## THE FEDERAL COUNCIL OF AUSTRALASIA ACT 1885.

### A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Imperial Parliament of the 48 and 49 Vict., Ch. 60, intituled "*An Act to constitute a Federal Council of Australasia*," it is enacted that the Sessions of the Federal Council subsequent to the First Session thereof shall be held in such Colony as the Council shall from time to time determine, and, further, that the Council shall be summoned and prorogued by the Governor of the Colony in which the Session shall be held, and shall be so summoned and prorogued by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* of each of the Colonies in the said Act referred to in respect to which the said Act is in operation, and shall meet at such time and such place as shall be named in the Proclamation: And whereas in the Seventh Session of the Federal Council held at Hobart, in the Colony of Tasmania, during the month of January, in the sixtieth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, it was, on the twenty-eighth day of the said month of January, determined by the said Council that the next Session thereof should be held at Melbourne, in the Colony of Victoria. Now therefore, I, the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the said Act, and by virtue of the power thereby conferred on me, do, by this my Proclamation, summon the Federal Council of Australasia, as constituted by the said Act, to meet at the Parliament Buildings in Melbourne, in Victoria aforesaid, on Tuesday, the twenty-fourth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, at the hour of Eleven in the forenoon, for the despatch of business.

## GENERAL ELECTORAL LISTS, 1898-9.—ISSUE OF ELECTORS' RIGHTS.

IT is hereby notified that Thursday, the 1st day of December, is the last day on which Electors' Rights can be obtained for enrolment on the General Lists of Non-ratepaying Electors for the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly, and that persons who are not already enrolled will be entitled to have their names entered on such lists by obtaining Electors' Rights from the Registrars for their respective Divisions, or their Deputies, before or on that date.

Intending applicants for Electors' Rights are cautioned to apply early to the Registrar. The law requires the prescribed questions as to an applicant's qualifications to be answered in writing before the Right is issued; therefore, if application be postponed until the last day allowed for the purpose, the Registrar or Deputy may be unable to issue Rights to all applicants on that day, and those to whom Rights are not so issued will not be enrolled, and will lose their title to vote.

Each applicant should provide himself with the stamp (6d.) necessary for payment for the Right.

Intending applicants are cautioned to carefully ascertain whether they are fully qualified under the law, as a penalty is imposed upon persons knowingly and wilfully obtaining Electors' Rights by falsely answering the questions when not qualified.

No person whose name is on, or entitled to be on, any Roll of Ratepaying Electors for any Division of a PROVINCE may obtain an Elector's Right for such PROVINCE.

No person whose name is already on the New List of Ratepaying Electors (now being prepared) for any Division of an ELECTORAL DISTRICT may obtain an Elector's Right for such DISTRICT.

Foreigners who desire to obtain Electors' Rights must, if not already naturalized in Victoria, obtain letters of naturalization before doing so; and such foreigners, if they desire enrolment as Ratepaying Electors, must obtain letters of naturalization before the sitting of the Revision Courts appointed to be held during February next.

The Registrars and Deputy Registrars throughout Melbourne and suburbs and in the principal towns throughout Victoria will keep their offices open for the issue of Electors' Rights until Ten o'clock p.m. on Saturday, the 26th, Monday, the 28th, and Wednesday, the 30th November, and Thursday, the 1st December.

FISHING IN THE MERRI RIVER, LADY BAY, AND  
HOPKINS RIVER.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, at the expiration of one month from the date of this notice, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to issue a Proclamation under the provisions of the *Fisheries Act 1890* revoking all previous Proclamations relating to fishing in the Merri River, Lady Bay, and the Hopkins River, and, in lieu thereof, defining the mouths of the Merri and Hopkins rivers, prohibiting the use of nets and fixed engines, and prescribing close seasons, as indicated hereunder, viz.:—

## MERRI RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Merri River to be a line bearing north ½ east from the easternmost point of Middle Island to a post fixed on the timber viaduct.

Prescribing a close season for all species of fish in the Merri River from the 1st July to the 31st October (both dates inclusive), in every year.

## LADY BAY.

Prohibiting the use of nets and fixed engines from the 1st July to the 16th December (both dates inclusive) in every year within a line bearing east by north from the seaward end of the Warrnambool breakwater to a post fixed on the shore a quarter of a mile westward of the western bank of the mouth of the Hopkins River.

