Factories and Shops Acts.

IN compliance with an application in writing under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, and after due inquiry, I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, being the responsible Minister for the time being administering the Factories and Shops Acts, do hereby suspend the operation of the first clause of section 30 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1890*, as re-enacted by the *Factories and Shops Act 1896*, in the

FACTORY OR WORK-ROOMS OF MESSRS. SNIDERS AND ABRAHAMS, CIGARETTE MANUFACTURER, DREWERY-LANE, MELBOURNE,

for a period of four weeks from the 4th July, 1898, upon the following express conditions, that is to say:—

1. That no person or persons shall employ in the said factory or work-rooms more than eighteen females for more than forty-eight hours in any one week, and that the said eighteen females shall not be employed for more than fifty-seven hours in any one week, nor for more than eleven hours in any one day, in preparing or manufacturing articles for trade or sale.
2. 3. That each female so employed shall receive Sixpence tea money each evening she works overtime.
4. That none of such females shall be so employed for more than forty-eight hours in any one week without their consent.
5. That a copy of this Order be kept conspicuously and continually posted in such factory or work-rooms for the information of all concerned.

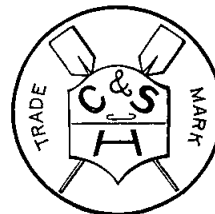

All previous determinations of the Board fixing the lowest price or rate which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons for wholly or partially preparing or manufacturing either inside or outside a factory or work-room, shirts, shirt-fronts, pyjamas, collars, and cuffs of every description shall, from and after the date upon which this present determination comes into force and be operative, be cancelled and annulled.

PIECE-WORK RATES INSIDE A FACTORY OR WORK-ROOM.

In consequence of the multiplicity of the operations to be provided for, and the varying modes of performing similar work, the Board has found it impossible to prepare a schedule particularizing every operation or combination of operations for the purpose of fixing the exact price to be paid for piece-work done inside a factory or work-room in each case. It has therefore had to fix the price or rate to be paid in any particular case by reference to the suppositions earnings of a hypothetical worker paid by time.

Accordingly the Board hereby fixes that the lowest price or rate to be paid to any person for preparing or manufacturing, or for any service connected with the preparation or manufacture of any of the articles of the kinds in respect to the price or rate of payment for wholly or partially preparing or manufacturing of which the Board has been appointed to determine, when the work is to be performed within a factory or work-room, shall be that sum which is equal in amount to the sum it is calculated the employer would have to pay in respect to the particular work were such work done by an average worker paid by time if working under like conditions.

Water Act 1890.

WYCHEPROOF WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATIONS.

THE Commissioners of the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulations:—

No. 1.

Regulation for determining rates to be paid for supply of water for domestic and other use, for preventing waste of water, and for other purposes in connexion with water supply for the Urban District situated within the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust District, and which Urban District was proclaimed and defined on the 26th April, 1898.

1. A supply of water for domestic purposes shall not include a supply of water to any livery or carriers' stables or troughs, or a supply for steam boilers, or for any manufacturing purpose, or for irrigation (which shall mean any mechanical or artificial contrivance for conveying water to the roots of plants without labour), or for water power, or for fountains, or for any ornamental purpose. No hose or pipe is to be applied to any pipes or taps for the purpose of watering the ground or trees or plants, or washing the house-walls, or carriages, or for any similar purpose, unless the water is charged for by meter. Siphon pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

2. The charges for water supplied by measure for other than domestic use, except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for to all owners or occupiers of gardens and lawns, or other lands where water is supplied by the Trust for the purpose of irrigation or for ornamental purposes, shall be as follows:—

