VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER, 1898.

THE births of 53 boys and 48 girls, or in all of 101 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of November. Of these, 44 occurred in Ballarat East, 48 in Ballarat West, 8 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 5 illegitimate births and 1 case of twins. In the previous month the births numbered 101, viz., 49 of boys and 52 of girls.

The deaths registered in November numbered 86, viz., 55 of males and 31 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 15. In October, the recorded deaths numbered 74; in November, 1897, they numbered 50; in November, 1896, they numbered 60; in November, 1895, they numbered 64; in November, 1894, they numbered 74; in November, 1893, they numbered 67; in November, 1892, they numbered 49; in November, 1891, they numbered 77; in November, 1890, they numbered 55; in November, 1889, they numbered 50; and in November, 1888, they numbered 45.

The following table shows the deaths which took place in Ballarat East, Ballarat West, Sebastopol, and the Suburban Districts, distinguishing also the sexes and persons under and over five years of age:—

Fifteen deaths, or 17 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz., Ballarat Hospital, 7; Benevolent Asylum, 4; Lunatic Asylum, 4.

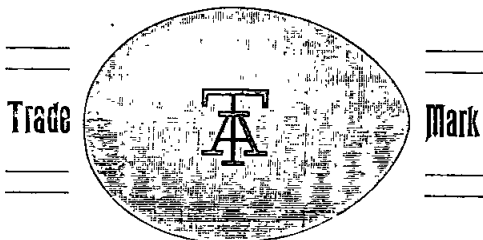

Marine Act 1890.

AMENDED REGULATIONS RELATING TO PILOTS AND PILOTAGE.

WHEREAS by section 60 of the *Marine Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Marine Board of Victoria, with the consent of the Governor in Council, may make and alter or repeal rules and regulations for the management and government of Pilots and all persons in their employ, and for the order in which they shall perform their services, and for the granting of certificates under section 80 of the said Act:

And whereas the Marine Board did, on the 10th day of August, 1894, make such Regulations as aforesaid:

And whereas it is expedient to repeal Regulations Nos. 17 and 86 of "The Regulations relating to Pilots and Pilotage," published in the *Government Gazette* of the 24th day of August, 1894, and to make amended Regulations in lieu thereof:

Now therefore the said Board doth hereby, with the consent of the Governor in Council, repeal the Regulations numbered as aforesaid from the date hereinafter specified, and doth make the following amended Regulations in lieu and to be read in substitution thereof, that is to say:—

AMENDED REGULATIONS.

17. *Vessel on Cruising Station.*—The respective stations shall, when practicable, be taken up by each pilot vessel in regular rotation for a period of seven (7) days; provided that at all times a pilot vessel shall be kept cruising outside Port Phillip Heads within the limits of the Cruising Station as hereinbefore defined.

86. *Qualifications for certificates of competency to masters of vessels to act as pilots of ships they command within the Ports of Victoria.*—The master of any ship employed in coasting only, or actually trading between any port of Victoria and of the colonies of New South Wales, Queensland, Tasmania, New Zealand, Fiji, Western and South Australia, or the master of any ship registered and owned in Victoria, desirous of obtaining a certificate that he is competent to act as pilot to such ship, must apply to the Board on the form which will be supplied to the applicant by the secretary thereto, and such application must be accompanied by—

(1) The applicant's certificate of competency, or service as master, such certificate being a certificate issued by some authority recognised by the Board.

(2) Properly attested testimonials, to the satisfaction of the Board, as to sobriety, experience, ability, and good conduct for (at least) the twelve months immediately preceding the date of application for examination.

(3) Official evidence that he has, whilst on a *bona fide* trading voyage from one port in Victoria to another port in Victoria or elsewhere (or *vice versa*), either—

(a) Commanded a vessel subject to the payment of pilotage dues twice in and twice out of Port Phillip Heads, and that whilst in command of any such ship engaged in such voyage he has been once up and once down the entire length of the South and West channels respectively of Port Phillip; or

(b) Has served as chief officer of such vessel employed in the course of any such voyage, as hereinbefore prescribed, four times in and four times out of Port Phillip Heads, and twice up and twice down the entire length of the South and West channels respectively of Port Phillip.

Provided that if any applicant be desirous of obtaining an exemption certificate for any port in Victoria other than for the ports of Port Phillip and Melbourne, he shall only be required to produce satisfactory evidence that—

(a) He has commanded a vessel subject to the payment of pilotage dues, and engaged on a voyage, as hereinbefore prescribed, once in and once out of the port for which he desires to obtain an exemption certificate; or that

(b) He has served as chief officer of a like vessel three times in and three times out of such port.

Provided also that should it appear to the Board in any case that the voyage or voyages on which the applicant had served was or were not of a *bona fide* trading character, such applicant may be rejected as a candidate.

These Regulations shall form portion of "The Regulations relating to Pilots and Pilotage," and shall be read in connexion therewith, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1899, on which date Regulations Nos. 17 and 86, as hereinbefore referred to, shall be repealed.

The foregoing amended Regulations were made and passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held this 25th day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

By-Law No. 2.

THE Council of the Shire of Dundas, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling the said Council in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the Shire of Dundas.

REGISTRATION OF COWKEEPERS, DAIRYMEN, AND PURVEYORS OF MILK.

4. Every person carrying on the trade of cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, on or before the 1st day of June in every year, register himself with the council of the said shire in the manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the council an application in the form

hereunder; and every person shall with every such application pay a fee of One shilling.

