INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1898.

(iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.

(iv.) That he is of good moral character.

The births of 1,031 children, viz., 518 boys and 513 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of August. The number was, it will be observed, 30 lower than in August, 1896, and the lowest recorded for the month during the last eleven years. The number was, moreover, 361 below the average during the previous ten years, or 365 below it if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in August numbered 567, viz., 275 of males and 292 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 464, or by 82 per cent. The deaths were, it will be noticed, fewer by 64 than in the corresponding month of the preceding year, and were, moreover, less numerous than in any such month of the previous ten years; they were also 89 below the average of August during the same period, or 91 below it, allowing for increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 26.91 and of deaths registered 14.80 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month during the last ten years of 37.03 and 17.47 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 34.55 and 18.37.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 68.1° on the 12th, and the lowest was 34.0° on the 10th. The mean temperature of the month (48.9°) was, with the exception of that in August, 1888, the lowest recorded in the last eleven years, and nearly 2° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27.6°) took place on the 12th, and the least range (3.4°) on the 13th. The mean daily range was 14.2°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.325 inches on the 6th, and the lowest was 29.285 inches on the 31st. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.960 inches) was a little below the average.

Rain fell on fifteen days, the amount being 2.03 inches, being about three-fourths of an inch below that in August, 1896, slightly lower than in August, 1889, or 1892, but much higher than in any other corresponding month, and was nearly a third of an inch above the average of the previous ten years.

Fog occurred on three days during the month. Males contributed 49 per cent. and females 51 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 22 per cent. to that mortality, or the same proportion as in August, 1896, as against 23 per cent. in August, 1895; 30 per cent. in August, 1894; 42 per cent. in August, 1893; 29 per cent. in August, 1892; and 41 per cent. in August, 1891.

Sixty-seven deaths of persons who had attained or passed the age of 75 years were recorded during the month. Of these, a tailor, aged 75, died of cerebral hemorrhage; a female, aged 75, of pericarditis; a carpenter, aged 75, of heart disease; a dealer, aged 75, of bronchitis; a female, aged 75, of pneumonia; a joiner, aged 76, of rheumatism; a draper, aged 76, of phthisis; a female, aged 76, of syncope; a coroner, aged 76, of heart disease; a cook (female), aged 76, of bronchitis; a female, aged 76, of pneumonia; a gentleman, aged 76, of nephritis; a coachman, aged 77, of valvular disease of the heart; 4 females, each aged 77, of apoplexy,

syncope, Bright's disease, and bedsores respectively; 2 females, both aged 78, of paralysis; a laundress, aged 78, of mitral regurgitation; a gentleman, a farmer, and a saddler, each aged 78, of heart disease; a gardener, aged 78, of a fistula; a gentleman, aged 78, of cerebral softening; a female, aged 79, of lung disease; 2 females, each aged 80, of paralysis and syncope respectively; a gentleman, aged 81, of paralysis; a male, of no occupation, aged 81, of syncope; 2 females, each aged 81, of heart disease; a pensioner, aged 81, of obstruction of the intestines; an agent, aged 81, of Bright's disease; a male, of no occupation, aged 82, of apoplexy; a female, aged 83, of bronchitis; a female, aged 84, of hemiplegia; a gardener, aged 84, of bronchitis; a publican, aged 84, of cystitis; a baker and a female, each aged 85, of bronchitis; a female, aged 86, of senile gangrene; a lodge-keeper, aged 86, a farmer, aged 87, and 2 females, aged 88 and 89 respectively, of bronchitis; a labourer, aged 90, of syncope; a furniture dealer, aged 90, of bronchitis; a female, aged 91, of valvular disease of the heart; a slater and a female, each aged 92, of pneumonia; 2 labourers and 2 females, all aged 75, 2 females, both aged 76, a female, aged 80, a labourer, aged 81, a dealer and a needlewoman, both aged 82, a gentleman and a female, both aged 84, a male of no occupation, aged 85, a clergyman, aged 90, a squatter, aged 93, and a female, aged 96, of old age.