## HOPKINS RIVER.

Defining the mouth of the Hopkins River to be a line extending from the extreme seaward or outward point of either bank or side to the opposite extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such river enter the ocean; and fixing the distance from the mouth of the said river within which nets and fixed engines are not to be used to be a radius of one-quarter of a mile from any portion or point of the aforesaid line defining the mouth of the said river.

Prescribing a close season for all species of fish in the Hopkins River eastward of a line marked by two posts about one mile and a half from the mouth of the said river from the 1st July to the 31st October (both dates inclusive), in every year; also prescribing a close season for bream and perch only in the Hopkins River westward of the said line to a radius of one-quarter of a mile seaward from the mouth of the said river from the 1st July to the 31st October (both dates inclusive), in every year.

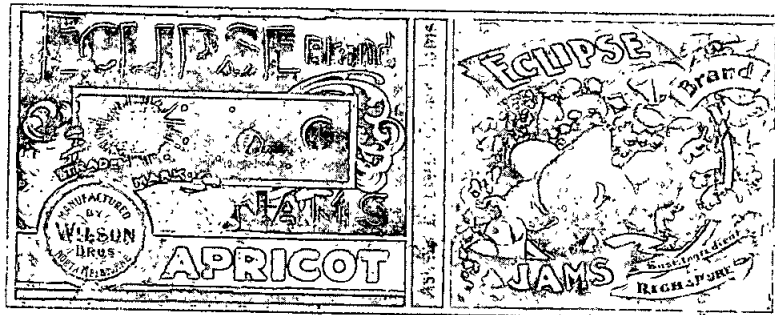

6. Where water is supplied by meter for domestic and other than domestic use, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate payable for the year in respect of the premises supplied.

## VITAL STATISTICS

## RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF OCTOBER, 1898.

THE births of 49 boys and 52 girls, or in all of 101 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of October. Of these, 46 occurred in Ballarat East, 51 in Ballarat West, 2 in Sebastopol, and 2 in the outlying districts; included were 3 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 101, viz., 51 of boys and 50 of girls.

The deaths registered in October numbered 74, viz., 44 of males and 30 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 27. In September, the recorded deaths numbered 60; in October, 1897, they numbered 46; in October, 1896, they numbered 58; in October, 1895, they numbered 56; in October, 1894, they numbered 80; in October, 1893, they numbered 63; in October, 1892, they numbered 64; in October, 1891, they numbered 101; in October, 1890, they numbered 46; in October, 1889, they numbered 61; and in October, 1888, they numbered 61.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Fifteen deaths, or 20 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz., Ballarat Hospital, 6; Benevolent Asylum, 9.

5. The acceptance of the firewood shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery, or such other officer as shall be named by him. If after the delivery of the firewood has been taken any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such firewood may be returned to the contractor. In case of the rejection or return of any firewood, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the wood so rejected or returned.
6. As soon as the orders shall have been completed the contractor will be required to furnish to the department supplied his account in the prescribed form, with the receipted delivery order attached thereto. Accounts will be payable at any Receipt and Pay Office that the contractor may desire.
7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the firewood as to the quality the same shall be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered as final.
8. If the board shall decide that the wood is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in condition No. 3.
9. If from any cause injury would accrue to the public service by waiting for a board of survey, the head of the department or officer in charge will have the power to reject such wood as is obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected wood, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense (if any) will be charged as in condition 3.
10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quality or quantity of the firewood, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor to such mulct, not exceeding £50, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct; and the amount may be deducted as in condition 3. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.
11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.
12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and in addition the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.
13. No subletting will be allowed; all work must be carried out by the contractor, and the hours of employment of any person engaged therein are not to exceed forty-eight per week, and at a minimum wage of 6s. per day; and a copy of these conditions shall be kept conspicuously and continually posted, in legible Roman characters, on the premises of the contractor. Any infringement of this condition, in the opinion of the Treasurer, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds (£50), as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted as in condition 3, and the Treasurer's decision shall be binding, final, and conclusive as to the fact of infringement, and in all other respects.