5. Upon receipt of every such application and fee the shire secretary shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

6. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized in writing by the president or secretary of the said council, and if on inspection such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk or otherwise, the said council may by an order in writing signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or in the case of an unregistered person, served personally or left at his dwelling-place or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person, and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are in the opinion of the inspector likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the said council may revoke, but upon every fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

7. All houses, dairies, cowsheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures, in the occupation of any person following the trade of cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectually lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cowkeeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

8. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows shall be regularly swept and kept perfectly clean; and shall within twenty-four hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed as may be in any such order so directed.

9. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

10. If any person or any member of the family of any person registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid or any dangerous infectious or contagious disease, the occupier of the premises in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the said council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order to be served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use or occupation of any such cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk until danger, in the opinion of such council or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, to milk cows or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business. Nor if the person suffering shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk or of its contamination has ceased.

11. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cowshed or dairy, or in the herds of any cowkeeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the said council,

officer of health, or nearest member of police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

12. No cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep or permit or suffer to be kept any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cow may be kept or sheltered.

13. In the interpretation of this By-law, words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

14. *Penalties.*—If any person commit a breach of the foregoing By-law, he shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds, and to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, and such penalties together with all expenses incurred by the council under this By-law may be recovered before any two or more justices of the peace, provided the justices before whom any penalty imposed hereby is sought to be recovered may order the whole or part only (not being less than Five shillings) of such penalty to be paid. And every person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the foregoing penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this By-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council have or have not taken advantage of such powers.

Health Act 1890.

SHIRE OF DUNDAS.

By-LAW No. 1.

THE Council of the Shire of Dundas, in the Colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every other power enabling the said council in this behalf, doth hereby make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former by-laws on the matters and things hereinafter provided for are hereby repealed, excepting as to acts done, penalties incurred, and proceedings at law pending at the time of this by-law coming into operation.

2. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This by-law shall apply to, and have operation in, the whole of the Shire of Dundas.

4. *Definitions.*—In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them (that is to say):—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cesspool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil, or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground.

"Earth-closet" shall include a pan-closet of any description.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge and any road, lane, foot-way, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural, and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

5. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be from time to time removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

6. The occupier of any land on which there shall be erected any stable, cow-yard, cattle-shed, or pigsty shall cause such premises to be kept in such a state, in respect of cleanliness, as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all soil, dung, or other manure produced or accumulated therein to be from time to time removed from such premises as often as the quantity of the same so produced or accumulated shall amount to 1 cubic yard; and if at any time the occupier of such premises shall neglect or fail to have such dung, soil, or other manure removed therefrom as aforesaid, same shall be removed by the council at the expense of such occupier.

7. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be any abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be removed therefrom once in every 24

hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health or to exhale any offensive effluvia. And if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever it may be removed by the said council at the expense of such occupier.

8. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide a sufficient means of ventilation and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof shall not exceed 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for an application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof and emptying; and cleansing the same.

9. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered charcoal, earth, ashes, lime, saw-dust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

10. Every closet-pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet.

11. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

12. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated as to be within a distance of 1 foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool. Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of lime, chloride of lime or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quantity and quality to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

13. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall (unless otherwise expressly permitted as hereinafter mentioned) once at least in every week empty and cleanse, or cause to be emptied and cleansed, every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil belonging to such premises. Where such premises are situated in a sparsely-populated portion of the shire, it shall be sufficient if such earth-closet, privy, or place, is emptied once in every fortnight, provided a written permission of the council or health officer or secretary is obtained at such times and for such periods as the council may direct.

14. Except in sparsely-populated portions of the shire, no person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night-soil, except by means of a cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering, so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof, or of effluvia therefrom.

15. Where any nightman is duly licensed by the council, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same; and the said licensee shall be entitled to demand and receive for such service such sum of money for each pan or service, as above-named, as the council may from time to time fix or determine.

16. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing except night-soil, or any solution or mixture of the same used, as provided by section 255 of the *Health Act 1890*, shall (unless otherwise expressly permitted in accordance with law, of which the proof shall lie upon the person proceeded against) be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the council from time to time for the final reception of the same.

17. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause, or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place, for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of Eleven p.m. and Five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the council (of which the proof shall lie on such person) or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized, and every person emptying, or causing to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

18. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way, or be likely to find its way, into any drain or sewer.

19. Every person placing or depositing, or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall, immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof, cover the same, or cause the same to be covered, with a layer of earth not less than 6 inches in depth.

20. Penalties.—Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued,

unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties, such portion being not less than Five shillings, to be paid. And any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The following rates and charges are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1899 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the Urban District of Tungamah, as such district has been proclaimed and defined by an Order in Council:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds or under, the sum of One pound.
 2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual municipal value of Twenty-five pounds and not less than Ten pounds, a rate of Two shillings in the pound of such value.
 3. For every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of One hundred pounds and not less than Twenty-five pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Two pounds ten shillings per annum.
 4. For every house or tenement of a value exceeding the municipal value of One hundred pounds, a rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound of such value, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Seven pounds ten shillings per annum.
 5. For every allotment or piece of land vacant or not built upon, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound on the annual municipal value of such land, provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Ten shillings.
 6. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, the amount of Two pounds per annum.
 7. For water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust, Two shillings and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum charge shall be not less than the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure, and except in cases where Trust has made special agreements.
 8. A minimum of Ten shillings and a maximum of Two pounds to every person using a hose for garden or stable watering during the year.
 9. Such rates and charges are hereby payable half-yearly in advance on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1899.
 10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

