SIR,
I am directed by the Board of Agriculture to transmit to you the accompanying copies of the Importation of Dogs Order of 1897 and of a Memorandum drawing the attention of local authorities, ship-owners, and the public generally, to the provisions of that Order, which will, from and after the 15th September next, regulate the landing in Great Britain of dogs brought from any other country except Ireland and the Isle of Man.

In order to prevent, so far as possible, the shipment of dogs to this country from the colonial dependencies of Great Britain before the necessary licence for their landing has been obtained, the Board desire me to ask you to be so good as to move Mr. Secretary Chamberlain to cause the enclosed copies of the Order and Memorandum to be forwarded to the various Governors, Commissioners and Administrators, or other officials in the Colonial Dependencies, with a request that the requirements of the Order may be made known as widely as possible.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.
(Dated 7th May, 1897.)

IMPORTATION OF DOGS ORDER OF 1897.

The Board of Agriculture, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Diseases of Animal Acts 1894
No. 77.—JULY 9, 1897.—1.

and 1896, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Prohibition of Importation of Dogs.

1. Dogs brought to Great Britain from any other country (except Ireland or the Isle of Man) shall not be landed in Great Britain otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

Licences for Importation in particular Cases.

2. The Board may in any particular case grant a licence authorizing the landing of a dog, and such dog may thereupon be landed subject to and in accordance with the conditions of such licence.

Applications for Licences.

3. Any application for a licence under the preceding Article is to be made in writing to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture, 4 Whitehall-place, London, S.W., and is to be accompanied by a statement signed by the owner of the dog to which the application relates or by his agent authorized in writing for this purpose, containing the following information (namely):—

- (i.) the description of the dog, stating, so far as possible, for purposes of identification, the particulars of its breed, sex, age, and colour;
- (ii.) the country from which it is proposed to be brought;
- (iii.) the port at which it is proposed to be landed; and
- (iv.) the place to which it is proposed, after being landed, to be moved for the purposes of such detention and isolation as may be required by the Board, and also the route by which it is proposed to be moved to such place of detention.

Conditions of Licence.

4. (1) The Board may insert in any licence granted under this Order authorizing the landing of a dog such conditions as they think necessary or desirable for the following purposes:—

- (a) for prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog by and at the expense of its owner, for any period not exceeding six months, at a place to be provided for that purpose by such owner and to be described in the licence; or
- (b) for regulating the movement of the dog to such place of detention and its movement during the period of detention prescribed by the licence.

(2) A dog landed under the authority of a licence granted under this Order shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the conditions of such licence, and shall not be moved in contravention of any such condition.

Restriction on granting of Licences.

(5) An applicant for a licence to be granted under this Order for the landing of a dog will be required to satisfy the Board that proper and suitable arrangements can be made for such detention and isolation of the dog as appears to the Board to be necessary or desirable.

Proceedings under Customs Acts for Unlawful Landing.

6. (1) If any person lands or attempts to land a dog in contravention of this Order, he shall be liable, under and according to the Customs Acts, to the penalties imposed on persons importing or attempting to import goods the importation whereof is prohibited by or under the Customs Acts, without prejudice to any proceedings against him under the Act of 1894 for an offence against that Act.

(2) The dog in respect whereof the offence is committed shall be forfeited under and according to the Customs Acts in like manner as goods the importation whereof is prohibited by or under the Customs Acts.

Extension of certain Sections of Diseases of Animals Act 1894.

7. Dogs shall be animals, and rabies shall be a disease, for the purposes of this Order and of the following sections of the Act of 1894 (namely):—

- Section 43 (powers of police);
Section 44 (powers of inspectors);
Section 56 (unlawful landing);

and also for the purposes of all other sections of the said Act containing provisions relative to or consequent on the provisions of those sections and this Order, including such sections as relate to offences or procedure.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

8. The provisions of this Order, except where it is otherwise provided, shall be executed and enforced by the local authority.