12. The births of 896 children, viz., 469 boys and 427 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of October. The number was, it will be observed, 12 more than in October, 1897, but much fewer than that recorded for the month during any other of the previous ten years. The number was, moreover, 352 below the average of the previous ten years, or 358 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in October numbered 574, viz., 315 of males and 259 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 322, or by 56 per cent., as against 87 in 1897 and 112 per cent. according to the average. The deaths were, it will be noticed, 102 more than those in October, 1897, but 16 fewer than the average of October during the last ten years, or 19 below it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 23.00 and of deaths registered to 14.74 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1897 of 23.07 and 12.32 respectively, and in the last ten years of 33.03 and 15.51 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 89.0° on the 26th, and the lowest was 38.2° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (57.0°), was three-fifths of a degree above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (39.9°) took place on the 26th, and the least range (2.4°) on the 7th. The mean daily range was 20.7°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.195 inches on the 1st, and the lowest was 29.153 inches on the 28th. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.758 inches) was about one-eighth of an inch below the average, and was, with one exception, the lowest for the month during the last eleven years.

Rain fell on eleven days, the amount being 1.21 inches, which was nearly two-thirds of an inch lower than in October, 1897, and 1.10 inches below the average of the previous ten years.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 30 per cent. to that mortality, as against 19 per cent. in October, 1897; 21 per cent. in October, 1896; 21 per cent. in October, 1895; 21 per cent. in October, 1894; 28 per cent. in October, 1893; and 26 per cent. in October, 1892.

Sixty-four persons—as against thirty-eight in October, 1897—whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a female, aged 75, died of phthisis; a miner and a female, each aged 75, of valvular disease of the heart; a carpenter, aged 75, of pericarditis; a female, aged 75, of heart disease; a labourer and a female, each aged 75, of bronchitis; a male, of no occupation, aged 76, of hæmoptysis; a female, aged 76, of heart disease; a gentleman and a male of no occupation, both aged 76, of bronchitis; a dairyman, aged 76, of pneumonia; a merchant, aged 76, of cystitis; a miner, aged 77, of gout; a female, aged 77, of paralysis; a bricklayer and a female, both aged 77, of bronchitis; a male, of no occupation, aged 77, of pneumonia; a labourer, aged 78, of phthisis; a female, aged 78, of diabetes; an ex-schoolmaster, aged 78, of softening of the

brain; a gentleman, aged 78, of gastritis; an engineer, aged 78, of kidney disease; two females, each aged 79, of cancer and paralysis respectively; a labourer, aged 79, of heart disease; a painter, aged 80, of apoplexy; a female, aged 80, of paralysis; a plasterer, aged 80, of heart disease; a gentleman, aged 80, of pleurisy; a carpenter, aged 81, of bronchitis; a female, aged 82, of cancer; a gentleman, aged 82, of valvular disease of the heart; a carpenter, aged 82, of syncope; two females, each aged 82, of embolism and heart disease respectively; a male, of no occupation, aged 82, of nephritis; a merchant, aged 83, of cirrhosis of the liver; a female, aged 83, of eczema; another, aged 84, of cancer; a labourer, aged 84, of valvular disease of the heart; a female, aged 84, of syncope; two females, each aged 85, of cerebral hemorrhage and bronchitis respectively; a mariner, aged 85, of cystitis; two gentlemen, aged 86 and 88 respectively, of syncope; a farmer, aged 89, of bronchitis; a tailor, aged 93, was found drowned in Hobson's Bay; a female, aged 75, a carpenter and a female, each aged 77, a labourer and two females, each aged 79, a gentleman, aged 82, two gentlemen, two labourers, and an engine-driver, each aged 84, a carter, aged 87, a labourer and a female, each aged 92, of old age.

Twenty-four of the deaths recorded during the month—as compared with 20 in October, 1897—were from external causes, of which 18 were set down to accident, 1 to homicide, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A jockey, aged 13, was killed whilst riding in a race; a female child, aged 6, died of fracture of the skull, the result of a fall in the street; a lithographer, aged 37, of injuries, consequent on a fall from a window; a seaman, aged 30, of injury to the spine, caused by a fall from a ship; a seaman, aged 32, of a wound in the head, consequent on a fall when drunk; a female, aged 61, also by a fall whilst drunk; a carter, aged 29, of rupture of the small intestine, and a labourer, aged 50, of fracture of the spine, the result in each case of a fall; a female child, aged 4, of burns; a boy, aged 10, was drowned in Hobson's Bay by falling off the pier; a seaman, aged 41, a carriage-builder, aged 45, a bootmaker, aged 52, and a female, aged 47, were "found drowned" in the River Yarra; a tailor, aged 93, in Hobson's Bay; a male, of no occupation, aged 48, was suffocated by a number of bags of cement falling on him; a new-born male infant, at birth, no evidence to show how caused; a female child, aged 3 months, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of a female, aged 35, who died of injuries to the spinal cord, resulting from violence, a verdict of manslaughter being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a boatman, aged 58, who shot himself; a hawker, aged 36, who cut his throat; a carriage-cleaner, aged 73, who drowned himself; and two females, aged 35 and 47 respectively, who hanged themselves.

