EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

OPEN COMPETITION OF AUGUST, 1898.

IT is hereby notified, at the request of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that, on the 2nd August, 1898, and following days, an examination, open to all qualified persons, will be held in London.

No person will be admitted to compete from whom the Secretary, Civil Service Commission, has not received, on or before the 31st May, 1898, an application on the prescribed form, accompanied by a list of the subjects in which the candidate desires to be examined.

No person will be deemed qualified who shall not satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (i.) That he is a natural-born subject of Her Majesty.
- (ii.) That he had attained the age of 21, and had not attained the age of 23, on the first day of the year in which the examination is held.

[N.B.—In the case of natives of India it will be necessary for a candidate to obtain a certificate of age and nationality signed, should he be a resident in British India, by the Secretary to Government of the Province, or the Commissioner of the Division within which his family resides, or, should he reside in a Native State, by the highest political officer accredited to the State in which his family resides.]

- (iii.) That he has no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity unfitting him, or likely to unfit him, for the Civil Service of India.
- (iv.) That he is of good moral character.

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COMMERCIAL ARRANGEMENT BETWEEN GREAT BRITAIN AND BULGARIA.

THE following Despatch from the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies to His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, and its enclosures, are published for general information.

SIR,

With reference to Lord Ripon's circular despatch of the 7th February, 1895, I have the honour to transmit to you, for publication in the Colony under your Government, a copy of the Commercial arrangement between this country and Bulgaria which was signed at Vienna on the 24th ult.

It will be observed that under Article 5 the arrangement will be applicable to all Colonies subject to the right of any Colony to refuse its acceptance within six months from the date of signature.

In view of this provision and the short duration of the arrangement, I did not consider it necessary to invite the views of your Government before the arrangement was concluded.

COMMERCIAL ARRANGEMENT BETWEEN THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND IRELAND AND THE PRINCIPALITY OF BULGARIA.

THE Undersigned, Francis Edmund Hugh Elliot, Esq., Her Britannic Majesty's Agent and Consul-General in Bulgaria, and his Excellency Dr. C. Stoiloff, President of the Council and Minister for Foreign Affairs and Public Worship of His Royal Highness the Prince of Bulgaria, Grand Cross of the Princely Order of St. Alexander in Brilliants, Grand Cordon of the Orders of the Osmanieh and Medjidieh in Brilliants, &c., duly authorized by their respective Governments, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1. British subjects in Bulgaria, and Bulgarians in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, shall respectively enjoy, immediately and unconditionally, in all matters relating to navigation, industry, and commerce, including importation and exportation, as well as transit, the same rights, privileges, liberties, facilities, immunities, and exemptions as are enjoyed, or may hereafter be enjoyed, by natives or by subjects of any other foreign State, without payment of any impost, tax, customs duty, or other due, charge, or expense, other or higher than those to which the latter are liable; further, no customs duties or other dues or charges shall be levied at any one frontier different from or higher than those which are levied at any other frontier on similar articles. British subjects in Bulgaria, and Bulgarians in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, shall enjoy perfect equality of treatment with natives and the subjects of every other foreign State in all matters relating to bonding, bounties, drawbacks, facilities, patents for inventions, trade marks, distinctive marks of manufacture or of origin, patterns, and designs.

Art. 2. No prohibition or restriction shall be maintained or decreed against the importation of any article the produce or manufacture of one or other of the contracting countries, from whatever place arriving, which shall not equally apply to the importation of the like article produced or manufactured in any other foreign country. It is, nevertheless, understood that each of the Contracting Parties reserves the right to apply sanitary measures and restrictions affecting the importation of any goods or articles injurious to public health, or to animals or plants.

Art. 3. Her Britannic Majesty's Government consents that, during the term of the present arrangement, articles of British origin or manufacture shall pay, on entering Bulgaria, the customs, octroi, and excise duties specified in Annex (A) and in the Final Protocol of the Treaty signed on the 9th December, 1896, between the Austro-Hungarian and Bulgarian Plenipotentiaries, saving all reductions which have been or may be granted to other Powers, and excepting the articles scheduled in Annex 2 of the present Arrangement, which shall pay the duties therein specified.

Art. 4. Annexes Nos. 1, 2, and 3 shall be considered as forming an integral part of the present Arrangement.

Art. 5. The present Arrangement shall be applicable, so far as the laws permit, to all the Colonies and foreign possessions of Her Britannic Majesty, provided always that each of the said Colonies and foreign possessions shall be free to refuse its acceptance of the Arrangement within six months from the date of the signature thereof, notification to that effect being given by Her Majesty's Representative at Sofia to the Minister for Foreign Affairs of His Royal Highness the Prince of Bulgaria.

