The estimates of population are based on municipal returns. During the last twelve months the population increased by 7,500, resulting from an excess of births over deaths of 5,470, and a net influx of persons into the Metropolitan districts of 2,030. The population in 1897 was larger than that in any previous year since 1892.

In 1897 only 39 per cent., as compared with 43 per cent. in 1891, of the population of the whole colony was resident in Greater Melbourne.

Exclusive of the shipping and hospitals there was an increase in the population of 18 of the 25 sub-districts\* of Greater Melbourne of 9,800, but a decrease in the other 7 sub-districts of 2,497; resulting in a net increase of 7,303. An increase of 2,257 occurred in Essendon, and 1,674 in Brunswick; and of the total decrease, 928 took place in Richmond, and 703 in Melbourne City. The following is a statement of the increase or decrease in each sub-district during the last twelve months:—

In the year 1897 the registered births exceeded the registered deaths in Greater Melbourne by 80 per cent., as compared with 79 per cent. in 1896, 87 per cent. in 1895, and 99 per cent. in 1894.

In 126 instances twins, and one case of triplets, were born in Greater Melbourne during the year under notice. As the births in the same period numbered in all 12,303, the confinements must have numbered 12,175. Thus one mother in 96 gave birth to more than one infant, as compared with 1 in 119 in 1896 and 1 in 99 in 1895.

The births set down as illegitimate in 1897 numbered 1,050, or 47 less than in 1896. Over a third of these took place in the Women's Hospital or in buildings under the supervision of the officers of that institution. The proportion of illegitimate births to the whole number of births registered was 1 in 12, which proportion was the same as in the five previous years.

Subjoined are the birth and death rates in each sub-district in 1897. Births and deaths in hospitals, &c., are excluded, and the sub-districts are arranged in order, the sub-district with the highest birth-rate and the highest death-rate being placed first and the rest in succession:—

It will be observed that the highest birth-rate was over 31 per 1,000 in Northcote; the next highest, about 32½ per 1,000, in Port Melbourne, Footscray, and Preston, and then 32 per 1,000 in Essendon; whilst the lowest was about 19 per 1,000 in Caulfield and Melbourne City, next between 20 and 21 in Brighton and Kew, and next a little over 22 in St. Kilda and Malvern. The highest death-rate was about 14 per 1,000, which prevailed in Fitzroy and Port Melbourne, and the next, 13 per 1,000 in Collingwood; whilst the lowest, after the Shipping, was 5½ in Caulfield, next 7½ in Preston, then 9 in Essendon, and about 10 in St. Kilda, Kew, and Coburg. Of the five districts referred to as having the highest birth-rates, two only had also high death-rates, viz., Port Melbourne and Footscray—the former standing second, and the latter fifth on the list. Northcote stood just below the average, whilst Essendon and Preston stood almost at the bottom of the list. Oakleigh, which was conspicuous in the three preceding years as having both the highest birth and the highest death-rate, fell to the seventh position on the list in regard to the former, and to the fourth in regard to the latter. As explained in the footnote, it should be borne in mind that the rates quoted are exclusive of any allowance for births and deaths in public institutions; and, assuming that each sub-district contributed its quota to the inmates on a population basis, the total birth-rate in each district would be about 1½ per 1,000, and the death-rate about 3½ per 1,000, greater than that shown in the foregoing lists.

In Greater Melbourne, taken as a whole, there was an average of over 2½ persons to the acre at the end of 1897, but the density of the population varies considerably in the different sub-districts, ranging from 32 persons to the acre in Fitzroy and North Melbourne Town to a little over 1 person to the acre in Coburg and Caulfield, and less than 1 to the acre in Boroondara, Oakleigh, Preston, and the outlying portions of the district. The following table shows the area of, and the density of the population living in, each sub-district:—

