METALLURGIST.

By-LAW No. 10.

FOR REGULATING THE CARRIAGE AND STORAGE OF FRUIT, VEGETABLES, OR OTHER FOOD.

THE Council of the Shire of Preston, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire and in pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890* and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, order as follows:—

1. No person shall place, carry, or have in any vehicle containing manure or offensive matter any fruit, vegetables, or other food, or any case or other receptacle customarily used for the reception and carriage of fruit, vegetables, or other food, in such manner that such fruit, vegetables, or other food, or such case or receptacle shall be in contact with, or be liable to be in contact with, such manure or offensive matter, or to be contaminated by moisture or effluvia therefrom.

2. Any person committing a breach of any of the provisions of the above by-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10) nor less than Five shillings (5s.)
