Income Tax Acts 1895 and 1896.
NOTICE TO MAKE RETURNS.

NOTICE is hereby given that, in pursuance of the above-named Acts and the Regulations made thereunder, every person and company (other than a company under section 10 of the *Income Tax Act 1896*) liable to make any return or declaration under the said Acts or Regulations, is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form such return or declaration on or before the 1st day of March, 1898.

And every company liable to make a return under section 10 of the *Income Tax Act 1896* or under the Regulations is hereby required to duly make and furnish to me in the prescribed form such return on or before the 31st day of March, 1898.

And, further, notice is hereby given that every such return shall be addressed to the Commissioner of Taxes, and be delivered at, or forwarded by post to, the Income Tax Office, at Queen-street, Melbourne.

Any person or company failing or neglecting to furnish a return or declaration at the prescribed time, or making a false return, is under the said Acts liable to a penalty of not less than £2 nor more than £100, and to be assessed and charged a double amount of tax in addition to the tax for which he would have been otherwise liable; and under the said Acts the Commissioner may assess any such defaulter for such sum as the Commissioner thinks ought to be charged.

Any person making a false return or declaration is liable to be prosecuted for perjury.

SMALL-POX ON BOARD THE STEAM-SHIP
"CALEDONIAN."

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that in any emergency or sudden necessity with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria and having any infectious or contagious disease on board, or on board of which any such infectious or contagious disease may have appeared in the course of the voyage, the Board of Public Health may take all necessary steps to prevent infection or contagion until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council under the provisions of section 165 of the said Act: And whereas the steam-ship *Caledonian* has arrived in Victorian waters, and had on board during the voyage a case reported to be one of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: And whereas it is also enacted by such Act that all the powers, rights, and authorities vested in the above-named Board shall, whenever he deems fit, be exercisable by the Minister: Now therefore, I, the Minister of Health for the colony of Victoria, do hereby order and direct that, until the issue or refusal of an Order in Council as aforesaid, and in order to prevent infection or contagion, the said steam-ship shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean, or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the mainmast-head; and do further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the said Board, except the passengers for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken, or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship, except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel and all persons and things on board of her shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

PUBLIC HEALTH.

Section 125 of Act 1098.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, notice is hereby given that it appears to the Board of Public Health that the Shire of Karkaroc is affected by the dangerous infectious or contagious disease typhoid fever; and the said Board doth therefore hereby require all medical practitioners, deputy registrars, school teachers, and members of the police force residing in such municipality, and the occupier or person in charge of any house in which any case of such disease may occur, to report such occurrence immediately on its coming to his or their knowledge, by telegraph, or, in case there is no telegraphic communication, by letter, to the said Board and to the council of the said municipality; and the said Board doth prescribe that such notification shall be in the form following (that is to say):—

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

BY-LAW No. 11.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong made under the provisions of the *Public Health Act 1890*, and numbered 11.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Health Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows, that is to say:—

1. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the following portions of the Shire of Dandenong, that is to say: Commencing over the bridge over the Dandenong Creek on Hammond-road; thence along Hammond-road to Kirkham-road; thence along Kirkham-road to Frankston-road; thence along Frankston-road to the main road in a direct line to the Dandenong Creek; thence along the Dandenong Creek to Kidd's-road; thence along Kidd's-road to Ross-street; thence by Ross-street to King-street; thence by King-street to Walker's-road; thence by Walker's-road to Herbert-street; thence by Herbert-street to Henty-street; thence by Henty-street to main Dandenong-road; thence by the main Dandenong-road to Potter-street; thence by Potter-street in a straight line to the Gippsland railway line; thence by the said railway line to Hammond's-road; thence by Hammond's-road to the starting point.

2. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any house or premises within the foregoing area shall register or cause to be registered all or any night-soil pan or pans in use on such premises and shall pay to the Council such annual charge as may be made from year to year under the provisions of section 259 of the *Public Health Act 1890*.

3. No person other than the person employed or licensed by the Council shall empty within the foregoing area any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil.

4. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet and shall be provided by the occupier.

5. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Five pounds for every such breach, or of Two pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty notwithstanding that the Council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such Council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 24th February, 1896, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.

(b) *Viva voce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.

2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.