One hundred and thirty-five deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 58 in the Melbourne, 17 in the Alfred, 3 in St. Vincent's, 4 in the Women's, 5 in the Children's, 6 in the Homoeopathic, and 6 in the Austin Hospitals; 6 in the Metropolitan and 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 8 in the Immigrants' Home, 12 in the Benevolent and 4 in the Infant Asylums, 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 1 in the Eye and Ear Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 171, of which 96, or 56 per cent., were of males, and 75, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 119 were under one year of age, 33 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 5 were between four and five. As compared with the corresponding month of the previous year, there was an increase of 81 in the deaths under five years, of which 62 was in those of infants under one year, and 19 in those between one and two years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 403. Of these, 219, or 54 per cent., were males, and 184, or 46 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 6 were between fifteen and twenty, 14 were between twenty and twenty-five, 20 were between twenty-five and thirty, 32 were between thirty and thirty-five, 32 were between thirty-five and forty, 20 were between forty and forty-five, 31 were between forty-five and fifty, 32 were between fifty and fifty-five, 32 were between fifty-five and sixty, 26 were between sixty and sixty-five, 38 were between sixty-five and seventy, 30 were between seventy and seventy-five, 32 were between seventy-five and eighty, 22 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, and 3 were between ninety and ninety-five.

In the month under notice as compared with the corresponding month last year, there was an increase of 51 deaths under the head of local, 18 under zymotic, 12 under constitutional, 5 under developmental, 2 under parasitic diseases, 4 under the head of violence, and 11 under ill-defined causes; whilst the only decrease was 1 under dietic diseases. Under the local class, the principal increases were 16 under diseases of the circulatory, 38 under those of the respiratory (chiefly bronchitis and pneumonia), and 27 under those of the digestive system (of which 16 were due to enteritis alone); as against which there was a decrease of 32 under diseases of the nervous system, and 3 under diseases of parturition. Under the zymotic class, deaths from diarrhoeal diseases increased by 5, typhoid fever, whooping cough, and syphilis by 4 each, and measles by 3; but, on the other hand, those from diphtheria diminished by 5. Under the constitutional class, deaths from cancer were more numerous by 7, and those from scrofula, &c., by 6.

The present epidemic of measles, which culminated in April with 99 deaths, is gradually abating—the deaths having since gradually fallen to 3 in October. Since its first outbreak, in December last, this epidemic has carried off 397 persons—principally children. During the last 25 years there have been six conspicuous epidemics of measles, of which the most fatal was the epidemic of 1874-5, which caused 733 deaths; the next, that now prevalent; and the next, that of 1893, which caused 386 deaths. Such epidemics have recurred at intervals of usually four or five years, and the disease is apparently not confined to any particular season of the year. The following are particulars of the leading outbreaks during the last 25 years:—

**NOTE.**—The natural increase of population during the quarter was one-fifth below the average of the corresponding quarters of the two previous years, owing to a falling-off in the birth rate, accompanied with an increase in the rate of mortality. Thus, the births fell off by 312 as compared with the third quarter of 1897, and by 500 as compared with that of 1896, whilst the deaths increased by 587 and 425 respectively; resulting in a reduction in the natural increase of 899 and 925 respectively.

The returns of the Immigration Agent, however, show a marked improvement in the movements of population, there having been recorded a net immigration during the quarter, for the third time since 1891, of 1,024 persons, the two other occasions being the fourth quarters of 1897 and 1894, when a net immigration of 2,504 and 1,311 respectively was recorded; whereas in the third quarter of 1897 there was a net emigration of 886, and in that of 1896 one of 5,386. Allowing for unrecorded departures (estimated), however, there was really a loss by emigration during the quarter of 548, as shown in the table.