Offences.

9. (1) If a dog is moved in contravention of this Order, or of the conditions of a licence granted thereunder, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If a dog is landed in contravention of this Order, the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel from which it is landed, and the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the landing, and the person landing the same, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been landed in contravention as aforesaid, shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3) If a dog is not kept isolated as required by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence granted thereunder, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person failing or neglecting to isolate the dog shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts, defaults, or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4) If a person with a view to unlawfully evade or defeat the operation of this Order, or of the conditions of a licence granted thereunder, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

10. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

- “The Board” means the Board of Agriculture.
“The Act of 1894” means the *Diseases of Animals Act 1894*.
“Master” includes a person having the charge or command of a vessel.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Act of 1894.

Extent.

11. Except where otherwise expressed this Order extends to Great Britain.

Commencement.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of September, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

Short Title.

13. This Order may be cited as the *Importation of Dogs Order of 1897*.

IMPORTATION OF DOGS ORDER OF 1897.

THE Board of Agriculture desire to draw the attention of local authorities, ship-owners, and the public generally to the provisions of this Order, which regulates the landing in Great Britain of dogs brought from any other country except Ireland and the Isle of Man.

The Order is made to take effect on the 15th of September, 1897, and it will be observed that no dog, to which the Order applies will be allowed to be landed in Great Britain without a licence from the Board of Agriculture obtained previous to the landing.

Special attention is drawn to the following provisions of the Order:—

Applications for Licences.

Any application for a licence is to be made in writing to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture, 4 Whitehall-place, London, S.W., and is to be accompanied by a statement signed by the owner of the dog to which the application relates, or by his agent authorized, in writing for this purpose, containing the following information, namely:—

- (i.) The description of the dog, stating, so far as possible, for purposes of identification, the particulars of its breed, sex, age, and colour;
- (ii.) The country from which it is proposed to be brought;
- (iii.) The port at which it is proposed to be landed; and
- (iv.) The place to which it is proposed, after being landed, to be moved for the purposes of such detention and isolation as may be required by the Board, and also the route by which it is proposed to be moved to such place of detention.

Conditions of Licence.

The Board may insert in any licence authorizing the landing of a dog such conditions as they think necessary or desirable for the following purposes—

- (a) For prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog by and at the expense of its owner, for any period not exceeding six months, at a place to be provided for that purpose by such owner, and to be described in the licence; or
- (b) For regulating the movement of the dog to such place of detention, and its movement during the period of detention prescribed by the licence.

A dog landed under the authority of such a licence shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the conditions of such licence, and shall not be moved in contravention of any such condition.

Restriction on Granting of Licences.

An applicant for a licence for the landing of a dog will be required to satisfy the Board that proper and suitable arrangements can be made for such detention and isolation of the dog as appears to the Board to be necessary or desirable.

In order that as little inconvenience as possible may be caused in the enforcement of the Order, the Board trust that local authorities will assist them by taking steps to make its contents known as widely as possible in their districts. The Board would invite ship-owners to co-operate with them by causing due notice to be given to passengers desirous of bringing dogs with them, of the conditions under which alone dogs will be permitted to be landed in Great Britain, and with this view the Board would suggest that ship-owners should instruct their agents abroad and the masters of their vessels to warn passengers, and prevent as far as possible the shipment of any dogs the owners of which may not have previously obtained the necessary licence for their being landed.

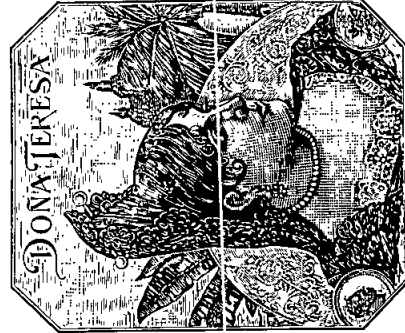

ADDITIONAL PILOTAGE RATE.

