#### METALLURGIST.







COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE FOR PUBLIC RECREATION IN THE TOWNSHIP OF HAWKESDALE.

OF HAWKESDALE.

WHEREAS by the 136th section of the Land Act 1890 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations, or to rescind any rules and regulations heretofore made for the care, protection, aid management of all public parks and reserves not conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the Regulation following to be observed and enforced in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order of the 8th March, 1887, as a site for Public Recreation in the township of Hawkesdale:—

#### REGULATION.