Deducting the net loss by emigration from the natural increase, there results an increase of population during the quarter of 3,219, as compared with an increase of 2,174 in the corresponding quarter of 1897, but with a decrease of 2,589 in that of 1896. The increase shown was the fourth largest recorded—taking all quarters—since 1891, the largest being 4,206 in the last quarter of 1894, the next, 3,696 in the fourth quarter of 1897, and the next, 3,247 and 3,219 respectively in the third quarter of 1892 and 1893.

From the date of the census (5th April, 1891) the allowance for unrecorded departures has been 55,515, viz., 43,156 of males, and 12,359 of females. Had no such allowance been made, the population at the end of September would have been set down at 1,228,168, viz., 634,262 males and 593,906 females.

The records of migration—which include passengers merely calling at Victorian ports *en route*—show a balance in favour of immigrants of 1,763 from Western Australia, 643 from Foreign Ports, 144 from South Australia, 170 from the United Kingdom, and 26 from South Africa; but a balance in favour of emigration of 1,284 to New South Wales, 410 to Queensland, 15 to Tasmania, and 13 to New Zealand and South Seas. The noticeable feature in these records is the cessation—temporary at least—of the emigration to Western Australia and South Africa, to the former of which there has been an almost uninterrupted net emigration during the previous nine years and a half amounting altogether to 70,650, and to the latter, during the previous three years and a half, a net emigration amounting to 5,211. The only exceptions to the regular outflow to Western Australia occurred in the fourth quarter of 1893 and 1897—when there was a net gain of 379 and 2,464 respectively, and in the quarter under review. In the third quarter of 1897, the net emigration to Western Australia was 1,377, and to South Africa 139; and in the corresponding quarter of 1896 it was 7,795 to the former and 1,118 to the latter colony.

*Police Offences Act 1890.*  
**SHIRE OF GLENLYON.**  
 BY-LAW NO. 2.

A By-law of the Shire of Glenlyon, made under Section 190 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, for applying and extending certain provisions of Part I. of the *Police Offences Act 1890* to all parts of the Shire of Glenlyon.

**I**N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts 1890 and 1891, and of any and every other Act in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Glenlyon order as follows:—

1. That from and after the date of this by-law coming into operation the following provisions of Part I. of the *Police Offences Act 1890* shall apply and extend to all parts of the shire of Glenlyon, that is to say:—

2. Any person guilty of any of the following offences, omissions, or neglects shall, on conviction, pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds:—

- (i.) Throwing any glass, filth, dirt, rubbish, or other matter of a similar nature upon any road, footway, or public place;
- (ii.) Riding, driving, or wheeling any barrow or carriage upon, or along any footpath;
- (iii.) Placing any timber, bricks, or other building materials upon any footway, channel, surface drain, or carriage road, without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained;
- (iv.) Burning any shavings or other materials upon any footway, carriage road, or open or public place;
- (v.) Leaving any inflammable materials or matter in any public shed or place, or on any open space near any building without having first obtained the permission of the local authority;
- (vi.) Drawing or trailing any sledge, timber, or other heavy material upon any footway or carriage road to the injury of such footway or carriage road;
- (vii.) Emptying any privy or cesspool, or carting away any night-soil or other offensive matter, without a licence from and without having given such security as is required by the local authority;
- (viii.) Allowing any night-soil or other offensive matter to be spilt or otherwise cast into or upon any road, street, footway, or public place;
- (ix.) Allowing the drippings of the eaves of any house to fall upon any public footway;
- (x.) Placing any placard or other document, writing, painting on, or otherwise defacing any house or building, or any wall, fence, lamp-post, or gate, without the consent of the occupier or owner thereof;
- (xi.) Opening any drain or sewer, or removing the surface of any footway or carriage road, without the permission of the local authority having been first obtained;
- (xii.) Neglecting to clean all private yards, ways, passages, or avenues, by which neglect a nuisance by offensive smell or otherwise is caused;
- (xiii.) Rolling any cask, beating any carpet, breaking-in any horse, flying any kite, using any bows and arrows, or playing at any game to the annoyance of any person in any public place; or obstructing any footpath or carriage road, whether by allowing any cart or animal to remain across such footpath or carriage road, or by placing goods thereon or otherwise;
- (xiv.) Throwing or discharging any stone or other missile, to the damage or danger of any person;
- (xv.) Having any awning on any footway in any public street or thoroughfare not being seven feet clear above the footway, or hanging any goods on or under such awning over the footway;
- (xvi.) Blasting any rock, stone, or timber in or near any public place without permission of the local authority, and not attending to any directions in regard thereto given by such local authority;
- (xvii.) Furiously or negligently riding or driving through any public place;
- (xviii.) Exposing in any public street or thoroughfare (except in any fair or market lawfully appointed for that purpose) any horse or other animal for show, hire, or sale;
- (xix.) Permitting any horse to serve a mare for breeding purposes, or permitting a mare to be brought to a horse, or a horse to be brought to a mare, in order to ascertain if she is in season for taking the horse for breeding purposes, in or within sight of any road, street, or thoroughfare;
- (xx.) Making cellar-door or other opening from the footway of any street or public thoroughfare without the consent of the local authority;
- (xxi.) Any carter plying for hire without a licence;
- (xxii.) Any carter waiting for hire allowing his cart or dray to stand in any other place than those appointed by the local authority, or demanding higher rates than authorized by such local authority;
- (xxiii.) Plying for hire with any boat not being a steam-boat at any ferry, or on any river, without a licence from the local authority, or demanding higher rates than sanctioned by such local authority;
- (xxiv.) Discharging any fire-arms, or setting off any fireworks, or carrying any fire-arms, sword, dirk, dagger, or other offensive weapon, within any town or public place without permission from the local authority. Provided that the provision last aforesaid shall not apply to any justice, or any person in Her Majesty's military or naval service, or any member of the police or other peace officer, or any member of a recognised volunteer corps, or any special constable, or any person actually in pursuit of any felon or offender.

