PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation revoke so much of the Proclamation made on the 1st day of February, 1898, as relates to the appointment of Wednesday, the 2nd day of March, 1898, to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Alberton; and in pursuance of the provisions aforesaid and of those contained in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), do hereby appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

FRIDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF MARCH NEXT,

as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the town of Ballarat East;

as a Public Holiday throughout the City of Ballarat, the Town of Geelong, the Boroughs of Geelong West, Newtown and Chilwell, and St. Arnaud, the Shires of Avon, Bacchus Marsh, Bairsdale, Benalla, Castle Donnington*, Colac, Donald, Morwell, McIvor, Omeo*, Wannon, Woorayl, and Yackandandah, and the United Shire of Beechworth; as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Shire of Yarrawonga; as a Bank Holiday at Bridgewater, Bruthen, Casterton, Inglewood, Merino, Nhill, Seymour, Terang, and Yackandandah; and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Bacchus Marsh, Euroa, Hamilton, Heathcote, Heyfield, Kilmore, Shepparton, and Swan Hill;

(a) Notice of his intention to present himself for examination, with documentary evidence of having complied with the preliminary conditions specified hereunder, all of which must reach the Secretary at least ten days before the date fixed for examination.

(b) A fee of £2 2s., which must be paid to the Secretary on or before the date of examination.

3. Every candidate presenting himself for examination shall provide himself with a book of logarithms, a 40 - 20 scale, a parallel ruler, protractor, and necessary appliances for plan drawing, except paper.

PRELIMINARY CONDITIONS.

4. Every candidate shall satisfy the Board that he is of the full age of twenty years at the time of examination; but no certificate or licence will be issued until the candidate shall have reached his majority.

5. Every candidate shall present satisfactory evidence as to character.

6. (1) Every candidate shall have passed, at an Australasian University, the matriculation examination, including English, geography, arithmetic, geometry, algebra, and physics, or such other examination as shall, in the opinion of the Board, be equivalent thereto; and shall have been professionally employed with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for not less than three years, two of which must have been in the field.

(2) Or he shall have served under articles or other similar agreement with some qualified surveyor or surveyors for a period of four years, three of which must have been in the field, and he shall further produce satisfactory evidence of having received such education as will qualify him for the proper exercise of his profession.

(3) Or he shall have completed a course of the Degree of Bachelor in Engineering at an Australasian University, or at any University recognised by the Australasian Universities, and have been professionally employed in the field for a period of two years with a qualified surveyor or surveyors.

Documentary evidence will be necessary in support of these conditions.

7. Every candidate shall produce, in the form hereafter, or in a like form, a certificate from a qualified surveyor with whom he has served that he is competent to undertake surveys.

8. Every candidate shall produce, before examination, his original field notes, and plan plotted by him therefrom, of the survey of an area of not less than 40 acres, one of the boundaries of which shall be a water-course or other natural feature, or an irregular road. The field notes, plan, and survey must be certified by the applicant to be entirely his own work.

9. SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

Mathematics.

Trigonometry plane and spherical, geometry and algebra. These subjects will be treated as far as they are applicable to surveying.

Computation.

Reduction of traverses, computation connected with the setting out of roads and curves, adjustment of discrepancies in surveys, computation of areas, including such as have irregular and curved boundaries.

Principles and Practice of Surveying.

Details of field practice, including the keeping of field notes, topographical surveying, setting out of areas, redetermination of boundaries, laying out roads, setting out curves, plotting from field notes, stadia surveying, barometric and other measurements of heights, surveying under the Real Property and Land Transfer Acts.

* If the certificate be of professional employment only, the words from "and that" to "surveys" inclusive shall be struck out.

Levelling, &c.

Levelling, measurement of earthwork.

Principles of Construction, Adjustment and Use of the following Instruments, viz.:—

Steel band, plane table, compass, sextant, level, clinometer, telemeter, theodolite, barometer, thermometer.

Field Astronomy, Geodesy, &c.

Determination of time, latitude, and azimuth, reduction of star places, elementary geodesy, including spherical excess and convergence of meridians, declination of the magnetic needle.

Drawing.

Plan drawing, compilation of plans, projection of maps and charts.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Physics (Matriculation standard)—Elementary Stratigraphical Geology—Description Writing.

Candidates who cannot comply with the first part of clause 6 (preliminary conditions), will be examined in elementary mathematics.

CERTIFICATE WITH REMISSION OF PART OF OR WITHOUT AN EXAMINATION.

10. A certificate may be granted by the Board to an applicant who has paid the prescribed fee, and who produces satisfactory evidence as to character, and that he has complied with the condition set forth, as follows:—

Having passed an examination equivalent, in the opinion of the Board, to that prescribed in the Australasian Colonies, and producing satisfactory evidence of not less than twelve months' field experience in practical land surveying similar to that required of candidates for examination by the Board.