1899 BY THE BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

WHEREAS default has been made in payment by the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust of the interest due by the said Trust on loans granted by the Governor in Council to such Waterworks Trust, and the said Trust has also failed to form a sinking fund for the liquidation of such loans. And the Board of Land and Works, having done all things necessary under the powers in that behalf it enabling, has entered upon and taken possession of the lands, tenements, and works of the said Trust: And whereas notice that the Swan Hill Shire Waterworks Trust District is supplied with water has been given in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by two Proclamations by the Governor in Council, bearing date the 18th day of December, 1883, certain portions of the Waterworks District (towns of Kerang and Castle Donnington) were proclaimed Urban Districts within the meaning of *The Victorian Water Conservation Act 1883*: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 31st October, 1898, made under the authority of the *Water Act 1890*, it was directed that the rates and charges which should be made and levied by the said Board of Land and Works in respect of the said Urban Districts should be made for the year 1899, and should be made in accordance with the provisions of Division IX. of Part II. of the said last-mentioned Act: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works doth hereby, in exercise of the powers conferred by the said *Water Act 1890*, and in accordance with the said recited Order in Council of the 31st October, 1898, in that behalf, make the following Regulation in respect of the said Urban Districts for the year 1899, that is to say:—

1. A rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling for the year 1899 on the annual municipal valuation of all lands and tenements liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.
2. The sum of One pound sterling shall be the minimum rate to be paid by every owner or occupier of any house or tenement liable to be rated in the said Urban Districts.

3. The rate to be charged for water supplied from the mains by measure shall be three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons.

4. The rate to be paid in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1899.

Such person or persons as the said Board of Land and Works may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, recover, and receive the said rates and charges.

The above Regulation is made by the Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the powers vested in the said Board in that behalf, the 11th day of November, 1898.

Regulation for the making of a rate for the year 1899 on all rateable property within the Urban District of Wycheproof.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Wycheproof, that is to say, in regard to houses or tenements fronting any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.
2. For every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Ten pounds per annum, the sum of Ten pounds per centum per annum on the annual municipal value of such property.

For all tenements in the said Urban District situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile from any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates, and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipe, and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.
4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.
5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1899, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1899, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1899, and shall be payable the one moiety on the 1st of January and the other on the 1st of July in such year. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand and receive the rates.

TION.—REGULATION FOR MAKING A RATE FOR
WATER SUPPLY PURPOSES.

THE Commissioners of the Omeq Waterworks Trust do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following rates and charges for the year 1899 upon all the lands and tenements within the Water Supply District, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement of the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds or under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. On every house or tenement above the annual municipal value of Thirteen pounds, a rate of Seven and one-half per centum shall be charged on the amount of valuation, but no rate shall exceed the sum of Twenty pounds, except where a meter is used.

3. For every water-trough supplied with water from the works of the Trust, a charge of One pound per annum shall be made.

4. For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, five pounds per annum shall be charged.

5. For water supplied by measure (except in cases of special agreement) from the works of the Trust, One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons shall be charged.

6. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where the water is supplied by measure shall be—

(a) If for domestic use and other than domestic use, the quantity for which the charge of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(b) If for other than domestic purposes only, 30,000 gallons per half-year, excepting as follows:—

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{4}$ acre and less, 8,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{1}{2}$ acre and less, 12,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, $\frac{3}{4}$ acre and less, 16,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, 1 acre and less, 28,000 gallons per annum.

Gardens and lawns, 1 acre and less, 40,000 gallons per annum.

(c) Livery and carriers' stables, for each stable Five pounds per annum shall be charged.

(d) Stand-pipes or hydrant water, for each load of 100 gallons or under, a charge of One shilling shall be made, and for each additional 100 gallons or fraction of 100 gallons after the first or any one load to be taken at one time, Sixpence.

(e) All charges for water supplied by measure to be paid quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, receive, and recover the rates and charges hereby made.

The following are the rates which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied for domestic purposes by the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust within the Urban District of Murtoa, that is to say:—In regard to houses or tenements fronting any streets in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which houses or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes:—

1. For every house or tenement of Ten pounds annual value or under, the sum of One pound per annum.

2. For every house or tenement above the annual value of Ten pounds, the sum of Two shillings in the pound sterling on the annual value of such property.

3. For all tenements in the said urban district situate otherwise than on streets in which the pipes for the supply of water have been laid down, and which tenements are not supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, and being within a quarter of a mile of any stand-pipe for the supply of water, one-half of the before-mentioned rates; and where such tenements are over a quarter of a mile from such stand-pipes and within half-a-mile thereof, one-fourth of the before-mentioned rates.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation of the several houses or tenements.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1899, commencing on the 1st January, 1899, and terminating on the 31st December, 1899, and shall be payable, the one moiety on the 1st January, and the other moiety on the 1st July of such year.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive the said rates.

BOROUGH ECHUCA WATER TRUST.—RATING REGULATION FOR 1899.—No. 16.

THE Commissioners of the Borough Echuca Water Trust, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the following Regulation, viz.:—

1. The rates and charges hereinafter specified are those which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Waterworks district of the Borough Echuca Water Trust shall pay for the year 1899. Such rates and charges shall be due and payable in advance, in four equal instalments, on the 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October, in such year.

