### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath: Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of Victoria, do hereby declare that I have, this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of Victoria, the titles whereof are hereinafter set forth, that is to say:—

“An Act to amend the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts 1890 and 1893.”

“An Act to authorize the construction by the State of a Line of Railway from Wangaratta to Whitfield.”

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fourth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and in the sixty-first year of Her Majesty's reign.

## Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 80 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY or WORK-ROOMS OF WILLIAM DETMOLD LIMITED, WHOLESALE STATIONERS, 125-32 FLINDERS-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of two weeks from the 17th August, 1897, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than twenty-one females or more than two boys under the age of sixteen years for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said twenty-one females and two boys under the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than three hours beyond the ordinary working hours, in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female so employed shall receive not less than Eight shillings and Twelve shillings respectively per week for each week during which he or she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half, and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That every boy under the age of sixteen years and every female shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening he or she works overtime.
4. That none of such females or boys shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continuously posted in such factory or work-room for the information of all concerned.

## REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF MINING SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

CANDIDATES must give notice, in writing, not less than three weeks prior to the date of the examination, of their intention to present themselves; they must also forward to the Board satisfactory documentary evidence that they have complied with the preliminary conditions; and on their application being approved by the Board they must pay the prescribed fee of £2 2s. into the Treasury, Melbourne, or into any Receipt and Pay Office, and forward receipt for same to the Secretary to the Board, Mining Department, Melbourne.

1. Every candidate must have previously obtained a certificate as Contract or Authorized Land Surveyor from the Board of Examiners appointed in connexion with the Department of Lands and Survey in Victoria.

2. He must also have served for not less than six months under some competent mining surveyor or engineer, or mining manager, in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations.

3. A candidate whose application shall have been approved as having complied with the above conditions will be examined, and will be required to pass in each of the four following subjects:—

(a) Mining Surveying.—Connexion and reduction of bearings to datum of surface survey; survey of vertical and inclined shafts, drives, and workings; survey of mineral veins and lodes, leads, and drifts.

(b) Practical Mining.—Construction of shafts, chambers, and tunnels in rock and drift; timbering, drainage, and ventilation of mines; general principles of the strength of timber in framings; constructions in rough carpentry.

(c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.

(d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visd voce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 24th February, 1896, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Vind roce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

## PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

*Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—*

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level-clinometer, teleneter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

\* If the certificate be of professional employment only, the words from "and that" to "surveys" inclusive shall be struck out.

*Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

*Drawing.*

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

## MISCELLANEOUS.

*Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.*

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

## CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

**RODNEY IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY  
TRUST.—REGULATIONS.**

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Rodney Irrigation and Water Supply Trust make the Regulations following, that is to say:—

**REGULATION No. 14.**

1. The Regulation made by the Trust on the 3rd day of July, 1893, and approved of by the Governor in Council on the 14th day of August, 1893, and numbered 7, shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

2. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land may be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall, except where they are inapplicable to the situation or circumstances, be by gauges of form and pattern approved of by the Trust, and fixed under the direction and to the satisfaction of the officer appointed by the Trust for that purpose. The registration of the quantities of water delivered shall be made by the Trust's officers; and where it is impossible, by reason of the absence of a gauge, to measure the volume delivered a watering shall be deemed to be 3 inches on an acre.

3. Any person who shall construct and put in any outlet from the works of the Trust without the written authority and (in that case) without the supervision of the Trust's authorized officer, or in any manner other than that sanctioned by such officer, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

4. Except as hereinafter provided, the rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of lucerne, crop, orchard, stubble, and all other products, excepting grass, shall be Eightpence per inch per acre for the first watering, Sixpence per inch per acre for the second watering, and Fourpence per inch per acre for the third or any subsequent watering during any one season; and for the irrigation of land used for grazing purposes (exclusive of any of the products hereinbefore mentioned), Fourpence per inch per acre.

And 1 inch of water on an acre shall be deemed to be 4,000 cubic feet of water measured by the gauge.

5. Agreements may be entered into with the Trust whereby the latter may contract to supply water for irrigation purposes, as often as it may be required during any period of twelve months, at the rate or price of One pound per acre, or fraction of an acre, per annum, to be paid in advance.

6. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct. No person shall be supplied with water for irrigation purposes, during any one season, of a value less than Ten shillings; and the delivery of water shall be continued on Sundays as well as on ordinary working days.

