





2. All the firewood supplied under these contracts must be split out of large forest timber, and must be dry, perfectly sound, of good burning quality, and of the kind or kinds and sizes specified in the various schedules. Neither burnt wood, heart wood, small branches, nor outside pieces of bark will be received.

3. The orders will be issued by the departments requiring the supplies, and the firewood shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply. 11.
