RAPPORT.

Au Président de la République Française.

Monsieur le Président,

Par suite des troubles récents qui ont eu lieu dans la colonie, le gouverneur de la Nouvelle-Calédonie s'est vu dans la nécessité de prendre un arrêté interdisant la vente aux indigènes des armes, des munitions et de tous autres explosifs.

Cet arrêté, en date du 30 août dernier, édictant des pénalités supérieures à celles de simple police, doit, en vertu du décret du 6 mars 1877, être transformé en décret dans un délai maximum de huit mois.

La mesure prise par le gouverneur de la Nouvelle-Calédonie me paraissant justifiée, j'ai l'honneur de soumettre à votre signature le projet de décret ci-joint.

Décète :

Art. 1<sup>er</sup>.—Il est interdit de vendre, prêter ou procurer des armes à feu, des munitions et explosifs aux indigènes non munis d'une autorisation délivrée par le gouverneur.

Art. 2.—Tout contrevenant au présent décret sera puni d'une amende de 50 à 100 fr. et de un à quinze jours de prison ou de l'une de ces deux peines seulement.

En cas de récidive, l'emprisonnement sera toujours prononcé.

Art. 3.—Le ministre des colonies est chargé d'assurer l'exécution du présent décret.

- (c) Hydraulic Engineering.—Measurement and estimation of water in natural and artificial channels, estimation of sources of water supply, dimensions and discharge of pipes and channels, construction of reservoir embankments, weirs, and aqueducts.
- (d) Geology.—Lithological structure of the principal rock formations as they occur in Victoria; modes of occurrence of gold and other valuable minerals.

4. The Board of Examiners will accept the degree of Master of Civil Engineering of the University of Melbourne, with satisfactory evidence of six months' practical experience under some competent mining engineer, mining surveyor, or mining manager in the conduct of mining surveys or actual mining operations, reserving the right of *visd roce* or other examination in these subjects and also in geology as applied to mining, if deemed necessary.

5. #### REGULATIONS FOR THE EXAMINATION OF LAND SURVEYORS, VICTORIA.

REGULATIONS approved by the Governor in Council, 24th February, 1898, are hereby rescinded, and the following Regulations are substituted therefor:—

1. (a) Regular examinations will be held in Melbourne in March and September of every year, of which not less than four weeks' notice will be given.
- (b) *Visd roce* and practical examinations will be held at any time that may be considered desirable.
2. Every intending candidate shall forward to the Secretary of the Board—
- (a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.
- (b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.
3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 – 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

#### PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.
  5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.
  6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.
  - (2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.
  - (3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.
- Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.
7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

##### *Levelling, &c.*

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

##### *Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—*

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

##### *Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.*

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

##### *Drawing.*

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

##### MISCELLANEOUS.

*Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.*

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

#### CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

No. 1112), it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Orders altering, for the purpose of adjustment, the boundaries of continuous municipal districts or subdivisions without any petition: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, for the purpose of adjusting the continuous boundaries of the Shires of Fern Tree Gully and Lilydale, doth hereby cancel all previously defined boundaries of the said Shires of Fern Tree Gully and Lilydale respectively, and doth re-define the boundaries thereof respectively in the manner following, that is to say:—

#### FERN TREE GULLY SHIRE.

Commencing at a point on the Dandenong Creek where the south boundary of the parish of Scoresby abuts thereon; thence northerly by the said creek and easterly by the southern boundaries of the parishes of Ringwood and Mooroolbark to the south-east angle of allotment 50 in the last-named parish; thence further easterly by a road to the south-east angle of allotment 52; thence southerly by allotment 55 to the south-west angle thereof; thence easterly by a road to a point thereon opposite the north-east angle of allotment 84, parish of Scoresby; thence easterly

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district, or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, closing all shops or all shops of any particular class within such district other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* for one afternoon in each week, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers, or of all the shopkeepers of the particular class (as the case may be) substantially interested and affected thereby: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the Town of Port Melbourne all shops (other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*) aforesaid shall be closed on Wednesday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers substantially interested and affected thereby: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

All shops in the municipal district of the Town of Port Melbourne (other than those mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*) shall be closed on Wednesday in each week, from the hour of One o'clock in the afternoon.