3. Any local authority may from time to time make regulations for the route to be observed by all carriages, carts, vehicles, and persons, and for keeping order in the carriage and foot ways and public places of any city, town, or borough, and for preventing any obstruction thereof, whether by the assemblage of

persons or otherwise; and every wilful breach of any such regulation shall be deemed to be a separate offence against this part of this Act, and every person committing any such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

4. Any local authority may make such rules and regulations with reference to the licensing of carters and boatmen, the places where they shall stand, the rates they shall receive, the distance they shall be compelled to go, and such other matters as may tend to the public convenience in regard to them as such local authority may see fit.

5. No person without a licence first had and obtained from the local authority shall erect, place, or set up, or build in any public place any hoarding or scaffolding, or place or erect any posts, bars, rails, boards, or other thing by way of enclosure for the purpose of making mortar, or of depositing, sifting, screening, or slacking any brick, stone, lime, sand, or any other material for building or repairing any house or other tenement or erection, or for any other purpose; and such licence as aforesaid shall specify therein the length of time for which any such hoarding, scaffolding, posts, bars, rails, boards, or other thing when so erected or set up may be continued, and shall contain such other directions respecting the same as are necessary. And if any person place, set up, erect, or build, or cause or permit to be erected, placed, set up, or built any such hoarding or scaffolding, or any enclosed posts, bars, or rails, or any other matter or thing for the purposes aforesaid, or for any other purpose without such licence, or contrary to the provisions and conditions of such licence, or to be continued for any longer time than is allowed or expressed in such licence, then and in any of the said cases such person shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and also the sum of One pound for every day that the same has been and is set up and continued contrary to the provisions hereof, and the said local authority may, four days after notice, cause the same to be pulled down and removed, and the same and all the materials thereof to be kept and detained until such person pays to such local authority all the penalties incurred by such persons, together with the charges of pulling down, removing, and keeping the same; and if the same be not claimed and the said penalties and charges as aforesaid paid within the space of five days next after the pulling down and removing thereof, such local authority may order or cause the same to be sold by public auction, and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.

6. If any person expose for sale any article whatsoever on any footway, or outside of any shop window or doorway abutting on any public thoroughfare or street, so as to obstruct the public thoroughfare, he shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds; and if any article so exposed be not removed within six hours after notice, any local authority, or any officer of police, or any constable without warrant, may seize any such article; and every such article shall be forfeited and sold, and the proceeds thereof applied according to the provisions hereinafter mentioned respecting the appropriation of moneys arising from forfeitures.

