WAR BETWEEN TURKEY AND GREECE.— PROCLAMATION OF NEUTRALITY.

The following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Governor, and its Enclosures, are published for general information.

A PROCLAMATION.

VICTORIA R.

WHEREAS we are happily at peace with all Sovereigns, Powers,

And whereas, notwithstanding our utmost exertions to preserve peace between the two Sovereign Powers, a state of war unhappily exists between his Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkey and his Majesty the King of the Hellenes, and between their respective subjects and others inhabiting within their countries, territories, or dominions:

And whereas we are on terms of friendship and amicable intercourse with each of these Sovereigns, and with their several subjects and others inhabiting within their countries, territories, or dominions:

And whereas great numbers of our loyal subjects reside and carry on commorce, and possess property and establishments, and enjoy various rights and privileges within the dominions of each of the aforesaid Sovereigns, protected by the faith of treaties between us and each of the aforesaid Sovereigns:

And whereas we, being desirons of preserving to our subjects the blessings of peace which they now happily enjoy, are firmly purposed and determined to maintain a strict and impartial neutrality in the said state of war unhappily existing between the aforesaid Sovereigns:

We therefore have thought fit, by and with the advice of our Privy Council, to issue this our Royal Proclamation:

And we do hereby strictly charge and command all our loving subjects to govern themselves accordingly, and to observe a strict neutrality in and during the aforesaid war, and to observe a strict neutrality in and during the aforesaid war, and to obstain from violating or contravening either the laws and statutes of the realm in this behalf, or the Law of Nations in relation thereto, as they will answer to the contrary at their peril:

And whereas in and by a certain Statute made and passed in a session of Parliament holden in the 33rd and 34th year of our reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the conduct of Her Majesty's subjects during the existence of hostilities between Foreign States with which Her Majesty is at peace," it is amongst other things declared and enacted as follows. This Act shall extend to all the dominions of Her Majesty, including the adjacent territorial waters:—

${\it ``Illegal\ Enlistment.}$

"If any person, without the licence of Her Majesty, being a British subject, within or without Her Majesty's dominions, accepts or agrees to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with any foreign State at peace with Her Majesty, and in this Act referred to as a friendly State, or whether a British subject or not, within Her Majesty's dominions, induces any other person to

accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any such, Foreign State as afore-

"If any person, without the licence of Her Majesty, being a British subject, quits or goes on board any ship with a view of, quitting Her 'Majesty's dominions, with intent to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any foreign State at war with a friendly State, or, whether a British subject or not, within Her Majesty's dominions, induces any other person to quit or to go on board any ship with a view of quitting Her Majesty's dominions with the like intent—

"He shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

"If any person induces any other person to quit Her Majesty's dominions or to embark on any ship within Her Majesty's dominions under a misrepresentation or false representation of the service in which such person is to be engaged, with the intent or in order that such person may accept or agree to accept any commission or engagement in the military or naval service of any Foreign State at war with a friendly State—

"He shall be guilty of an offence against this Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without head below. without hard labour.

"If the master or owner of any ship, without the licence of 'Her Majesty, knowingly either takes on board, or engages to take on board, or has on board such ship within Her Majesty's dominions any of the following persons, in this Act referred to as illegally enlisted persons, that is to say—

"Such person shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this Act, and the following consequences shall ensue:—

"(1) The offender shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

"(2) The ship in respect of which any such offence is committed and her equipment shall be forfeited to Her Majesty.

"Provided that a person building, causing to be built, or equipping a ship in any of the cases aforesaid, in pursuance of a contract made before the commencement of such war as aforesaid,

tract made before the commencement of such war as aforesaid, shall not be liable to any of the penalties imposed by this section in respect of such building or equipping if he satisfies the conditions following, that is to say—

"(1) If forthwith upon a Proclamation of Neutrality being issued by Her Majesty he gives notice to the Secretary of State that he is so building, causing to be built, or equipping such ship, and furnishes such particulars of the contract and of any matters relating to or done or to be done under the contract as may be required by the Secretary of State:

"(2) If he gives such security, and takes and permits to be taken such other measures, if any, as the Secretary of State may prescribe for insuring that such ship shall not be despatched, delivered, or removed without the licence of Her Majesty until the termination of such war as aforesaid.

