PUBLIC AND BANK HOLIDAYS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir John Madden, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the *Public Service Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the *Banks and Currency Act 1890* (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897* (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz. :—

That each female so employed shall receive not less than twelve shillings per week for each week during which she works overtime, and, in addition, each wage-worker shall be paid for such overtime at the rate of time and a half; and each piece-worker shall be paid Threepence per hour for overtime in addition to ordinary earnings by piece-work.
3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.

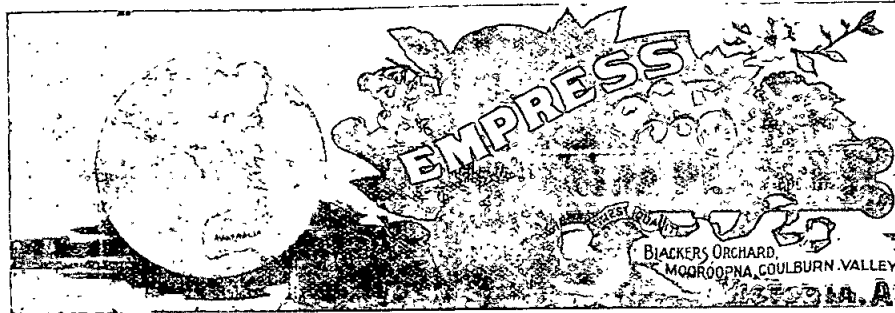

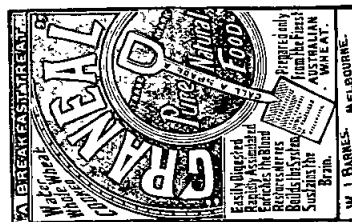

THE Council in and for the Shire of Eltham, in the colony of Victoria, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said shire, by virtue of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and every power enabling the said Council on this behalf, and for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within the jurisdiction of the said Council, doth hereby make the following by-law, being By-law No. 1 of the said Council, that is to say :—

1. This by-law shall come into full force and operation on its confirmation by the Board of Public Health, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the said shire.

Definitions.

3. In the construction and for the purposes of this by-law the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the text or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say :—

"House" shall mean and include dwellings of any kind, schools, hotels, licensed public-houses, factories, work-rooms, common or other lodging-houses, or other buildings or premises.

"Cess-pool" shall mean any receptacle for night-soil or for noxious or offensive matter below or above the ground; and earth-closet shall include a pan-closet of any description.

"Street" shall mean and include any highway and any public bridge, and any road, lane, footway, square, court, alley, or passage, whether a thoroughfare or not.

"Slaughter-yard" or "slaughter-house" shall include an abattoir or any place whatever where slaughtering takes place.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular the plural and the plural the singular, and the word "person" shall include a corporation.

Part 1.—General Cleanliness.

4. The occupier of every house and premises shall cause the yard and ground belonging thereto, or occupied in connexion therewith, to be kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall cause all dust, filth, rubbish, and refuse matter to be once at least in every week removed from such yard and ground; and if at any time the occupier of any premises shall neglect or fail to have such filth, rubbish, or refuse matter so removed as aforesaid, the Council may cause the same to be removed at the expense of such occupier.

5. The occupier of any premises used for the purpose of any noxious or offensive trade, business, occupation, process, or manufacture whatever, or used for the purpose of slaughtering, whether it be an abattoir or otherwise, shall cause any rubbish, blood, offal, bones, water, liquid, soil, or other offensive matter produced or accumulated thereon to be effectually deodorized, and to be removed therefrom once in every twenty-four hours, and to be in the meantime kept so as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or to exhale any offensive effluvia; and if such occupier shall neglect or fail to have removed therefrom any offensive matter whatever it may be removed by the said Council at the expense of such occupier.

6. No person shall place or deposit any dust, mud, ashes, rubbish, filth, blood, offal, manure, dung, or soil, or any night-soil or other offensive matter in any street, road, lane, right-of-way, or place so as to be a nuisance to any person or injurious to health or in any way contrary to the directions of the Council or officer of health.

7. No person shall keep any animal in such a manner as to pollute any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, so as to endanger the health of any person using such water, or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

Part 2.—As to Manure.

8. Nothing herein contained shall be taken to prevent the occupier of any premises from causing any dung, soil (not being night-soil), or other refuse matter produced or accumulated on any premises to be at any time removed or to be used as manure on any garden or land, or to be kept for the purpose of being used on any garden or land contiguous to such premises as manure, so that the same be not so removed, kept, or used as to contravene any by-law of the Council, or so as to be a nuisance or injurious to health, or contrary to any directions of the Council or officer of health.

9. Every person placing, depositing, or spreading or causing or suffering to be placed or deposited or spread, or assisting in placing or depositing or spreading on any land, whether by way of manure or otherwise, any liquid manure, of which night-soil, urine, or any similar offensive matters form a part, night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter, removed from any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or other place, shall immediately on the deposit or spreading thereof cover the same or cause the same to be covered, and shall keep the same covered with a layer of earth not less than six inches in thickness, and shall keep and use the same in such a way only as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health.