2. On every house or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile of the annual value of Twenty-five pounds or under, a sum of Twenty-five shillings.

3. On every hotel, house, or tenement, used either wholly or partly as a domicile above the annual value of Twenty-five pounds, a sum of Five pounds per centum on the annual value of such property.

4. On every shop, or place of business, not used either wholly or partly as a domicile, a sum of Three pounds per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twenty-five shillings.

5. On every cordial or aerated-water factory, or other factory, or saw-mill, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings; on every flour-mill, a sum of Fifteen pounds; and on every liverystable, a sum of Seven pounds ten shillings.

6. On every steam-engine, a sum of Twenty shillings, not to include any steam-engine working any factory or mill named in clause 5.

7. On every horse-trough, a sum of Ten shillings.

8. The area of land allowed for every house or tenement shall be one quarter of an acre. Should any larger quantity of land be attached to a house or tenement, an extra sum of Ten shillings for cultivated land, and Three shillings for uncultivated land, shall be paid for every quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre.

9. For a temporary supply of water during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per centum on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, and plastering; All persons about to build must notify the Trust.

Cases where water is not laid on.

10. On every house, tenement, hotel, factory, &c., not supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property shall be paid. The minimum rate under this clause to be Twelve shillings and sixpence.

11. On each quarter of an acre or part of a quarter of an acre of land rated separately from any tenement, a sum of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the annual value of such property. The minimum rate under this clause to be Three shillings.

12. Any owner or occupier of property supplied through a service-pipe with water by the Trust, who wishes to be charged at the minimum rate as provided for in clause 10, must give notice in writing to the Trust Secretary; the water will then be turned off, and the minimum rate will take effect after the expiration of the quarter then current. No allowance will be made unless the water is turned off for a full quarter, nor in any case where water is supplied to two or more premises through one service-pipe.

Water supplied by measure.

13. The charge for water supplied to market gardens and nurseries from which produce is sold shall be One shilling per thousand (1,000) gallons, such supply to be in every case by or through a meter, which may either be provided and affixed by the consumer after the approval of the Trust, or the Trust may provide and affix same and charge a rental of One shilling and sixpence per quarter. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for under this clause shall be twenty thousand (20,000) gallons; a one-inch service pipe may be allowed.

14. The Trust may require a meter to be used in any case where it is deemed necessary. In such case the provisions of clause 13 shall apply.

15. The Trust will not in any way be held liable to supply water under clauses 13 and 14 until all consumers are supplied for domestic purposes.

16. The charge for water supplied from the Trust's stand-pipes shall be Sixpence for each two hundred (200) gallons.

17. In any case where rates, meter charges, or other charges are not paid when due, the water may be cut off until such amounts are paid.

18. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

19. In the construction of this regulation the words "annual value" shall mean the municipal annual valuation in force in the borough of Echuca on the 1st January, 1899, and the word "Trust" shall mean the Borough Echuca Water Trust.

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.
2. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling.
3. For each and every vacant allotment and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.
4. For each and every unoccupied allotment and each and every vacant piece of land, a rate of One pound sterling per annum.
5. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of Twenty pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling; provided that such rate shall not in any case be less than Twenty shillings per annum.
6. For each and every tenement, house, allotment of land, and piece of land not included in or affected by clauses 1, 2, and 3 of this Regulation, of more than Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling and ninepence in the pound sterling.
7. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), a charge of One shilling and ninepence for every 1,000 gallons shall be made.
8. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case when water is supplied by measure shall be—
 - (a) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.
 - (b) All water used over and above the amount allowed by the rate at One shilling and ninepence per 1,000 gallons shall be paid for at the end of each half-year.
9. The foregoing rate is hereby made payable in equal moieties half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1899.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose is hereby authorized to demand, collect, sue for, and recover the said rate.

**MARYBOROUGH WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING
REGULATION FOR 1899.**

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulation, viz:—

REGULATION No. 19.

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1899 in respect of water supplied by the Trust within the said Urban District:—

1. For every house or tenement used as a domicile of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.
2. For every house or tenement used as a domicile of Fourteen pounds annual municipal value and upwards, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
3. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of Sixteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.
4. For every house or tenement not being used as a domicile of more than Sixteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Six pounds five shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
5. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, the sum of One pound sterling.
6. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of more than Thirteen pounds annual municipal value, an amount of Seven pounds ten shillings per cent. per annum upon the annual municipal value of such property.
7. For every water-trough Twelve shillings per annum will be charged, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of troughs supplied by measurement shall be 12,000 gallons.

8. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, One shilling per thousand gallons (or at such price as may be specially agreed on), and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens (except market gardens) and lawns or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust by measurement for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes shall be as follows:—

Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons; exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding one acre, per annum, 60,000 gallons; for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for any fractional part of an acre.

In livery, bait, and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 5,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for the above purposes, each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

9. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for by meter, where water is supplied for domestic purposes as well as for purposes other than domestic, shall be the quantity which, at One shilling per 1,000 gallons (or Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for market gardens), equals the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

10. The Trust will, if it so think fit, but not otherwise, let for hire water meters, the rent for which shall be at the rate of Five shillings each per annum, which rent shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount or rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water, and shall be due and must be paid half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year.

11. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, Ten shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering; or, if there be no contract, then upon the value of or the amount charged or paid for such stonework, brickwork, or plastering.