"Where any ship is built by order of or on behalf of any

"Where any ship is built by order of or on behalf of any foreign State when at war with a friendly State, or is delivered to or to the order of such foreign State, or any person who to the knowledge of the person building is an agent of such foreign State, or is paid for by such foreign State or such agent, and is employed in the military or naval service of such foreign State, such ship shall, until the contrary is proved, be deemed to have been built with a view to being so employed, and the burden shall lie on the builder of such ship of proving that he did not know that the ship was intended to be so employed in the military or naval service of such ship of proving that he did not know that the ship was intended to be so employed in the military or naval service of such foreign State.

"If any person within the dominions of Her Majesty, and without the licence of Her Majesty—

"Such person shall be guilty of an offence against this

"If any person within the limits of Her Majesty's dominions and without the licence of Her Majesty—

"(1) Every person engaged in such preparation or fitting out or assisting therein, or employed in any capacity in such expedition, shall be guilty of an offence against this 'Act, and shall be punishable by fine and imprisonment, or either of such punishments, at the discretion of the court before which the offender is convicted; and imprisonment, if awarded, may be either with or without hard labour.

"(2) All ships and their equipments, and all arms and munitions of war, used in or forming part of such expedition, shall be forfeited to Her Majesty.

"Any person who aids, abets, counsels, or procures the commission of any offence against this Act shall be liable to be tried and punished as a principal offender."

And whereas by the said Act it is further provided that ships built, commissioned, equipped, or despatched in contravention of the Said Act, may be condemned and forfeited by judgment of the Said Act, may be condemned and forfeited by judgment of the Court of Admiralty; and that if the Secretary of State or Chief Executive Authority is satisfied that there is a reasonable and probable cause for believing that a ship within our dominions has been or is being built, commissioned, or equipped, contrary to the said Act, and is about to be despatched contrary to the Act, such Secretary of State or Chief Executive Authority shall have power to issue a warrant authorizing the seizure and search of such ship and her detention until she has been either condemned or released by process of law. And whereas certain powers of seizure and detention are conferred by the said Act on certain local authorities;

Now, in order that none of our subjects may unwailly render themselves liable to the penalties imposed by the said Statute, we do hereby strictly command that no person or persons whatsoever do commit any act, matter; or thing whatsoever contray to the provisio

pleasure.

And we do hereby further warn and admonish all our loving subjects, and all persons whatsoever entitled to our protection, to observe towards each of the aforesaid Sovereigns, their subjects and territories, and towards all belligerents whatsoever with whom we are at peace, the duties of neutrality and to respect, in all and each of them, the exercise of those belligerent rights which we and our royal predecessors have always claimed to exercise.

And we hereby further warn all our loving subjects, and all persons whatsoever entitled to our protection, that if any of them

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"shall presume; in contempt of this our Royal Proclamation, and of our high displeasure, to do any acts in derogation of their duty as subjects of a neutral Sovereign in a war between other Sovereigns, or in violation or contravention of the Law of Nations in that behalf, as more especially by breaking, or endeavouring to break, any blockade lawfully and actually established by or on behalf of either of the said Sovereigns; or by carrying officers, soldiers, despatches, arms, ammunition, military stores or materials, or any article or articles considered and deemed to be contraband of war according to the Law of Modern Usages of Nations, for the use or service of either of the said Sovereigns, that all persons so offending, together with their ships and goods, will rightfully incur and be justly liable to hostile capture, and to the penalties denounced by the Law of Nations in that behalf. And we do hereby give notice that all our subjects and persons entitled to our protection who may misconduct themselvas in the premises will do so at their peril, and of their own wrong; and that they will in nowise obtain any protection from us against such capture or such penalties as aforesaid, but will, on the contrary, incur our high displeasure by such misconduct.

Given at our Court at Windsor, this third day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, in the sixtieth year of our reign.