Part 3.—As to Earth-closets, &c.

10. No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any privy, except in the form of an earth-closet, which shall consist of a suitable privy building, the floor whereof is at no point less than 3 inches above the surface of the adjoining ground, and every such building shall be constructed with proper openings or flues to provide sufficient means of ventilation, and shall be provided with a suitable pan or other movable receptacle for night-soil, the contents whereof does not exceed 3 cubic feet, and with the requisite apparatus for the application of dry earth or some other deodorizing material to the contents thereof, and shall be constructed and placed so as to afford easy means of access for the purpose of removing the pan or receptacle and the contents thereof, and emptying and cleansing the same. Every privy attached to any school, hotel, licensed public-house, factory, work-room, or common lodging-house, and every public privy shall be flagged or paved with some non-absorbent material having a fall or inclination towards the door or other opening of at least half-an-inch to the foot.

11. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth-closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material sufficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth-closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or receptacle.

12. Every closet-pan shall be constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered so as to be watertight, and with handles thereto, and of a capacity not exceeding 3 cubic feet, and provided with a closely-fitted cover, of pattern to be approved by the inspector of nuisances.

13. No closet door or trap shall abut or open on a street, lane, or right-of-way exceeding 10 feet in width.

14. The occupier of every house, building, or tenement shall cause every cesspool already in existence, and until its abolition, to be emptied and cleansed from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such cesspool shall have so accumulated therein as to be within a distance of 1 foot from the top of the sides, walls, or lining of such cesspool.

Provided that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m. And provided also that the contents of any cesspool shall not be removed or discharged therefrom until such contents shall have had mixed therewith carbolic acid, sulphate of iron, chloride of lime, or some other efficient deodorizer, sufficient in quality and quantity to effectually deodorize and disinfect the same.

15. Every occupier and every person having the management and control of any premises shall once at least in every week empty and cleanse or cause to be emptied and cleansed every earth-closet, privy, and place in the nature of an earth-closet for the reception of night-soil on or belonging to such premises.

16. No person shall empty any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the reception of night soil, except by cart, carriage, or means of conveyance properly constructed and furnished with a sufficient covering so as to prevent the escape of the contents or any portion thereof or of effluvia therefrom.

17. Where any nightman is licensed by the Council, such nightman shall be employed by the occupier of the premises for the removal of night-soil therefrom, and no other person shall remove the same.

18. All night-soil, blood, offal, or other offensive matter or thing shall be removed to and finally placed in such place or places only as may be appointed by the Council from time to time for the final reception of the same.

19. No person shall empty, assist in emptying, or cause or permit to be emptied, any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil, except between the hours of eleven p.m. and five a.m., unless otherwise permitted by the Council (of which the proof shall lie on such person), or until the contents thereof have been properly deodorized; and every person emptying or causing to be emptied any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for the deposit of night-soil shall cause the night-soil taken therefrom to be removed as soon as the same is emptied.

20. No person shall empty, cause or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying any earth-closet, privy, cesspool, or place for

the deposit of night-soil, offal, blood, or other refuse matter into any drain or sewer, or so that the contents thereof may find its way or be likely to find its way into any drain or sewer.

Part 4.—Prevention of Pollution of Water.

21. No person shall place, assist in placing, or cause or permit to be placed in or so that the same may or may be likely to find its way into any water used or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used or likely to be used in any dairy, any matter or thing likely to endanger the health of any persons using such water, or drinks, or milk, or other produce of such dairy.

22. No person shall empty, cause, or permit to be emptied, or assist in emptying, any cesspool, or place for the deposit of offal, blood, or other refuse matter, into any water supplied, used, or likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or for manufacturing drinks for the use of man, or used, or likely to be used in any dairy, or so that the contents, or any portion of the contents thereof, may find its way, or be likely to find its way into any such water.

23. Every accumulation or deposit of offensive matter so situated as to find its way, or be likely to find its way into any water used or be likely to be used by man for drinking or domestic purposes, or likely to be used in any dairy, shall be deodorized and removed by the owner of the property upon which such accumulation or deposit is situated, within twenty-four hours of notice given by the council or by one of its officers.

Part 5.—Drainage of Buildings.

24. Every person erecting, or causing to be erected, any new building, shall cause the foundations thereof, and the ground upon which such building is to be placed to be rendered dry, sound, and well drained, so that no water, soakage, or damp shall lodge there.

25. Every owner of a building shall cause the same to be provided with proper and sufficient drains, so constructed as to prevent any nuisance arising therefrom, and to secure the healthfulness of the inmates of such building; and every tenant of a building under a lease of which fourteen years or upwards is unexpired shall be deemed an owner within the meaning of this section.

Part 6.—Registration of Cow-keepers, Dairymen, and Purveyors of Milk.

26. Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, shall, on or before the 1st day of July in every year, register himself with the council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the secretary of the council an application in the form hereunder written, and every such person shall with every such application pay a fee of Two shillings and sixpence.