Death-rates do not always vary with the density of population. According to the foregoing table, by far the densest sub-districts in Greater Melbourne in 1897 were Fitzroy and North Melbourne; but only the former had a high death-rate. Moreover, of the six towns which stood next in point of density, viz., Collingwood, Richmond, South Melbourne, Melbourne (proper), Prahran, and Flemington, two had death-rates below the average of Greater Melbourne, viz., Melbourne City and Flemington. On the other hand, of the ten sub-districts in the above list, having a density of less than four persons to the acre, six will be found amongst the last eight (except the shipping) on the list, with the lowest death-rates; but three had death-rates only slightly below the average, whilst one—Oakleigh—had the fourth highest death-rate. As pointed out in the last report, however, it is possible that some of the anomalies would be accounted for, if all disturbing influences were taken into account.

The estimated population, the births and deaths, and their proportions to the population, the excess of births over deaths, the mean temperature in the shade, the rainfall, and the mean atmospheric pressure in Greater Melbourne, during each of the twenty years ended with 1897, were as follow:—

The births in Greater Melbourne during 1897 were fewer than in any of the eleven years immediately preceding, but were more numerous than in any year prior to that period; and their proportion to the population has gradually fallen off year by year from 1889 to 1897 from 38 per 1,000 in the former to 27 in the latter year, the proportion in 1897 being absolutely the lowest in the last twenty years, and 64 per 1,000 below the mean of that period.

The rate of mortality in 1897 was by far the lowest during the last twenty years, and about 27 per 1,000 below the average of the last ten years. Ever since 1893, the mortality has been exceptionally low.

The proportion by which the births exceeded the deaths in 1897 was slightly higher than that in 1896, but lower than in any other previous year since 1889. All the figures in the table relating to births and deaths include those which occurred in hospitals, &c., which accommodate large numbers of persons coming from country districts. Should such of these as are not *bona fide* residents of Greater Melbourne be eliminated the number of births would be slightly less, but that of deaths would be considerably less, whilst the excess of births over deaths would be much higher.

The exceptional reductions in the birth and death rates which have taken place since 1890 were fully dealt with in the annual report for 1894. It is possible also that the population may be over-stated.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the year 1897 was 107.3°, on the 30th December; and the lowest was 31.5°, on the 13th June. The mean temperature of the year (57.6°) was two-fifths of a degree below the average of the last decade, but a fifth of a degree above the average of the preceding one. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (53.1°) took place on the 16th December, and the least range (2.0°) on the 19th February. The mean daily range was 17.9°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.540 inches, on the 30th May, and the lowest was 29.213 inches, on the 28th September. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.94 inches) was about the average. Rain fell on 117 days, or 14 days below the average; but the amount of rainfall was 25.85 inches, or 1.85 inches above the average. The number of days in which fog occurred was 11.

Of the births registered in Greater Melbourne during 1897, 51 per cent. were of males, and 49 per cent. of females. Of the deaths during the year, 53 per cent. were of males, and 47 per cent. of females. Children under the age of 5 years contributed 29 per cent. to the total mortality, as against 32 per cent. in 1896, 31 per cent. in 1895, 34 per cent. in 1894, 41 per cent. in 1893, 38 per cent. in 1892, 40 per cent. in 1891, 39 per cent. in 1890, 44 per cent. in 1889, 42 per cent. in 1888 and 1887, 41 per cent. in 1886, and 38 per cent. in 1885. The great fall in the birth-rate since 1892 accounts in a large measure not only for the smaller proportion of deaths of children under five years amongst whom the mortality is always greater, but also for the fall in the general death rate, which would be materially affected by the lower proportion of children in the population.

The deaths of 1,464 infants under 1 year of age occurred in Greater Melbourne during 1897, the proportion being 11.90 to every 100 births. This was the lowest infantile death-rate that has occurred in the district during the last twenty-four years, the next lowest being in 1894, 1895, 1892, and 1896, when it was 12.24, 13.45, 12.86, and 13.09 respectively; whereas the highest was 19.43 in 1889, and the average 16.14. The proportion has rapidly fallen off from 17.84 in 1886.