## Education Act 1890.

## ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (74 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order rescind Regulation No. XI. (Exhibitions) of the Regulations made under the provisions of the Act aforesaid, and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, viz:—

## REGULATION XI.—EXHIBITIONS.

The Minister of Public Instruction may annually award twenty Exhibitions or any less number in the manner and on the conditions hereinafter mentioned:—

1. Exhibitioners will be selected upon competitive examinations held in the month of January of each year. Candidates who will have completed their seventeenth year before the first day of January preceding the examination will not be permitted to compete. In addition to having passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne, they must have been the holders of Scholarships gained as State School pupils on examinations held under the Education Department, and have attended regularly at an approved secondary school or college as students for not less than two years immediately prior to the date of examination, and have annually obtained a good report from the authorities of the school or college they have been attending.

2. The subjects for examination will be—

English, } As prescribed for the Matriculation Exam-  
Algebra, } ination held in the previous October Term,  
Geometry, }

and any two of the following languages:—

Latin, } As prescribed for the Matriculation Exam-  
Greek, } ination held in the previous October Term.  
French, }  
German, }

3. Each Exhibition will be of the annual value of £10, tenable for four years, upon the following conditions:—

(a) That the exhibitioner shall, at the commencement of the February Term following the award of the exhibition, enter as a student of the Melbourne University, and that he shall, during the whole term of his tenure, be enrolled as attending lectures, and in each year keep courses of lectures in as many subjects as he must pass in to complete his year.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained an exhibitioner may, with the sanction of the Minister, be allowed to attend during the year immediately succeeding the award of the Exhibition an approved secondary school or college, provided that at such school or college instruction is given in the honour subjects of the Matriculation Examination, and that there is evidence that they can be successfully taught thereat, or, on good cause being shown, have his Exhibition suspended for one year, and, if necessary, for a further period.

(b) That at the end of the second year of his tenure he shall have passed the first ordinary examination for a degree or the first of the two examinations prescribed in sub-section (2) of section 11 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1891*, and at the end of the third year the second ordinary examination for a degree or the second examination prescribed in the sub-section, section, and Act aforesaid.

If at any time the Minister be satisfied that the conduct of any exhibitioner has been disorderly or immoral, the Exhibition and all the advantages connected therewith shall thereupon cease and determine.

4. Exhibitioners who shall be candidates for a degree in Medicine, and shall, at the end of the fourth year of their tenure, have passed the fourth ordinary examination for such degree, and the exhibitioners who shall have passed for the degree of Bachelor of Arts and during the fourth year of their tenure have passed the third ordinary examination for the degree of Bachelor of Laws, as required by section 12 of chapter X. of the *University Calendar* for the year 1898, will have their exhibitions continued for another year.

5. Payments will be made quarterly. All payments will be conditional on moneys being placed by the Legislature at the disposal of the Minister.

6. Exhibitions in force previous to the issue of this regulation shall, until they expire by effluxion of time, be continued under the conditions of the regulation under which they were granted.

**WANGARATTA AND WHITFIELD RAILWAY CONSTRUCTION TRUST.—REGULATION No. 1.—FOR CONVENING MEETINGS OF THE TRUST AND GENERALLY FOR REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF THE BUSINESS OF THE TRUST.**

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of February, 1898.*

**PRESENT:**

**WHEREAS** by section 25 of the *Railway Lands Acquisition Act 1893* (No. 1288) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make Regulations relating to any Railway Construction Trust appointed and created under Part I. of the said Act, for the purposes following:—

- "(a) The mode in which meetings of the members of Trusts under the said Part of the said Act are to be convened;
- "(b) The form of any notice or order which may be required to be given by any Trustees under the said Act; and
- "(c) Generally for regulating the conduct of the business and the proceedings of such Trusts and the numbers of members to form quorums thereof, and the appointment of the Chairman of each Trust, and for carrying into effect the provisions of the said Part of the said Act."