27. Upon receipt of every such application and fee, the secretary of the council shall indorse the same with a memorandum of the date on which it is received, and of the payment of the fee, and shall file the same, and shall enter the particulars in the schedule to such application in a book to be kept for that purpose, and cause the same to be properly indexed.

28. All paddocks, grounds, lands, and enclosures used as grazing ground for dairy cattle shall, whenever necessary, be inspected by any member or officer of the said council, or by any person authorized in writing by the president or secretary of the said council and if, on inspection, such paddocks, grounds, or enclosures, or any one of them, are or is likely, in the opinion of the officer or person so inspecting, to be prejudicial to health by affecting the milk, or otherwise, the said council may, by an order, in writing, signed by the secretary, and served personally or left at the dwelling-house of the registered person, or, in the case of an unregistered person served personally or left at his dwelling-place, or posted upon the land, prohibit the use of the same for the purpose of feeding dairy cattle, either absolutely or for any time named in such order. All cattle in dairies shall also be similarly inspected by a veterinary surgeon or other competent person; and any cows found to be diseased, or which from poverty or weakness are, in the opinion of the inspector, likely to be unfit for use for dairy purposes, shall be forthwith removed from such dairy if ordered by such inspector or other officer as aforesaid. And any such order as aforesaid the council may revoke, but upon fresh inspection a similar order may from time to time be made.

29. All houses, dairies, cow-sheds, milk stores, milk shops, or other buildings or structures in the occupation of any person following the trade of cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not, shall be kept in such a state in respect of cleanliness as not to be a nuisance or injurious to health, and shall be thoroughly and effectively lighted and ventilated, and the drainage of all such buildings shall be so arranged that no stagnant water or refuse matter of any kind shall remain or lie in any way whatever in or upon or contiguous to any premises of such person following the trade of a cow-keeper or dairyman, whether registered or not.

30. All yards, sheds, or other places used for keeping or holding dairy cows, shall be regularly swept, and be kept perfectly clean; and shall, within 24 hours of any order to such effect from the health officer or inspector of nuisances, be fumigated, disinfected, or lime-washed, as may be in any such order so directed.

31. All vessels used for containing milk shall be thoroughly scalded and scoured daily.

32. If any person, or any member of the family of any person, registered as aforesaid, or not so registered, but employed as a cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, or any visitor or member of the family of any visitor to any such person, shall be attacked by typhoid fever, or any dangerous infectious disease, the occupier of the house in which such person shall be, or (if he be the person attacked) his wife or other person in charge, shall immediately give notice thereof to the council or officer of health, or to the nearest member of the police force, who shall immediately inform the council, and thereupon it shall and may be lawful for the said council or the officer of health, by order, served as aforesaid, to prohibit absolutely the sale and vending and forwarding of milk for sale from any premises in the use and occupation of any such cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk, until danger, in the opinion of such council, or officer of health, no longer exists. And in any such case it shall not be lawful to allow any person so suffering, or having recently been in contact with a person so suffering, to milk cows, or to handle vessels used for containing milk for sale, or in any way to take part or assist in the conduct of such trade or business; nor if the person registered or conducting such business be himself the person suffering, shall he take any part whatever in the conduct of such trade or business until in either case all danger therefrom of the communication of infection to the milk, or of its contamination has ceased.

33. If at any time disease exists in the dairy or among the cows or cattle in any cow-shed or dairy, or in the herds of any cow-keeper, dairyman, vendor, or purveyor of milk, the registered person, owner, occupier, or other person in charge, as the case may be, shall immediately give notice to the council, officer of health, or nearest member of the police force; and the milk of a diseased cow shall not be used in any way whatsoever.

34. No cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall keep, or permit or suffer to be kept, any pigs in the sheds, buildings, or milking yards in which any dairy cows may be kept or sheltered.

Part 7.—Penalties.

35. Every person who shall by any act or default be guilty of any breach of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of Ten pounds for every such breach, or of Five pounds for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued, unless the justices before whom the penalty is sought to be recovered shall order any portion only of either of the said penalties—such portion not being less than Five shillings—to be paid; and any person committing any such breach as aforesaid shall be liable to the penalty, notwithstanding that the council may be empowered by this by-law or otherwise to remedy such breach, and whether such council has or has not taken advantage of such powers.

The foregoing by-law was duly made, ordered, and passed by the municipal council under the provisions of the *Health Act 1890* in and for the whole shire, this 2nd day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety-eight, and the seal of the council duly attached thereto in the presence of the council on same date.

Health Act 1890. BOROUGH OF KEW. BY-LAW No. 37.