Art. 6. The present Arrangement shall come into effect on the 12th July, 1897, and shall remain in force until the 31st December, 1899.

In case neither of the Contracting Parties shall have notified six months before the end of the said period the intention of putting an end to it, the Arrangement shall remain binding until the expiration of one year from the day on which one or other of the Contracting Parties shall have denounced it.

ARRANGEMENT COMMERCIAL ENTRE LE ROYAUME-UNI DE LA GRANDE-BRETAGNE ET D'IRLANDE ET LA PRINCIPAUTÉ DE BULGARIE.

LES Soussignés, Mr. Francis Edmund Hugh Elliot, Agent et Consul-Général de Sa Majesté Britannique en Bulgarie, et son Excellence M. le Docteur C. Stoiloff, Président du Conseil et Ministre des Affaires Etrangères et des Cultes de Son Altesse Royale le Prince de Bulgarie, Grand-Croix de l'Ordre Princier de Saint-Alexandre en Brilliants, Grand-Cordon des Ordres de l'Osmanieh et du Medjidieh en Brilliants, &c., dûment autorisés par leurs Gouvernements respectifs, sont convenus de ce qui suit:—

Article 1. Les sujets Britanniques en Bulgarie, et les Bulgares dans le Royaume-Uni de la Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande, jouiront respectivement, immédiatement et sans conditions, en toute matière de navigation, d'industrie, et de commerce, tant pour l'importation et l'exportation que pour le transit, des mêmes droits, privilèges, libertés, facilités, immunités, et franchises dont jouissent, ou pourraient jouir à l'avenir, les nationaux ou les sujets de tout autre Etat étranger, sans payer aucun impôt, taxe, droit de douane, ou autre droit, charge ou frais, autre ou plus élevé que ceux auxquels ces derniers sont assujettis; en outre, il ne sera prélevé à l'une des frontières des droits de douane ou autres droits ou charges, différents ou plus élevés que ceux qui sont prélevés à toute autre frontière sur les articles similaires. Les sujets Britanniques en Bulgarie, et les Bulgares dans le Royaume-Uni de la Grande-Bretagne et d'Irlande, jouiront d'une parfaite égalité de traitement avec les nationaux et les sujets de tout autre Etat étranger, en tout ce qui concerne l'entreposage, les primes, les drawbacks, les facilités, les brevets d'invention, les marques de fabrique, les marques distinctives de fabrication et de provenance, les modèles et les dessins.

Art. 2. Il ne sera maintenu ou édicté contre l'importation d'un article quelconque, produit du sol ou de l'industrie de l'un ou de l'autre des pays contractants, de quelque provenance que ce soit, aucune prohibition ou restriction qui ne s'appliquerait pas également à l'importation du même article, produit du sol ou de l'industrie de tout autre pays étranger. Il est néanmoins entendu que chacune des Parties Contractantes se réserve le droit d'appliquer des mesures et restrictions sanitaires concernant l'importation de toute marchandise ou colis nuisible à la santé publique, aux animaux, ou aux plantes.

Art. 3. Le Gouvernement de Sa Majesté Britannique consent pour la durée du présent Arrangement que les marchandises d'origine ou de manufacture Britannique acquittent à leur entrée en Bulgarie les droits de douane, d'octroi, et d'accise indiqués dans l'Annexe (A), et dans le Protocole Final du Traité signé le 9th Décembre, 1896, entre les Plénipotentiaires Austro-Hongrois et Bulgares, sauf toutes les réductions accordées ou qui seront accordées à d'autres Puissances, et à l'exception des articles indiqués dans l'Annexe II du présent Arrangement, qui paieront les droits y mentionnés.

Art. 4. Les Annexes Nos. I, II, et III seront considérées comme formant partie intégrante du présent Arrangement.

Art. 5. Le présent Arrangement sera applicable, dans la mesure compatible avec les lois, à toutes les Colonies et possessions étrangères de Sa Majesté Britannique; sous la réserve, toutefois, que chacune des dites Colonies et possessions étrangères sera libre de renoncer à l'acceptation de l'Arrangement dans un délai de six mois à partir de la date de la signature de cet Arrangement, notification à cet effet étant donnée par le Représentant de Sa Majesté Britannique à Sophia au Ministre des Affaires Etrangères de Son Altesse Royale le Prince de Bulgarie.

