INNER ROUTE TO TORRES STRAIT.

Passage through the Great Barrier Reef, near the Howick Group.

Passaye through the Great Barrier Reef, near the Howick Group. NOTICE is hereby given that Captain W. Dawson, of H.M.S. Wattreatch, reports having sounded out the passage through the Great Barrier Reef, which lies between Stapleton (N) Islet (in lat. 14° 19° 12° S. Jong. 144° 51° 3° E.) and No. 1 sandbank.

The passage, which will be known hereafter as "Water witch Passage," is clear of dangers, and carries a depth of 14 to 19 fathoms.

Vessels proceeding to sea from the Inner Route should pass between Bewick and Ingham Islands, and, having made Stapleton Island, leave it on the starboard hand 4-nile distant; then steering N. 10° E. (mag.) for 74 miles will bring No. 1 sandbank abeam. It is close to the edge of the reef, and should be passed on the starboard hand 4-nile distant. The passage is 14 miles wide, but the reef on the west side of it should be given a good berth, as it was not sounded off. Heavy tide-rips and strong tidal currents are met with in the passage, but on the sandbank side it is always smooth. The nothern edge of the reef west of Stapleton Island bears N. 523° W. from Stapleton. The channel between the two is 2° miles wide, and quite clear of dangers. Chaits affected—2922, 780, and 2964.

Notice is hereby given that an Automatic Clock-face Tide Gauge, illuminated at night, is exhibited from the Fairway Beacon at the outer edge of the bar at Cairus Harbor. The beacon, from which False Cape bears S. 79° 30° E. and the front leading light S. 21° W., is placed in a depth of 15 feet at low-water springs, and is 150 feet from the line of lights and beacons marking the centre of the bar cutting. It is to be left on the port hand when entering.

The tide gauge indicates the height of the tide above low-water datum from 1 foot to 11 feet by means of a pointer moving round a clock-face dial looking seaward. The gauge does not indicate below 1 foot nor above 11 feet, the pointer resting at those points so that 1 foot should be interpreted 1 foot or under and 11 feet as 11 feet and over.

The available depth in the cutting will be obtained by adding 12t. 6in, to the height shown by the gauge.

The light will be visible in clear weather at a distance of 5 miles, except between the bearings of W.S.W. and S.S.E., between which bearings the direct light is obscured, and the frosted clock-face is only visible.

The old red Fairway Buoy has been removed.

PEGULATIONS in connexion with the Vote of Two thoumore and five hundred pounds (£2,500) for fencing and improving public parks and gardens under the control of borough
councils, trustees, committees of management, &c.

1. A sum not exceeding Five shillings may be paid to the
treasurer of the managing body of any public park or garden
having a claim on the vote for every (Do pound expended by such
body on fencing, preparation of land and planting, forming of
roads and paths, and such other works as the Minister may
approve, in such park or garden between 1st January, 1897, and
31st December, 1897, out of funds locally contributed, provided
such claim be neceived by the Secretary for Agriculture on or
before the 1st March, 1898. Every statement of particulars of
claim on the vote must be made in the form A, and be accompanied by a declaration in the form B.

2. The term "locally contributed" shall mean and include all
moneys voted by the managing body of any public park or garden
from its own funds for the fencing and planting of such park or
garden, also all moneys voluntarily contributed for the same purpose, between the 1st of January, 1897, and 31st December, 1897;

but it shall not mean nor include any sums advanced by any bank, nor any subsidy paid by Government between the abovementioned dates, nor the balance of any subsidy paid by Government at any period prior to the 1st January, 1897.