12. For water supplied to market gardens the charge shall be Sixpence per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 200,000 gallons per acre, and proportionately for every fractional part of an acre. The supply to be by meter only.

13. For water supplied to breweries the charge shall be Ten pounds per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

14. For water supplied to cricket and bowling clubs, One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

15. For every steam boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust by measurement the charge shall be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for shall be 10,000 gallons for each inch of the diameter of the engine cylinder.

16. For water supplied to syphon pumps, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

17. For water supplied to private fountains, Twenty shillings each per annum, in addition to the rate hereby made for a supply for domestic or other purposes.

That the before-mentioned rates and charges shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1899, excepting the charges for water supplied by measure, which shall be paid for quarterly.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Maryborough Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

1. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Ten pounds and under, the sum of One pound per annum shall be paid.

2. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of more than Ten pounds and not exceeding Twelve pounds ten shillings annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings in the pound shall be paid.

3. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of above Twelve pounds ten shillings and under Seventeen pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound five shillings shall be paid.

4. Upon all rateable property, except vacant allotments, of the annual municipal value of Seventeen pounds and upwards, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be charged.

5. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant lands shall be One shilling and sixpence in the pound according to the municipal valuation, provided that in no case shall a rate of less than Twelve shillings and sixpence be paid.

6. For water supplied to public troughs a charge of Two pounds shall be made, provided that no person shall be charged for more than one trough.

7. Any water supplied to troughs other than public troughs must be paid by meter, or by special agreement, at such rates, upon such terms, and subject to such conditions as the Trust and the person requiring such supply may agree to adopt.

8. For water supplied by measure a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in the case of special agreement with the Trust.

9. The foregoing rates are made payable in equal moieties, on 1st January and 1st July, 1899.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

1. A rate of One shilling in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property within the Waterworks District of the Trust (excepting the Urban District of Tungamah) shall be imposed and levied for the year 1898.

2. For the annual supply of water to gardens and special blocks of land on or near any of the Trust's channels, either within or without the Trust's district (in the shires of Tungamah and Benalla), there shall be charged such sum as the Trust's Commissioners, in consideration of the circumstances of each case, shall from time to time by resolution of the Trust determine.

3. The before-mentioned rates and charges shall be for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1898, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1898, and shall be payable on the 1st day of December, 1898.

4. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

A Regulation of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust, made under the *Water Act 1890*, for the purpose of imposing, levying, and receiving a rate.

IN pursuance of the powers granted and conferred under the *Water Act 1890*, the Commissioners of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust hereby make the following Regulation:—

A rate of One shilling and sevenpence in the pound sterling shall be imposed and levied on all the rateable property in the Waterworks District of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust, according to the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the shire of Lancefield in which such lands and tenements are situated, for one year, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1899, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1899.

Such rate shall be payable and collected in two portions or instalments, and the first portion or instalment of Tenpence shall be due and payable on the 2nd day of January, 1899, and the second portion or instalment of Ninepence shall be due and payable on the 3rd day of July, 1899.

The minimum rate to be paid for the year 1899 where water is supplied shall be Twenty shillings.

Such person as the Commissioners of the Lancefield Waterworks Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand and receive, collect, and recover the said rate.

Water Act 1890.—Part II.—Division 9.
THE BOROUGH OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.—REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations are made by the Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust, pursuant to the provisions of the above Act, and shall come into operation and shall take effect on the 2nd January, 1899.

1. Water will, subject to the provisions of the *Water Act 1890*, Part II., be supplied within the district of the Trust for purposes other than domestic solely by measurement through a meter.

The charge for water so supplied shall, subject to clause 7 of these Regulations, be One shilling per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon between the Trust and the person requesting the supply, provided that the minimum charge shall be as follows:—

- (a) For irrigation, Ten shillings per annum.
- (b) For carriers and livery stables, Two shillings and sixpence per stall, or in open sheds Two shillings and sixpence per 5 feet of accommodation per annum.
- (c) For a trough in a paddock, Five shillings per annum.
- (d) For steam-engine, Ten shillings per inch cylinder diameter per annum.
- (e) For syphon, One pound sterling per annum.

The Trust year begins on the 1st day of January in each year, and all payments and charges on tenements having no water meter shall be payable half-yearly in advance: and where water meters are affixed, payments shall be made at the end of each quarter, namely, 31st of March, 30th June, 30th September, and 31st December, or at such time or times as may be demanded by the Trust.