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the said provisions of the now in part recited Act, doth for the purposes aforesaid, so far as these may relate to a certain Railway Construction Trust duly appointed and created under the said Act, and known as the Wangaratta and Whitfield Railway Construction Trust, make the Regulation following, viz:—

1. First meeting.—The first meeting of the Trust shall be convened by the Minister, at such time and place as he may direct.
2. Time and place of meeting.—The subsequent meetings of the Trust shall be held at such time and place as the Trustees may from time to time appoint, or, in default of such appointment, as the Minister may direct.
3. Quorums of meetings.—There shall be present at least three members from each municipal council in such Construction District at such first meeting in order to constitute a quorum, and all future quorums shall consist of six members, exclusive of the Chairman.
4. Chairman.—The Chairman shall be elected at the first meeting of the Trust, or at any adjournment thereof, by a majority of votes of those present, and he shall hold office as Chairman so long as he shall remain a member of the municipal council of his district, and may be willing to act.
5. Vacancy of Chairman, how filled.—Any vacancy in the position of Chairman shall be filled at the next meeting of the Trust after such vacancy has occurred, or at any adjournment thereof, in the same manner as aforesaid, and such election shall be the first business on the notice-paper for such meeting. Provided that in the event of the Trust failing or neglecting to elect a Chairman the Minister may, by writing under his hand, appoint one of the members of the Trust to be Chairman, who shall hold office so long as he remain a member of the municipal council of his district and be willing to act.
6. Vice-Chairman.—In the absence of the Chairman, through illness or otherwise, at any meeting the members shall elect a Vice-Chairman to conduct the business of that meeting.
7. Special meetings.—The Trust may hold special meetings, which may be called upon the requisition of the Chairman, or upon the requisition, in writing under their hands, of any seven members, addressed to the Chairman; but no such special meeting shall be held unless seven clear days' notice thereof at least be given.
8. General conduct of business.—In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament, which shall be followed, so far as the same are applicable, to the proceedings of the Trust.
9. Meetings, notice of.—A notice of every meeting of the Trust shall be, by the Secretary, delivered or sent by the post, addressed to the usual or last known place of abode of each member seven clear days at least prior to the day upon which such intended meeting is to be held.
10. Minutes of meeting to be read at subsequent meeting.—At every meeting of the Trust the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting and the reading of the minutes of the proceedings of any committee presented at any such preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings; and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed by the Chairman.
11. Order of business of meetings.—After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid, the order of business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but, for the greater convenience of the Trust at any particular meeting thereof, it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—
  - (i.) Reading of copies of letters sent by authority of the Trust.
  - (ii.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
  - (iii.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
  - (iv.) Presentation of reports of committees.
  - (v.) Payments.
  - (vi.) Ordinary business, including dealing with tenders.
  - (vii.) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
  - (viii.) Extraordinary business, new rules and regulations.
  - (ix.) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
  - (x.) Notices of motion.

And the order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

12. Addresses to the Governor in Council.—All addresses and applications to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Secretary of the Trust, unless otherwise ordered by the Trust.

13. Motions.—All notices of motion shall be given in writing to the Secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting at which the motion is intended to be moved, and the Secretary shall, seven clear days at least before such meeting, cause notice of such intended motion to be sent to each Trustee, or notice of motion may be handed to the Secretary at any meeting, and, on being read to the meeting, may be dealt with at the next meeting.

14. Notice of motion to be given.—No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion but in pursuance of notice given, as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

15. Petitions.—No motion except that for receiving the same shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, and then only by leave being granted by a two-thirds majority of those present at the meeting, be made on any petition, memorial, or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Trust after that at which it has been presented.

16. Motions to be moved in order.—Except by leave of a majority of the Trustees present motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved shall be struck out.

17. Motion to be moved by member giving notice.—No motion shall be proceeded with in the absence of the member who gave notice of the same, unless by some other member producing written authority from him to that effect.

18. Mover of motion appointing committee to be a member.—The mover of every motion appointing a committee shall be a member of such committee.