7. The local authority or any justice, may authorize and depute any peace officer or constable from time to time to visit and inspect any butcher's shambles, slaughter-house, or yard, or any house, out-building, lane, alley, or other place, for the purpose of ascertaining if the same be kept cleansed; and such person so authorized shall, if it appear that any accumulation of manure, dung, offal, soil, filth, coal, ashes, or other unwholesome or noxious matter whatsoever ought to be removed, shall give notice to the person to whom the same belongs, or to the occupier of the premises whereon it exists, to remove the same; and if, at the expiration of four days after such notice, the same be not complied with, the manure, dung, offal, soil, filth, coal, ashes, or other matter referred to shall be removed by such other peace officer, at the expense of the person to whom such notice was given, and such expense may be recovered in the same manner as any penalty inflicted hereunder.

8. If any person, after the coming into operation of this Act, erect or cause to be erected in any city, town, district, or place to which this provision may be extended any chimney or fire-place of timber or other matter liable to ignition, or do not place for a sufficient distance some matter or material not liable to ignition between such chimney or fire-place and any material of an inflammable nature or liable to ignition, the occupier of such house shall, on notice from the local authority being served upon him or left at such premises, requiring such fire-place or chimney to be so altered as not to come within the meaning of this provision, and neglecting, after the expiration of seven days, to comply with the conditions of such notice, forfeit and pay a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

9. Upon the extension of any of the provisions of this part of this Act to any city, town, or borough in Victoria, the council of such city, town, or borough, or, if there be no such council, the Surveyor-General, shall cause to be set out the breadth of the carriage and foot ways in the streets and public places of every such city, town, or borough, and shall cause the said footways to be marked by posts at the corners and intersections of the streets; and the carriage and foot ways, when so set out, shall be deemed to be the carriage and foot ways respectively of such city, town, or borough.

10. Before the Surveyor-General shall cause to be set out the carriage and foot ways of any such city, town, or borough as aforesaid, he shall submit to the Governor in Council a plan of the same, showing the proposed breadth of the carriage and foot ways; and thereupon the Governor may, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, fix and declare the breadth of such carriage and foot ways, and the distance from the outer edge of such footways, within which it shall not be lawful to erect any building or fence.

# REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF COBURG.

WHEREAS by the Crown grant issued in favour of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Coburg, and their successors, in respect of, it is provided and declared that the land thereby granted, and the buildings for the time being thereon, shall be maintained and used as and for a site for the recreation and amusement of the people, and offices and conveniences connected therewith, under and in accordance with such regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Governor or Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria for the time being, with the consent of the Executive Council thereof, and in the meantime under and in accordance with such rules, orders, by-laws, and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Coburg.

And whereas by section 137 of the *Land Act 1890* it is provided that where any such land has been vested in trustees, or jointly with the Board of Land and Works and trustees, it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land, with the approval of the Governor in Council, from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules and regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in clause 1 of the said section: Now therefore the Council of the Shire of Coburg doth hereby make the following regulations for the care, protection, and management of the said reserve for public recreation in the township of Coburg, and for the preservation of good order, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon:—

1. The reserve shall be open to the public free of charge from sunrise to sunset, except on such days as the reserve may be set apart for shows, athletic and bicycle sports, cricket or football matches, fêtes, or holding amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding One shilling may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, stick bills thereon, or cut, or in any way damage the fences, gates, or seats, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or commit any nuisance in the reserve, or leave therein any bottles, papers, cast-off clothing, or any litter.

5. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, goats, sheep, or pigs.

6. No person shall erect any booth or other structure in the reserve, or hawk or offer for sale therein any goods or other articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the council.

7. No person shall light any fire in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the council.

8. No person, except labourers or workmen employed in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of trees or shrubs.

9. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog unless led by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the council.

10. No person shall engage in any game or sports in the reserve on Sunday.

11. No person shall engage in cricket, football, lacrosse, baseball, tennis, or any other like game in the reserve without the permission, in writing, of the council, unless such person is at the time of playing a member of any club which is duly authorized to play in the reserve.

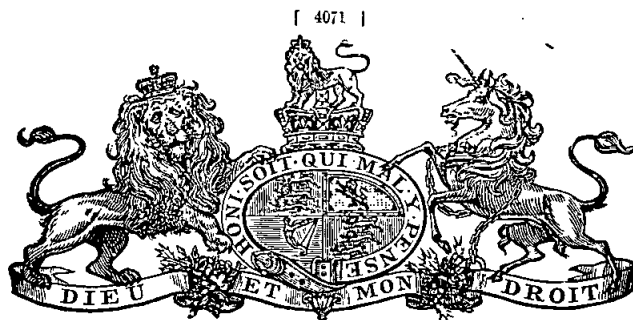