Art. 6. Le présent Arrangement entrera en vigueur le 12th Juillet, 1897, et demeurera exécutoire jusqu'au 31st Décembre, 1899.

Dans le cas où aucune des Parties Contractantes n'aurait notifié six mois avant la fin de la dite période son intention d'en faire cesser les effets, le dit Arrangement demeurera obligatoire jusqu'à l'expiration d'un an à partir du jour où l'une ou l'autre des Parties Contractantes l'aura dénoncé.

Annex No. 1.

1. The right of "cabotage" is maintained for British vessels. During the term of the Arrangement signed on the 12th July, 1897, British vessels calling at Bulgarian ports shall not be liable to any dues or charges, other or higher than those set forth in the annexed Circular of the 3rd April, 1885.

When ships can take advantage of the works now being constructed, or which may hereafter be constructed, at certain ports, the question of new dues to be paid at those ports shall be settled by mutual agreement.

2. In all operations relating to commerce or navigation (customs operations, fines, &c.) where British subjects are called upon to provide guarantees, bank guarantees will only be accepted as satisfactory if furnished by banks established in Bulgaria with the sanction of the Government of the Principality.

3. Every facility shall be granted to British subjects for bonding goods at the sea-ports; and the bonding of coal shall be permitted in depôts either on land or afloat.

4. British subjects shall be permitted freely to exercise the profession of ship-broker. British subjects shall be permitted freely to exercise the profession of grain-broker, provided they pay a licence tax of 400 fr. per annum.

5. In the event of the Government of Bulgaria undertaking the administration of the Sanitary and Lighthouse services on the Bulgarian coast of the Black Sea, it will not collect higher dues than those now levied by the existing Administrations.

6. With regard to the transport of goods by rail, the Bulgarian Government undertakes to admit British goods, and goods imported by British subjects or their agents, to the enjoyment of all advantages, or reductions of freight or of other charges, and to all privileges and facilities which have been, or may hereafter be, accorded to goods coming from any other foreign country, or imported by the subjects of the most favoured nation.

All goods landed at Bulgarian ports, including goods destined to be immediately despatched to the interior of the Principality under the conditions of a tariff of through rates, may be cleared at the custom-house of the port of entry.

Annexe No. 1.

1. Le droit de cabotage est maintenu pour les navires Britanniques. Pendant la durée de l'Arrangement signé le 12 Juillet, 1897, les navires Britanniques faisant escale aux ports de la Bulgarie ne seront soumis à aucuns droits ou charges autres ni plus élevés que ceux indiqués dans l'Ordonnance Circulaire du 1^{er} Avril, 1885, dont copie annexée.

Lorsque les navires pourront profiter des travaux des ports actuellement en construction, ou qui seront construits à l'avenir, la question de nouveaux droits à payer dans ces ports sera réglée d'un commun accord.

2. Dans toutes les opérations relatives au commerce ou à la navigation (opérations de douane, amendes, &c.) où les sujets Britanniques seront tenus de fournir caution, il ne sera accepté comme caution suffisante, en fait de garanties de banque, que les garanties des banques fondées en Bulgarie avec la sanction de l'autorité Principière.

3. Toute facilité sera accordée aux sujets Britanniques pour l'entrepôtage de marchandises aux ports de mer, et l'entrepôtage du charbon de terre sera permis tant dans des dépôts sur terre que dans des dépôts flottants.

4. L'exercice de la profession de courtier maritime sera libre pour les sujets Britanniques. L'exercice de la profession de courtier pour les céréales sera libre pour les sujets Britanniques qui paient la taxe de patente de 400 fr. par an.

5. Dans le cas où le Gouvernement Bulgare se chargerait de l'administration du service Sanitaire et du service des Phares sur le littoral Bulgare de la Mer Noire, il ne percevra pas des taxes plus élevées que celles actuellement prélevées par les Administrations existantes.

6. En ce qui concerne le transport de marchandises par chemin de fer, le Gouvernement Bulgare s'engage à faire participer les marchandises Britanniques, et celles importées par des sujets Britanniques ou leurs ayants cause, à tout avantage ou diminution de frais de transport ou d'autres charges, et à tout privilège et facilité qui sont ou qui seront accordés aux marchandises provenant de tout autre pays étranger, ou importés par les sujets de la nation la plus favorisée.

Toutes marchandises débarquées aux ports Bulgares, même celles qui seraient destinées à être immédiatement dirigées vers l'intérieur de la Principauté, sous les conditions d'un tarif de transport direct, pourront être dédouanées à la douane du port d'entrée.

