RATING REGULATION, 1897. No. 2.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Korumburra Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1890, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Act 1890, make the Regulation following:—

The following are the rates for the year 1897 which the owners and occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments of land liable to be rated shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Water Supply District:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or under, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

under, a rate of One shilling in the pound storling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.

2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.

3. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments of land shall be Ten shillings sterling per annum for each and every additional allotment.

4. For water supplied by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.

5. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water is supplied by meter, shall be—

(a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by rate, at One shilling for every 1,000 gallons, shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.

6. The toregoing rate is horeby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance.

7. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rate.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has rescinded rule No. 17 of the Rules for the Management of the Alfred Graving Dock and Patent Slip, and the Schedule of Dues for the use of such Dock and Slip, and has substituted the following rule and schedule of dues therefor, to take effect on and after the 20th July, 1897, viz.:-

Vessels using the dock or slip under this rule shall be kept in such a condition as to be able to leave the dock or slip (if required for another vossel) within a period of five days after notice has been given to leave, otherwise full dues will be charged for overy day the vessel remains in dock or on the slip after the date of notice has expired.

The births of 1,141 children, viz., 620 boys and 521 girls, were registered in Greater McBourne during the month of June. The number was, it will be observed, 8 higher than in June, 1896, which was the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years. One hundred and fifty four deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—54 in the Melbourne, 15 in the Alfred, 5 in St. Vincent's, 7 in the Women's, 6 in the Children's, 8 in the Homospathic, and 7 in the Austin Hospitals, 12 in the Metropolitan and 6 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 17 in the Benevolent and 3 in the Infant Asylums, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 3 in the Immigrants' Home, 17 in the Benevolent and 3 in the Infant Asylums, 2 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 3 in the Protestant Refuge, 3 in the Melbourne Gaol, and 1 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 149, of which 75, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 74, or 50 per cent., were females. Of those who died, 106 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two, 7 were between two and three, 11 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 454. In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding one in the previous year, an increase of 19 deaths occurred under the head of symotic diseases, and of 9 under ill-defined causes; but, on the other hand, there was a decrease of 19 in the constitutional class, 31 in the local, and 5 under violence.

The increased mortality in the zymotic class was due to diphtheria, which caused 28 deaths during the month, as compared with only 6 in June, 1896, whilst the number from scarlet fover also rose from 1 to 4. The decline in the constitutional class occurred under the heads of phthisis and cancer, the deaths from the former having fallon from 65 to 49, and from the latter from 39 to 36. Under local diseases, deaths from diseases of the nervous the respiratory system rose from 12 to 119, and of the dig; stive system from 39 to 36; whereas those from diseases of the nervous testing fill from 62 to 53, of the circulatory system from 80 to 63, of the urinary system from 34 to 23, of the generative system from 6 to 2, of parturition from 7 to 4, and of the organs of locomotion from 8 to nil.

The following is a statement of the deaths set, down to diphtheria and typhoid favor in each worth of the years 1800 to 1806.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1896, and the first six months of 1897, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that diphtheria prevailed in an epidemic form during the last three months, and caused a greater mortality in June, 1897, than in any previous month since September, 1890.