19. Draft of address or petition to be submitted at previous meeting.—No motion for any address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall at some previous meeting have submitted a draft of the same.

20. Order, &c., of debate.—Any member desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the member calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question of order disposed of, when the member in possession of the chair may proceed with his subject.

21. Nature of motion to be stated.—Any member desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Trust thereon.

22. No motion to be withdrawn without leave.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of a majority of the Trustees present.

23. Motion to be seconded.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Trust unless it be seconded; but a member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Trust by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.

24. Mover of motion.—A member moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a member merely seconding a motion shall not be held to have spoken upon it.

25. Motions, &c., how decided.—All questions shall be decided in accordance with the terms of section 21, clause 1, of Act No. 1288.

26. Resolutions, how revoked or altered.—No resolution shall be revoked or altered except in accordance with clause 2 of section 21 of the same Act.

27. Priority of members.—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide, by naming the member, who is entitled to priority.

28. Members to stand while addressing the Trust.—Every member, including the Chairman, shall stand while addressing the Trust.

29. Points of order.—The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same; and his decision as to order or practice in each case shall be final.

30. Members not to digress.—No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or comment upon the words used by any other member in a previous debate; and all imputations of improper motives, and all personal reflections on members, shall be deemed highly disorderly.

31. Members to apologize for disorderly or offensive expressions.—Whenever any member shall make use of any expression disorderly, or capable of being applied offensively to any other member, the member so offending shall be required by the Chairman to withdraw the expression, and to make a satisfactory apology to the Trust.

32. Members called to order to sit down.—A member called to order shall sit down, unless permitted by the Trust to explain.

33. Members twice offending to be liable to a penalty.—Any member using disorderly or offensive language, and having been twice called to order, or to withdraw, and to apologize for such conduct, and refusing to do so, shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

34. Strangers.—Any person, not being a member of the Trust, who shall, having been admitted to any meeting of the Trust, be guilty thereof of any improper or disorderly conduct, or who shall not leave when requested by the Chairman to do so, may, on his order, be forthwith removed, and shall be liable to a penalty for a breach of this Regulation.

35. Members may demand documents.—Any member may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.

36. No second amendment until previous one disposed of.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.

37. Mover of motion to have right of reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right of reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the Chair; but no other member shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.

38. No discussion on motion for adjournment of Trust.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for an adjournment of the Trust; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice-paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the debates on motions moved and seconded, or any other order of the day may be resumed at the next adjourned meeting of the Trust at the point of which it was so interrupted.

39. Protests.—Any member may protest against any resolution of the Trust, and notice of intention to protest shall in every case be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Trust by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the office of the Secretary, and signed by such member, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Trust to be not in accordance with truth, or in its terms disrespectful to the Trust.

40. Lapsed questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of members present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

41. Lapsed order of the day may be restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of number as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice-paper for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.

42. Committees.—Minutes of all proceedings of Committees shall be entered in the Committee's minute-book, and, being signed by the Chairman of Committee, shall be presented to the Trust.

43. Meetings of Committees.—The Secretary shall convene every Committee within ten days of its first appointment, or at any other time by order of the Trust, or on the written order of the Chairman, or of any two members of the Committee.

44. Petitions.—No petitions shall be presented after the Trust shall have proceeded to the orders of the day; and every member presenting a petition to the Trust shall acquaint himself with its contents, and ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Trust, and that its contents do not violate any Regulation herein contained, and shall write his name at the beginning of the said petition.

45. No debate shall take place upon petitions.—No debate shall take place upon any petition or memorial, except as to its being received and taken into consideration as an order of the day at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a Committee.

46. Secretary.—The Secretary shall keep all minutes of meetings of the Trust, or of any Committee of the same; he shall also keep all accounts, books, and documents, conduct all correspondence, and perform all clerical work required to be performed for the Trust; and shall attend all meetings of the Trust or Committees when required, and at the office for the transaction of business as provided for under this Regulation; and shall perform all other acts which shall be deemed by the Trust incumbent upon the Secretary to discharge; he shall also have the receipt and disbursement of all moneys, and shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct. All moneys received by him shall, as soon as possible thereafter, be paid into the account of the Trust to the bank wherein the same is kept. That he shall at no time hold in his hands more than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without banking the same. That all payments of the Trust shall be made by cheque, signed by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman and two members, and countersigned by the Secretary. That he shall take account of all moneys received by the Collector, and supervise his accounts as provided for under these Regulations.