- 2. (a) On and from the 2nd January, 1899, the supply of water to lands or tenements not having meters affixed to the service-pipes as hereinafter provided shall be for domestic purposes solely. And all persons who shall use water of the Trust so supplied for domestic purposes for purposes other than domestic solely shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and may be prosecuted according to law.
- (b) All persons requiring water for other than domestic purposes solely on and after the 2nd January, 1899, shall deliver to the Trust Engineer personally a notice in the form in the schedule hereto, and upon acceptance by the Secretary of such notice the person delivering the same shall be deemed to have agreed with the Trust for a supply of water by measure.
- (c) Every person having delivered such notice, if the same be accepted by the Secretary, shall be entitled forthwith to use water for the purposes in the said notice set forth, and the quantity of water used before a meter be affixed shall be ascertained by the average consumption during such number of days following the fixing of the meter as the Secretary may deem right.
- (d) No meter or apparatus for measuring water shall be deemed to be a meter within the meaning of clause 1 of this Regulation unless the pattern or type be of a kind approved of by the Trust.
- (e) All meters shall be affixed in such position as the Engineer or Secretary to the Trust may direct, and the keys shall be kept by such Engineer or Secretary.
- (f) When a meter shall be out of repair, the water consumed during the period of disrepair shall be ascertained according to the consumption during such number of days following repair as the Secretary may think right.
- (g) No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam-engine without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter.
- 3. (a) Any person who shall waste or misuse, or allow to be wasted or misused, the water supplied to him by the Trust shall, for every such offence, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.
- (b) A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include watering horses in stables, or hosing down or washing horses or vehicles.
- (c) Unless a meter shall be affixed to the service-pipe no person shall have fitted to the pipes or apparatus through which he receives the water of the Trust any tap with a thread, union, or other attachment, for the purpose of attaching thereto hose, nor shall any stand-pipe be fitted to such pipes or apparatus in or near any garden, and available for the purposes of delivering water for irrigation.
- (d) No person shall have fitted to any bath supplied by water from the Trust any over-flow pipe.
- (e) The bore of any pipe for the supply of water from the pipes of the Trust otherwise than by measure shall not exceed one-half of an inch in diameter, except with the consent of the Trust.

4. Every person supplied with water by the Trust shall keep his pipes and other apparatus in repair; and if any pipes or apparatus become out of repair the Trust may, by notice, require the same to be placed in proper order.

5. Any person supplied with water by the Trust shall not allow any other person to use such water unless by special authority of the Trust; any person who shall use without such authority the water supplied to any other person shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

6. The Trust will, upon the application of an intending consumer, supply to him a meter at cost price for cash on delivery, or on time payment on the following terms:—Ten shillings cash

deposit, and the balance, bearing interest at 7 per cent. per annum, by annual payments of Five shillings, payable in advance.

7. Any person having agreed to be supplied with water by measure may take the water supplied for domestic purposes through the meter service on the following terms:—He shall be entitled to a supply per annum for domestic purposes at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, until at such rate the charge for the quantity consumed would equal the current water rate on the tenement; and thereafter all the water consumed shall be deemed to be taken for the purposes for which water is supplied to such consumers by measure.

8. In laying down future services, or in extending existing services, the intending consumer shall not be entitled to avail himself of the provisions of clause No. 7 without the consent of the Trust, to be refused or accorded at the discretion of the Trust, and on such terms as the Trust may decide.

9. If any person shall be guilty of a breach of any of the foregoing Regulations, he shall, where not otherwise herein expressly provided or specially provided in the *Water Act 1890*, incur a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and if such breach shall continue after notice by the Trust he shall incur a further penalty not exceeding Three pounds for every day that such breach continues.

10. If any person acts in contravention of these Regulations, or fails to pay when due or on demand any rates or charges, the water may be cut off by stop-valve, or cutting through the service-pipe, or otherwise as the Trust may determine.

If acting under or giving effect to the foregoing Regulations, the Secretary, instructed by resolution of the Trust, may do, and in his name sign, for the Trust all things and documents required to be done or executed by the Trust, and in construing the Regulations "The Trust" means "The Borough of Horsham Waterworks Trust," the singular imports the plural, the masculine imports the feminine, and persons imports a corporation.

LEAGHUR AND MEERING IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.—REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Leaghur and Meering Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1892*, do make the following Regulation:—

1. All water supplied from the works of the Trust for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water shall be by gauges of such form and pattern as may be adopted and fixed by the Trust's officers.

2. The rate or price to be paid for water delivered from the works of the Trust for irrigation purposes shall be One shilling per inch per acre, including gardens, one-fourth of which shall be paid on making application for the water, and the balance within a month after the water has been delivered. The minimum quantity to be supplied at each watering shall be 2 inches per acre.

3. All persons agreeing to take water from the works of the Trust shall take delivery thereof through their respective outlets at such times, in such order, and in such manner as the Trust shall direct, and the delivery of water may be continued on Sundays and holidays, as well as on ordinary working days.

4. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by persons authorized by the Trust, and no person who is not so authorized shall under any circumstances (unless he obtain permission from the Chairman of the Trust) open any such outlet or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.

5. No person shall trespass along the works or upon the lands of the Trust to the hindrance of the Trust servants, annoyance of adjacent land-owners, damage to works or adjacent property or crops, or to stock depasturing on adjacent lands.

6. Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding, for any offence, the sum of Ten pounds.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, do make the following Regulation:—

REGULATION FOR DETERMINING THE RATES AND CHARGES WHICH SHALL BE MADE FOR WATER SUPPLIED WITHIN THE BOUNDARIES OF THE YARRAWONGA URBAN WATERWORKS TRUST DISTRICT.

1. A rate of One shilling and threepence in the pound sterling on the annual municipal value of all rateable property valued at Twenty-four pounds sterling and upwards (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), situated within the Waterworks District of the Yarrawonga Urban Waterworks Trust, is hereby made for the year 1899.

2. Upon properties of the annual municipal value of Fifteen pounds sterling and not more than Twenty-three pounds sterling, a rate of One pound ten shillings per annum shall be payable. Upon properties valued at Fourteen pounds and under, a rate of Two shillings in the pound sterling shall be payable, according to the municipal value of such properties, providing that in no case shall a less rate than Twenty shillings be payable, in accordance with section 122 of *Water Act 1890*.