11. Subject to the payment of the fee prescribed, the Board may, at its discretion, issue a certificate of competency, under the Regulations adopted by the Australasian Boards, to any applicant holding a certificate as a qualified surveyor conferred prior to the adoption of such Regulations, either without examination, or upon passing such part of the examination therein prescribed as the Board may require.

Provided that the Board may confer the certificate without examination only when there is no reason to doubt that the qualifications required by the Board are possessed by the applicant.

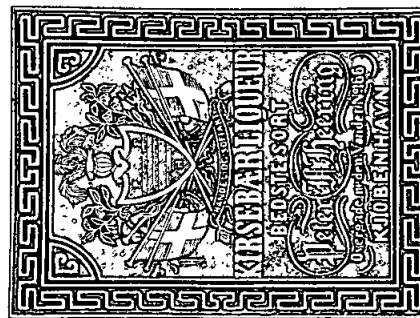

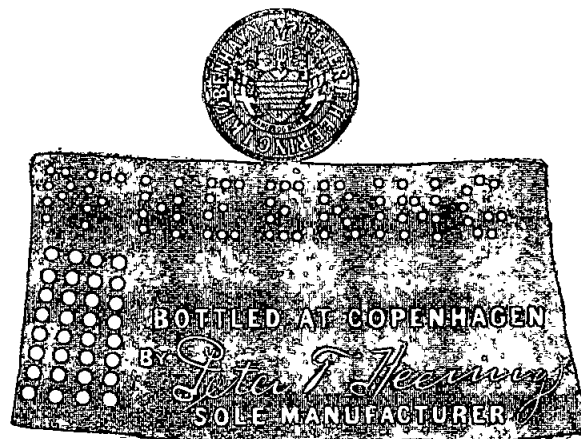

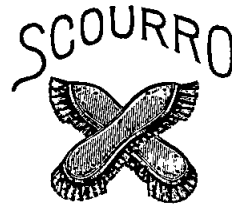

1. That all water supplied from the Trust works for the irrigation of land shall be paid for by measure. All measurements of water supplied shall be by such method as shall be adopted and fixed by the Trust. The registration of the area watered shall be made by the Water Bailiff.

2. That all pumped water shall be paid for at the rate of One shilling per inch per acre for the first watering, which shall not be less than 3 inches per acre, and One shilling per inch per acre for the second watering, which shall not be less than 3 inches per acre.

3. Gravitation water shall be supplied during each season when available at Fourpence per inch per acre for each watering, which shall not be less than 3 inches per acre.

4. Every ratepayer who has constructed a proper channel from the Trust works on application shall receive a stock and domestic supply of water free of charge at an interval of 60 days, such interval to date from the last time water was available in the Trust channel from which he usually gets his supply.

5. Every applicant for water shall enter his name in a book to be carried by the Water Bailiff, stating the date on which application is made, the area to be watered applied for, and paying the Water Bailiff the full price for such water, failing which no application will be entertained.

6. In the event of the Trust being unable (through failure of works or any other cause) to supply any person with the full area paid for the deficiency shall be refunded; but the Trust will not be answerable for any damage caused through such deficiency.

7. Every person applying for water will receive notice from the Water Bailiff of the date on which such water shall be supplied, and no applicant who is the occupier of 320 acres shall (if

other applicants are watering) be allowed to water, if by pumping, more than 20 acres, nor, if by gravitation, more than 40 acres, at one turn. A *pro rata* area will be allowed to be watered in the case of owners or occupiers of holdings of lesser or greater extent, provided that no one shall be limited to a lesser quantity than will water 5 acres of land. Each applicant shall be given a supply of water in order of application.

8. When the Water Bailiff is of opinion that an applicant's channel is likely to cause delay and waste in the delivery of water, and where the land proposed to be watered is not sufficiently protected to prevent flooding the roads or adjoining lands, he may refuse to entertain any application for water, pending a reference to the Trust at its next meeting, who, if satisfied with the reason given by the Water Bailiff, may confirm his action, and direct him to supply no more water until the cause of complaint has been removed.

9. All outlets, whether their cost of construction has been paid for by the owner or occupier of the land to be watered by such outlet or by the Trust, shall remain under the control of the Trust.

10. The outlets for the delivery of water shall be opened only by the Water Bailiff, and no person other than the Water Bailiff shall, under any circumstances (unless with his written permission), open any such outlet or otherwise do any act that may permit of the escape of water from the channels or works of the Trust.

11. Any person who shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds, which may be recovered in accordance with the provisions of Act No. 1136.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Swan Hill Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, under and by virtue of the provisions of Part III. of the *Water Act 1890*, this sixth (6th) day of January, 1898.