Ordonnance Circulaire adressée le 3 Avril, 1885, par le Ministère Princier des Finances; à MM. les Directeurs des Douanes établies dans les Ports, No. 8752.

(Traduction.)

Le Tarif concernant la perception des droits de port et annexé à l'Ordonnance en date du 28 Février, année courante, No. 5277, prévoit des taxes assez élevées; quelques-unes de ces taxes sont même inutiles. Le Ministère des Finances désirant éviter des réclamations de la part des propriétaires indigènes ou étrangers de bateaux et écarter toute difficulté, a élaboré le Tarif ci-joint, aux lieu et place de l'ancien Tarif et des modifications qui y ont été apportées à diverses reprises par les Circulaires ultérieures. Vous êtes en conséquence prié, M. le Directeur, de vous conformer au nouveau Tarif lors de la perception des droits de port afférents aux bateaux qui arrivent dans nos ports.

Tarif des Droits de Port.

§ 1. Pour ancrage et bouée.

Tous les bâtiments de commerce battant pavillon Bulgare ou étranger, qui arrivent dans des ports Bulgares où le chargement et le déchargement des marchandises sont autorisés, acquitteront les droits suivants:—

1. Si les bâtiments ne chargent ni ne déchargent, dans un délai de huit jours à partir de leur arrivée dans le port, ils ne paient aucune taxe. Passé ce délai, s'ils commencent à charger, ils acquittent:—

- (a) Les bâtiments jaugeant jusqu'à 5 tonneaux, 1 fr.
- (b) " " de 5 à 50 tonneaux, 2 fr. 50 c.
- (c) " " de 50 à 300 " 10 fr.
- (d) " " de 300 à 600 " 15 fr.
- (e) " " de 600 tonneaux et au delà, 20 fr.
- (f) Les schleps ou radeaux, 2 fr.

Les bâtiments qui, après le délai de huit jours, ne chargent point de marchandises, acquitteront la moitié des taxes correspondantes: mais si après avoir payé cette dernière taxe ils commencent à charger, ils devront acquitter l'autre moitié.

Remarque 1: Les petits bâtiments qui voyagent munis d'un certificat de cabotage, les bateaux de poste, et les Sociétés de Navigation qui font un service régulier sont exemptés du paiement de ces taxes.

Remarque 2: Les bâtiments venant d'un port Bulgare acquitteront la moitié du droit d'ancrage.

Remarque 3: Sont également exemptés du paiement du droit d'ancrage les bâtiments qui, pour cause de tempête ou autre accident de mer, accostent à un point du littoral où le chargement et le déchargement des marchandises ne sont pas autorisés.

§ 2. Droits perçus annuellement des propriétaires de bâtiments et embarcations Bulgares.

- (a) Tout propriétaire de bâtiment jaugeant jusqu'à 5 tonneaux paie annuellement 8 fr.
- (b) Tout propriétaire de bâtiment jaugeant de 5 à 50 tonneaux paie annuellement 15 fr.
- (c) Tout propriétaire de bâtiment jaugeant de 50 à 100 tonneaux paie annuellement 25 fr.
- (d) Tout propriétaire de bâtiment jaugeant de 100 à 200 tonneaux paie annuellement 40 fr.
- (e) Tout propriétaire de bâtiment jaugeant de 200 tonneaux et au delà, paie annuellement 50 fr.

Les petites barques de pêche et les moulins à nef sont exemptés du paiement de ces taxes. Les barques payeront seulement les droits établis par la Loi sur la Pêche et les moulins acquitteront les droits prévus dans la Loi sur les Patentes.

§ 3. Les bâtiments neufs, construits dans la Principauté, paieront, lorsqu'ils seront lancés:—

- (a) Les bateaux jaugeant 5 tonneaux, 2 fr.
- (b) " " de 5 à 50 tonneaux, 10 fr.
- (c) " " de 50 à 100 " 15 fr.
- (d) " " de 100 à 200 " 20 fr.
- (e) " " 200 tonneaux et au delà, 25 fr.

§ 4. Les bâtiments construits à l'étranger et battant pavillon Bulgare acquittent les taxes dans la proportion prévue au § 3.

§ 5. Droits pour délivrer différents documents et pour visa.

(a) Les bâtiments sous pavillon Bulgare, qui désirent se munir d'un diplôme de sujétion, doivent payer:—

1. Les bâtiments jaugeant de 5 à 300 tonneaux, à 10 c. par tonneau.

2. Les bâtiments jaugeant plus de 300 tonneaux paient 4 c. par tonneau en plus. Les diplômes doivent en outre être munis d'un timbre d'enregistrement de 1 fr.