 3. The subsidy or the balance thereof last paid to the managing body of any public park or garden shall be deducted from the return of expenditure for the year 1837 (vide form A), and a sum equal to one-fourth of the balance then remaining, if made up of local contributions as above interpreted, shall be paid as subsidy; provided that if the claims are in excess of the sum of Two thousand five hundred pounds they shall be reduced pro ratā.
- 4. In every case in which a claim is sent in, an officer of the Department may be instructed to make an inspection of the books kept by the managing body, and of the vouchers for the several items of exponditure; and if such inspection be refused the claim shall be disallowed.
- 5. Moneys expended in street planting, or in fencing, formation, or maintenance of land for racing, cricket, football, croquet, tennis, bowling, quoits, or other sports, or in crection or repairs of stands or pavilones for the purpose of witnessing sports, must not be included in any claim upon the vote.
- 6. The foregoing shall not apply to parks and gardens within the limits of the city of Melbourne, except the Royal Park, or to the Edinburgh Garden, Fitzroy, or the Darling Gardens, Collingwood, or to Albert Park, South Melbourne and St. Kılda, or the Richmond Park, Richmond, or the Botanical Garden, Geelong.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath : Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the Thistle Act 1893, I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclammation declare certain plants named respectively Rosa Rubbyinosa, commonly known as "Sweet Briar," and Ulex Europeus, commonly known as "Kurze," to be thistles within the meaning of the Thistle Act 1890 throughout the Shire of Whittlesea.

Given under my Hand and the Scal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven, and in the sixty-first year of Her

BAIRNSDALE IRRIGATION AND WATER SUPPLY TRUST.-REGULATION No. 11.

THE Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, hereby make the following Regulation for determining the rates and chargest to be paid in respect of water supplied or available for supply by the Trust within the Urban Division, and for other purposes, during the calendar year 1898:—

- 1898:—

 1. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands, houses, and tenements situate in the Urban Division of the Trust area shall pay in respect of water supplied or available for supply to such lands, houses, or tenements situate on any street in which pipes for water supply are laid, or which lands, houses, or tenements, if not on such streets, are supplied with water by reticulation from such pipes, for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1898, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1898, and such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to denand and receive the said rates:—

 (a) On every house, tenement, or lands, a rate of Eightbenge.
 - (a) On every house, tenement, or lands, a rate of Eightpence for every One pound per annum of municipal valuation.
 - (b) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping or any other purpose, a maximum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any fractional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
 - (c) For water supplied by the said Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (c) of section 1 of this Regulation), One shilling per 1,000
 - (d) Water supplied to gardens, nurseries, manufactories, aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of
 - (c) For water supplied to Government departments, cricket clubs, bowling greens, boating clubs, show-yards, cattle-yards, and recreation reserves, shall be charged by measurement at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 'gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 30,000 gallons per
- annum.

 (f) Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.

 2. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this Regulation shall be paid by and be recoverable from the owner of the premises, or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.
- 3. The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1898, and on the 1st day of July, 1898 (except in the case of water supplied by meter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust from time to time), and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

In the construction of this Regulation the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether

aggregate or sole; and the word "Trust" shall mean the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust.

The foregoing Regulation was made by the Commissioners of the Bairnsdale Irrigation and Water Supply Trust on the 2nd day of December, 1898, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Water Act 1890, and the corporate seal of the Trust was affixed hereto in the presence of—

MANSFIELD WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1898.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Mansfield Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Act 1890, do hereby pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the said Act, make the following Regulations:

The following are the rates and charges which the owners or occupiers of lands and tenements liable to be rated shall pay for the year 1898, in respect of water supplied by the said Trust within the Urban District.

1. For every house or tenement of Twenty (20) pounds annual municipal value or under, the sum of One pound sterling.

2. For every house or tenement of Twenty pounds annual municipal value or upwards, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling shall be paid.

3. For every unoccupied piece or allotment of land of not more than Two pounds annual municipal value, a rate of Two shillings shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid.

shillings shall be paid. Where the valuation exceeds Two pounds, a rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be paid.

4. For water supplied by the Trust by measurement, a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons shall be made, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for when used for domestic and other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would be equivalent to the quantity of water which the owner or occupier would be entitled to receive according to his assessed rate for the year if supplied otherwise than by measure. Where water is used solely for other and domestic purposes it shall be charged for half-yearly, and the minimum quantity to be charged for during each half-year shall be 10,000 gallons.

5. For the right to use a hose for watering ornamental plots or gardens not exceeding one square chain. Ten shillings shall be charged, and Eight shillings for every additional chain.

6. For a temporary supply during the erection of a building or repairs, One pound per cent shall be charged on the cost of the brickwork, stonework, and plastering; or the Trust may cause a meter to be fixed and a charge made by measure; or a special agreement may be made for the supply.