47. Treasurer.—The Treasurer shall provide a guarantee for such amount for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, as they may direct.

48. Collector.—The Collector shall give security for his fidelity and due fulfilment of his duties, and for the proper management and disposal of the funds of the Trust, for such amount as they may determine. He shall give no receipts except upon the printed forms provided for the same; and every receipt shall have a butt filled in by him, containing all particulars of moneys received, and from whom. He shall pay to the Treasurer or Secretary all moneys received by him at least once a week, and he shall at no time hold more moneys of the Trust than Twenty pounds (£20) for 72 hours without paying the same to the Treasurer or Secretary. He shall, at the close of each month, at least, submit his books and butts, with a statement of all amounts collected, to the Secretary; and render to him a full account then, or whenever demanded by him, of all moneys received by him on account of the said Trust.

49. Appointment, &c., of officers.—No appointment to any office at the disposal of the Trust shall take place until seven clear days' notice shall have been given, by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Construction District, inviting applications from qualified candidates for the same. Where the number of candidates are in excess of the number required, the Trust may reduce the same by ballot.

50. Salaries of officers, &c.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Trust shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same, and before the advertisement inviting applications as aforesaid, and shall be specified in such advertisement.

51. Expense of preparing security.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any duty, the expense of such security shall be borne by the Trust.

52. Common Seal.—The Secretary of the Trust shall have the custody of the common seal, and shall be responsible for the same; and impressions shall only be made by order of the Trust, verified by the signatures of the Chairman, a member, and Secretary.

53. Suspension of rules.—With the exception of clauses 25 and 26, any one or more of the clauses of this Regulation may be suspended *pro tem*, in cases of emergency, and with the consent of a majority of the whole Trust.

54. Penalty.—Any person guilty of a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

And the Honorable Henry Roberts Williams, Her Majesty's Minister of Railways for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas it is deemed necessary that the exclusive control and management of that portion of the Loddon River and also that portion of the Wandella Creek, Serpentine Creek, Bullock Creek, Kinypaniel Creek, and Twelve-mile Creek, severally described hereunder, shall be under the exclusive control and management of the Board of Land and Works, viz:—

#### LODDON RIVER.

From the Kinypaniel Weir National Works to the Syphon across the said river at the end of the Macorna Channel National Works.

#### WANDELLA CREEK.

From its effluence from the Loddon River at the Leaghur Dam to the joint head-works of the Wandella and Leaghur and Meerling Irrigation and Water Supply Trusts on the said creek.

#### SERPENTINE CREEK.

From its effluence from the Loddon River to the southern boundary of the Tragowel Plains Irrigation and Water Supply Trust District.

#### BULLOCK CREEK.

From the point where the Bridgewater Channel joins the said creek to the northern boundary of the Loddon United Water-works Trust District.

#### KINYPANIEL CREEK.

From the head-sluice of the Kinypaniel Weir National Works on the said creek to the southern boundary of the North Boort Irrigation and Water Supply Trust District.

#### TWELVE-MILE CREEK.

From its effluence from the Loddon River to the point where it returns to the said river.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the Loddon River, Wandella Creek, Serpentine Creek, Bullock Creek, Kinypaniel Creek, and Twelve-mile Creek, as herein described, shall be under the exclusive control and management of the Board of Land and Works.

#### STEAM-SHIP "CALEDONIAN" DETAINED IN QUARANTINE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of February, 1898.

##### PRESENT:

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steam-ship or vessel *Caledonian* arrived in Victorian waters having had on board in the course of her voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and doth further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the Board of Public Health, except the passengers for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel, and all persons and things on board of her, shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

And the Honorable Henry Roberts Williams, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