(b) Pour un acte de congé délivré à des bâtiments sous pavillon Bulgare, il est perçu 5 fr. Cet acte doit être également muni d'un timbre de 1 fr.

(c) Pour un rôle d'équipage délivré à des bâtiments sous pavillon Bulgare, pour un long ou court voyage, il est perçu 2 fr.

(d) Pour un certificat de navigation le long du littoral, délivré aux petites embarcations, 1 fr. Ce certificat sera muni d'un timbre de 50 c.

(e) Pour dresser ou légaliser un acte quelconque, 4 fr.

(f) Pour visa, lors du départ du bâtiment, 2 fr.

Remarque 1: Sont exemptés du visa les documents délivrés aux petites embarcations naviguant le long du littoral.

Remarque 2: Toutes les autres taxes pour dresser et légaliser différents actes relatifs à la navigation, sont perçues par les Tribunaux compétents ou par les Agences de Bulgarie à l'étranger, conformément au tarif annexé à la loi sur la navigation del commerce. (Voir Législation Ottomane, Toms I, traduit par Ch. S. Armandoff, p. 346.)

§ 6. Droit de lest.

(a) Tout bâtiment qui a jeté son lest dans un port maritime Bulgare; à l'endroit fixé par l'Administration du port, paiera 3 centimes par tonne de jaugeage du bâtiment. Si le lest est déchargé à terre ou chargé dans un autre bâtiment, il ne sera perçu aucun droit.

(b) Tout bâtiment qui prend du lest dans un port Bulgare où le lest est affermé, doit en payer le prix à l'entrepreneur conformément au tarif en vigueur.

Les droits de port doivent être acquittés en argent lorsqu'ils ne dépassent pas 20 fr., et en or lorsqu'ils sont supérieurs à cette somme, ainsi qu'il est établi pour les droits de douane.

Annex No. 2.

1. During the term of the Arrangement signed on the 12th July, 1897, the import duties on the goods specified below shall not exceed the rates scheduled as follows:—

(1) Copper, in ingots, plates, and sheets, 10 per cent. *ad valorem*.

(2) Caustic soda and soda of all kinds; potash; alums of all kinds; carbonate of ammonia; sal ammoniac; spirit of salt of ammonia and sulphate of ammonia; green and blue vitriol, 12 per cent. *ad valorem*.

(3) Coal, 10 per cent. *ad valorem*.

(4) Iron and steel scrap, 8 per cent. *ad valorem*.

(5) Pig-iron, 8 per cent. *ad valorem*.

(6) Steel and iron, in blooms, ingots, bars, plates, sheets, hoop-iron, nail rods, 10 per cent. *ad valorem*.

(7) Wrought-iron and steel plates, polished, varnished, coated with copper, zinc, or tin, 12 per cent. *ad valorem*.

(8) Tin plates, 12 per cent. *ad valorem*.

(9) Coke, free.

(10) Sacks of all kinds for the exportation of cereals, free.

(11) Agricultural and other machinery, free.*

2. With regard to the right which the Bulgarian Government reserves to levy excise dues on building materials and combustibles, it is agreed that, among building materials, only timber shall be liable to such dues, and that coal and coke shall be free from all excise dues. It is likewise agreed that the excise dues which may be levied on sweet preserves shall not exceed the rate of 40 fr. per 100 kilog.; and on sweetened biscuits, 10 fr. per 100 kilog.

ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

THE Public Service Board, pursuant to the provisions of the *Public Service Act* 1890, hereby makes the following Regulation in lieu of Chapter VII. of the Regulations made by the Public Service Board on the 31st December, 1895, which is hereby repealed:—

CHAPTER VII.

INSURANCES TO BE EFFECTED BY OFFICERS.

[Section 59 (IX.)]

1. Every person entering the Public Service of Victoria shall, as a condition precedent to the confirmation of his appointment, lodge in the office of the Board a policy or policies on his life effected with some life assurance company carrying on business in Victoria. Such policy or policies shall provide for the payment to the person assured on his attaining any age not exceeding sixty years, or to his personal representatives within three (3) months from the date of his death if the person assured should die under the age set forth in such policy or policies, of a sum or sums of money at least equal in the aggregate to the amount of the maximum annual salary as shown in the Public Service Acts or any amendment thereof or any regulations framed thereunder for the class or grade in the Public Service to which the person assured has been appointed; provided that in lieu of the payment of the sum or sums of money on his attaining the prescribed age such policy or policies may provide for an annuity or annuities payable to the person assured, quarterly during the remainder of his life, after he attains the age of sixty years, but the annual amount of such annuity or annuities must be in the aggregate at least equal to one-tenth of the maximum annual salary as set forth in the Public Service Acts or any amendment thereof or any regulations framed thereunder for the class or grade in the Public Service to which the person assured has been appointed.