7. For every water-trough a charge of Fifteen (15s.) shillings shall be made.

8. For every stean-boiler supplied, except by special agree-

7. For every water-trough a charge of Fifteen (15s.) shillings shall be made.

8. For every steam-boiler supplied, except by special agreement, a charge of Thirty shillings per each horse power shall be made; and for a supply to livery or carriers' stables, Four (4s.) shillings for each stall shall be charged.

9. The fee to be paid for a plumber's licence shall be One pound per annum.

10. Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pines of the Trust extended to their

Provided that where persons within the Water Trust area desire to have the service pipes of the Trust extended to their properties, and are willing to pay the cost of such extension, the Trust shall have power to make a special agreement with them regarding the payment of water supplied so as to cover their outlay.

The rates and charges herein mentioned are hereby made payable half-yearly in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July, 1897, provided that the charge for a temporary supply shall be paid in advance, or as may be agreed upon.

Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and accover such rates and charges.

- 8. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable, as the Board shall see fit; and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employés, committing any breach of these by-laws.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement on pain of cancellation of livence. A high-pressure screw-down stop-cock

shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the line, properly secured and covered with an approved

building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap.

13. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person negloct to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the mains being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall be responsible for keeping the same in repair, and in every instance in which, after notice that repairs to service-pipes are required, damage is caused by reason of their leaking or heing otherwise out of repair or broken, the occupier or owner shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

15. All water-troughs supplied from the pipes of the Board shall be lined with metal, so as to be perfectly water-tight, and shall have proper and efficient fittings for supplying them automatically. All such troughs and fittings shall be kept in proper order and repair. No water-trough, the supply to which is charged under sub-section (iv.) of section 2 of these by-laws shall be of greater capacity than 25 gallons. Should any trough or the fittings thereof be out of repair or leaking, the supply thereto will be cut off until the same has been properly and efficiently repaired.

16. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or nealigently allow the same to run to waste shall be

efficiently repaired.

16. Any person supplied with water by the Board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

17. No meter shall be affixed until it shall have been examined, tested, and approved by a duly authorized officer of the Board. Each meter must be capable of registering at least one million

18. If any meter shall cease registering, or be reported by the inspector or any authorized officer of the Board as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the Board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and re-fixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the Board may insert a check-meter on the service-pipe.

19. Meters affixed to services shall not be removed or interfered with except upon written application to and with the approval of the Board, unless for the purpose of repair, as mentioned in the last preceding section, in which case notice, in writing, must be given to the officer in charge of the works of the Board six days at least before removal.

20. A separate meter shall in every case be provided for each tenement where the supply is by measure.

21. Baths supplied from the pipes, except where the supply is by meters, shall not exceed 6ft. 3m. in length along the centre line, by a mean width of 2 feet and a depth of 1ft. 9in., the ends sloping inwards. Overflow pipes to baths will not be permitted.

No person shall use a hose attached to any tap or pipe used for the purpose of supplying the water of the Board for domostic purposes to any house or premises for watering any garden, laying dust, or for any other purpose whatsoever, unless where a water meter is fixed and the water is supplied by measure; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.

23. No person who may be supplied by measure shall use the water for irrigation purposes after the blowing of the tower whistle at Eight o'clock each evening; and any person offending against this by-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence.

If any person supplied with water by the Board does, or causes to be done, anything in contravention of any of these Regulations, or fails to pay his rates when due, or fails to do anything which under these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Board may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of injury remains or is not remedied.

To combat the attacks of this scale, the strongest washes must be used, such as kerosene sprayed on affected trees with the aid of kerosene "attachment," say, in the proportion of 1 to 12 for winter wash, and 1 to 20 for summer wash, or resin compound, one of the best being prepared in the following manner:—3 lbs. caustic soda and 4 lbs. resin, dissolve in 3 pints of water over a fire, when properly dissolved add water slowly, while boiling, to make 36 pints. In the case of peaches and other tender plants, washing soda may be substituted for the caustic soda, and for the scale above ground, one part of the compound to eight of water is recommended. In the event of a tree being so badly infested that recovery appears hopeless, the same should be carefully grubbed out and burned on the spot, or as near to it as possible.
