WAR BETWEEN TURKEY AND GREECE.— PROCLAMATION OF NEUTRALITY.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its Enclosures, are published for general information.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit to you copies of Her Majesty's Proclamation of Neutrality on the occasion of the war between Turkey and Greece.

F.O., 3rd May, 1897. together with copy of a letter from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs embodying Rules which Her Majesty has directed to be observed during the continuance of the present state of war, and I have

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to request that you will cause both documents to be immediately published throughout the Colony under your Government, and that you will not fail to conform to Her Majesty's commands.

BY THE QUEEN.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

WHEREAS we are happily at peace with all Sovereigns, Powers, and States:

And whereas, notwithstanding our utmost exertions to preserve peace between the two Sovereign Powers, a state of war unhappily exists between his Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey and his Majesty the King of the Hellenes, and between their respective subjects and others inhabiting within their countries, territories, or dominions:

And whereas we are on terms of friendship and amicable intercourse with each of these Sovereigns, and with their several subjects and others inhabiting within their countries, territories, or dominions:

And whereas great numbers of our loyal subjects reside and carry on commerce, and possess property and establishments, and enjoy various rights and privileges within the dominions of each of the aforesaid Sovereigns, protected by the faith of treaties between us and each of the aforesaid Sovereigns:

And whereas we, being desirous of preserving to our subjects the blessings of peace which they now happily enjoy, are firmly purposed and determined to maintain a strict and impartial neutrality in the said state of war unhappily existing between the aforesaid Sovereigns:

We therefore have thought fit, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, to issue this our Royal Proclamation:

And we do hereby strictly charge and command all our loving subjects to govern themselves accordingly, and to observe a strict neutrality in and during the aforesaid war, and to abstain from violating or contravening either the laws and statutes of the realm in this behalf, or the Law of Nations in relation thereto, as they will answer to the contrary at their peril:

And whereas in and by a certain Statute made and passed in a session of Parliament holden in the 33rd and 34th year of our reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the conduct of Her Majesty's subjects during the existence of hostilities between Foreign States with which Her Majesty is at peace," it is amongst other things declared and enacted as follows. This Act shall extend to all the dominions of Her Majesty, including the adjacent territorial waters:—

"Illegal Enlistment.

"If any person, without the licence of Her Majesty, being a British subject, within or without Her Majesty's dominions, accepts or agrees to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any foreign State at peace with Her Majesty, and in this Act referred to as a friendly State, or whether a British subject or not, within Her Majesty's dominions, induces any other person to

accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any such Foreign State as aforesaid—

“He shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

“If any person, without the licence of Her Majesty, being a British subject, quits or goes on board any ship with a view of quitting Her Majesty’s dominions, with intent to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with a friendly State, or, whether a British subject or not, within Her Majesty’s dominions, induces any other person to quit or to go on board any ship with a view of quitting Her Majesty’s dominions with the like intent—

“He shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

“If any person induces any other person to quit Her Majesty’s dominions or to embark on any ship within Her Majesty’s dominions under a misrepresentation or false representation of the service in which such person is to be engaged, with the intent or in order that such person may accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any Foreign State at war with a friendly State—

“He shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

“If the master or owner of any ship, without the licence of Her Majesty, knowingly either takes on board, or engages to take on board, or has on board such ship within Her Majesty’s dominions any of the following persons, in this Act referred to as illegally enlisted persons, that is to say—

“(1) Any person who being a British subject within or without the dominions of Her Majesty has, without the licence of Her Majesty, accepted or agreed to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State;

“(2) Any person, being a British subject, who without the licence of Her Majesty, is about to quit Her Majesty’s dominions with intent to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with a friendly State;

“(3) Any person who has been induced to embark under a misrepresentation or false representation of the service in which such person is to be engaged, with the intent or in order that such person may accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with a friendly State;

“Such master or owner shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and the following consequences shall ensue, that is to say—

“(1) The offender shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour; and

“(2) Such ship shall be detained until the trial and conviction or acquittal of the master or owner, and until all penalties inflicted on the master or owner have been paid, or the master or owner has given security for the payment of such penalties to the satisfaction of two justices of the peace, or other magistrate or magistrates having the authority of two justices of the peace; and

“(3) All illegally enlisted persons shall, immediately on the discovery of the offence, be taken on shore, and shall not be allowed to return to the ship.