2. The premiums on any policy or policies lodged as aforesaid shall be of such amount and be payable at such times as may be agreed upon between the person assured and the company or companies, all which shall be clearly expressed in the body of the policy or policies; and the Treasurer of the Colony may pay such premiums at or about the dates when they respectively fall due, and may deduct the same from the salary payable to the person assured, and the receipts for premiums paid by the Treasurer shall be forthwith lodged in the office of the Board. The policy or policies shall remain in the custody of the Board so long as the person assured shall continue in the Public Service.

3. Every policy to be lodged with the Board as aforesaid shall contain a condition to the effect that so long as the person assured remains in the Public Service the policy shall not be made void for non-payment of premiums till one month after notice of such non-payment shall have been served on the Board, and that the company will within one month after the service of such notice receive the overdue premiums without interest, and a further condition, in accordance with the provisions of sections 37 and 89 of the *Public Service Act* 1890, to the effect that such policy shall not, so long as the person assured remains in the Public Service, be assignable either at law or in equity.

4. If the person assured under any policy or policies lodged with the Board shall retire or be removed from the Public Service before the sum assured becomes payable, such policy or policies shall be delivered to such person or to his order, and shall thereafter cease to be subject to these regulations.

5. If the person assured under any policy or policies lodged as hereinbefore provided shall die, such policy or policies shall be delivered up to the executors or administrators of the estate of such deceased person, or in the case of minors the policy or policies may be delivered to the father or to the mother of the deceased person, or in the case of a policy not exceeding One hundred pounds exclusive of bonus (if any) or such other amount as the company may legally pay, if no probate of the will of the deceased person or letters of administration in his estate be taken out within three months from the date of his death the policy may be delivered to his widow or any adult child of his,* and shall thereafter cease to be subject to these regulations.

* Section 370 of Act 1074.

6. If the person assured under any policy providing for the payment of a sum of money elect or be required under the provisions of sections 143 or 145 of the *Public Service Act* 1890 to remain in the Public Service after he has attained the age of sixty years, or if he shall remain in such service beyond the age at which any sum shall become payable under such policy as hereinafter provided, the said sum of money shall be held by the company in which such officer is assured until he retire or be removed from the Public Service or depart this life, and such company shall pay the officer so assured interest half-yearly at the rate then allowed by the Government Savings Bank or the Commissioners' Savings Bank for deposits on the sum accrued on such policy from the date of its maturing and until the time the officer so assured retire from the Public Service or depart this life.

7. From and after the passing of these regulations any officer who may have lodged in the office of the Board a policy of insurance on his life, in accordance with the regulations previously in force, may agree with the company which issued such policy to reduce the sum assured under the same to an amount at least equal to the maximum annual salary of the class or grade in which such officer is classified, and such policy may be indorsed with a condition setting forth the terms of the agreement entered into between the company and the officer upon whose life such policy was issued.

8. The term "sixty years" expressed in any sentence or part of the foregoing regulations shall be read as "fifty years" whenever and so far only as such regulations shall apply to the insurance to be effected by female teachers.

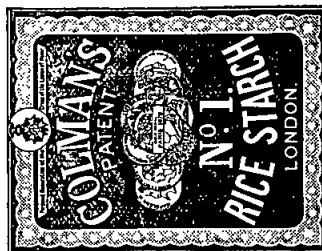

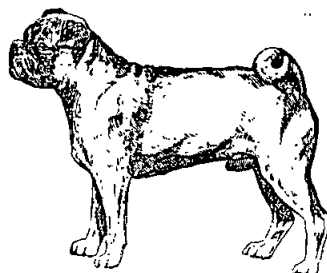

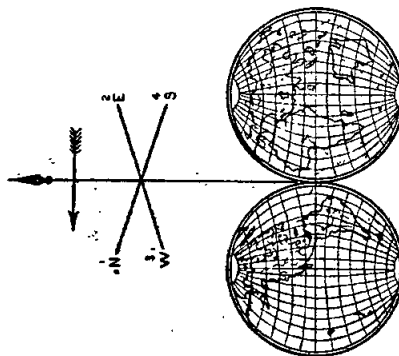

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF LOWAN.