7. Every person agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall receive notification of the dates and quantities in which it will be delivered to him or her.

8. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the authority of the Trust, or of its engineer, or by any person acting under the instructions of the latter officer.

9. Any person not being duly authorized as in the last preceding clause who shall open any irrigation outlet, or do any act which may cause the escape of water from the Trust's channels or works, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation.

10. No person shall injure or damage any of the works of the Trust, or waste or defile the water contained therein; and any person who shall injure or damage such works, or any part thereof, or waste or defile the water contained therein, shall be deemed to have committed a breach of this Regulation. In addition, where irrigation is carried on without a gauge to record the quantity of water delivered, and no provision has been made for the economical use of the water, or where the application of the water becomes palpably wasteful, the person so offending shall have his, or her, supply cut off. But this clause, and the one next preceding, shall not apply to *bona fide* action taken by any ratepayer or land-owner within the district of the Trust with a view to insuring the safety of the works, or precluding any possible action at law against the Trust for damage by flooding which might arise were not such action taken.

11. In the event of the Trust being unable from failure of the works, or from any other cause, to deliver or supply water to persons whom it shall have agreed to supply, such persons shall be entitled to a rebate of the price agreed to be paid for such water. But the Trust shall not be answerable for any loss or damage which may have been sustained by any person by reason of such non-delivery.

12. Should any account due to the Trust for irrigation water supplied remain unpaid for two months after the rendering of such account, the person making such default with payment shall have no further supply delivered to him or her until the account be acquitted.

13. Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding, for any offence, the sum of Five pounds.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1896, in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Trust's district (exclusive of the Urban District of Tungamah as such Urban District was proclaimed and defined on 20th January, 1891):—

1. A rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Trust (excepting the Urban District of Tungamah) shall be imposed and levied for the year 1896.

2. For the annual supply of water to gardens and special blocks of land on or near any of the Trust's channels, either within or without the Trust's District (in the Shires of Tungamah and Benalla) there shall be charged such sum as the Trust's Commissioners, in consideration of the circumstances of each case, shall, from time to time by resolution of the Trust, determine.

3. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1896, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1896, and shall be payable on the 1st day of January, 1896.

4. Such person or persons, as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint, shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

The foregoing Regulation, numbered 21, was made by the Chairman and Commissioners of the Shire of Tungamah Waterworks Trust this 2nd day of August, 1897.

#### EAST BOORT IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—RATING REGULATION.

REGULATION for the making of rate, under section 254 of the *Water Act 1890*, on all rateable property in the Irrigation and Water Supply District.

1. A rate of Sixpence in the pound sterling on the annual value of all rateable property within the Irrigation and Water Supply District of the East Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rates of the Shire of Gordon, is hereby made for the year 1897, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1897, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1897.

2. Such rate is made payable on the 1st day of June, 1897.

3. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rate.

NOTE.—The births registered during the second quarter of 1897 (viz., 7,981) were fewer by 215, and the deaths (3,704) fewer by 43 than in the corresponding quarter of the previous year, thus resulting in a decrease of 172 in the natural increase (4,277).

The returns of the immigration agent indicate a net emigration by sea during the quarter of 1,806, but correcting this for unrecorded departures—estimated at 1,974—the whole loss was apparently as high as 3,780. This was less than in the corresponding quarter of 1896 by 981, of 1895 by 237, and of 1894 by 76.

Deducting the net emigration from the natural increase, there results a net increase in the population during the quarter of 497, as compared with a decrease of 297 in the corresponding quarter of 1896. The increase referred to is in marked contrast to the large decreases of population in the first and third quarters of 1896 and the first quarter of 1897, which averaged 3,900 per quarter; and is the third and largest increase that has occurred in any quarter since September, 1895.

From the date of the Census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 45,360, viz., 35,397 of males and 9,963 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the population at the end of June would have been set down at 1,215,664, viz., 626,602 males and 589,062 females.

Taking the migration returns for what they are worth they show a balance in favour of immigration of 822 from New South Wales, 916 from Tasmania, 271 from New Zealand, and 694 from Foreign Ports; but a balance in favour of emigration of 2,847 to Western Australia, 285 to South Australia, 25 to Queensland, 5 to South Seas, 126 to South Africa, and 1,221 to the United Kingdom. The net emigration to Western Australia fell off by 924 as compared with the second quarter of 1896, and that to South Africa by 278.