A. By-law of the Borough of Kew made under the *Health Act 1890* for repealing clause 4 of the By-law numbered 16 of the Local Board of Health of the Borough of Kew, and for determining the manner of registering and the registration fee to be paid by dairymen, cowkeepers, and purveyors of milk within the Borough of Kew.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1890*, the Council of the Municipality of the Borough of Kew, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Kew, do hereby order and direct as follows (that is to say):—

1. Clause 4 of By-law numbered 16, made by the Local Board of Health of the Borough of Kew, under the *Public Health Amendment Statute 1881*, shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. From and after the coming into force of this by-law, every person carrying on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the Borough of Kew shall, within fifteen days from and after the 1st day of July in every year, and every person about to carry on the trade of a cowkeeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk shall, previous to carrying on such trade within the said borough, register himself with the borough council in manner following, that is to say, by signing and forwarding to the Town Clerk of the said borough an application in the form hereunder written; and every person shall with every such application pay a fee of Twenty shillings, excepting that when a registration is made between the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in any year a fee of Ten shillings shall be paid.

SHIRE OF TOWONG.

BY-LAW 4 UNDER THE HEALTH ACT 1890.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act 1890*, and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Towong, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say:—

Pans for Night-soil.

1. The ordinary system of open pans for night-soil shall be abolished.

Double-pan Service.

2. In lieu of such ordinary system of pans every closet shall be furnished with a double-pan service, and such pans shall be fitted with air-tight lids, and the pans removed for cleansing at least once a week.

Removal of Night-soil.

3. No householder or occupier shall contract with any person or persons for the removal of night-soil, or permit or cause the same to be removed by any person or persons, save and except the person or persons in that behalf to be appointed by the council of the said shire, and any such pan or pans shall be removed and emptied alternately, as the council of the said shire shall direct.

Use of Deodorant.

4. Every occupier and every person having the management or control of any premises shall cause to be kept in every earth closet belonging thereto a supply of dry powdered earth, ashes, charcoal, lime, sawdust, or some other material efficient for deodorizing night-soil, and shall cause all night-soil which may be deposited in any pan or other receptacle in such earth closet to be immediately, on the deposit thereof, covered with a quantity of such deodorizing material, sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan or other receptacle.

Power of Council to make a Charge.

5. The council shall have power, in lieu of making a rate for the removal of night-soil, to make a charge on each occupier for such service and for pans supplied, the amount, in default of payment, to be recovered in any Court of Petty Sessions.

Extent of Application of By-law.

6. This By-law 4 shall apply to and have operation within the township of Corryong, in the Shire of Towong.

Penalties.

7. If any person commit a breach of any of the provisions of this by-law he shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and a further penalty of not more than Five pounds or less than Five shillings for every day such offence is continued after any conviction.

SEYMOUR WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1898.—No. 8.

THE Chairman and Commissioners of the Seymour Waterworks Trust, a portion of the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the *Water Act 1890*, do hereby, pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, make the Regulations following:—

The following are the rates for 1898, which the owners or occupiers of lands, tenements, and vacant or unoccupied allotments within the aforesaid Urban District, and liable to be rated, shall pay to the Trust in respect of such property:—

1. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of Thirteen pounds annual municipal value and under, a rate of One pound sterling shall be paid.
2. For every house or tenement of more than Thirteen pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound seven shillings and sixpence shall be paid.
3. For every house or tenement of more than Twenty pounds and not exceeding Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound twelve shillings and sixpence shall be paid.
4. For every house or tenement used either wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Twenty-five pounds annual municipal value, and not exceeding Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One pound fifteen shillings shall be paid.
5. For every house or tenement used wholly or partly as a domicile of more than Thirty-five pounds annual municipal value, a rate of One shilling in the pound sterling.
6. The rate to be paid in respect of vacant or unoccupied allotments shall be One pound per annum for each and every separate allotment by which a main passes.
7. For all lands and tenements situated otherwise than in streets in which pipes are laid down, and which are not supplied with water, and being within a quarter of a mile of a stand-pipe, one-half of the before-mentioned rate; and where lands and tenements are over a quarter of a mile and under half-a-mile from a stand-pipe, one-quarter of the before-mentioned rate.
8. Water supplied by measure shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly, where the water is used for domestic and other than domestic purposes, shall be the quantity which, at the rate of One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, would be equal to the assessed rate for the half-year which would be payable in respect of the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure. In cases where water is sold by measure for other than domestic use solely, the charge shall be One shilling and sixpence per 1,000 gallons, or such price as may be specially agreed upon, and the minimum quantity to be charged for half-yearly shall be 27,000 gallons.
9. The foregoing rates are hereby made payable in equal moieties on the 1st January and 1st July, 1898.
10. Such person or persons as the Commissioners of the said Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

4. Such before-mentioned rates shall be based upon the municipal valuation.

5. Such rate is hereby made for the year 1898, commencing on the 1st day of January, 1898, and terminating on the 31st day of December, 1898, and shall be payable the one moiety on the 1st of January, and the other on the 1st of July in such year. WHEREAS by the Factories and Shops Acts it is enacted that in order to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing, either inside or outside a factory or work-room, any particular articles of clothing or wearing apparel (including boots and shoes), the Governor in Council may, if he think fit, from time to time appoint a Special Board, consisting of not less than four or more than ten members, elected as may be prescribed, and a chairman, and may make regulations for determining the mode of electing members of such Boards, and generally for the better carrying out of the provisions of the said Factories and Shops Acts: And whereas under regulations duly made pursuant to the provisions of the said Acts it is further provided that the Governor in Council may from time to time direct by Order published in the *Government Gazette* that any such Special Board as aforesaid be appointed, and that such Order shall state the number of members of which such Special Board shall consist, and shall specify the particular articles or classes of articles to be dealt with by such Board, and that the Governor in Council may in the same or subsequent Order appoint a day on or before which nominations of candidates for election on such Board shall be received by the returning officer and a day for the election of candidates: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth by this Order direct that a Special Board be appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates of payment to be paid for wholly or partly preparing or manufacturing the following articles or classes of articles, that is to say:—