“*Illegal Shipbuilding and Illegal Expeditions.*

“If any person within Her Majesty’s dominions, without the licence of Her Majesty, does any of the following acts, that is to say:—

“(1) Builds or agrees to build, or causes to be built, any ship with intent or knowledge, or having reasonable cause to believe that the same shall or will be employed in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State; or

“(2) Issues or delivers any commission for any ship with intent or knowledge, or having reasonable cause to believe that the same shall or will be employed in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State; or

“(3) Equips any ship with intent or knowledge, or having reasonable cause to believe that the same shall or will be employed in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State; or

“(4) Despatches or causes or allows to be despatched any ship with intent or knowledge, or having reasonable cause to believe that the same shall or will be employed in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State;

“Such person shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this Act, and the following consequences shall ensue:—

“(1) The offender shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

“(2) The ship in respect of which any such offence is committed and her equipment shall be forfeited to Her Majesty.

“Provided that a person building, causing to be built, or equipping a ship in any of the cases aforesaid, in pursuance of a contract made before the commencement of such war as aforesaid, shall not be liable to any of the penalties imposed by this section in respect of such building or equipping if he satisfies the conditions following, that is to say—

“(1) If forthwith upon a Proclamation of Neutrality being issued by Her Majesty he gives notice to the Secretary of State that he is so building, causing to be built, or equipping such ship, and furnishes such particulars of the contract and of any matters relating to or done or to be done under the contract as may be required by the Secretary of State;

“(2) If he gives such security, and takes and permits to be taken such other measures, if any, as the Secretary of State may prescribe for insuring that such ship shall not be despatched, delivered, or removed without the licence of Her Majesty until the termination of such war as aforesaid.

“Where any ship is built by order of or on behalf of any foreign State when at war with a friendly State, or is delivered to or to the order of such foreign State, or any person who to the knowledge of the person building is an agent of such foreign State, or is paid for by such foreign State or such agent, and is employed in the military or naval service of such foreign State, such ship shall, until the contrary is proved, be deemed to have been built with a view to being so employed, and the burden shall lie on the builder of such ship of proving that he did not know that the ship was intended to be so employed in the military or naval service of such foreign State.

“If any person within the dominions of Her Majesty, and without the licence of Her Majesty—

“By adding to the number of the guns, or by changing those on board for other guns, or by the addition of any equipment for war, increases or augments, or procures to be increased or augmented, or is knowingly concerned in increasing or augmenting the warlike force of any ship which at the time of her being within the dominions of Her Majesty was a ship in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any friendly State—

“Such person shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

“If any person within the limits of Her Majesty’s dominions and without the licence of Her Majesty—

“Prepares or fits out any naval or military expedition to proceed against the dominions of any friendly State, the following consequences shall ensue:—

“(1) Every person engaged in such preparation or fitting out or assisting therein, or employed in any capacity in such expedition, shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

“(2) All ships and their equipments, and all arms and munitions of war, used in or forming part of such expedition, shall be forfeited to Her Majesty.

“Any person who aids, abets, counsels, or procures the commission of any offence against this Act shall be liable to be tried and punished as a principal offender.”

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that ships built, commissioned, equipped, or despatched in contravention of the said Act, may be condemned and forfeited by judgment of the Court of Admiralty; and that if the Secretary of State or Chief Executive Authority is satisfied that there is a reasonable and probable cause for believing that a ship within our dominions has been or is being built, commissioned, or equipped, contrary to the said Act, and is about to be taken beyond the limits of such dominions, or that a ship is about to be despatched contrary to the Act, such Secretary of State or Chief Executive Authority shall have power to issue a warrant authorizing the seizure and search of such ship and her detention until she has been either condemned or released by process of law. And whereas certain powers of seizure and detention are conferred by the said Act on certain local authorities;

Now, in order that none of our subjects may unwarily render themselves liable to the penalties imposed by the said Statute, we do hereby strictly command that no person or persons whatsoever do commit any act, matter, or thing whatsoever contrary to the provisions of the said Statute, upon pain of the several penalties by the said Statute imposed, and of our high displeasure.

And we do hereby further warn and admonish all our loving subjects, and all persons whatsoever entitled to our protection, to observe towards each of the aforesaid Sovereigns, their subjects and territories, and towards all belligerents whatsoever with whom we are at peace, the duties of neutrality; and to respect, in all and each of them, the exercise of those belligerent rights which we and our royal predecessors have always claimed to exercise.