Seventeen deaths during the month were from external causes, of which 16 were set down to accident and 1 to homicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A carpenter, aged 54, was passed over by a railway train, and a female, aged 70, by a tram-car; a boy, aged 8, died of rupture and abrasion of the peritoneum, the result of a kick whilst playing football; a labourer, aged 16, was crushed to death by machinery; a male child, aged 2 years, and a girl, aged 7, died of burns; a commercial traveller, aged 28, was poisoned by an overdose of chloroform; a painter, aged 40, died of lead poisoning; a steward and a servant, both aged 25, and a female, aged 61, were accidentally drowned in Hobson's Bay, and a labourer, aged 67, in a vat of beer; a labourer, aged 66, was "found drowned" in the River Yarra; a female, aged 35, was suffocated by food; and two female infants, aged 1 day and 13 days respectively, died of umbilical hemorrhage. The homicidal death was that of a female, aged 51, who died of septic pneumonia, the result of arsenical treatment, a verdict of manslaughter being returned.

One hundred and fifty-two deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—60 in the Melbourne, 18 in the Alfred, 2 in St. Vincent's, 8 in the Women's, 9 in the Children's, 4 in the Homoeopathic, and 5 in the Austin Hospitals; 14 in the Metropolitan and 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 1 in the Immigrants' Home, 18 in the Benevolent and 3 in the Infant Asylum, 1 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, 1 in the Protestant Refuge, 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital, and 4 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 124, of which 64, or 52 per cent., were of males, and 60, or 48 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 88 were under one year of age, 15 were between one and two, 9 were between two and three, 9 were between three and four, and 3 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 443. Of these, 211, or 48 per cent., were males, and 232, or 52 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 27 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 41 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 28 were between forty and forty-five, 22 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 17 were between fifty-five and sixty, 37 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 36 were between seventy and seventy-five, 32 were between seventy-five and eighty, 19 were between eighty and eighty-five, 8 were between eighty-five and ninety, 7 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-six.

In comparing the mortality of the month under review with that in the corresponding month of the previous year, it will be noticed that an increase of 2 deaths under zymotic diseases was counterbalanced by a decrease of 2 under parasitic diseases; an increase of 12 under constitutional, by a decrease of 11 under developmental diseases, and an increase of 13 under ill-defined causes.

by a falling off of 13 under the head of violence; whilst a decrease of 68 occurred under local diseases. Under zymotic diseases, deaths from diphtheria rose from 9 to 12, but those from septic diseases fell from 5 to 3. In the constitutional class, increases of 20 under phthisis, 8 under rheumatic fever and rheumatism, were to a large extent set off by decreases of 9 under cancer, 5 under other tubercular diseases, and 3 under diabetes mellitus. Under developmental diseases, deaths from premature birth and old age each fell off by 5, and atelectasis by 3. With one marked exception, there was a general falling off under all the sub-classes of local diseases, viz., 3 under diseases of the nervous system, 20 under those of the circulatory, 38 under those of the respiratory (28 under pneumonia alone), 11 under those of the urinary, and 6 each under those of the digestive system and of the generative organs. The exception referred to was diseases of parturition, which, in the month under review, caused as many as 17 deaths—of which 4 were set down to abortion or miscarriage—equivalent to 1 death of a mother to every 61 births registered. A high mortality from this cause was also noticed in the report for the preceding month, when 13 such deaths (including 6 from puerperal fever) occurred, or 1 to every 83 births, as against only 22—or 1 to 288 births—during the first six months of the current year, and only 4 in August, 1896. During the last 10 years the highest numbers previously recorded were 16 (including 9 from puerperal fever) in June, 1883, or 1 to every 86 births; 15 (including 5 from puerperal fever) in August, 1890, or 1 to 104 births; and 15 (including 8 from puerperal fever) in June, and again in September, 1892, averaging 1 to every 99 births. Annually there are about 87 such deaths, or 1 to every 178 births.

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1896, and the first eight months of 1897, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that diphtheria, prevalent in an epidemic form during the second quarter of the year, still causes a more than average mortality.

THE births of 54 boys and 60 girls, or in all of 114 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of August. Of these, 46 occurred in Ballarat East, 55 in Ballarat West, 12 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 7 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 122, viz., 56 of boys and 66 of girls.

The deaths registered in August numbered 59, viz., 38 of males and 21 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 55. In July the recorded deaths numbered 46; in August, 1896, they numbered 71; in August, 1895, they numbered 77; in August, 1894, they numbered 75; in August, 1893, they numbered 38; in August, 1892, they numbered 77; in August, 1891, they numbered 72; in August, 1890, they numbered 62; in August, 1889, they numbered 63; in August, 1888, they numbered 66; and in August, 1887, they numbered 69.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—