All articles of women's and girls' underclothing, except Stays and Corsets, also Night-gowns, Blouses, Finiflores, Aprons, and Infants' Gowns, and Underclothing.

NITRO COMPOUNDS.

Division 1.

Kallénite.—Consisting of thoroughly purified nitro-glycerine thickened by being combined with nitro-cotton carefully washed and purified, mixed or incorporated with potassium nitrate or such other nitrate as may for the time being be sanctioned by the Governor in Council, with the addition of one or more of the following non-explosive ingredients, viz.:- Cotton, charcoal, wood meal (for the bleaching or purifying of which no chemical agents have been used, or if used have been absolutely removed), magnesium carbonate, calcium carbonate, or such other ingredients as may for the time being be sanctioned by the Governor in Council, and in such proportions that the whole shall be of such character and consistency as not to be liable to liquefaction or exudation. Provided that the amount of magnesium carbonate or calcium carbonate shall not exceed 2 parts by weight in every 100 parts by weight of the finished explosive.

And whereas by the said Act it is provided that the sum herein specified shall be expended under Regulations to be made by the Governor in Council. And whereas by Regulations of 29th April, 1890, a sum not exceeding Twenty-five thousand pounds was made available for payment of bonuses to persons who, at any time after the 20th May, 1890, and before the 30th June, 1895, sow or plant and cultivate vegetables to be used for the manufacture of fibre, paper, oil, syrup, sugar, tannin, drugs, dyes, scents, insecticides, and such other things as may at any time hereafter be approved by the Governor in Council. And by Order in Council dated 29th July, 1895, a Regulation was made extending the time for sowing, planting, and cultivating the vegetables named in Regulations of 29th April, 1890, aforesaid. Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth amend the Regulation made for the purpose named in the Order in Council dated 29th July, 1895, in the manner following (that is to say):—

WHEREAS by Part I. of the *Defences and Discipline Act 1890* it is amongst other things provided that the Governor in Council may make rules and regulations for the employment, removal, or dismissal, and for the better government, of persons engaged by virtue of the said Part of the said Act, and for enforcing good order and discipline among them, and otherwise carrying out the said Part of the said Act, and from time to time amend, alter, or amend the same, and substitute others in lieu thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following alterations in the Regulations for the Victorian Military Forces (that is to say):—

PART I.—GENERAL REGULATIONS FOR THE VICTORIAN MILITARY FORCES.—SECTION II.—COMMISSIONS AND PROMOTIONS OF OFFICERS.

Sub-section I.—General Regulations.

The following paragraph is added, viz.:—

21. If any officer by bankruptcy, liquidation, composition, or other like legal proceeding, finds himself unable to meet his engagements, he should at once notify the fact and submit a full statement of all debts incurred to his Commanding Officer. The latter will then at once ascertain and report the circumstances of the case for the information of the Commandant who, in concurrence with the Minister, will investigate each case, and decide whether the officer can be permitted to hold his commission.

Sub-section II.—Appointments in the Permanent Forces.

The whole of Sub-section II. is cancelled, and the following is substituted therefor:—

Sub-section II.—Appointments in the Victorian Permanent Artillery and Engineers.

1. Appointments as Commissioned Officers in the Victorian Permanent Artillery and Engineers, will be granted to Commissioned Officers of the Military Forces of Victoria, subject to the following regulations:—

2. Applications for appointment must be forwarded to the Commandant through Commanding Officers. If possible three months' notice of vacancy will be given.

3. No officer may be an applicant for any appointment unless he is, in the opinion of his Commanding Officer, in all respects a fit and proper person for appointment, and has, at the date of his application, served at least twelve months as a Commissioned

Officer in the Military Forces (not including service on probation) and attended one training. A certificate from his Commanding Officer to this effect must be attached to each officer's application.

4. No officer may present himself for any examination for any appointment unless he was under the age of twenty-two years on the last day appointed for receiving applications for such appointment.

5. Approved applicants may present themselves at a qualifying literary examination, and on qualifying thereat shall be enrolled as candidates. Such examination shall be in the following subjects, and the maximum number of marks for each subject shall be that shown opposite each of them respectively:—

(1) Mathematics, viz.: (a) Arithmetic, including vulgar and decimal fractions, proportion, and simple interest; (b) Euclid, Books I. and II.; (c) Algebra, up to and including simple equations	300
At least 10 questions will be set in (a), (b), and (c).	
(2) French, German, or some other modern language, the examination being limited to two translations from the language and five grammatical questions	100
(3) Writing English correctly, and in a good legible hand, from dictation. English composition tested by the power of writing an essay, letter, or précis	100
(4) The elements of geometrical drawing, including the constructions of scales and the use of simple mathematical instruments	100
Ten questions will be set in this subject.	