The births of 1,084 children, viz., 543 boys and 541 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of July. This number shows an appreciable increase over the unusually low numbers recorded in the corresponding months of the last three years, although it was 211 below the average during the previous ten years, or 214 below it if allowance be made for increase of population.

The deaths registered in July numbered 530, viz., 284 of males and 246 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 554, or 105 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, fewer by 25 than in the corresponding month of the preceding year. They were, however, by far the lowest recorded in any such month of the previous ten years, and 117 below the average of July during the same period, or 119 below it, allowing for increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 28.29 and of deaths registered 13.84 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month during the last ten years of 31.34 and 17.16 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 34.55 and 18.37.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 66.1° on the 30th, and the lowest was 34.6° on the 29th. The mean temperature of the month (50.8°) was the highest on record, being four-fifths of a degree more than the next highest, viz., 50.0° in July, 1862, and 2.6° above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.9°) took place on the 29th, and the least range (4.7°) on the 21st. The mean daily range was 12.5°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.412 inches on the 24th, and the lowest was 29.482 inches on the 20th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.014 inches) was above the average.

Rain fell on fourteen days, the amount of rainfall being 2.45 inches, being about a seventh of an inch above that in July, 1896, but a ninth of an inch below the average of the previous ten years.

Fog occurred on one day during the month.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 20 per cent. to that mortality, as against 22 per cent. in July, 1896; 27 per cent. in July, 1895; 27 per cent. in July, 1894; 50 per cent. in July, 1893; 29 per cent. in July, 1892; and 33 per cent. in July, 1891.

Fifty-eight deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, four females, each aged 75, died of endocarditis, pericarditis, heart disease (undefined), and bronchitis respectively; a farmer, aged 75, of pneumonia; a carpenter, aged 75, of abscess of lung; a lady, aged 76, of heart disease; a female, aged 76, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 76, of pneumonia; another, aged 77, of rheumatism; a female, aged 77, of apoplexy; a glazier, aged 77, of hemiplegia; a billiard-table repairer, aged 77, of heart disease; a female, aged 77, of pneumonia; a builder, aged 77, of nephritis; two females, each aged 78, of cancer and apoplexy respectively; a mariner, aged 78, of apoplexy; a gentleman and a clerk, each

aged 78, of bronchitis; a compositor and a female, each aged 78, of pneumonia; a female, aged 79, of cancer; a sailmaker and a female, each aged 79, of bronchitis; a gentleman, aged 80, of heart disease; two females, each aged 80, of asthma; a gentleman, aged 80, of pneumonia; a female, aged 81, of syncope; a gentleman, aged 82, of pneumonia; a carpenter, aged 83, of hydatids; a female servant, aged 83, of apoplexy; a lawyer, aged 83, of bronchitis; a bootmaker, aged 83, of pneumonia; two females, each aged 84, of paralysis and heart disease respectively; a labourer, aged 84, was found drowned in the River Yarra; a female, aged 85, died of insanity; a contractor, aged 85, of pneumonia; a female, aged 86, of bronchitis; a farmer, aged 87, of dilatation of the heart; a female, aged 88, of pneumonia; and a miner, aged 94, of heart disease; a beekeeper, a bootmaker, a miner, and a female, each aged 76, an engineer and a female, each aged 78, a female, aged 79, a gentleman, a housekeeper, and a female, each aged 81, a carpenter, aged 82, a brickmaker and a gardener, each aged 83, and a boardinghouse-keeper, aged 89, of old age.