BY-LAW No. 3.

THE Council of the Shire of Lowan, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other, enabling the said council in this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said council, doth hereby make the following by-law, that is to say:—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Lowan, excepting clause 19, which shall apply to and have operation in all portions of the said shire not included in a proclaimed or surveyed township.

4. *Definitions.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—

“House” shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

“Cesspool” shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

“Earth-closet” shall include a pan closet of any description.

“Street” shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word “person” shall include a corporation.

5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any land on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-shed, cattle-shed, or pig-sty, shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure, produced or accumulated therein, to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom, as aforesaid, same shall be removed by the council at the expense of such occupier.

7. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every 24 hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever, it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

8. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide a sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof shall not exceed 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for an application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy, shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material, having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered charcoal, earth, ashes, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

10. Every closet pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

11. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

12. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated as to be within a distance of 1 foot from the top of the sides, or walls, or linings of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., and provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of lime, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quantity and quality to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

13. Every occupier and every person having management and control of any premises shall (unless otherwise expressly permitted as hereinafter mentioned) once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied or cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil or belonging to such premises. Where such premises are situated in a sparsely-populated portion of the shire, it shall be sufficient if such earth-closet, privy, or place is emptied once in every fortnight, provided a written permission of the local board or health officer or secretary is obtained at such times and for such periods as the local board may direct.

14. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for reception of night-soil except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed, and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

15. Where any nightman is duly licensed by the council, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same; and the said licensee shall be entitled to demand and receive for such service such sum of money for each pan or service as above named as the local board may from time to time fix or determine.

16. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing, except night-soil, or any solution or mixture of the same, used as provided by section 255 of the *Health Act 1890*, shall (unless otherwise expressly permitted in accordance with law, of which the proof shall lie upon the person proceeded against) be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same.

17. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the council (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized, and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

18. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied or assist in emptying, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

19. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or

depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in thickness.

20. *Penalties.*—Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST CONSTITUTED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of October, 1897.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government.

WHEREAS by the *Water Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that, at the expiration of two months after the notice of any application shall have been first advertised in the *Government Gazette*, the Minister, if satisfied that the provisions of the now in part recited Act have been substantially complied with, shall submit such application and the general plan and description therein referred to and all petitions which have been received in respect of such application to the Governor in Council, together with any recommendations as to the granting of the application or as to any alterations or additions he may think desirable in the proposed waterworks; and that the Governor in Council may thereupon approve of the construction of such proposed waterworks, with or without any alterations or additions in the general plan and description thereof, or may disapprove of the construction of such waterworks, and shall make an Order in Council accordingly: And whereas it is further enacted that if the Governor in Council shall approve of the construction of such waterworks, with or without alterations or additions or restrictions of any such general plan and description, a Waterworks Trust shall be constituted to construct, maintain, and continue the whole or any part of the waterworks therein described, in accordance with the provisions of such Order and of the now in part recited Act: And every Order approving of the construction of any proposed waterworks and the constitution of a Waterworks Trust for the purpose shall—

- (a) State the amount of money which the Governor in Council will grant as a loan for the purpose of carrying out the same and paying the cost and expenses of the plans and application for the same, and also the rate of interest which will be charged for such loan, such rate being at least one-half per centum more than the rate payable by the Government on the public loan out of which such loan may be granted;
- (b) Proclaim the limits of the lands, whether within or without the municipal districts of the council or councils applying for the proposed waterworks, within which such Trust shall have authority, to be called a Waterworks District;
- (c) State what are the principal works to be constructed; and
- (d) Contain such provisions (not inconsistent with the provisions of the now in part recited Act) as, according to the nature of the application and the facts and circumstances of each case, the Governor in Council shall think fit:

And whereas it is further enacted by section 25 of the *Water Act 1890* aforesaid that whenever a Waterworks District is either wholly, or, with the exception of the waterworks or proposed waterworks thereof, within one municipal district, the Governor in Council may appoint the municipal council for the time being of such municipal district, together with one or more persons not being members of such municipal council, to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, has approved of a general plan and description as set forth in a certain application by the Council of the Shire of Wodonga for a loan to carry out certain waterworks for the supply of the Township of Wodonga, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