The deaths of 617 persons, viz., 327 males and 290 females, of the age of 75 years or upwards occurred during 1897, or 34 less than in the previous year. Of these, 323 were between 75 and 80, 169 between 80 and 85, 89 between 85 and 90, 24 between 90 and 95, 10 between 95 and 100, and 2 at 100 years. Deaths of females were more numerous than those of males at the two age periods between 15 and 35 years, but at no other periods. Nearly a third of those who died were under 5 years, another third were between 5 and 55, and the remaining third over 55. The following were the numbers of those of either sex who died at various periods of age in 1897, and the proportion of the deaths at each period to the total number during the year:—

The following are the numbers of deaths in 1897 which took place in Public Institutions:—690 in the Melbourne, 191 in the Alfred, 51 in the St. Vincent's, 58 in the Women's, 96 in the Children's, 52 in the Homeopathic, and 65 in the Austin Hospitals; 119 in the Metropolitan and 73 the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 13 in the Infant Asylum; 60 in the Immigrants' Home; 160 in the Benevolent Asylum; 29 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor; 22 in the Protestant Refuge; 22 in the Melbourne Gaol; 6 in the Pentridge Penal Establishment; and 3 in the Eye and Ear Hospital. The total number is 1,710: of which 1,135 took place in Melbourne City, 160 in North Melbourne, 119 in Kew, 20 in Brunswick, 52 in South Melbourne, 51 in Fitzroy, 29 in Northcote, 6 in Coburg, and 138 in the remainder of district. These figures, compared with the total deaths (6,833), furnish a proportion of 25 per cent., or, in other words, 1 person in every 4 who died in Greater Melbourne during 1897 ended his or her days in a hospital, an asylum, or a gaol. Some idea of the large proportion of persons dying in hospitals, &c., more especially from certain diseases, may be formed from the following statement:—

All the diseases named caused a lower mortality than the average of the last ten years, excepting only scarlet fever, cancer, and heart diseases. The mortality from typhoid fever and diarrhoeal diseases was only about half, and that from influenza about one-fourth below the average; whilst that from diseases of the digestive system a fifth, from diseases of the lungs (including bronchitis, &c.) and from diphtheria about one-sixth, from phthisis an eighth, and from brain diseases about a ninth below it. In regard to extremes of mortality, it will be found by the table that in 1897 the mortality from whooping-cough was the lowest in the last twenty years; that from phthisis the lowest, with one exception (viz., in 1896), in the last fourteen years; that from brain diseases was about the same as in 1894 or 1895, but lower than in any other years since 1881, except 1896; that from pneumonia and

other lung diseases other than bronchitis the lowest, with one exception, in the last fourteen years; and that from diseases of the digestive system the lowest in the last eleven years; whereas the mortality from cancer in 1897 was exceeded only in the two preceding years, and that from diseases of the heart was the highest during the whole period, with two exceptions. The deaths from child-birth were four below the average, but relatively to the births registered were above the average, for there was one death to every 130 births in 1897, as against one to 178 on the average of the last ten years. An epidemic of measles—the first since 1893—broke out about the end of the year under notice, although, so far, only six deaths occurred.

In connexion with the comparisons made, it must be borne in mind that the population level during the last decade rose from 100 in 1888 to 117 in 1891, and then fell to 108 in 1897, and in the latter decade, as compared with the previous one, it increased by about 47 per cent. (See Table of Population *ante*.)

The following table shows the number of deaths in Greater Melbourne from all causes, also from typhoid fever, diarrhoeal diseases, and diphtheria and croup, registered in each month of the last ten years:—

According to the experience of the ten years named, the general mortality and the mortality from diarrhoeal diseases are greatest from December to March, by far the worst months being December and January; the mortality from typhoid fever is greatest from January to May, the worst months being February, March, and April; and the mortality from diphtheria and croup is greatest from March to September, the worst month being May. It will be noticed that the last-mentioned complaints are the only ones named which appear to be more destructive in winter than in summer.