Her Majesty being fully determined to observe the duties of neutrality during the existing state of war between His Imperial Majesty the Sultan of Turkoy and His Majesty the King of the possible, the use of Her Majesty's heabers ports, at cases, and the waters within Her Majesty's territorial jurisdiction, in aid of the warlike purposes of ether belligerent, has commanded me to communicate to your Lordships, for your guidance, the following rules, which are to be treated and enforced as Her Majesty's released further to command that these rules shall be put in force in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, and the Channel Islands, on and after the Sth inst., and in Her Majesty aterritories, and possessions beyond the seas, six days after the day when the Governor, or other chief authority of each of such territories or possessions, respectively, shall have notified and published the same; stating in such notification that the said rules are to be obeyed by all persons within the same in Louring the continuance of the present state of war, all ships of war of either belligerent are prohibited from making use of any port or coadstead in the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, or the Channel Islands, or in any of Her Majesty's colonides or foreign possessions or dependencies, or of any waters subject to the territorial jurisdiction of the British Crown, as a station, or place of resort, for any warlike purpose, or or the purpose of obtaining any facilities for warlike equipment; and to ship of war of either belligerent shall be graved to sail out of or leave any port, roadstead, or waters subject to British jurisdiction, from which have yeased to the other hellicer the sail parts of the purpose of obtaining any facilities for warlike equipment; and to sail out of or leave any port, roadstead, or waters subject to British jurisdiction, from which have yeased to the other hellicer of the purpose of repai

Every person who is the owner or occupier of any dairy farm, or milk store, or who is a purveyor of milk or cowkeeper shall, on or before the 1st day of January, 1897, and in subsequent years on or before the 1st day of January, 1egister himself by signing and forwarding to the town clerk of the city an application in the form next hereinafter set out, and every such person shall, with every such application, pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

All paddocks, grounds, lands, houses, yards, premises, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the council, or by any person authorized, in writing, by the mayor or town clerk of the said council; and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, houses, yards, premises, or enclosures, or any one of them are, or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may, by an order in writing, signed by the town clerk, and served personally, or left at the dwellinghouse of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person served personally, or left at the dwelling dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle and other animals in dairies may also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, and any other diseased animal, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

The council on receiving a report from an inspector that the construction of any dairy, milking place, cowshed, milk store, milk shop, or other building in the occupation of any person following the trade of dairyman, cowkeeper, or purveyor of milk, is defective or faulty in regard to lighting, ventilation, drainage, or water supply in such a way as to prejudicially affect the health of the cows or the wholesomeness of the milk or other dairy produce, may order the dairyman, cowkeeper, or purveyor of milk to make afteration in any such buildings or structures, to remedy any such defects within a time specified in such order.

- 7. Such closet accommodation shall be provided for the persons employed on the premises of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop,

and at such distance from the milking place, milk store, or milk shop as may be directed by the council, and the closet pans on such premises shall be disinfected daily.

- 8. Where horses are kept on the premises of any dairy, milk store, or milk shop, such stable accommodation shall be provided and at such distance from the milking-place, or milk store, or milk shop as the council may direct.

All houses, dairies, milking-places, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, by affecting the milk or otherwise, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated; and the drainage of all such buildings and milking-places shall be so arranged that no staguant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or centiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman.
- 10. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and be kept perfectly clean, and shall within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector, be furnigated, disinfected, or limewashed, as may be in any such order so directed.
- 11. All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly 11. All vessels used for holding milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily. And no cowkeeper, dairyman, or person employed in milking or dairy work shall use in connexion with milking, or for washing vessels used for holding milk or for any dairy work, water that is in any way infected or contaminated, or contains matter injurious to health; and the health officer or inspector may, after inspection, prohibit, by, order served as prescribed in clause 5 of these regulations, the use for dairy purposes of the water obtained from any well or tank or other source of water supply, and may require any tank to be cleaned and disinfected.
- 12. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force, and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.





SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1897.—No. 7.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1899, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1897 which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

3. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty-five pounds and not exceeding Thirty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound ten shillings shall be paid.

4. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile, of more than Thirty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotmonts shall be One pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.

6. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.