- (a) One-sixteenth of an acre and less, per annum, 8,000 gallons.
- (b) Exceeding one-sixteenth of an acre, but not exceeding one-eighth of an acre, per annum, 12,000 gallons.
- (c) Exceeding one-eighth of an acre, but not exceeding one-quarter of an acre, per annum, 16,000 gallons.
- (d) Exceeding one-quarter of an acre, but not exceeding half-an-acre, per annum, 28,000 gallons.
- (e) Exceeding half-an-acre, but not exceeding an acre, per annum, 40,000 gallons.
- (f) And at the rate of 40,000 gallons per acre for every additional acre, and proportionately according to the foregoing scale for every fractional part of an acre.
- (g) In livery and carriers' stables supplied by the Trust with water by measurement, the minimum quantity to be charged for shall be 2,000 gallons per stall used for stabling horses. In open sheds used for above purposes each space of 5 feet shall be charged for as a stall.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case (except in the cases of special agreement with the Trust) where water is supplied by measure for domestic and other than domestic use shall be the quantity for which the charge at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed water rate if water was supplied otherwise than by measure. For all water used in excess of such minimum quantity, a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons shall be made.

4. The minimum charge for water supplied by meter for manufacturing or other purposes otherwise than provided in clauses 2 and 3 hereof, shall be 15,000 gallons per half-year.

5. The charges for water supplied under special agreement, or by meter or measure, shall be paid monthly or as may be agreed upon.

6. Any person receiving water from the Trust who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

7. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the Trust, and who shall not be rated or liable to be rated for water in respect of property situated within the Urban District, who shall take or carry away water from any private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

8. The Commissioners may, if they see fit, allow persons not residing within the Urban District to have water from any public service-pipe in the Urban District at the rate of One shilling and sixpence for each tank of 400 gallons or for any less quantity.

9. The Trust may direct that a meter or meters be affixed in any case where they may consider it necessary; such meter or meters to be provided and fixed at the expense of the consumer, and the water supplied to be charged for by measurement at the aforesaid rate. No meter shall be affixed unless the dial on the same is capable of registering 1,000,000 gallons.

10. No person shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the Trust without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the Trust, nor shall make any such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of the duly authorized officer of the Trust appointed for the purpose, and no such pipe shall exceed in any case that known as a 3-in. pipe; and any person committing a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every such breach.

11. The Trust may contract with any owner or occupier of any lands or tenements who is entitled to be supplied with water from its works, or who is desirous of being supplied, for the provision and laying of a service-pipe from the pipes of the Trust to the boundary of such land or tenement abutting upon the street or road in which are pipes of the Trust.

12. No person supplied with water by the Trust shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, and any person committing a breach of this Regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such breach.

13. No person shall connect any service-pipe or branch service-pipe with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, under a penalty of Five pounds, and in the event of continuing the offence, to a penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice from the Trust.

14. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted.

15. No person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the Trust, or alter or repair or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the Trust, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the Trust until he shall have obtained from the Trust a licence in that behalf to execute such works; and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, or repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

16. Before any such licence shall be granted by the Trust, the person applying for the same shall satisfy the Trust that he is a competent plumber. The Trust shall have the power of cancelling such licence at any time.

17. Any person whether licensed or not who shall offend by opening any ground so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the Trust without giving two days' notice to the Trust of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the Trust, without the permission of the Trust, in writing, being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine the property of the Trust, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

18. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the Trust into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the Trust that such service-pipe requires repairing, the Trust may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise as to the Trust may seem fit until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main, being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier, if any, and, if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, and, in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

19. Before any licensed person shall break up any footpath for the purpose of laying on water from the main to any house or premises he shall deposit with the Trust the sum of Two pounds, and in case he shall not immediately after laying on the water as aforesaid make good and restore the said footpath to the satisfaction of the Trust, then the said sum of Two pounds shall be absolutely forfeited to the Trust, which shall be at liberty to expend the same in making good and restoring the said footpath or otherwise as to the Trust may seem best.

20. Any person watering any street or footpath by means of a hose, except under the direction of the officers of the Trust, shall be liable to a penalty of Two pounds for each offence.

21. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of the Regulations, or fail to pay his rates or any lawful charge imposed by the Trust when due, or fails to do anything which under any of these Regulations ought to be done, or wilfully or negligently allows water to run to waste, the Trust may cut off the supply of water from the premises of such person, either by cutting the pipes by or through which water is supplied or otherwise, and may cease to supply him with water so long as the cause of complaint remains or is not remedied.