To qualify, an applicant must obtain at least one-half of the maximum number of marks in each of the subjects (1), (2), (3), and (4), and three-fifths of the aggregate maximum number of marks for the whole of such subjects.

6. Candidates who, subsequently to notice of a competitive examination, are certified by the Principal Medical Officer as physically qualified in all respects for appointment, and are approved by the Commandant as fit and proper persons for appointment, may present themselves at such examination. Every such examination shall be in the following subjects, and the maximum number of marks for each subject shall be that shown opposite each of them respectively:—

(a) Plane trigonometry up to and including the solution of triangles	100
(b) Mensuration	100
(c) Elementary hydrostatics and mechanics	100
Ten questions will be set in each paper.	

To qualify, a candidate must obtain at least one-half of the maximum number of marks in each of the subjects (a), (b), (c), and three-fifths of the aggregate maximum number of marks for the whole of such subjects.

7. At any competitive examination the candidate who qualifying thereat obtains the highest aggregate number of marks, or, if there be only one candidate, if he qualifies thereat will be appointed on probation for six months. At the end of his term of probation he shall pass a qualifying examination in military subjects. The appointment of any candidate who fails to pass such examination will not be confirmed, but his term of probation may be extended on the recommendation of the Commandant for a period not exceeding six months.

And the Honorable William McCulloch, Her Majesty's Minister of Defence for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CHETWYND PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations made by the Trustees of Chetwynd Public Cemetery (in accordance with the *Cemeteries Act 1890*) for the general management thereof:--

1. All charges for interment shall be paid when order for interment is given.
2. Orders for interments shall be given to the secretary at least 24 hours previous to burial.
3. The time fixed for the funeral to take place shall be the time at which the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
4. The hours for burial, unless by special permission of the trustees, shall be from Ten a.m. to Five p.m.
5. No burial shall, under any circumstances, be permitted in the cemetery until an application has been lodged with the secretary, together with the name, age, late place of residence, occupation, and probable cause of death of deceased.
6. Every grave shall be at least 6 feet deep for an adult's body, and not more than two adults shall be interred in each, unless the grave be of greater depth or extra width, two infants being considered equal to an adult.
7. Before a private grave shall be re-opened the content, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same shall be given.
8. No order for burial shall be issued until there has been deposited with the secretary a certificate from a coroner, justice of the peace, or registrar of deaths, and, in case of re-interments or removal from another cemetery, verified copies of such certificate, and of the licence of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf, and on payment of the usual fees.
9. No fence shall exceed 3ft. 6in. in height, including the coping, and shall be subject to the approval of the trustees previous to erection.
10. No servant or person employed or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
11. No dogs, horses, or carts will be allowed to enter the cemetery without special permission.
12. No tree or shrub shall be planted in any portion of the cemetery except as approved by the trustees.

13. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower or take away any tree or shrub from the cemetery without the authority from the trustees.

14. The certificate of title to allotments to be signed by the chairman and countersigned by the secretary.

THE Government having made arrangements for the resumption of portions of Messrs. Wood's Mallee blocks 51A, 51B, and 52A, county of Tatchera, and known as "Lalbert," applications will now be received for allotments within the proposed subdivision of such areas.

Fencing, water, or other improvements on the allotments granted must be paid for in like manner.

Lessees must either reside on or within 5 miles of their land or else cultivate up to one-half of the area of their allotment before the end of the fourth year.

The births of 1,139 children, viz., 575 boys and 564 girls, were registered in Greater Melbourne during the month of May. A steady increase has taken place in the number of births since May, 1896, viz., an increase of 69 between May, 1896, and May, 1897, and one of 61 between the latter and May, 1898; although the number in the last-named month was 219 below the average in the corresponding month of the previous ten years, or 229 below it, if allowance be made for the increase of population.

The deaths registered in May numbered 699, viz., 347 of males and 352 of females; the births thus exceeded the deaths by 440, or 63 per cent., as against 89 per cent. in 1897 and 117 per cent. according to the average. The deaths were, it will be noticed, exceptionally high, being 129 in excess of those in the corresponding month of the preceding year, and more numerous than in the month of May for any of the previous ten years, except 1889 and 1890; they were also 72 above the average of May during the same period, or 69 above it, allowing for the increase of population.

