PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency the Right Honorable Thomas, Baron Brassey, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath; Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in Part VI. of the Public Service Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1133), in Part III. of the Banks and Currency Act 1890 (54 Vict. No. 1164), and in the Public and Bank Holidays Act 1897 (61 Vict. No. 1534), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation appoint the days and dates hereunder mentioned to be observed as Public Holidays or Bank Holidays (as the case may be) at the places respectively specified, viz.:—

THURSDAY, THE 27TH DAY OF JANUARY INSTANT, as a Bank Holiday at Wycheproof;

MONDAY, THE SIST DAY OF JANUARY INSTANT. as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Colac* and as a Bank Holiday at Birchip;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the West Riding of the Shire of Leigh, as a Public Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, throughout the Town of Grelong, and as a Bank Half-Holiday, from the hour of Twelve o'clock noon, at Geelong, Rochester, and Rokowood;

WEDNESDAY, THE 2ND, AND FRIDAY, THE 4TH, DAYS OF FEBRUARY NEXT,

as Public Holidays throughout the Shire of Alberton; *

TUESDAY, THE 8TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Bank Holiday at Kaniva;

WEDNESDAY, THE 9TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT,

as a Bank Holiday at Minyip;

THURSDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT, as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Queenscliff * and the Shire of Moorabbin;

FRIDAY, THE 11TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Borough of Oakleigh; SATURDAY, THE 12TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT,

as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Wyndham; WEDNESDAY, THE 16TH DAY OF FEBRUARY NEXT,

as a Bank Holiday at Castlemaine; Monday, the 21st day of February Next, as a Public Holiday throughout the Shire of Walhalla.







 (a) On every house, tenement, or lands, a rate of Eightpence

 - (b) For water supplied from the wharf at Bairnsdale for shipping or any other purpose, a maximum charge of Sixpence per 100 gallons, or Sixpence for any frac-tional part thereof, and a minimum charge of Three shillings per 1,000 gallons, or Three shillings for any fractional part thereof exceeding 500 gallons, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust.
 - (c) For water supplied by the said Trust by measurement (except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, or water supplied under terms of sub-section (c) of section 1 of this Regulation), One shilling per 1,000
 - (d) Water supplied to gardens, nurseries, manufactories aerated water and cordial makers, brewers, bakers, butchers, livery and coach-horse stables, hotel premises, and for any other than domestic purposes, may be charged for by measurement at the discretion of
 - (e) For water supplied to Government departments, cricket clubs, bowling greens, boating clubs, show-yards, cattle-yards, and recreation reserves, shall be charged by measurement at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 30,000 gallons per annum.
 - (f) Private water-troughs will be charged for at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each, except when, in the opinion of the Trust, a meter shall be necessary.
- 2. The rates and charges for water and all sums due to the Trust under this Regulation shall be paid by and be recoverable from the owner of the premises, or the occupier or person requiring, receiving, or using the supply of water.

The said rates and charges shall be payable in advance, by equal instalments, on the 1st day of January, 1898, and on the 1st day of July, 1898 (except in the case of water supplied by moter or by agreement, which shall be payable at such time or times as may be determined by the Trust from time to time), and the first payment shall be made at the time when the owner or occupier shall become liable to pay the rates and charges for the supply of water as hereinbefore mentioned.

Now therefore the said Board of Land and Works hereby make the following Regulations:—

- 1. Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Forty shillings per annum each.
- 2. The rate to be charged for water supplied from stand-pipes shall be Fourpence per 100 gallons.
- 3. On all buildings in course of erection where water is required for building purposes the rate to be charged shall be Ten shillings per centum on the contract price of the work, excepting in such cases as the Minister of Water Supply shall direct that the supply shall be by measure, at the rate of Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons, or by special agreement.
- 4. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be—(1) If for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity the charge for which at Three shillings and fourpence per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) If for other than domestic purposes, only 6,000 gallons per quarter.

Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Board, or alter or repair, or in any way interfere with any pipe of the Board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting, connected with the pipes of the Board, he shall obtain from the Board a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting, as aforesaid, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

 8. Such licence shall be for such period, and be from time to time renewable, as the Board shall see fit; and the Board may at any time cancel such licence in the event of the holder thereof, by himself or his employés, committing any breach of these by-laws.

- 9. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Board, the person applying for same shall satisfy the Board that he is a competent plumber.

Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes, the property of the Board, without giving two days notice to the Board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe, the property of the Board, without the permission in writing of the Board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the Board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

All fittings must be of good quality, and of strength sufficient to bear with safety the maximum pressure to which they may be subject. Ordinary connexion with sub-mains must be made with proper stop cock, screwed ferrules, and with 2 feet of lead piping with brass unions. One service-pipe only for domestic supply for each tenement will be permitted. The maximum size of service-pipes, unless by special consent of the Board, shall be, for tenements of annual value not exceeding £40, ½ in. bore, for tenements exceeding £40 annual value, ½ in bore.

12. All connexions with lead and iron pipes must be made with brass union couplings. All joints connecting lead pipes must be "wiped" joints, and in no case will "bolt" or "copper bit" joints be allowed on water service-pipes, either in the interior or on the exterior of any building or tenement on pain of cancellation of licence. A high-pressure screw-down stop cock shall be fixed on each house service between the main and the building line, and at a uniform distance of three (3) feet from the building line, properly secured and covered with an approved cast-iron cap:

13. No extensions of private services will be allowed except by consent of the Board.

14. If any person neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said Board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the mains being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupiers (if any), and, if none, the owner, shall be responsible for keeping the same in repair, and in every instance in which, after notice that repairs to service-pipes are required, damage is caused by reason of their leaking or being otherwise out of repair or broken, the occupier or owner shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding. Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Board.

(c) Houses unoccupied for a period of not less than six calendar months, commencing on the 1st day of January or the 1st day of July, shall be charged two-third rates.

(d) Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, such as bonded stores, warehouses, and wholesale stores, not being domiciles nor used in retail business, a rate of Twelve pence in the pound on the amount of the annual valuation, oxcept in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

(c) Private water-troughs shall be charged at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each, except when the Trust shall order a meter to be used, in which case the minimum quantity of water to be charged for, half-yearly, shall be 10,000 gallons.

f) For water supplied by the Trust by measure, except in special agreement with the Trust, or otherwise provided for in this Regulation, the rate shall be Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons; and ratepayers shall be charged for the quantity of water which, at Twelve pence per 1,000 gallons; exceeds the amount of the assessed rate payable for lands or tenements, according to their distance from such stand pipe.

(h) Water for gas engines shall be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each engine, except in cases where the Trust shall order a meter to be used.

NHILL WATERWORKS TRUST.—RATING REGULATIONS FOR 1898.

REGULATIONS FOR MANAGEMENT OF THE WOOLSTHORPE TOWN COMMON.

IN pursuance of the Regulations relating to Commons made by the Governor in Council on the 3rd July, 1893, the managers of the Woolsthorpe Town Common, having drafted the following Regulations for management thereof, submit the same for revision by the Board of Land and Works and approval by the Governor in Council, in lieu of the Regulations heretofore in force in respect of such Common:-

REGULATIONS.

- 1. Ratepayers, holders of miners' rights, business licences, or carriers' licences, and farmers residing within a distance of five miles from the common, may respectively depasture thereon four head of large cattle, or the equivalent of the whole or a portion thereof in small cattle, on the basis that one head of large cattle be deemed equivalent to three head of small cattle. A farmer having under cultivation not less than one-tenth portion of the land occupied by him, may depasture on the common one additional head of large cattle, or the equivalent in small cattle, for every ten acres of such land cultivated by him.
- 2. No person shall depasture on the common stock of which he is not the $bon\hat{a}$ fide owner.
- 3. The fees for depasturing stock on the common shall be as follow, and shall be payable half-yearly, in advance, on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in every year:—

For every horse, mare, gelding, colt, filly, ass, or mule, Fifteen shillings (15s.) per annum.

