### METALLURGIST.

By-law No. 10.

For Regulating the Carriage and Storage of Fruit, Vegetables, or others Food.

THE Council of the Shire of Preston, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire and in pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1890 and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, order as follows:—

1. No person shall place, carry, or have in any vehicle containing manue or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food, in such nanner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or such case or receptacle shall be in contact with, or be liable to be in contact with, such manue or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

2. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of the above by-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) nor less than Five shillings (5s.)

On an average, ten words make a line, but for the description of a brand consisting of more than one letter, &c., placed perpendicularly, thus, B, each additional letter under the first is charged

as a line.

Every Signature must likewise be counted as a line.

. The final words of a paragraph, though only a portion (f a line must be counted as one line,

Signatures (in particular) and Proper names must be written very plainly in the text; ONE SIDE ONLY of each slip of paper should be WRITTEN UPON.

ALL DOCUMENTS illegibly written will be returned unpublished, and, where brands occur unprovided for by the ordinary letters of the alphabet, a worded explanatory description must be furnished.