And we hereby further warn all our loving subjects, and all persons whatsoever entitled to our protection, that if any of them

shall presume, in contempt of this our Royal Proclamation, and of our high displeasure, to do any acts in derogation of their duty as subjects of a neutral Sovereign in a war between other Sovereigns, or in violation or contravention of the Law of Nations in that behalf, as more especially by breaking, or endeavouring to break, any blockade lawfully and actually established by or on behalf of either of the said Sovereigns; or by carrying officers, soldiers, despatches, arms, ammunition, military stores or materials, or any article or articles considered and deemed to be contraband of war according to the Law of Modern Usages of Nations, for the use or service of either of the said Sovereigns, that all persons so offending, together with their ships and goods, will rightfully incur and be justly liable to hostile capture, and to the penalties denounced by the Law of Nations in that behalf.

And we do hereby give notice that all our subjects and persons entitled to our protection who may misconduct themselves in the premises will do so at their peril, and of their own wrong; and that they will in nowise obtain any protection from us against such capture or such penalties as aforesaid, but will, on the contrary, incur our high displeasure by such misconduct.

Given at our Court at Windsor, this third day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the sixtieth year of our reign.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

THE Marquess of Salisbury to the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty* :—

Foreign Office,
3rd May, 1897.

MY LORDS,

Her Majesty being fully determined to observe the duties of neutrality during the existing state of war between His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey and His Majesty the King of the Hellenes, and being moreover resolved to prevent, as far as possible, the use of Her Majesty's harbors, ports, and coasts, and the waters within Her Majesty's territorial jurisdiction, in aid of the warlike purposes of either belligerent, has commanded me to communicate to your Lordships, for your guidance, the following rules, which are to be treated and enforced as Her Majesty's orders and directions :—

Her Majesty is pleased further to command that these rules shall be put in force in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, and the Channel Islands, on and after the 8th inst., and in Her Majesty's territories, and possessions beyond the seas, six days after the day when the Governor, or other chief authority of each of such territories or possessions, respectively, shall have notified and published the same; stating in such notification that the said rules are to be obeyed by all persons within the same territories and possessions.

1. During the continuance of the present state of war, all ships of war of either belligerent are prohibited from making use of any port or roadstead in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, or the Channel Islands, or in any of Her Majesty's colonies or foreign possessions or dependencies, or of any waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of the British Crown, as a station, or place of resort, for any warlike purpose, or for the purpose of obtaining any facilities for warlike equipment; and no ship of war of either belligerent shall hereafter be permitted to sail out of or leave any port, roadstead, or waters subject to British jurisdiction, from which any vessel of the other belligerent (whether the same shall be a ship of war or a merchant ship) shall have previously departed, until after the expiration of at least 24 hours from the departure of such last-mentioned vessel beyond the territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty.

2. If any ship of war of either belligerent shall, after the time when this Order shall be first notified and put in force in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, and the Channel Islands, and in the several colonies and foreign possessions or dependencies of Her Majesty, respectively, enter any port, roadstead, or waters belonging to Her Majesty, either in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, or the Channel Islands, or in any of Her Majesty's colonies or foreign possessions or dependencies, such vessel shall be required to depart and to put to sea within 24 hours after her entrance into such port, roadstead, or waters, except in case of stress of weather, or of her requiring provisions or things necessary for the subsistence of her crew, or repairs; in either of which cases the authorities of the port, or of the nearest port (as the case may be), shall require her to put to sea as soon as possible after the expiration of such period of 24 hours, without permitting her to take in supplies beyond what may be necessary for her immediate use; and no such vessel which may have been allowed to remain within British waters for the purpose of repair shall continue in any such port, roadstead, or waters, for a longer period than 24 hours after her necessary repairs shall have been completed. Provided, nevertheless, that in all cases in which there shall be any vessel (whether ships of war or merchant ships) of the said belligerent parties in the same port, roadstead, or waters within the territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty, there shall be an interval of not less than 24 hours between the departure therefrom of any such vessel (whether a ship of war or merchant ship) of the one belligerent, and the subsequent departure therefrom of any ship of war of the other belligerent; and the time hereby limited for the departure of such ships of war respectively shall always, in case of necessity, be extended so far as may be requisite for giving effect to this proviso, but no further or otherwise.

3. No ship of war of either belligerent shall hereafter be permitted, while in any port, roadstead, or waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of Her Majesty, to take in any supplies, except provisions, and such other things, as may be requisite for the subsistence of her crew, and except so much coal only as may be sufficient to carry such vessel to the nearest port of her own country, or to some nearer destination, and no coal shall again be supplied to any such ship of war in the same or any other port, roadstead, or waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of Her

Majesty, without special permission, until after the expiration of three months from the time when such coal may have been last supplied to her within British waters as aforesaid.