To every 1,000 of the population of the district the proportion of births registered was equivalent to 29.24 and of deaths registered 17.95 per annum, as compared with averages of the same month in 1897 of 28.14 and 14.87 respectively, and during the last ten years of 35.50 and 16.39 respectively, and averages of the whole year of 33.56 and 17.77.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 69.4° on the 30th, and the lowest was 35.0° on the 26th. The mean temperature of the month (51.9°), which was over 2° below the average, was one of the lowest recorded for May during the last 39 years, and on only five occasions was a lower mean temperature recorded for that month, viz., 50.9° in 1865, 51.3° in 1870 and 1875, 51.4° in 1879, and 51.7° in 1869. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (29.5°) took place on the 14th, and the least range (5.3°) on the 19th. The mean daily range was 16.3°. The highest atmospheric pressure recorded was 30.414 inches on the 31st, and the lowest was 29.582 inches on the 16th. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.087 inches) was slightly above the average.

Rain fell on ten days, the amount being 2.09 inches, which was nearly one-eighth of an inch higher than in May, 1897, but about one-eighth of an inch below the average of the previous ten years.

Males and females contributed in nearly equal proportions to the mortality of the month. Children under five years of age contributed 34 per cent. to that mortality, as against 25 per cent. in May, 1897; 30 per cent. in May, 1896; 26 per cent. in May, 1895; 28 per cent. in May, 1894; 33 per cent. in May, 1893; and 30 per cent. in May, 1892. Three-fourths of the increased mortality during the month, as compared with the corresponding period last year, occurred amongst young children.

Fifty persons whose deaths were recorded during the month had attained or passed the age of 75 years. Of these, a clerk, aged 75, died of heart disease; a female, aged 75, of pneumonia; an assayer, a male of no occupation, and a female, each aged 75, of cystitis; a female, aged 76, of influenza; a cabinetmaker, aged 76, of syncope; a cab-driver, aged 77, of cancer; a mason, aged 77, of epilepsy; a farmer, aged 78, of cancer; a female, aged 79, of rheumatism; an architect, aged 79, of phthisis; a tailor, aged 79, of bronchitis; a male of no occupation, aged 79, of pneumonia; a female, aged 79, of congestion of the liver; another, aged 80,

of influenza; a gentleman, aged 80, of dilatation of the heart; three females, each aged 80, of syncope, pleurisy, and Bright's disease respectively; a gentleman and a labourer, each aged 82, of bronchitis; a farmer, aged 83, of influenza; a gentleman and a labourer, each aged 88, of pneumonia; a gardener, aged 84, of softening of the brain; a doctor of medicine, aged 84, of syncope; a painter, aged 84, and a nurse, aged 85, of bronchitis; two females, each aged 86, of insanity and pericarditis respectively; a carpenter, aged 87, of diarrhoea; a plumber, aged 87, of pneumonia; a female, aged 88, of cancer; a male of no occupation, aged 90, of influenza; a hawket, aged 95, of cerebral hemorrhage; a civil engineer, aged 75, a male of no occupation, aged 76, a stonemason, aged 79, three females, each aged 80, a baker, aged 81, a farmer, aged 82, two females, aged 82 and 83 respectively, a contractor, aged 88, two gentlemen, aged 90 and 91 respectively, and a labourer, aged 92, of old age.

Twenty-three of the deaths recorded during the month were from external causes, of which 14 were set down to accident, 5 to homicide, and 4 to suicide. The following are the particulars of the accidental deaths:—A cook (female) aged 45, was passed over by a railway train; a salesman, aged 21, died of injuries, the result of a fall from a bicycle; a jockey, aged 30, of injuries to the head, consequent on a fall from a horse; a labourer, aged 46, of rupture of the bowel, caused by the kick of a horse; a carrier, aged 37, of injuries the result of a fall from a van; a carter, aged 36, was crushed between a dray and a post; a female child, aged 1 year, died of erysipelas of the head, and a maltster, aged 40, of fracture of the spine, the result of falls in both cases; an accountant, aged 32, of gunshot wounds; a boy, aged 6, of scalds; a female, aged 32, of corrosive sublimate poisoning; a male child, aged 3, was drowned by falling from a lighter into the River Yarra, and a boy, aged 6, by falling into a quarry hole; and a female infant, aged three weeks, was overlain. The homicidal deaths were those of a boy, aged 6, and two female children, aged 4 and 9 respectively, who were murdered by their mother, apparently during a fit of temporary insanity; a male child, aged 12 months, who was also murdered by some person unknown; and a carter, aged 28, who succumbed to erysipelas, consequent on a blow on the head, a verdict of manslaughter being returned. The suicidal deaths were those of a tanner, aged 20, and a gentleman, aged 54, who shot themselves; a baker, aged 66, who poisoned himself; and a female, aged 16, who hanged herself.