22. The water supplied within the Urban District of the Trust shall be received and consumed under and in accordance with these Regulations, and not otherwise, through pipes and meter laid, placed, and being in accordance with the said Regulations, and not otherwise.

23. In the construction of these Regulations, the word "Trust" shall mean the Wycheproof Waterworks Trust.

The foregoing Regulation No. 1 was made by the Commissioners of the Wycheproof Water Works Trust this 5th day of May, 1898.

WIMMERA UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST.—
REGULATION.

THE Commissioners of the Wimmera United Waterworks District, in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 75 of the *Water Act 1890*, do make the following Regulation respecting Fishing, &c., in Lake Marma:—

No. 57.—FISHING IN LAKE MARMA.

1. No person shall use in Lake Marma any weir, net, implement, device, or contrivance fixed to the soil or made stationary or partly stationary in any way or manner for the purpose of taking fish.

2. No person shall angle for or remove or take from the said lake any fish which may be therein during the months of May, June, July, August, and September in each and every year.

3. No person shall angle with or use more than two artificial baits of any kind whatsoever upon or in the said lake at one and the same time, save and except artificial flies. That no person shall angle in said lake with more than two hooks covered with live bait at one and the same time.

- For licence for one day's fishing, 6d.
The owners of boats on the said lake shall pay an annual licence of 5s. for each boat.
11. If any person shall be guilty of any wilful offence or misfeasance, or wilful or negligent act of commission or omission contrary to any of the provisions of this by-law, where not otherwise provided, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds.
- That Regulation No. 38 be and the same is hereby repealed.

SHIRE OF DONALD.

BY-LAW No. 7.

A By-law of the Shire of Donald, made under section 191 of the *Local Government Act 1890*, and numbered 7, for the regulation and government of drivers of bicycles and other velocipedes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1890*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Donald order as follows:—

1. Throughout this by-law the expression "machine" shall mean a bicycle, tricycle, or other velocipede.
2. A person shall not drive, ride, or impel a machine upon any footway made or set apart for the use of foot passengers.
3. Every person who drives, rides, or impels a machine during the hours between sunset and sunrise shall carry a lamp, which shall be attached to the machine, and so constructed and placed as to exhibit a light in the direction in which he is proceeding, and such lamp shall be kept so lighted as to afford adequate means of signalling the approach and position of such machine.
4. Every person who rides, drives, or impels a machine shall keep the same upon the near or left-hand side of the carriage-way, and whenever he shall overtake with such machine any vehicle or machine, or any horse or other beast of burden, or foot passenger proceeding or standing in the street or carriage-way, he shall, within a reasonable distance from and before passing such vehicle, machine, horse or other beast of burden, or foot passenger, give audible and sufficient warning of the approach of his machine by sounding a bell or whistle, and shall pass at a distance of not less than 6 feet on the off side, and shall maintain such distance for at least 30 feet ahead of such vehicle, machine, horse or other beast of burden, or foot passenger before crossing to the near side of the roadway.
5. In every case where a person driving, riding, or impelling a machine meets or overtakes any vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden, and where any animal drawing such vehicle or any horse or other beast of burden may, on such meeting or overtaking, become restive or alarmed, or may cease to be under the due control of the person for the time being in charge of such vehicle or such horse or other beast of burden, the person riding such machine shall dismount as speedily as possible, and shall continue dismounted as long as may be reasonably necessary.
6. No person driving, riding, or impelling a machine shall proceed at a greater pace than at the rate of 8 (eight) miles per hour upon or along any of the streets or public places within the township of Donald.
7. No person whilst driving, riding, or impelling a machine through the said streets or public places shall ride with his hands off the handle-bars, or otherwise ride the machine carelessly or negligently, but shall so ride, drive, or impel the machine that he shall at all times retain full control thereof.
8. This by-law shall apply to and have operation in the township of Donald.
9. Any person offending against or failing to observe this by-law shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding (£5) Five pounds.