Thirty-three deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 22 were set down to accident, 2 to homicide, and 9 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A labourer, aged 55, was passed over by a railway train; a boy, aged 11, by a tram-car; a driver, aged 34, by a lorry; a jockey, aged 26, died of injuries consequent on a fall from a horse, whilst riding in a race; a driver, aged 48, of fracture of the skull, the result of a kick from a horse; a storekeeper, aged 48, and a musician, aged 62, both of fracture of the skull, caused by a fall whilst in a fit; a cab-driver, aged 63, of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall down stairs; a female child, aged 2, of injuries also caused by a fall; a female, aged 85, of rupture of the intestines; a new-born female infant, of hæmorrhage on the brain during birth; a driver, aged 36, of traumatic tetanus; a male child, aged 1 year, of scalds; a labourer, aged 45, was drowned in the River Yarra through having been knocked off the deck of a ship whilst assisting to unload; a labourer, aged 51, by falling into a water channel whilst drunk; four persons were found drowned, viz., a miner, aged 44, a male, of unknown occupation, aged 45, and a labourer, aged 84, in the River Yarra; and a publican, aged 67, in the Albert Park Lagoon; two females, aged 33 and 66 respectively, were suffocated during the night by coal gas which entered their house through a bath drain-pipe owing to a fracture in the gas main; and a female child, aged 6 months, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of two male children, aged 7 weeks and 3 months respectively, who were suffocated, a verdict of wilful murder being returned in each case. The suicidal deaths were those of a shopman, aged 35, and a female, aged 37, who cut their throats; a miner, aged 30, a labourer, aged 47, a pawnbroker, aged 50, and a gardener, aged 54, who poisoned themselves; a gentleman, aged 38, who drowned himself; and two females, aged 25 and 39 respectively, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and thirty-six deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—58 in the Melbourne, 16 in the Alfred, 5 in St. Vincent's, 1 in the Women's, 5 in the Children's, 4 in the Homœopathic, and 2 in the Austin Hospitals, 9 in the Metropolitan and 10 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums, 5 in the Immigrants' Home, 16 in the Benevolent and 1 in the Infant Asylums, 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 3 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 107, of which 53, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 54, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 76 were under one year of age, 13 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 7 were between three and four, and 6 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 423. Of these, 231, or 55 per cent., were males; and 192, or 45 per cent., were females; 16 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 12 were between twenty and twenty-five, 37 were between twenty-five and thirty, 41 were between thirty and thirty-five, 31 were between thirty-five and forty, 17 were between forty and forty-five, 29 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 34 were between fifty-five and sixty, 36 were between sixty and sixty-five, 34 were between sixty-five and seventy, 39 were between seventy and seventy-five, 32 were between seventy-five and eighty, 17 were between eighty and eighty-five, 8 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 1 at the age of ninety-four.

In the month under review, as compared with the corresponding month in 1896, an increase of 8 deaths took place under zymotic diseases, 5 under developmental diseases, and 8 under violence; whilst on the other hand there was a decrease of 12 under constitutional, 31 under local, and 3 under ill-defined or unspecified causes. In the zymotic class, deaths from venereal disease fell from 5 to 1, but those from septic diseases rose from 2 to 12—including 6 from puerperal fever. In the developmental class, an increase from 11 to 14 under premature birth was counterbalanced by a decrease from 21 to 18 under old age, whilst deaths from atelectasis and other malformations rose from 5 to 10. In the constitutional class, the number from cancer fell from 36 to 24; and in the local class, that from diseases of the respiratory system declined from 109 to 87, and from those of the digestive system from 44 to 32, although deaths from childbirth increased from 5 to 7. The mortality from childbirth (including puerperal fever) was exceptionally high during the month under notice, no fewer than 13 deaths being recorded, equivalent to 1 death of a mother to every 83 births registered; whereas in the first six months of the current year only 22 such deaths occurred, or 1 to every 288 births.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1896, and the first seven months of 1897, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the epidemic of diphtheria, prevalent during the previous three months, appears to be rapidly subsiding.

No. 1106, Part I., sec. 142) power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations made under the provisions aforesaid (that is to say):—

## REGULATIONS UNDER PART I. OF THE LAND ACT 1890.

*Regulations dated 2nd July, 1893.—Schedule C3.—Wattle Bark  
Licence.*

To the schedule of Crown lands for which this licence is not available the following words are added, namely:—"Nor for any reserved land situate on the bank of any river or creek, nor for any Crown land that has been either temporarily or permanently reserved for a specified purpose, except by the special permission, in writing, of the Minister of Lands."

Condition 3 is hereby cancelled, and the following condition is substituted therefor:—

3. No tree of less than 5 inches in diameter, when of the black or feather-leaf species, nor less than 3½ inches, when of the golden or broad-leaf species, shall be stripped of its bark, except the

golden species be more than 50-miles from the sea coast, in which case trees having a diameter of 2½ inches may be stripped. The measurements in each of the foregoing cases shall be taken at 2 feet from the ground.

And the Honorable Robert Wallace Best, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THAT PORTION OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES IN THE PARISH OF LORNE, KNOWN AS THE "MARRAM RESERVE."