- (1) The construction of the said waterworks.
- (2) The Municipal Council of the Shire of Wodonga for the time being and one other Commissioner to be the Waterworks Trust of such Waterworks District.
- (3) That the amount of loan hereby granted shall be Seven thousand five hundred pounds sterling (£7,500), for the purpose of carrying out approved works and paying the cost and expense of the plans and application for the same; and that the interest to be charged for such loan shall be at the rate of Four pounds ten shillings per centum per annum, payable half-yearly.
- (4) That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those comprised within the following boundaries:—

Portion I.—Supply Area.—Commencing at the intersection of the roads at the south-west angle of allotment 4, section IV, in the township of Wodonga; thence northerly by the north and south road to the north-west angle of allotment 1, section I; thence easterly by a road to the centre of road forming the east boundary of section J; thence north-easterly by said road to its intersection with the centre line of Osburn-street; thence south-easterly along said street to a point opposite the south-west angle of allotment 8, section H; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of section H to the centre of Huon-street; thence westerly along said street to a point opposite the south-west angle of the Presbyterian Church Reserve; thence north-easterly along the western boundary of said church reserve and by a line to the north side of Wodonga-street; thence in the same direction to the most easterly angle of the Reserve for Public Park; thence in an easterly direction about twenty-six chains; thence southerly to the north-west angle of allotment 4, section U; thence south-westerly along the western boundary of section U to a point in the centre of Huon-street; thence south-easterly along said street to the north-west angle of section A²; thence south-westerly along east side of Anne-street and across railway line to the northern angle of section A¹; thence

by a line south-easterly along the eastern boundary of last-named section across Lawrence-street and along the western boundary of the Wodonga and Tallangatta Railway Reserve to its intersection with the three-chain road from Wodonga to Yackandandah; thence north-westerly along said road to its intersection with the east boundary of allotment 2, section VI; thence northerly by the east boundary of section VI to the north-east angle thereof; thence westerly along a road to the point of commencement.

Portion II.—Pipe Track.—A strip of land fifty links wide throughout: Commencing at a point on pipe track on the south boundary of Trust district at the intersection of the Beechworth and Yackandandah three-chain roads to Wodonga; thence southerly and westerly along said pipe track to the service basin; thence by the pipe track from the basin to the site of the dam on House Creek.

Portion III.—Service Basin Site.—A strip of land four chains in width and four chains in length at the junction of the pipe track with the service basin and comprising the site of the latter.

Portion IV.—Catchment Area to Storage Reservoir.—Commencing at the site of dam on House Creek; thence by the watershed line southerly through the parish of Wodonga, south-westerly through the parish of Baranduda, south-westerly and north-westerly through the parish of Woorragree North, north-easterly through the parish of Belvoir West, and easterly and southerly through the parish of Wodonga to the site of the dam, the point of commencement aforesaid.

All of which boundaries are as shown on an Order in Council plan deposited in the office of the Minister of Mines and Water Supply, Melbourne.

- (5) That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of a storage reservoir on House Creek; a pipe main thence to a service basin within allotment 3, of section 12, parish of Wodonga; piping thence to the township of Wodonga; and the reticulation of the said township.
- (6) That the name of the Trust shall be the "Wodonga Waterworks Trust."

And the Honorable Henry Foster, Her Majesty's Minister of Mines and Water Supply for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section 20 of the *Water Act 1890* (No. 1156) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after any Waterworks Trust has been by Order in Council duly constituted, make additional Orders in Council not inconsistent with the provisions of the said Act relating to such Waterworks Trust, and that the Governor in Council may in such Order, among other things, increase or diminish the extent of the Waterworks District of such Waterworks Trust: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the 19th December, 1892, a Waterworks Trust, known and incorporated as the Shire of Shepparton Waterworks Trust, was duly constituted, and the boundaries of the land comprising the Waterworks District of the said Trust were, in and by the said Order in Council, and by a subsequent order in Council bearing date the 12th January, 1897, defined and limited: And whereas it is expedient to increase the extent of the said Waterworks District: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, doth order that the land comprised within the following boundaries shall be added to and form part of the aforesaid Waterworks District of the Trust as and from the date hereof:—

Portion A.—Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 21, in the parish of Gowangardie; thence easterly by the northern boundary of said allotment twelve chains fifty links to the western boundary of Trust district as defined in Order in Council of 12th January, 1897; thence N. 0° 20' W. one thousand and seventy links; thence in a general westerly direction by a line parallel to the northern bank of Broken River to the western boundary of subdivision B of allotment 60A, parish of Currawa; thence southerly by that boundary to the Broken River by a line, and south-easterly by the eastern boundary of allotment 22, in the parish of Gowangardie, to the commencing point.