One hundred and forty-seven deaths, or 21 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz., 60 in the Melbourne, 13 in the Alfred, 1 in St. Vincent's, 9 in the Women's, 5 in the Children's, 9 in the Homoeopathic, and 16 in the Austin Hospitals; 5 in the Metropolitan and 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylums; 6 in the Immigrants' Home, 16 in the Benevolent Asylum, 3 in the Convent of the Little Sisters of the Poor, and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 238, of which 111, or 47 per cent., were of males, and 127, or 53 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 123 were under one year of age, 66 were between one and two, 28 were between two and three, 12 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five. As compared with May, 1897, an increase of 96 occurred in the number of deaths under five years, of which 32 was amongst children under twelve months, 44 in those between one and two, and 14 in those between two and three years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 461. Of these, 236, or 51 per cent., were males, and 225, or 49 per cent., were females; 32 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 19 were between fifteen and twenty, 24 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 43 were between thirty and thirty-five, 26 were between thirty-five and forty, 30 were between forty and forty-five, 23 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 44 were between sixty and sixty-five, 52 were between sixty-five and seventy, 39 were between seventy and seventy-five, 18 were between seventy-five and eighty, 20 were between eighty and eighty-five, 7 were between eighty-five and ninety, 4 were between ninety and ninety-five, and 1 at the age of ninety-six years. As compared with May, 1897, there was an increase of 13 in the deaths between the ages of five and fifteen, 20 between those of twenty and thirty-five, and 12 in those aged 80 or upwards; but a net decrease of 12 on the whole at all other periods; the total increase being 33.

The heavy mortality during the month is mainly attributable to the prevalence of epidemics of measles and typhoid fever. Measles, which did not appear as a cause of death in May, 1897, caused 80 deaths during the month under notice, making a total of 300 since its first outbreak in December last. Typhoid fever also caused 35 deaths, as compared with only 10 in May, 1897; and puerperal fever, usually prevalent during epidemics, caused 5 deaths as compared with only 1. As against these increases, however, deaths from diphtheria fell from 22 in May 1897, to 12 in May 1898. As compared with the corresponding month of 1897, deaths from zymotic diseases increased by 97, local diseases by 14, developmental diseases and ill-defined causes by 9 each, dietic diseases by 3, and constitutional diseases by 2; but those from violence fell off by 4, and parasitic diseases by 1; the net increase under all causes being 129.

Epidemics of measles recur at intervals of usually four or five years, and the disease is apparently not confined to any particular season of the year. The following are particulars of the leading outbreaks during the last 25 years:—

The following is a statement of the deaths set down to diphtheria and typhoid fever in each month of the years 1890 to 1897, and the first five months of 1898, from which may be traced the rise and fall of the mortality at various periods of the year. It will be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever usually attains its maximum in March, and is at a minimum from July to November. It will also be noticed that the mortality from typhoid fever in the first five months, and from diphtheria in the second and third months, of 1898 was by far the highest recorded since 1890.

VITAL STATISTICS.

RETURN OF THE BIRTHS AND DEATHS REGISTERED IN BALLARAT AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF MAY, 1898.

THE births of 61 boys and 47 girls, or in all of 108 children, were registered in Ballarat and Sebastopol during the month of May. Of these, 51 occurred in Ballarat East, 55 in Ballarat West, 1 in Sebastopol, and 1 in the outlying districts; included were 5 illegitimate births. In the previous month the births numbered 88, viz., 44 of boys and 44 of girls; and in the month of May, 1897, they numbered 101.

The deaths registered in May numbered 85, viz., 47 of males and 38 of females. The births thus exceeded the deaths by 23. In April the recorded deaths numbered 96; in May, 1897, they numbered 65; in May, 1896, they numbered 82; in May, 1895, they numbered 56; in May, 1894, they numbered 53; in May, 1893, they numbered 75; in May, 1892, they numbered 60; in May, 1891, they numbered 66; in May, 1890, they numbered 79; in May, 1889, they numbered 72; and in May, 1888, they numbered 52.

The deaths occurred in the following proportions:—Males, 55 per cent.; females, 45 per cent.; under five years, 14 per cent.; over five years, 86 per cent. The percentage of deaths under five years was exceptionally low, but in Ballarat the mortality range in this respect is very great; for example, the percentages in 1897 varied from 12 in November to 40 in February, the average being 27½; and in 1896 from 10 in November (also 12 and 13 in May and June respectively) to 48 in January—the average being 27. In the corresponding month of 1897 these proportions were:—Males and females, 58 and 42 per cent.; under and over five years, 28 and 72 per cent. respectively.

Twenty-two deaths, or 26 per cent. of the total number registered, occurred in public institutions, viz., Ballarat Hospital, 13; Benevolent Asylum, 6; Gaol, 2; Lunatic Asylum, 1.

The high mortality, to which attention was directed in the previous month, still continues, the mortality in the month under review being nearly one-third higher than that in the corresponding month of 1897, or than the average of May during the last ten years. As already noticed, a peculiar feature of the high mortality is the remarkably small proportion of children affected. The prevailing epidemic is typhoid fever, which caused 8 deaths as compared with 11 in April, 8 in March, and 5 in February of the current year.

As compared with the corresponding month of the preceding year, deaths from typhoid fever rose from 1 to 8; those from diarrhoeal diseases from 1 to 4; those from cancer from 1 to 5; those from old age from 3 to 8; those from diseases of the circulatory system from 9 to 19; and those from diseases of the respiratory system from 8 to 15. On the other hand, deaths from phthisis fell from 8 to 6; those from premature birth from 5 to 3; those from diseases of the nervous system from 9 to 5; and those from violence from 7 to 1.
