



Such permission, when given, shall limit a time within which the person to whom such has been issued shall be at liberty to take water for domestic supply, and such permission shall be available for the time thereon appearing and for no longer. Permits will be issued only after the water in the various channels, creeks, drains, streams, and water-courses has reached the boundary of the Trust area, and persons requiring water must obtain same while such water is available, and in turn, those furthest from the headworks of the Trust being first supplied.

2. No person shall take any water the property of the Trust until proper drains have been cut, opened, or made from the channel, creek, drain, stream, or water-course through which such water is flowing to the dam, tank, or well proposed to be

such water is flowing to the dam, tank, or well proposed to be filled.

3. The Trust engineer or ranger shall inspect all drains so cut, opened, or made, and give his certificate, in writing, that such drains have been properly cut, opened, and made.

4. No permit to take water will be issued without production of the certificate in the last preceding clause mentioned.

5. Persons requiring to fill dams, tanks, or wells must obtain permits, while the water is being sent down the channels, creeks, drains, streams, and water-courses in the vicinity of the dams, tanks, or wells sought to be filled.

6. Every person desiring to stop or block the flow of water in any channel, creek, drain, stream, or water-course shall before interfering with same obtain the approval, in writing, of the Trust engineer or Trust ranger of the proposed stop or block.

7. Every person shall, immediately upon being required so to do, remove any stop or block created, formed, or made by him or her under the clause last aforesaid, and every person failing so to remove such stop or block shall be deemed guilty of a breach of this Regulation on each and every day during which he or she so fails to remove such stop or block.

8. No person shall fill his dam, tank, or well a second time within a period of two months from such dam, tank, or well having been previously filled unless a fee of Ten shillings for each dam, tank, or well so filled hav been first previously paid.

9. Every person cutting, making, or opening a drain upon any road within the Trust area shall first obtain written authority from the proper officer of the municipality in which such road is situated, and shall cut, make, and open such drain, and provide a proper crossing over same to the satisfaction of the engineer for such municipality.

10. The Trust may, upon such conditions as to it may seem desirable, and subject to the provisions of this Regulation, supply water for domestic purposes to persons outside the area of the Trust district.