4. Armed ships of either party are interdicted from carrying prizes made by them into the ports, harbors, roadsteads, or waters of the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, the Channel Islands, or any of Her Majesty's colonies or possessions abroad.

Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the *Factories and Shops Acts*, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the *Factories and Shops Acts*, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF LINCOLN, STUART, AND CO. PROPRIETARY LTD., 238 FLINDERS-STREET, MELBOURNE (CLOTHING DEPARTMENT),

for a period of two weeks from the 10th June, 1897, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than fifty females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said fifty females shall not be employed for more than fifty-six hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That each female so employed shall receive not less than Twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

CITY OF BALLAARAT.

By-Law No. 80.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution, the Council of the City of Ballaarat, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City of Ballaarat, hereby make the following by-law, being By-law numbered 80:—

1. From and after the coming into operation of this by-law, clauses No. 34 to No. 37, both inclusive, of By-law numbered 12 of the City of Ballaarat shall be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following by-law is hereby made:—

2. Every person who is the owner or occupier of any dairy farm, or milk store, or who is a purveyor of milk or cowkeeper shall, on or before the 1st day of January, 1897, and in subsequent years on or before the 1st day of January, register himself by signing and forwarding to the town clerk of the city an application in the form next hereinafter set out, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

Form of Application for registration as owner or occupier of dairy farm, milk store, purveyor of milk, or cowkeeper.

To the Town Clerk
of the City of Ballaarat.

Period of time for which registration is desired	Year commencing 1st day of January

3. Every person who, after the 1st day of January next, shall become the owner or occupier of any dairy farm or milk store, or who is a purveyor of milk or cowkeeper, shall register himself forthwith in the manner provided in the next preceding section.

4. Upon receipt of every application for registration and fee the town clerk shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

5. All paddocks, grounds, lands, houses, yards, premises, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the mayor or town clerk of the said council; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, houses, yards, premises, or enclosures, or any one of them are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order in writing, signed by the town clerk, and served personally, or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally, or left at his dwelling, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle and other animals in dairies may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

6. The council on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking place, cowshed, milk store, milk shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of dairyman, cowkeeper, or purveyor of milk, is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, or water supply in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce, may order the dairyman, cowkeeper, or purveyor of milk to make alteration in any such buildings or structures, to remedy any such defects within a time specified in such order.

7. Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons employed on the premises of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop,

and at such distance from the milking place, milk store, or milk shop as may be directed by the council, and the closet pans on such premises shall be disinfected daily.

8. Where horses are kept on the premises of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop, such stable accommodation shall be provided and at such distance from the milking-place, or milk store, or milk shop as the council may direct.

9. All houses, dairies, milking-places, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings and milking places shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman.

10. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

11. All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily. And no cowkeeper, dairyman, or person employed in milking or dairy work shall use in connexion with milking, or for washing vessels used for holding milk or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated, or contains matter injurious to health; and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit, by order served as prescribed in clause 5 of these regulations, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well or tank or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.

12. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

13. No dairyman, purveyor of milk, or cowkeeper shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

14. No person suffering from any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, or dangerous infectious disease, or who has been recently in contact with any person so suffering, shall milk cows or handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business until authorized by the council, municipal clerk, or health officer so to do.

15. If any person (whether an adult or a child) living on or occupying, or staying on a visit at any premises used as a grazing ground or dairy, or for cowsheds, or as a milk shop, or milk store be attacked by any epidemic, endemic, or contagious disease, the occupier of the house or premises in which such person is (or if he be the person attacked, his wife, or other person in charge) shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or health officer, or to the nearest member of the police force; and the council may, whether or not the person so attacked has been removed from the premises, by order served as aforesaid, prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk, or the produce thereof, from the premises until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists, and may order the destruction of the milk or any produce thereof on the premises.

16. Every dairy, milk store, or milk shop shall be inspected once in each quarter of the year by the council's inspector, who shall furnish a report to the council on the following matters, that is to say:—Conditions of paddocks, water supply, drains, sheds and buildings, disposal of manure, closet and stable accommodation, storage for milk, means of scalding and cleaning vessels, cleanliness of all buildings, yards, and premises, compliance with this by-law.

Penalties.

Sec. 32.—If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, or to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued: Provided that the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid.