For every head of other large cattle, Ten shillings (10s.)

per annum.

For every head of small cattle, Three shillings and fourpence (3s. 4d.) per annum.

Progeny under six months old, of stock legally pasturing on the common, free.

- 4. No bull or entire horse over the age of nine (9) months shall be allowed to depasture on the common, without the permission, in writing, of the managers, who may refuse to allow thereon any beast or animal which, in their opinion, would be dangerous to stock on the common.
- dangerous to stock on the common.

 5. The herdsman shall, with the assistance of the owners, muster, during the last week of every half-year, all stock on the common, and shall, during the same week, take delivery of stock that may be placed on the common, and the managers shall, on payment of the prescribed fees on stock, of which the owners shall have furnished, in writing, the number and description, give a receipt for the same, and the herdsman shall forthwith, with the assistance of the owners or persons in charge, brand such stock in a conspicuous place with the common brand, which shall be of pitch or tar, or a mixture of both.

 6. All etok on which the prescribed fees shall not be paid
- 6. All stock on which the prescribed fees shall not be paid within ten (10) days after the beginning of each half-year shall be deemed to be trespassing on the common, and shall be liable to be impounded.

- 7. No stock registered in the books of the managers shall be removed from the common, unless notice of intention so to do be first given to the herdsman, who shall obtain a receipt from the owner for the stock removed.
- 8. The managers or herdsman shall not be responsible for the loss of, or injury to, stock depasturing on the common, save as provided in clause nine (9).
- 9. The herdsman shall, on any stock straying from the common, or on being removed therefrom without the consent of the owners, notify them within three days thereof; and if the herdsman fail or neglect to give the owners notice, in writing, within the time specified, the former shall, should the stock be lost, be held responsible for the loss, which shall not exceed Five pounds (£5) for every horse, and Three pounds (£3) for every head of other large cattle.
- 10. No animal affected with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture on the common; and as soon as the herds man shall discover that any stock legally depasturing thereon is infected with any such disease, he shall forthwith give notice thereof, in writing, to the owner or owners of such stock, and to the managers of the common, and shall at once take steps to remove such stock therefrom, and shall not be responsible for any loss the owner or owners thereof may suffer.
- 11. The herdsman shall assist the owners of stock legally depasturing on the common to separate any that they may require to remove.
- 12. All carcasses found on the common, which the owner or owners thereof may refuse or neglect to remove, after receiving twenty-four (24) hours' notice, in writing, from the managers or herdsman, may be removed or destroyed by burning or otherwise at the expense of such owner or owners.

 Évery person offending against any of the foregoing Regulations shall; on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for each offence.

A By-law of the Council of the municipality of the City of Hawthorn, made under the Health Act 1890, and numbered 42.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1890, the Council of the municipality of the City of Hawthorn hereby orders and directs:

1. By-law No. 35, made and passed by the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn, shall be and is hereby received.

2. On and after the 21st day of January, 1898, the occupier of every building within the City of Hawthorn shall furnish every closet, attached thereto or used in connexion therowith, with a double-pan service

3. Such occupier shall cause to be placed in every such closet a pan constructed of galvanized iron, properly riveted and soldered, so as to be perfectly watertight, and provided with an air-tight lid, and of such a shape as will admit of it being fitted with such air-tight lid, and of a capacity not less than 2 cubic feet and not exceeding 2½ cubic feet, and having handles firmly fixed thereto.

4. Every such pan shall boof the form of the approved pattern lying at the Town Clerk's office, Town Hall, Burwood-road, Hawthorn.

5. Such occupier shall cause every such pan to be emptied and cleansed at least once a week, and from time to time as soon as any portion of the contents of such pan shall have accumulated therein as to be within a distance of 3 inches from the top of the