VICTORIAN NAVAL AND MILITARY FORCES.—ALTERATION OF FINANCIAL AND STORE REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in and additions to the Financial and Store Regulations for the Victorian Naval and Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART III.—PAY OF VOLUNTEER FORCES.

Section I.—Mounted Rifles and Victorian Rangers.—After paragraph 84 the following paragraph is added:—

84. In the case of the Mounted Rifles, a new saddle may be purchased out of company funds and supplied to a member whose length of service is, in the opinion of the Commanding Officer of the Company, sufficient to warrant the expenditure of company funds for the purpose; the saddle remaining the property of the company until completion of three years' service by the member. In no case are saddles purchased out of company funds to be supplied to recruits.

PART IV.—ALLOWANCES.

Section I.—Travelling Allowances (General).—In paragraph 89 the sub-paragraphs (g) and (h) are hereby cancelled, and the following sub-paragraphs are substituted therefor:—

(g) Carriage and cab hire will not be allowed when railway or other ordinary public conveyance is available, unless the claim be supported by a statement showing the necessity for using carriages or cabs, also the places from and to and distance travelled.

(h) Cab hire, when baggage is not necessarily taken, will not be admitted for distances of less than two (2) miles, unless required for necessary saving of time apart from all circumstances under the officer's own control. A full explanation of the circumstances must accompany each claim, and the distance travelled, together with the places from and to, must, in every case, be shown.

SHIRE OF BALLAN.

By-Law No. 5.

BY-LAW No. 5 of the Shire of Ballan, made under the provisions of section 191 of the Local Government Act 1890, as amended by section 46 of the Local Government Act 1891, for the purpose of regulating and defining the conditions upon which traction engines impelled by steam or electricity may proceed along the roads of the said shire.

1. No traction engine shall travel over any road within the shire boundaries without having the true name and full address of the owner painted on such engine in a conspicuous place, and so that the word "owner" shall appear between the name and address.

2. No traction engine shall travel over any road within the shire after dark or before daylight, unless such engine shall be preceded by some person by at least 100 yards, which person shall carry a lamp and shall give notice that such engine is travelling on such road to the president, councillor, or secretary.

3. No traction engine shall travel on any road within the shire with badly packed stuffing boxes or leaky valves, or otherwise in bad order, and the driver shall not permit steam to be blown off unless through accident to the engine, or unavoidable circumstances which necessitate the stoppage of such engine.

4. No traction engine shall travel on a road within the shire with less than two men engaged thereon, one of whom shall be the driver and in charge of such engine, and the other of whom shall steer such engine and render assistance to horses and vehicles passing when necessary.

5. The person in charge of any traction engine shall stop such engine, or where practicable take or move such engine to one side of the road upon which such engine shall be travelling when called upon to do so by persons travelling thereon on horseback, or with vehicles, or otherwise where horses are frightened, except in the following places, namely:—(a) Where the engine at such time or times is in such a position as to have the front wheels much lower than the hind wheels. (b) Where the man in charge would be endangering the engine boiler by so doing. (c) When such engine shall be crossing a bridge. (d) When such engine is proceeding up a steep hill. (e) Where the person in charge would not be able, if he then stopped, to start such engine again, and in all such places the person in charge shall send his assistant to, and such assistant shall, render all such help as may then be required to persons, horses, and vehicles then passing and travelling.

6. The person in charge of any traction engine shall forthwith fill up, or cause to be filled up, any hole caused by such engine or waggon or vehicles drawn by it, on any road along which the same shall have travelled or otherwise, where such road shall be damaged shall repair such road in a proper manner so as to render the same fit for any vehicle traffic.

7. The owner of any traction engine shall be liable to pay for any damage caused to any bridge or culvert by his engine.

8. No person shall permit a traction engine whilst travelling to stop upon a bridge or culvert.

9. In the event of any traction engine breaking the decking or otherwise damaging a bridge or culvert, the person in charge thereof shall forthwith, before leaving the bridge or culvert, place an obstruction or notice in a conspicuous position on or near the damaged portion, and shall send notice within 24 hours

to the president and secretary, or president, councillor, or engineer of the shire. Notice shall particularize the bridge or culvert so damaged, and the nature of such damage.

10. The owner of or person travelling with or in charge of any traction engine within the shire shall do so at his own risk, and the owner shall be responsible for any damage done or caused through or by any traction engine whilst travelling as aforesaid.

11. All owners of waggon or other vehicles carrying over five tons shall be equally liable for damaging any road, bridge, or culvert within the shire.

12. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. The person in charge of any traction engine, whether stationary or travelling on any road within the shire, shall, between sundown and sunrise, cause a lamp to be fixed thereon in a prominent position, and keep such lamp brightly burning between the periods aforesaid.

14. A licence fee of Five (5) pounds per annum shall be paid for each engine used on the roads of the shire.