WHEREAS by section 82 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is enacted that the rates of pilotage on ships arriving at or departing from any of the ports of Victoria, or from any one part of such port to any other, shall be those set forth in the Third Schedule of the said Act, subject to the exemptions therein contained and the powers to alter or reduce such rates as thereinbefore in the said Act provided: And whereas by section 58 of the said Act it is amongst other things further enacted that the Marine Board may fix the limits within which the rates of pilotage therein mentioned shall be payable, and may appoint a scale of lesser rates for any shorter distance within such limits at which any vessel may be boarded, and also a scale of rates for pilotage from any one part of any one port to any other part thereof, and from time to time reduce such rates of pilotage as well as those set forth

in the Third Schedule of the said Act: And whereas the Marine Board did on the 23rd day of November, 1894, fix such limits and appoint such scales of rates as aforesaid, which limits and rates were duly published in the *Government Gazette* of the 14th December, 1894: And whereas it is expedient to decrease the rates of pilotage in certain cases (hereinafter set forth): Now therefore the said Marine Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, fix the following limits and appoint the following additional rate of pilotage as hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

The owner, master, or agent of any ship being a vessel of war or a yacht used exclusively for purposes of pleasure, or of any ship entering Port Phillip for any of the following purposes, namely:—Seeking cargo only, calling for orders, effecting repairs, for docking, for obtaining provisions, or on account of being otherwise in distress (such ship having had the services of a pilot from without the Heads to any anchorage within the ports of Port Phillip, Geelong, or Melbourne) shall be required to pay pilotage at the rate only of One penny per ton net registered tonnage of such ship inwards and outwards, and the maximum amount of inward or outward pilotage to be charged on any such ship shall not exceed the amount of Ten pounds (£10). Provided that should any such ship subsequent to arrival in Port Phillip load or discharge any cargo or land or take on board any passengers in such port for the purpose of earning freight or passage money the owner, master, or agent of such ship shall be required to pay the ordinary full rates of pilotage thereon, both inwards and outwards:

Any such ship forced back within forty-eight (48) hours after having been piloted to sea shall be charged one-half (½) of the foregoing rate for pilotage services rendered subsequently to its original departure.

The fixing of the foregoing limits and rate shall take effect from the date of the publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

The foregoing limits and rate of pilotage were fixed and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria held this eleventh day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

REGULATION for the imposing, levying, and receiving water rates and charges within the Boort Waterworks Trust District.

1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements within the Boort Waterworks Trust District shall pay for the year 1897, viz.—
2. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting every street within which the Trust shall have laid a main-pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being of the annual value of Seventeen pounds ten shillings or less according to the municipal valuation of such house or tenement for the said year, the sum of Thirty-five shillings.
3. On every house or tenement abutting or fronting any street within which the Trust shall have laid a main-pipe for the purpose of supplying water, and such house or tenement being above the annual value of Seventeen pounds ten shillings according to the municipal valuation for the said year, the sum of Two shillings in the pound of such valuation.
4. On every house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a main-pipe for the supply of water, and to which house or tenement the water shall not have been laid on, a rate of Seventeen shillings and sixpence shall be paid where the municipal valuation of such house or tenement does not exceed Seventeen pounds ten shillings. In all such cases where the municipal valuation exceeds Seventeen pounds ten shillings a rate of One shilling in the pound shall be paid.

5. In every case where the water shall be laid on to a house or tenement not abutting or fronting a street within which the Trust shall have laid down a pipe for the purpose of supplying water, the rates provided by clauses 2 and 3 of this Regulation shall be paid. Also that any ratepayer who may be considered to be using an undue quantity of water shall be compelled by the Trust to provide a meter, water to be charged for at the rate of One shilling per thousand gallons.

6. The above rate shall be due and payable on the 1st day of July, 1897.

7. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates.

