Water Act 1890.

WYCHEPROOF WATERWORKS TRUST,—REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Water Act 1890, do make the following Regulations:—

No. 1.

No. 1.

Regulation for determining rates to be paid for supply of water for domestic and other use, for proventing waste of water, and for other purposes in connexion with water supply for the Urban District situated within the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust District, and which Urban District was proclaimed and defined on the 29th April, 1898.

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables or tronghs, or a supply for steam boilers, or for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any prinamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house-walls, or carriagos, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Siphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure for other than domestic use, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be at the rate of Two, shillings per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

[a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000

(a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000

- (a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
 (b) Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
 (c) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 15,000 gallons.
 (d) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
 (e) Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding an acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
 (f) And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.
 (g) In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.
- 3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case (except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust) where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure. For all water used in excess of such minimum quantity, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be rade.
- made.

 4. The minimum charge for water supplied by meter for manufacturing or other purposes otherwise than provided in clauses 2 and 3 hereof, shall be 15,000 gallons per half-year.

 5. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed

- 5. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, oby meter or measure, shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.

 6. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five jounds.

 7. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated within the Urban District, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

 8. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within the Urban District at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each tank of 400 gallons or for any less quantity.

 9. The Trust may direct that a netter or meters be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

 10. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, mor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and no such pipe shall exceed in any case that known as a ½-in. pipe; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

 11. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or r

13. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

14. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

15. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

16. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust without siving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

18. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe con-

or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

18. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main, being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the cocupier, if any, and, if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reasen of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

19. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.

20. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

21. If any person supplied with water by the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.-REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 75 of the Water Act 1890, do make the following Regulation respecting Fishing, &c., in Lake Marma:—

No. 57.-FISHING IN LAKE MARMA.

No. 57.—FISHING IN LAKE MARMA.

1. No person shall use in Lake Marma any weir, net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil or made stationary or partly stationary in any way or manner for the purpose of taking fish.

2. No person shall angle for or remove or take from the said lake any fish which may be therein during the months of May, June, July, August, and September in each and every year.

3. No person shall angle with or use more than two artificial baits of any kind whatsoever upon or in the said lake at one and the same time, save and except artificial flies. That no person shall argie in said lake with more than two hooks covered with live bait at one and the same time,

4. No person or persons shall be allowed to catch fish in the lake between the hours of 9 p.m. and 4 a.m.

5. No person shall use ground bait of any kind whatsoever in the said lake for the purpose of attracting fish to any particular spot, or for any other purpose whatsoever.

6. All persons catching any fish in the said lake under four ounces in weight shall forthwith return the same to the lake.

7. No person shall remove or take away or cause or procure to be removed and taken away from the said lake any ova or spawn without the consent of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust being first obtained.

without the consent of the Wimmera United Waterworks Trust being first obtained.

8. No person shall angle for or by any other means endeavour to take fish from the said lake on any Sunday.

9. Any person detected in leaving any weight, stone, tin, or other obstacle at the bottom of the lake shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds.

10. No person shall angle for or otherwise endeavour to catch fish in the said lake unless previously licensed so to do. Such licences shall be issued to applicants at the discretion of the Engineer of the Trust at the following rates:

For each licence to persons under sixteen years of age, 6d. per annum.

per annum.

For each licence to persons of sixteen years of age and over, 2a, 6d, per annum.

For licence for one day's fishing, 6d. The owners of boats on the said lake shall pay an annual licence of 5s. for each boat.

11. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or mis-feasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any of the provisions of this by-law, where not other-wise provided, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

That Regulation No. 38 be and the same is hereby repealed.

Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be kept so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.

4. Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriageway, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any vehicle or machine, or any horse or other beast of burden, or foot passenger proceeding or standing in the street or carriageway, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle, machine, horse or other beast of burden, or foot passenger, givo andible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine by sounding a bell or whistle, and shall maintain such distance for at least 30 feet ahead of such vehicle, machine, horse or other beast of burden, or foot passenger before crossing to the near side of the roadway.