The estimated mean population, the births and deaths, and their proportions to population, and the excess of births over deaths in each of the metropolitan cities of Australasia, except Perth, in 1897 were as follow:—

It will be noticed that the birth-rate was higher in Melbourne than in Hobart, but lower than in the other cities named, although only slightly lower than in Wellington; that the death-rate in Melbourne was higher than in any of the other cities except Hobart; and that the proportion of excess of births over deaths was much lower in Melbourne than in any, except Hobart.

It should be mentioned that the death-rate of Melbourne is much swelled by the large number of country residents who are admitted to and die in the Metropolitan hospitals. In some of the other colonies it is believed to be the custom to eliminate such entries.

Should the light be so powerful as to dazzle the mariner and render the passage through the entrance to Port Phillip or through the channel uncertain and hazardous, he is warned to exhibit a blue light, when the use of the electric light will be discontinued until the vessel has passed beyond its influence.

## ALTERATION OF REGULATIONS.

*At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of April, 1898.*

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government.

WHEREAS by section 23 of the *Education Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1086) it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for all or any of the purposes therein mentioned, and generally for carrying the said Act into effect: And whereas by section 18 of the *Teachers Act 1893* (56 Vict. No. 1302) it is also enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for the purposes therein mentioned, and for carrying out any of the provisions of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby repeal Regulation No. VI. (Appointment and Transfer of Pupil Teachers, Monitors, and Sewing Mistresses) made under the provisions of the Acts aforesaid, and of Part III. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), and doth make the following Regulation in lieu thereof, that is to say:

VI.—APPOINTMENT AND TRANSFER OF PUPIL  
TEACHERS, MONITORS, AND SEWING MIS-  
TRESSES.

## PUPIL TEACHERS.

1. Candidates for appointment as pupil teachers must be not less than fourteen years of age, and must furnish satisfactory evidence of aptitude for teaching. Prior to appointment candidates must furnish certificates of good character, of sound constitution, and of freedom from any physical defect likely to impair their usefulness as teachers; and (1) must have passed in reading, spelling and composition, writing, arithmetic, grammar, and geography, and, in the case of girls, in needlework, as prescribed for the Fifth\* or Sixth class in the course of Free Instruction (Regulation I.); or (2) must have passed the Matriculation Examination of the University of Melbourne; or (3) have been the holders of State School scholarships or exhibitions.

2. (a) As vacancies occur, in schools where monitors are employed, the monitors will be regarded as having the first claim to appointment as pupil teachers in the schools in which they have been appointed monitors, provided there is no pupil teacher recorded for transfer for such appointment. In the event of there being more than one monitor employed in a school in which there is a vacancy for a pupil teacher, the order of seniority for appointment shall be determined by competitive examination, and the subjects for examination shall be reading, spelling and composition, writing, arithmetic, grammar, and geography, as prescribed for Class VI. in Regulation I. In determining the order of merit of the candidates, consideration shall be given to the aptitude of the respective candidates for teaching.

(b) Monitors employed in schools in Melbourne, Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong respectively will be examined each half-year for prospective vacancies in their own schools, and the names of such monitors shall be recorded in the Employment Register in their order of merit for such prospective vacancies, and such order of record shall remain in force for a period of six months from the date of each successive examination. The subjects of such examination shall be as in (a) *supra*.

(c) Monitors who have been removed on account of reduced average attendance will be permitted to compete for vacancies in the schools in which they were employed.

3. In schools within a radius of 20 miles of Melbourne, and 10 miles of Ballarat, Bendigo, and Geelong, respectively, where no monitors are employed, competitive examinations shall be held once in each half-year, and the names of such candidates as are meritorious shall be recorded in the Employment Register, and such order of record shall remain in force for a period of six months from the date of each successive examination. The subjects for such examination shall be as in 2 (a) *supra*.

