on no pretence attempt to run.

If anchored under the lec of an island, and the wind does not shift, the centre of the storm will pass over them; and the fiercest part of the gale will be experienced; after the centre has passed they will have a dead lee shore.

Therefore, when the wind lulls, which it usually does, ship and get away at once, if possible to do so.

- 6. - 7. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order, they or any like supplies suitable for the service will be otherwise procured, and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account or from the security money.
- 8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided by a board of survey composed of persons named by the officer commanding, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 7.
- 9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper, quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor failing which, it or any like supply suitable for the service will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 7.
- 10. As the exact quantity of any article of provisions which may be required cannot be stated, the estimate being approximate only, the Government will not be bound by the quantity stated in the schedule, but will be at liberty to order more or less, according to circumstances, and the contractor will be bound to supply the same as ordered.
- 11.