WE, William Allin Mountjoy, J.P., John Elkington, J.P., John Stirling, Charles Rooke, Edgar Mountjoy, Hamilton Donnan, and Charles A. Gwynne, the duly appointed Committee of Management of that portion of the Reserve for Public Purposes in the parish of Lorne, known as, and hereinafter designated, the "Marram Reserve," having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*:—

## REGULATIONS.

1. The "Marram Reserve" shall be open to the public free of charge.
2. No person shall climb any of the trees, or climb or jump over the seats or fences, in or around the "Marram Reserve."
3. No person shall cut or deface any building, seat, gate, post, or fence, or write thereon, or affix any bill or stencil mark to any building, tree, seat, gate, post, fence, wall, or railing in the "Marram Reserve."
4. No person shall cut, remove, or injure any trees, shrubs, plants, flowers, or fruits in the "Marram Reserve," or interfere with or destroy, or cause to be destroyed, any of the trees, shrubs, plants, flowers, labels, or other property in the "Marram Reserve," or remove sand or soil therefrom.
5. No person shall camp in the "Marram Reserve," or erect thereon any dwelling, or any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management first obtained.
6. No person shall leave or deposit in the "Marram Reserve" any bottles, broken glass, fruit skins, bones, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter.
7. No person shall light fires or discharge firearms in the "Marram Reserve."

8. No person shall enter or remain in the "Marram Reserve" who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

9. No person shall bring into the "Marram Reserve" any dog, unless led by a chain or cord.

10. No person shall moor or fasten any boat to the posts or fences of the "Marram Reserve" which face the sea beach.

11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the "Marram Reserve," shall ride or drive therein any horse, carriage, or other vehicle without the consent, in writing, of the committee of management.

12. No person shall depasture in the "Marram Reserve" any horses, cattle, sheep, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the committee of management: provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the "Marram Reserve," and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.

13. No performance or entertainment of any kind shall be permitted in the "Marram Reserve" on Sundays.

14. No public meeting of any kind, or assemblage of persons together to the number of twenty or more for any like purpose shall be allowed in the "Marram Reserve" without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the *Land Act 1890*, on conviction, before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

# CLOSE SEASON IN THE HOPKINS AND MERRI RIVERS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fisheries Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1093), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, from time to time by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, may for any species of fish prescribe a "close season" or "close seasons" in every year, and that every Proclamation under the said Act may be explained, varied, revoked, annulled, or superceded by any other Proclamation under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, and bearing date the 20th day of October, 1896, relating to fishing in the Hopkins and Merri Rivers, and do by this my Proclamation prescribe close seasons as follow, viz.:—

1. In the Merri River, from the 1st July to the 31st October (both dates inclusive) in each year, for all fish.
2. In the Hopkins River, eastward of a line marked by two posts about one mile and a half from the mouth of the said river, from the 1st July to the 31st October (both dates inclusive) in each year, for all fish.
3. In the Hopkins River, westward of the said line to a radius of one quarter of a mile seaward from the mouth of the said river, from the 1st July to the 31st October (both dates inclusive) in each year, for bream and perch only.

*Description of land.*—One acre, county of Villiers, town of Dunkeld, being allotments 6 and 7 of section 9: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 7; bounded thence by Wills-street bearing east two chains; thence by allotment 5 bearing south five chains; thence by Martin-street bearing west two chains; and thence by allotment 8 bearing north five chains to the point of commencement.

*Names of trustees.*—John Abraham Lord, George Taylor, James Allan Learmonth, William Pope Brown, Thomas Carus Yockins, and William Young.

*Powers of disposition.*—Power to sell, lease, mortgage, exchange, transfer, or deal with the whole or any part or parts of the land when and as the trustees or the major part of them shall, with the approval of the Victoria and Tasmania Conference, as defined by *The Victorian Wesleyan Methodists Act 1887*, think most advantageous. The authorized representative of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Victoria for the time being duly appointed under that Act shall have power to fill up all vacancies occurring in the trusteeship, to appoint new or additional trustees, and to register these trusts in the register of trustees under *The Victorian Wesleyan Methodists Act 1887*. Subject to such powers as aforesaid, but not in derogation thereof, the land or such part thereof as shall be undisposed of as aforesaid shall be held upon the trusts of "The Wesleyan Methodist Model Deed of Victoria 1887," enrolled in the office of the Registrar-General of Victoria under the provisions of the said last-mentioned Act.

*Purposes to which proceeds of disposition are to be applied.*—To such Wesleyan Methodist Church building purposes as shall be approved by a majority of the trustees, with the consent of the aforesaid Conference.