4. In schools outside the districts specified in (3) *supra*, where no monitors are employed, where there is no pupil teacher recorded for transfer, and where there are more qualified candidates than one, a competitive examination shall be held, the subjects of which shall be as in 2 (a) *supra*. In determining

\* From the 1st July, 1893, passing in the subjects above mentioned prescribed for the Fifth Class in the course of Free Instruction will cease to be regarded as a qualification.

the order of merit of the candidates, consideration shall be given to the aptitude of the respective candidates for teaching. The Inspector shall place the names of candidates in order of merit, and shall report to the Secretary of the Education Department, for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, the names of as many candidates as there are vacancies. The names of such candidates as are meritorious shall be entered on the Employment Register in the same order.

5. Where there is no pupil teacher recorded for transfer, and only one qualified candidate for any vacancy, the name of such candidate shall be entered on the Employment Register for that vacancy.

6. Candidates for any present or immediately prospective vacancy may be presented to the District Inspector of schools for examination for qualification at any ordinary visit of inspection.

7. Pupil teachers' names shall be arranged on the Transfer List for transfer in the following order:—

First.—Pupil teachers in schools that have been closed or amalgamated, or who are in excess of the staff allowed.

Second.—Pupil teachers recorded for transfer—

(i.) In the public interest.

(ii.) On the ground of ill-health, attested by satisfactory medical evidence.

(iii.) For some other satisfactory reason.

#### MONITORS.

8. Monitors will be appointed as vacancies occur, and every such appointment will be temporary.

9. The appointments may be terminated at any time at the discretion of the Minister, and will cease while the average attendance of the school in which the monitor is employed falls below the required number.

10. The salary for monitors will be at the rate of £12 per annum for males and £10 per annum for females.

11. The qualifications for appointment as monitors shall be the same as those for appointment as pupil teachers.

12. The conditions and mode of filling up vacancies for monitors shall be the same as those prescribed in clauses 3 and 4 for pupil teacher vacancies.

13. Monitors shall receive instruction as provided for pupil teachers in Regulation V. 14, and may present themselves at the annual examinations in the literary work prescribed for the several classes of pupil teachers' examinations subject to Regulation V. 11 and 12.

14. Monitors who have passed the literary examination for any class of pupil teachers will be entitled, on their being appointed pupil teachers, to be recorded and paid as Fourth Class pupil teachers until the 1st of January following date of appointment, when they will be entitled, on completing their examinations, to be classified in such higher class and to be paid accordingly, subject to the provisions of Regulation V. 11.

15. When the reduced average attendance at any school in which there are more monitors than one employed renders the removal of a monitor necessary, the order of seniority for retention shall be determined by the respective qualifications of the monitors as shown by the examination they have passed at the annual examination of pupil teachers; but in the event of their not having passed any such examination then the services of the monitor placed lowest in order of merit at the original examination shall be terminated.

16. Monitors may be recorded for transfer on their satisfying the Department that such transfer is necessary.

#### SEWING MISTRESSES.

17. Candidates shall not be less than seventeen years of age, and must furnish with their application satisfactory evidence as to good character and suitability, and, prior to appointment, as to sound health.

18. When there is no person recorded for transfer, and only one qualified candidate for any vacancy, the Secretary of the Education Department shall, if satisfied that the candidate is competent to perform the duties of the position, inform the Committee of Classifiers thereof, who shall enter the name of the candidate on the Employment Register for that vacancy.

19. When there is no person recorded for transfer, and there are more candidates than one, a competitive examination shall be held in reading, writing (including dictation and composition), arithmetic, grammar, and geography for the Third Class in State

Schools, as provided for by the Regulations for the time being of the Education Department, in all the kinds of needlework required from girls in State Schools and in teaching such needlework and any of the other programme subjects for the First and Second Classes. The Inspector shall arrange the names of the candidates in their order of merit as determined by the examination, and report to the Secretary of the Education Department, for the information of the Committee of Classifiers, who shall enter in the Employment Register the name of the first candidate, provided she prove duly qualified.

