7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure, and except in cases where Trust has made special agreements.

8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.

9. Such rates and charges are hereby payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1899.

10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to de-mand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

per annum.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION AND SHOW YARDS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF LEONGATHA.

SHIP OF LEONGATHA.

WE, Thomas Sellars Ridgway, George Roughead, Robert Bair, and Hugh McCartin, a majority of the duly appointed Committee of Management of the Reserve for Public Recreation and Show Yards in the Township of Leongatha, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and deceney therein, and also for the collection and receipt of tolls, entrance fees, or other charges for entering therein or thereupon, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1890:—

REGULATIONS.

- 1. The reserve shall be open to the public, free of charge, from sunrise to sunset, except on such days (not exceeding twelve in any one year) as the reserve may be set apart for sports, cricket matches, or football matches, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the reserve.
- 2. All person paying for admission to the reserve shall be supplied with a ticket of admission, which shall on demand be produced, and (if required) surrender to any gatekeeper or other person having authority from the Committee of Management to demand the production or surrender of same.
- 3. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
- 4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 5. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or gates, or stick bills thereon, or cut names on the fences, trees, or seats, or roll or throw stones in the reserve.
- 6. No person shall put in the reserve any cattle, goats, sheep, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management, provided always that the moneys received for agistment shall be expended in the maintenance and improvement of the reserve, and that an account thereof shall be furnished annually to the Board of Land and Works.
- 7. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee of Management.
- 8. No person shall engage in any game or sport in the reserve on Sunday.
- No person shall erect any dwelling in the reserve, nor any booth or other structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.
- 10. Any person who may have obtained the consent, in writing, of the Committee of Management to the temporary erection within the reserve of any building for special purposes shall be bound by any order given by the Committee of Management in

regard thereto, and shall remove the same and all debris as directed by the Committee of Management before the surrender of his monetary deposit (if any).

- 11. No person, except labourers and workmen employed by the Committee of Management in the reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs, or for other purposes.
- 12. Any person committing in the reserve, or in any of the buildings thereon, any of the following offences shall be liable to be removed from the reserve, notwithstanding such person may have purchased a ticket of admission thereto, or to any part

2nd. Being drunk.

3rd. Crossing or trespassing upon the playing ground during a cricket or football match, or sports, or trespassing upon the running ground when a race is being run.

4th. Using profane or abusive language, or behaving improperly or riotonely.

5th. Not surrendering (if required) to any gatekeeper or other authorized person any ticket duly authorizing admission to that part of the reserve where such person shall be found.

13. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, or enclosure in the reserve on the occasion of any sports, cricket, or football matches may be required to deposit any sum, not exceeding Ten pounds sterling, which the Committee of Management may determine in the way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, or enclosure, and the Committee of Management may make repairs or make good any damage or loss sustained by any such building, stand, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such renting or bring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money go deposited by such person as for liquidated damages.

Every person offending sensing these Regulations shall in

Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

A By-law of the Shire of Moorabbin, made under section 191 of the Local Government Act 1850, and numbered 25, to prevent driving and riding on or neross any footways or channels in the Shire of Moorabbin.

I N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act, the President, Councillors, and Katepayers of the Shire of Moorabbin order as follows:—

Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal or rides or drives any horse or other animal or rides or drives any searinge, cart, bieyele, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway or any water-channel or gutter by the side of any street or road, save in such case upon and by or at some crossing or bridge to be made over such channel or gutter under the direction and approval of the Moorabbin Shire Council or any of its officers shall forfeit a sum not exceeding £5, and shall also pay to the council such sum not exceeding £5 and shall also pay to the council such sum not exceeding £10 by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the justice or justices adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.