CLOSE SEASON, NORTH ARM, OR LIMEBURNERS' BAY, INNER HARBOUR, GEELONG.*

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.—No. 7.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1897 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.
2. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be paid.
3. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty-five pounds and not exceeding Thirty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.
4. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Thirty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.
5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be One pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.
6. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.
7. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.
8. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1897.
9. For water supplied for garden purposes, where no meter is attached to the service-pipe, a charge of Ten shillings for each area of 200 square yards or portion thereof shall be made for

the year, and in all cases payment for such supplies of water shall be made in advance.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

All applications must contain the correct postal address, and the name of the nearest railway station thereto, and must be posted, duly stamped, and addressed to the Staff Office, Secretary's Branch, Victorian Railways, Melbourne, so as to reach their destination not later than noon on the 5th day of July, 1897.

Testimonials, birth registrations, or other documents required should not be sent with the applications, but must be produced as hereinafter directed.

If the number of candidates be not more than twice the number of persons to be employed, they will all be examined by the examiners at a time and place to be notified to them.

If the number of candidates be more than twice the number of persons to be employed, such number of candidates will be reduced by a Board of Selectors to such number of eligible candidates as such Board think fit, not exceeding twice the number of persons to be employed.

Unless otherwise notified, all candidates shall present themselves for selection by the Board of Selectors at the Railway Offices, Spencer-street, Melbourne, at Ten a.m. on Monday, 19th July, 1897.

The Board of Selectors will be appointed within seven days before the time so named.

The Board of Selectors will not be informed of or acquaint themselves with the names of the candidates or any of them.

Every person who either directly or indirectly attempts to influence any member of the Board of Selectors in favour of himself or in favour of or against any other person will for ever be disqualified for employment in the Railway service.

Each candidate, immediately before presenting himself to the Board of Selectors, will be furnished by the Officer-in-Charge with a card bearing a number, by which number alone he will be known to the Board of Selectors.

The candidates selected by the Board of Selectors must present themselves for examination by the examiners appointed in that behalf at such time and place as may be thereafter notified to them by the Officer-in-Charge.

Candidates must be strong, healthy, and active, and must produce to the examiners satisfactory written testimony that they are of respectable character, and must furnish names of any persons or firms with whom they may have been employed during the previous two years, together with certified extracts from the register of their birth, or, in default, statutory declarations as to their age last birthday, giving the date thereof.

The age of all candidates shall be reckoned to the date fixed by the Commissioner for opening applications, except in the case of applicants already temporarily employed in the Department, whose age may be reckoned to the date of their first employment as supernumeraries.

Any candidate who was at any time employed in the Railway or Public Service must furnish particulars as to the period of his service and the cause of his leaving. No person who has been previously dismissed from such service shall be eligible for employment under these Regulations.

After examination the successful candidates in each grade will be called together, and determine by ballot, in accordance with the Regulations, the order of precedence for appointment in which their names shall be placed.

Any successful candidates in excess of the number required by the Commissioner shall be eligible for appointment in the order so decided for a period of twelve months then next ensuing from the date of such determination without further examination.

All appointments will be made to the lowest grade in each of the various branches of the Railway service, and on probation only for a period of six months. After such probation, and upon

production of a certificate of fitness from the Head of the Branch in which the probationer was employed, and of evidence that his life is insured in Victoria, as prescribed by Regulations, such appointment may be confirmed.

Appointments will be made only on the distinct understanding that an employe's services are liable to be dispensed with at any time without previous notice having been given to him, and without his having any claim whatever against the Victorian Railways Commissioner on account of his services having been so dispensed with.

This licence is also subject to the rights of the holders of miners' rights or of mining leases now issued or hereafter to be issued to enter upon the allotment hereby licensed, and to search for gold, and to mine therein, and to erect and occupy mining plant and machinery, without making any compensation for surface or other damage.

3. Subject to these conditions, the licensee shall be entitled to use the land for the purposes for which the licence has been granted, until notice has been given in the *Government Gazette* that such land, or any part thereof, has been sold, leased, licensed, alienated, dealt with, or resumed as aforesaid; and immediately upon such notice being given, all the interest of the licensee in the licensed land described in such notice shall cease and be determined, and any person entitled to occupy the licensed land, or any part thereof, may lawfully make entry upon and hold the same without the permission or sanction of the licensee or any one claiming under her, him, or them.

10. This licence may be forfeited if the licensee commit a breach of or neglect to comply with any of these conditions.

11. The publication of a notice in the *Government Gazette*, purporting to declare that the Governor or Administrator, with the advice aforesaid, has forfeited this licence, shall be conclusive evidence that the licence is forfeited.

12. The ring-barking of the timber upon the land by the licensee is expressly forbidden, nor is he entitled to destroy or cut and take away any such timber; and should he be found destroying, felling, or removing live or dead timber without a licence authorizing him so to do he will be prosecuted according to law.