3. On each vacant allotment or piece of land rated for the ordinary municipal rate within the Trust district before mentioned separately from any building, the annual rate of Ten pounds sterling per centum on the annual valuation of the same shall be payable.

4. Water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust shall be charged for at the rate of Two shillings and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons, up to an amount equal to that which the Trust would be entitled to receive under the municipal assessed value of any premises, and at the rate of Two shillings and Sixpence per 1,000 gallons for any quantity of water used beyond such an amount aforesaid. Nevertheless it shall be competent for the Trust to make special arrangements from time to time for the supply of water by meter or otherwise.

5. For any public water trough supplied with water by the Trust, the sum of Forty shillings per annum shall be charged, unless supplied by measurement.

6. For any steam-boiler supplied with water by the Trust (except in cases of special arrangement with the Trust), the sum of Thirty shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam-boiler, in addition to the charge for domestic use where water is supplied for domestic purposes also. In case the charge by measure would exceed the charge per horse-power, a charge by measure shall be made.

7. Water supplied to Government Departments, cricket grounds, show yards, cattle yards, and similar properties shall be charged for by measure. Provided the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than Thirty shillings per annum, or the charge may be by special agreement with the Trust.

8. For water supplied from stand-pipe or hydrant, for each load of 200 gallons or under, the sum of Sixpence, and for each additional load *pro rata* upon the above scale.

9. For a temporary supply during the erection of new buildings, repairs, or additions, Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of contract for stonework, brickwork, or plastering, or, in the absence of a contract, of the sum paid for stonework, brickwork, and plastering, or the Trust may require a meter to be fixed, when the charge shall be by measurement.

10. A minimum rate of Five shillings and a maximum rate of Forty shillings per annum shall be chargeable to persons for using water for ornamental, garden, or other like purposes.

11. For each spray supplied with water by the Trust, used for the purpose of cooling houses, the sum of Ten shillings per

annum, in addition to the charges under any previous clauses of this Regulation. Provided that such sprays shall only be used between the hours of Nine o'clock a.m. and Nine o'clock p.m.

12. Such rates are hereby made for the year 1899, and are made payable in equal moieties half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in the year, excepting those by measure, which shall be paid quarterly, or as the Trust may direct.

13. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and recover the said rates.

(2) For every steam-boiler supplied with water from the works of the Trust, Twenty shillings per boiler per annum.

(3) For water supplied by the Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust), One shilling and sixpence for every 1,000 gallons.

(4) Any person who may or shall obtain water or may be supplied with water from the public stand-pipes, or any or either of them in the said district, shall pay the sum of Ten shillings per annum.

2. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case, when water shall be supplied by measurement, shall be—

(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity for which the charge at One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons will be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

(2) If for other than domestic purposes, only, 30,000 gallons per half-year.

3. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1899, commencing from the 1st of January, 1899, as also the charges for every steam-boiler and for water supplied from public stand-pipes, and shall be payable on 1st July, 1899.

4. All other charges by measurement shall be paid half-yearly, on the 1st of January, 1899, and the 1st of July, 1899.

5. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose are hereby authorized to collect and recover the said rates and charges.

WHEREAS by the *Railway and Public Works Loan Application Act 1898* (No. 1566) it is amongst other things enacted that the sum of One hundred thousand pounds, to be raised by the sale of Victorian Government Three per cent. Stock under the authority of the said Act, may be applied for the purpose of District Co-operative Wineries and Viticulture Industry, Dairy Schools, Experimental Stations, Purchase of Live Stock, Machinery, Implements, and other Appliances, and Technical Agricultural Education, Development of the Export Trade, Bonuses for the encouragement of the Cultivation, Manufacture, and Export of Fruit, Tobacco, Flax, Hemp, Silk, and of other Rural Industries, to be expended under Regulations to be approved by the Governor in Council: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

EXPORT OF TOBACCO.

1. Out of the sum of Seventeen thousand five hundred pounds applicable under the *Railway and Public Works Loan Application Act 1898*, which may be applied by the Minister of Agriculture for the purpose of Bonuses for the encouragement of the cultivation, manufacture, and export of fruit, tobacco, flax, hemp, silk, and other rural industries, a bonus of Threepence per pound may be paid for tobacco grown in Victoria and exported therefrom to such foreign port or ports outside the Australasian Colonies as may be approved by the Minister.

2. Persons desirous of participating in the Bonus payable under these Regulations shall notify their intention to the Secretary for Agriculture, in writing, fourteen days prior to shipment, and such notice shall state the quantity of tobacco it is proposed to export, and the place where it may be inspected.

3. All tobacco offered for export must be of the best quality, carefully cured, uniform in colour, well graded, and neatly tied into hands of uniform size.

4. If the tobacco be found suitable for export, instructions as to the process of preparation for export will be given, and the work supervised by the Government Tobacco Expert as far as practicable.

5. All tobacco for export will require to be packed and priced in tierces or hogsheads, or in approved boxes, and be in dry "summer order," containing not more than 10 per cent. of moisture.

6. Bonus shall be payable only to approved growers, and payment may be made on the certificate of the Expert that the tobacco has been exported in terms of these Regulations.

7. Tobacco for export will be treated and packed at the Government Tobacco Farm, Eddi, or such other place as may be approved by the Minister of Agriculture. The expenses incidental thereto shall be paid by the grower.

REGULATIONS UNDER PART I. OF THE LAND ACT 1890.