The names of sewing mistresses shall be arranged on the Transfer List for transfer in the following order:—

First.—Sewing mistresses in schools that have been closed or amalgamated, or whose services have been discontinued through the operation of the provisions of the Second Schedule of the *Teachers' Act* 1895.

Second.—Sewing mistresses recorded for transfer—

- (i.) In the public interest.
- (ii.) On the ground of ill-health, attested by satisfactory medical evidence.
- (iii.) For some other satisfactory reason.

And the Honorable Alexander James Peacock, Her Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### STEAM-SHIP "AUSTRALIA" DETAINED IN QUARANTINE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the fourth day of April, 1898.

WHEREAS by the *Health Act 1890* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make such Order as shall be deemed expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in particular cases with respect to any vessel arriving in Victoria under any alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection or contagion; and also with respect to the persons and things on board the same: And whereas the steam-ship or vessel *Australia* arrived in Victorian waters having had on board in the course of her voyage a case of the contagious disease small-pox: And whereas it is expedient to make an Order to prevent, as far as possible, the spread of such contagious disease in Victoria: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that the said vessel shall be detained and anchored off the Quarantine Station at Point Nepean or at the Outer Anchorage off Williamstown, and shall fly and keep flying the yellow flag at the main-mast-head; and doth further direct that no person whatever, unless directed to do so by the Health Officer or other officer in charge on behalf of the Board of Public Health, except the passengers for Victoria, nor any article, cargo, goods, or letters shall leave the said steam-ship, nor be taken or allowed or suffered to be taken and removed from her, nor shall any boat put off from the said steam-ship except only that her mails, cargo, and passengers' luggage for Victoria may be discharged into lighters, and may, after careful disinfection, and under the supervision of the Health Officer, be afterwards conveyed to shore under his directions; and, further, that cargo, provisions, luggage, and mails may be slung or hoisted on board the said steam-ship under such conditions as the Health Officer may direct, and under his supervision; and, further, that no person, except the Medical Inspector or Health Officer or person authorized by either of such officers necessarily employed in fumigating or discharging cargo, shall be permitted to board or approach the said steam-ship, nor shall any one remain unnecessarily in her vicinity; and, further, that all persons engaged in conveying any cargo, passengers' luggage, provisions, or mails to or from the said steam-ship shall immediately afterwards, together with their clothing, be fumigated and disinfected to the satisfaction of the Health Officer; and, further, that the said vessel, and all persons and things on board of her, shall be detained in quarantine until severally released by the Health Officer aforesaid.

And the Honorable Henry Roberts Williams, Her Majesty's Minister of Health for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### REGULATION OF HAIRDRESSERS' SHOPS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF HAMILTON.

WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations to have effect within any specified municipal district or any specified part of such district for, amongst other things, permitting shops of any particular class not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, on obtaining a licence to keep open after the hours mentioned in the said Factories and Shops Acts, and during such hours as shall be specified in such licence, provided a petition shall have been previously addressed to the Governor in Council, and forwarded to the Minister, certified to by the municipal clerk as having been signed by a majority of the shopkeepers keeping shops of such class: And whereas a petition has been so addressed and forwarded praying that in the municipal district of the Borough of Hamilton all hairdressers' shops (such shops being shops not included in the Fourth Schedule to the *Factories and Shops Act 1890* aforesaid) may be permitted, on obtaining a licence, to keep open until Eight o'clock on the evenings of Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday in each week, and until half-past Ten o'clock on the evening of Saturday in each week: And whereas such petition has been certified to by the municipal clerk of the said district as having been signed by a majority of all the shopkeepers of such class: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

**CHARLTON WATERWORKS TRUST.  
RATING REGULATION No. 1.**

THE Charlton Waterworks Trust doth hereby, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the *Water Act 1890* (and whose Water District has for the purposes of the said Act been proclaimed an Urban District), make the Regulation following:—