RATING REGULATION, 1897. No. 2.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1897 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments of land liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.
2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.
3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land shall be Ten shillings sterling per annum for each and every additional allotment.
4. For water supplied by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.
5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by meter, shall be—
(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by rate, at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.
6. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance.
7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

WANDELLA IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION FOR SALE OF WATER.—No. 1.

THE Commissioners of the Wandella Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation for the sale of water:—

1. All water supplied from the Trust works shall be paid for by measure. All measurements shall be made by gauges of a form and pattern approved by the Trust, and fixed under direction of the Trust; and all quantities shall be computed by the officer of the Trust deputed for that purpose.
2. All water shall be supplied through properly constructed outlets, which shall be fixed in any part of a channel approved by the Commissioners.
3. The Trust reserves to itself the right to fix the quantity of water from time to time which shall be supplied to every 320 acres or fractional part thereof.
4. The manipulation of the works shall be solely in the hands of the Trust officers, who shall turn the water on and off, and any other person not being duly authorized who shall in any way interfere, tamper with, or damage any of the works shall be deemed to be guilty of a breach of this Regulation; and the Trust shall prosecute such person according to law.
5. The water bailiff shall supply water to each land-holder in succession, and no person shall be supplied out of his turn, excepting when surplus water is available, when applicants shall be supplied in order of application for surplus water.

6. The rate or price to be charged for water supplied for the irrigation of grass land shall be Three pence per inch per acre, from the 1st day of March to the 31st day of October, both days inclusive, and for water supplied for similar use between the 31st day of October and the last day of February the charge shall be Nine pence per inch per acre.

The rate or price to be paid for water supplied for the irrigation of any kind of crop or cultivated land (excepting lucerne) shall be Two pence per inch per acre from the 1st day of January to the 31st day of December.

7. The rate or price to be paid for water supplied for the irrigation of land under lucerne shall be Nine pence per inch per acre for each watering.

8. The rate or price for filling tanks shall be One pound for any tank not exceeding 1,000 cubic yards.

And whereas the Broken Creek is a natural source of water supply to the Waterworks District of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust, which said Trust has been constituted according to law: And whereas it is deemed advisable that the diversion of water from the said Broken Creek be regulated:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that no diversion of water shall be made by the said Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust from the said Broken Creek in its flow to and through the Waterworks District of that Trust during such time as the rate of diversion of water into such creek from the Broken River, by means of a work known as Casey's Weir constructed on such river, shall be less than Four hundred (400) cubic feet per minute.

And it is hereby further directed that, for the purpose of ascertaining the quantity of water diverted into and from the said creek, the said Trust shall construct and erect, within three months from the date hereof, proper gauges, to the satisfaction of the Chief Engineer of Water Supply, at the following places, viz.:

- Broken River, immediately above the works known as Casey's Weir.
- Broken Creek, immediately below the works known as Casey's Weir.
- Broken Creek, immediately above the Katandra Weir.
- Broken Creek (locally known as Nine-mile Creek), immediately above the Dumbulbalane Weir.

The designs for the said gauges to be in the first instance submitted to and approved by the Chief Engineer of Water Supply.

No. 1432) it is among other things provided that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, may, either absolutely or subject to any regulations, prohibit the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any tree, plant, or vegetable which is, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, likely to introduce any disease or insect into Victoria: And whereas, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, the trees and plants of the kinds hereinafter specified are likely to introduce disease or insects into Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation prohibit, subject to the regulations for the time being in force under the said recited Act, the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of any tree or plant of the following kinds, provided that nothing in this Proclamation shall or shall be deemed to apply to the importation, introduction, or bringing into Victoria of the fruit or product of any of the kinds of trees or plants so specified, that is to say:—Apple trees, apricot trees, almond trees, currant trees, cherry trees, fig trees, gooseberry trees, nectarine trees, pear trees, plum trees, peach trees, persimmon trees, raspberry plants, strawberry plants, and plants of the citrus family.

AREAS OF LANDS INCREASED AND DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 3, 4, 5, and 8 of section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—