Chapter XI.—Licences.—State Forests and Timber Reserves.

Chapter XII.—Timber Licences.—Licences on Crown Lands (not being State Forests or Timber Reserves).

Sleeper Hewing from Live or Dead Wood in State Forests, Timber Reserves, or on Crown Lands.

The Regulation made on the 31st May, 1898, relative to sleeper hewing is hereby rescinded, and the following Regulation is made in lieu thereof as from 23rd November, 1898.

There may be issued to wood-carters permits to cut or hew and take away railway sleepers from such portions of Crown lands, State Forests, or Timber Reserves as may be approved by the Honorable the Minister of Lands.

Every such permit shall be in the form and shall be subject to the conditions specified in the Schedule hereto.—(Corr.F.10237.)

SLEEPER-HEWING PERMIT available for sleepers in the parish of _____ issued by _____

This permit is issued to _____ for the purpose of hewing railway sleepers on the area set out above, and no other, subject to the following conditions:—

1. This permit is available for a period of _____ months

2. Sleeper hewing in every district shall be under the direct supervision of the forest officer in charge, who shall mark or brand (with the broad-arrow thus \wedge) all trees that are to be felled, and should any hewer fell unbranded trees his permit will be at once cancelled.

3. No sleepers are to be removed from any Crown lands, timber reserve, or State forest until they are counted and branded with the "Crown" brand by the forest officer and paid for by the permit-holder, or until approved and satisfactory arrangements are made for such payment.

4. Any person removing or having in his possession unbranded sleepers will be liable to prosecution under the provisions of section 102 of the *Crimes Act 1890* or section 114 of the *Land Act 1890*.

5. The royalty charge shall be 3d. per sleeper for live wood and 2d. for deadwood. Sleepers six (6) feet and under in length may, however, be cut either from live wood or from deadwood, on payment of a royalty charge of Two pence (2d.) each. Deadwood shall consist of debris from saw-milling or other timber operations, and timber killed by having been ringbarked, whether standing or lying on the ground.

6. The permit-holder shall stack, ready for burning, all tops of trees and other debris caused by his operations, to the full satisfaction of the forest officer.

7. I hereby agree to strictly abide by the above conditions.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time increase or diminish the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in section 6 of Part I. of the said Act, except increasing lands which may be sold by auction: And whereas by the *Land Act 1891* it is amongst other things further enacted that where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding twenty acres, and not contiguous or adjacent to any other Crown lands, is so situated as to make it desirable, in the opinion of the Governor in Council, that the same should be sold, or where any portion of Crown lands not exceeding three acres is required for a site for a church or for any charitable purpose for which land cannot legally be reserved, the Governor in Council may direct the sale of such portion of Crown lands, and for such purpose may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the *Land Act 1890* as lands which may be sold by auction by adding such portion thereto: And whereas by the *Land Act 1893* it is amongst other things further enacted that, notwithstanding anything contained in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid, the Governor in Council may increase the area of land described in the Second Schedule to the said last-mentioned Act as lands which may be sold by auction by adding thereto any portion of the Crown lands described in the said Schedule as Swamp lands: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby increase or diminish (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in classes 2, 3, 4, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 6 of the *Land Act 1890* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedules respectively (that is to say):—

Printed forms of tender and conditions of contract may be obtained from the Secretary, Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne, or from the officer in charge at the station, by whom also information or explanation will be afforded to persons tendering.

As much forage as can be stored at any station where the storage is small will, for the convenience of the contractor, be ordered at one time.

The price, which must be expressed in words as well as in figures, and without alterations, erasures, or discrepancies, must be per cental of 100 lbs. (net weight), including delivery at the stations, and all charges except the bags, which will remain the property of the contractor. At stations where the bags can be at once emptied the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations, notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders, which should be upon the printed form, will be received for either oats, bran, hay, or straw (the particular kind of hay or straw offered to be stated); but if all be included in one tender it may be accepted for one article only, if advisable. Oaten hay will be preferred. If sheaf hay be tendered for, it must be so stated in the tender.

A tenderer not desiring to accept a contract for part of the requirements of any station should write against such station the words "all or none."

Telegrams or tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

Tenders must be enclosed in an envelope, marked "Tender for Forage," and deposited in the Tender-Box, Pay Office, Treasury, Melbourne; or, if sent by post, they must be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Treasury, Melbourne.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.

The decision of the Government will be made known by *Gazette* notice, and by letter to accepted tenderers.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed, except when otherwise specified in the contract; the straw to be wheaten or oaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats, white or Algerian (Victorian grown), of the best description of their respective kind, full kernel, clean, and free from wild oats or other objectionable seeds; bran to be sound and sweet, and of the best description; chaff to be made from oaten hay of the best quality; the maize to be of the best quality. The hay tenders must specify whether they are for oaten or wheaten hay.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses required to be stationed at any of the stations, the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two the contractor may, if he desires it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding condition, the contractors for the supply to the Police Depot may be called upon to supply any Government Departments within a radius of six miles from Melbourne, for which no contracts have been taken, at the same rates.

4. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be indorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station, for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and, on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the department (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to the quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the Board is to be considered final.

8. If the Board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, from some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Treasurer of the Colony for the time being may direct. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognised by the Government.

12. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract, and in the event of his failing to carry on his contract he will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure. In the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.

13. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as broken, infringed, or vitiated by the purchase by any Department of forage grown at any Government establishment.