The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupier of lands and tenements shall pay for the year 1898 in respect of water supplied by the Trust, that is to say:—

- (a) On every house or tenement, whether occupied or not, or block of land supplied with water, a rate of Two shillings for each pound sterling on the amount of the municipal annual value, but the annual minimum amount to be paid shall be One pound sterling.
- (b) Unoccupied land where no water is laid on shall be charged Five pounds per centum on the amount of the municipal annual valuation.
- (c) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in special agreement with the Trust or otherwise provided for in this regulation, the rate shall be Fourpence for every 100 gallons.
- (d) The rate to be charged non-ratepayers for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Sixpence for every 100 gallons.
- (e) For steam boilers the rate shall be Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of each boiler, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.
- (f) In buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, or by special agreement. Wooden houses shall be charged half rates. Payments to be made before the supply is given.
- (g) Supply of water for purposes not specified herein must be paid for at such rate the Trust will in each case determine, and the preliminary payment at such rate must be paid at the office of the Trust before a supply can be taken or used.
- (h) In the event of any dispute as to any sub-section applying to any particular case, the Trust shall have power to decide or to make a special charge.
- (i) The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure for domestic or other than domestic purposes shall be the quantity which, at Fourpence per 100 gallons, equals the amount of the assessed rate for the year which would be payable for the premises or land so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure.

The journey may be broken for one month on the forward and during the currency of the ticket on the return journey. Sydney excursion tickets will not be available by the express train on the New South Wales line except on payment of 2s. 6d. first class and 16s. second class. Adelaide and Brisbane excursion tickets will be available by the express and ordinary trains.

*Luggage.*—Excursion passengers to and from stations in Victoria will only be allowed to carry such luggage free as can be stowed under the seats without inconvenience to other passengers, and those who have luggage for the van are required to be at the station half-an-hour before the starting time of train, and pay as under on it:—

No. 1106) it is amongst other things enacted that, notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or particular description of timber or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such Proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any licence granted under the authority of Division 8 of the said Part of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby make Orders as follow, that is to say:—

**DARKBONE AND GOWAR.**—No person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall, unless he hold a special permit issued under the authority of the Minister of Lands, cut, dig, or remove timber which, at the height of two feet from the surface of the ground, is of less diameter than twelve inches, on or from the Crown lands comprised in the parishes of Darkbone and Gowar, county of Kara Kara.—(98.F.7395.)

**WHEREAS** by section 3 of the *Vermin Destruction Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1153) it is amongst other things enacted that vermin shall include rabbits, foxes, wallabies, dingoes, and dogs run wild or at large, and shall also include any kind of animal or bird which the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare to be vermin for the

purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare Sparrows to be vermin within the boundaries of the Shire of Dunmunkle.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE RESERVE IN THE PARISH OF YEERUNG, FOR THE USE OF THE ABORIGINES.

THE Board for Protection of the Aborigines, the duly appointed Committee of Management of the reserve in the parish of Yeerung, for the use of the Aborigines, having framed the following Regulations for the care, protection, and management thereof, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, submit the said Regulations to the Board of Land and Works, to be made by such Board in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 136 of the Land Act 1890:—

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the reserve without the written permission of the Board.
  2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, flowers, fences, or improvements in the reserve, nor shall fires be lighted therein.
  3. No person shall be allowed to fish or shoot in the reserve.
  4. No person shall put in the reserve any horses, cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs, and all stock trespassing thereon shall be liable to be impounded.
  5. No person shall bring into the reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the written authority of the Board.
- Every person offending against these Regulations shall, in accordance with section 136 of the Land Act 1890, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who knowingly and wilfully offends against any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, does not desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

14. In the event of any alteration in the tariff affecting any of the items included in these contracts, the Postmaster-General will neither claim any decrease upon the contract price nor entertain any application from a contractor for any increase to it.

15.
